Heavy Rain / Flooding - California

<u>Situation:</u> A powerful atmospheric river will intensify today into Tuesday over California and western Nevada with additional heavy rain, heavy mountain snow, and damaging winds up to 60 MPH expected. Flash flooding and debris flows are possible over burn scar areas. Scattered power outages are also likely. Readiness efforts are being ramped up with the establishment of a joint interagency state and

federal contingency planning group.

<u>Lifeline Impacts:</u> (FEMA RIX SLB 10:28 p.m. ET, Jan 8) Safety and Security:

Evacuations issued for Santa Cruz county for 10 residents

Schools: 4 schools closed Esparto School District in Yolo County

Tribal Impacts:

- Power providers coordinating with 8 tribes for restoration of service
- Tribal LNO providing coordination with the Kaisha Band of Pomo Indians for federal support

Food, Water, Sheltering: (FEMA RIX SLB 9:29 p.m. ET, Jan 8)

10 (-3) shelters; 274 (-96) occupants

Health and Medical:

12 (+1) confirmed storm related fatalities



121k (-385k) (.82%) customers without power statewide: Counties most affected Sacramento 41k (6%), Yolo 9k (9%), San Joaquin 8k (3%)

Communication:

Total cellular site outages: 79 (+30)





Transportation:

- Multiple road closures due to flooding; debris removal ongoing
- Amtrak trains 11 and 14 between Sacramento to Seattle cancelled
- Union Pacific report track outages due to washouts
- Sacramento Regional Transit Systemwide light rail disruption is in effect due to overnight winds, power outages, and debris obstructing tracks

Hazardous Materials:

 Various ongoing efforts to clear up debris and unclogged drainage throughout impacted counties CA EOC: Full Activation (Flooding)

State / Local Response:

- Flood Operation Center for the city of Sacramento
- The county of Marin, Monterey, Santa Cruz, Calaveras, Alameda, San Joaquin, Sonoma, Mariposa, Placer, El Dorado, Tuolumne, Butte, Sutter, Yolo, Merced, San Mateo, Sacramento, Santa Clara, Amador, the city of Sacramento, Cloverdale, Nevada, Capitola, Sonora, Danville, Santa Cruz, Atherton, Pleasant Hill, and Placerville have issued Proclamations of Local Emergency
- 28 county EOCs activated
- Tuolumne Band of Mi-Wuk Indians declared State of Emergency
- Gov: Declared State of Emergency; CA NG authorized to use high water vehicles






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






California – RFC River Forecasts / 5-Day Forecast Rainfall




National Weather Forecast






Snowfall Forecast






Long Range Outlooks – Jan 14-18

6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




