

Explosion / Fire - Chemical Refinery

- An explosion occurred at 2:00 a.m. EST at the TPC Group Refinery, City of Port Neches (Jefferson County)
 - Butadiene was released, prompting a shelter-in-place order for up to a mile radius around the incident until 7:00 a.m. EST
 - Mandatory evacuation in effect for residents within ½ mile of the facility
 - Jefferson County issued a shelter-in-place order for the City of Groves (pop. 15,656) and a portion of Port Arthur (pop. 55,018)
- Some reports of damage to homes in surrounding area (windows and doors)
- No fatalities, 3 injuries
- One shelter open, no occupants

- TX EOC at Normal Operations
- FEMA Region VI RWC/Denton MOC at Steady State
- FEMA Region VI and FEMA HQ continue to monitor the situation
- No requests for FEMA assistance









Forecast Snowfall – 72 hour






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






