### Severe Weather – East Coast to the Northeast – FINAL

#### Current Situation: (FEMA Regional DSARs)

Storm activity has tapered Thursday going into Friday. Another strong storm system is expected beginning Friday afternoon into Friday night for portions of Southern Plains into the Lower Mississippi Valley. Flood warnings remain in effect in scattered counties along the Gulf Coast and the Eastern seaboard.







### **National Weather Forecast**






### **Severe Weather Outlook**






# **Snowfall Forecast**






### Hazards Outlook – Jan 13-17


