Flooding – Pacific Northwest

<u>Situation:</u> Multiple days of snowfall, rainfall, and snow melt have created major and local road closures, delaying emergency response, and have aggravated supply chain issues. Avalanche, & mudslide dangers continue for coastal and inland Washington and Flood Warnings remain in effect in southwestern Washington.

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety & Security:

 3 (-3) counties are reporting portions of their counties are inaccessible; impacting emergency response & local PDAs

Food, Water, Shelter:

- 2 shelters open with 27 (-18) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:50 a.m.)
- Boil water advisory issued for Grays Harbor, WA

Health and Medical:

 Makah Nation – UPS delivery issues affecting delivery of medications and other supplies to residents

Energy:

Minimal power outages reported for WA (Eagle-I, as of 7:27 a.m. ET)

Transportation:

Reopening highways in WA: Highway 2 (Snohomish, Chelan, & Douglas)

Hazardous Waste:

- 3 wastewater treatment plants, (1) Grays Harbor & (2) Lewis, WA, having issues due to flooding
- Pollutants present in floodwater in Lewis and Thurston counties














Response:




Precipitation Forecast






FEMA Common Operating Picture






