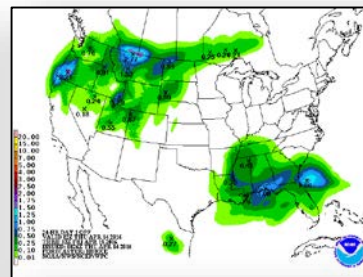
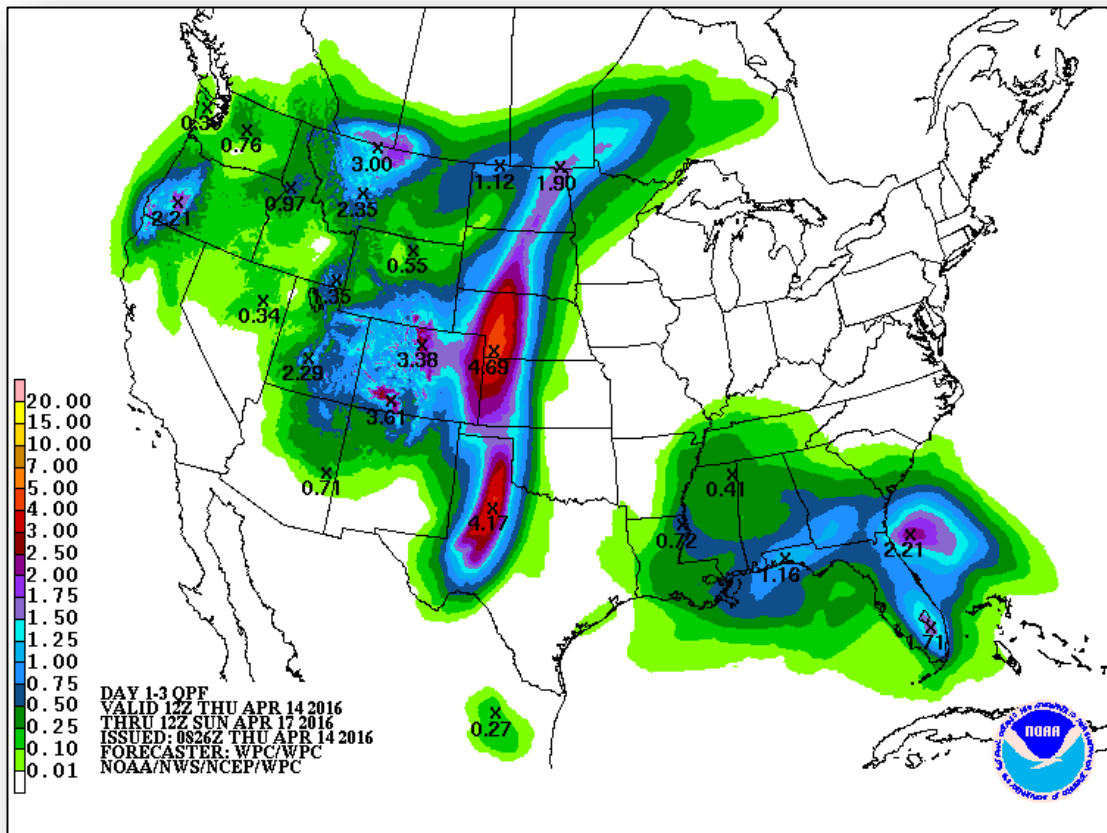
Convective Outlook Days 1-3



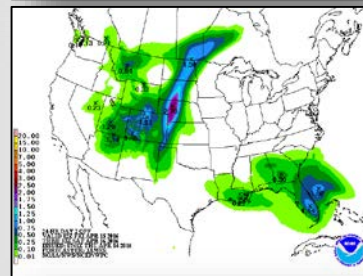
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



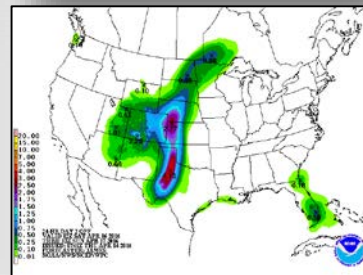

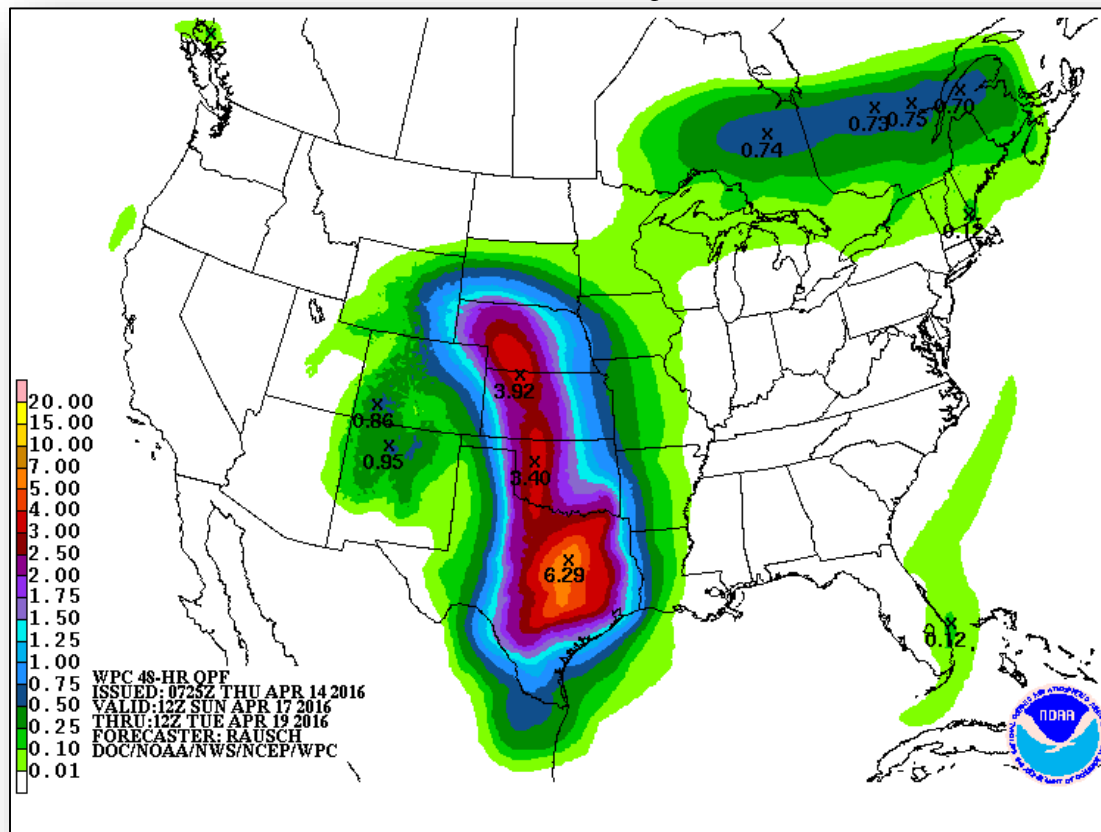
Flash Flood Potential



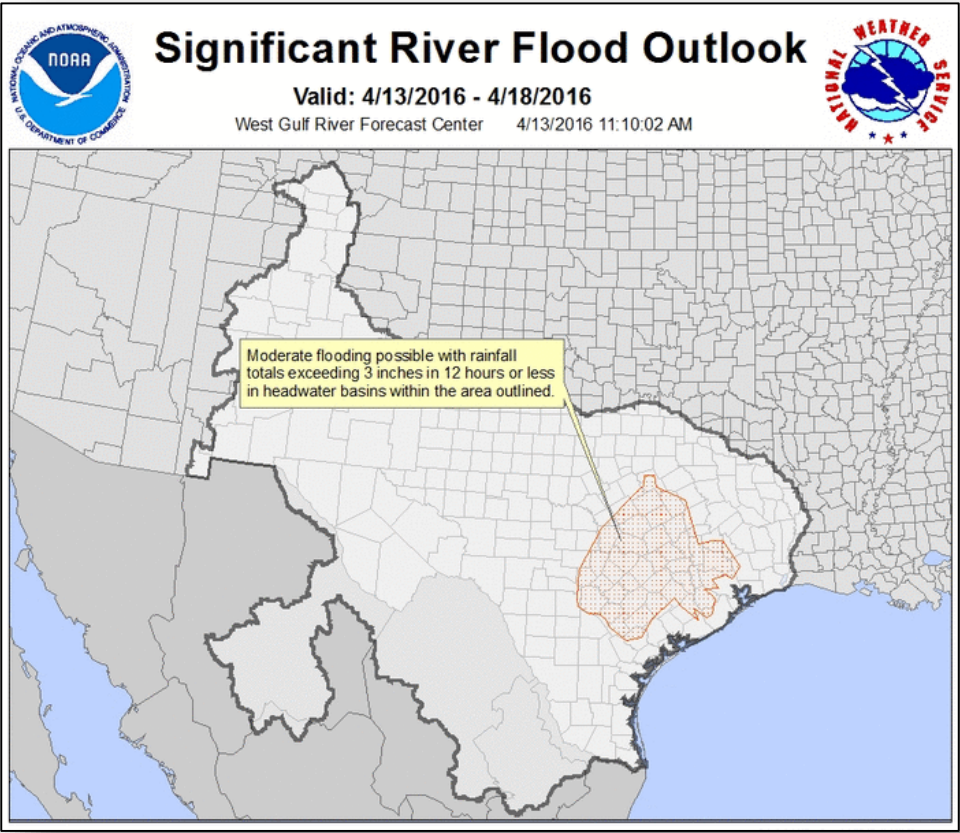
Precipitation Forecast, 4-5 Day



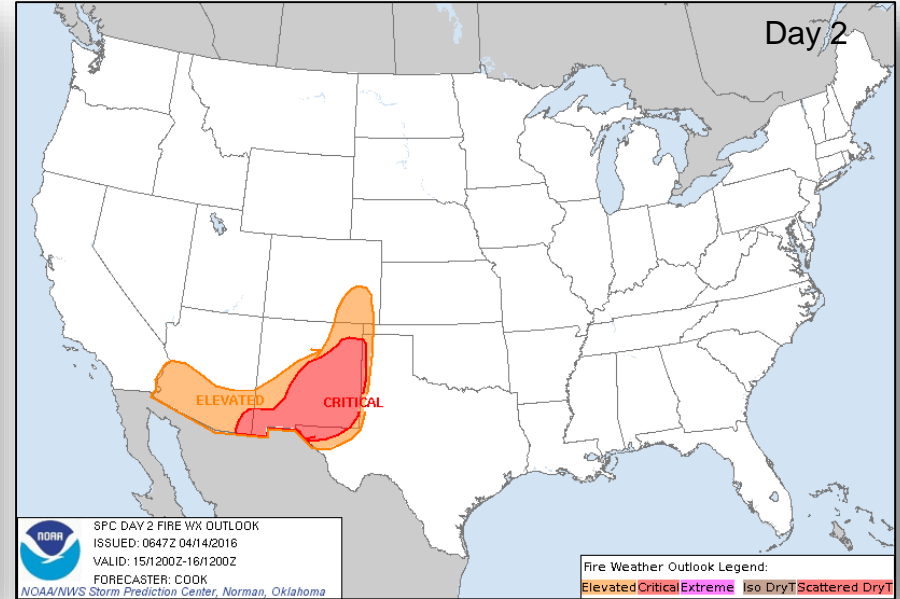
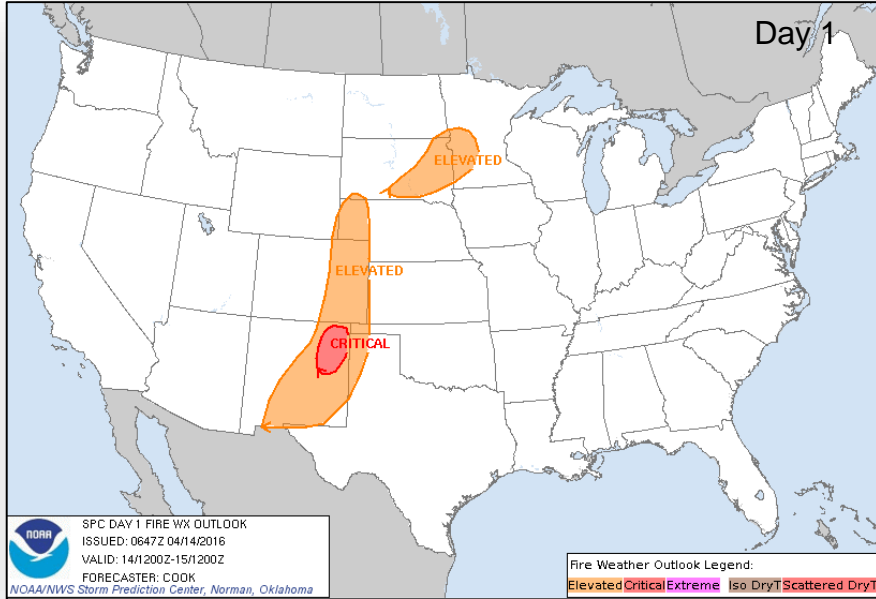

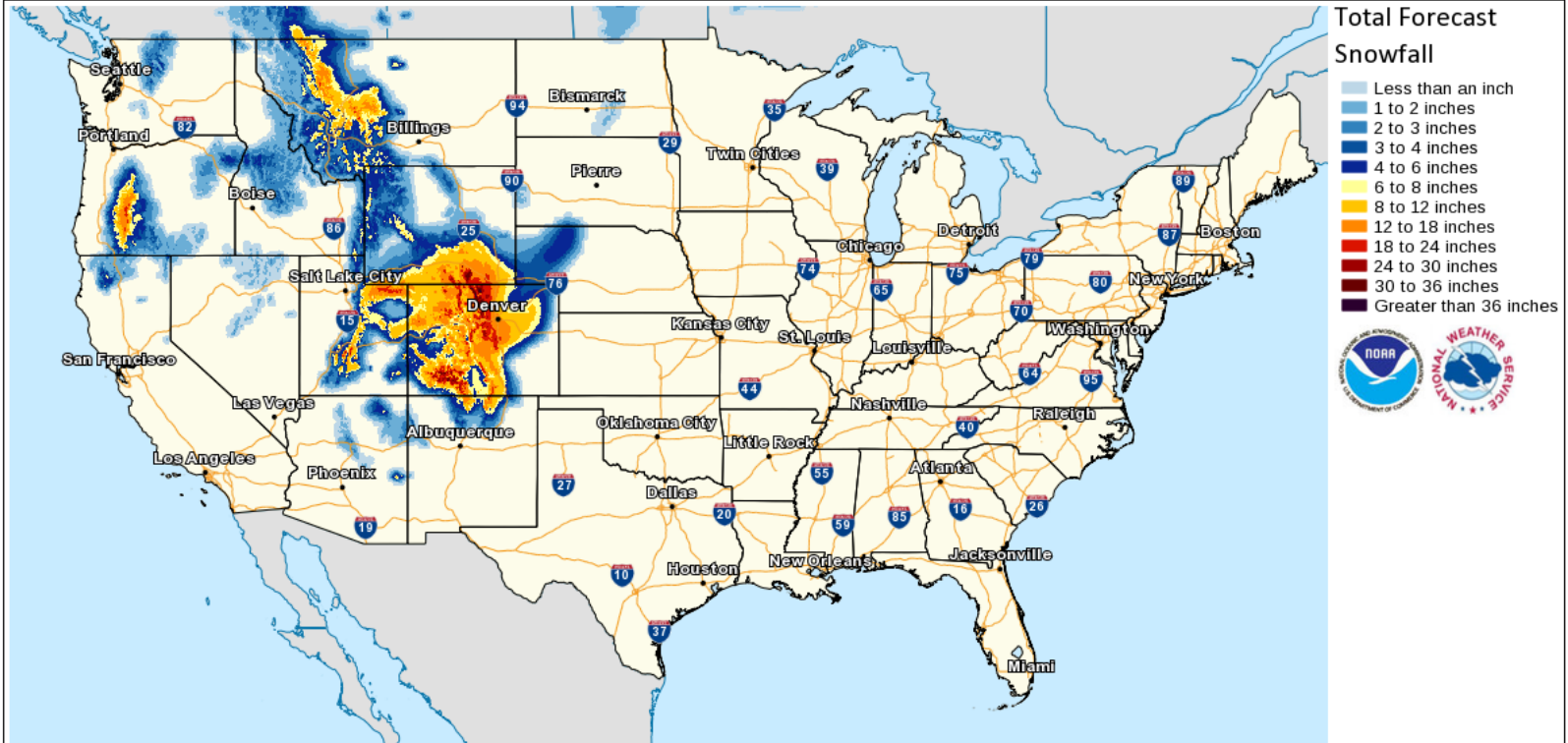
Significant River Flood Outlook

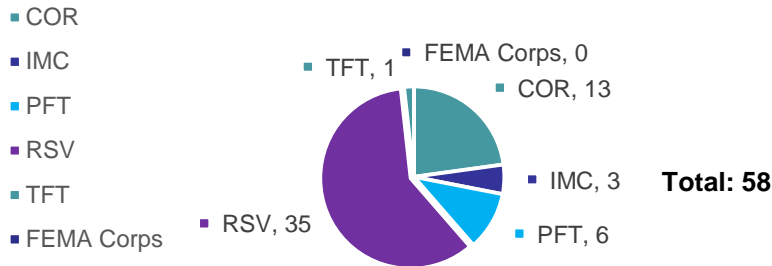
