Marshall Fire - Boulder Co., CO

<u>Situation:</u> The Marshall Fire has burned 6,219 (+208) acres since Dec 30 with eight inches of snowfall falling in the vicinity Friday and Saturday. Boulder OEM reports the fire is 62% contained with hot spots still existing around some impacted structures. 991 (+441) structures have been destroyed and 127 (+2) structures are damaged. Most areas that were evacuated remain closed with partial reopening of identified neighborhoods.

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA RVIII SPOTREP, as of Jan 1, 11:16 p.m. ET)

Safety & Security:

- Partial reopening of evacuations areas for portions of Boulder Co. (pop. 97k)
- 991 (+441) homes destroyed; 127 (+2) structures damaged

Food, Water, Shelter:

- 2 shelters open with 132 (-38) occupants
- Boil Water Advisories remain for the towns of Louisville and Superior
- Wastewater treatment facility has sustained damaged, assessments ongoing

Health & Medical:

- No fatalities reported; one (1) injury to a responder
- Avista Adventist Hospital evacuated



Highway 170 and McCaslin Blvd closed through Evacuation Order area


















Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Forecast Snowfall






Long Range Outlooks – Jan 7-11



6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




