Earthquake (M6.4) – Puerto Rico



Situation: Following the M5.2 aftershock, power generation remains stable across PR; Energy Lifelines continue to trend towards Green. Primary focus for FEMA is coordination efforts for structural assessments of public and private structures and maintaining sheltering and counseling support. Preliminary damage assessments are ongoing. Aftershocks continue but are consistent with the USGS forecast of 56% (+3%) probability for M5.0 earthquakes in the next 7 days.






Winter Precipitation Outlook








Forecast Snowfall







