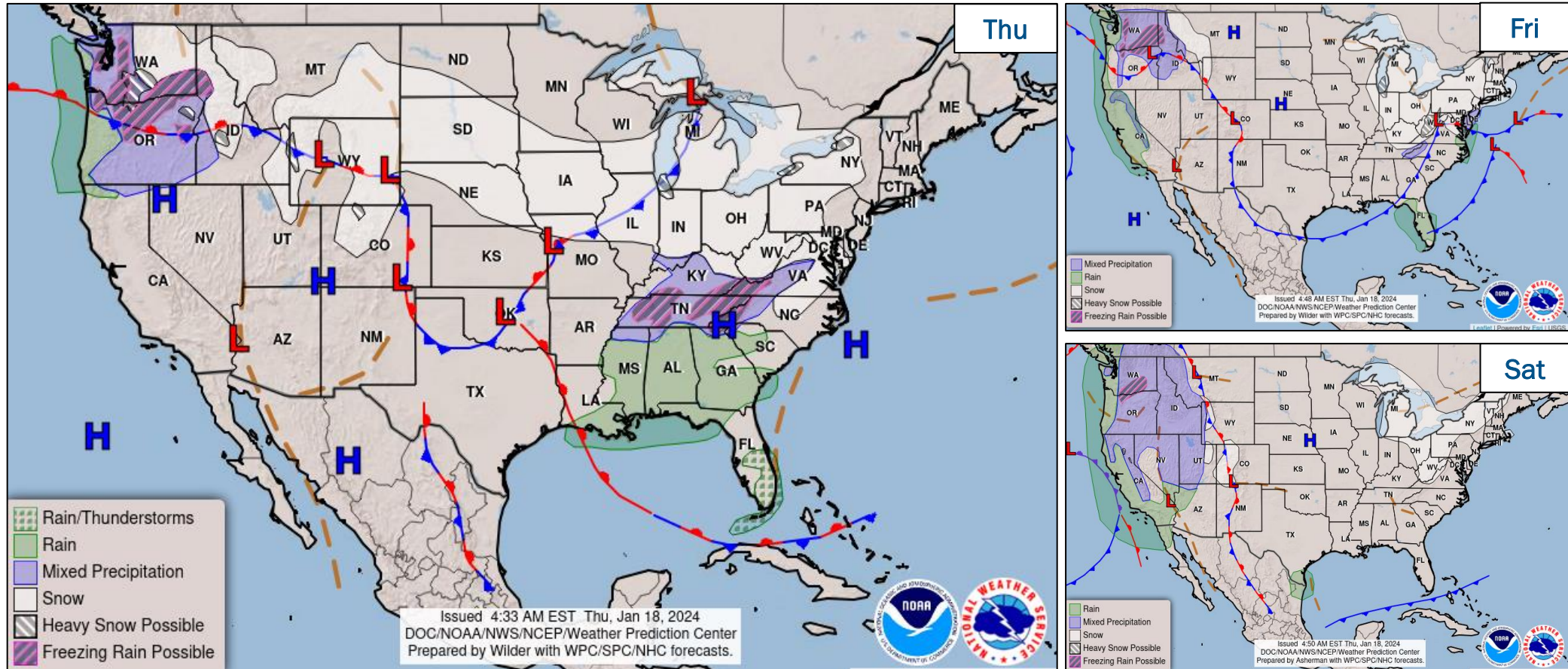

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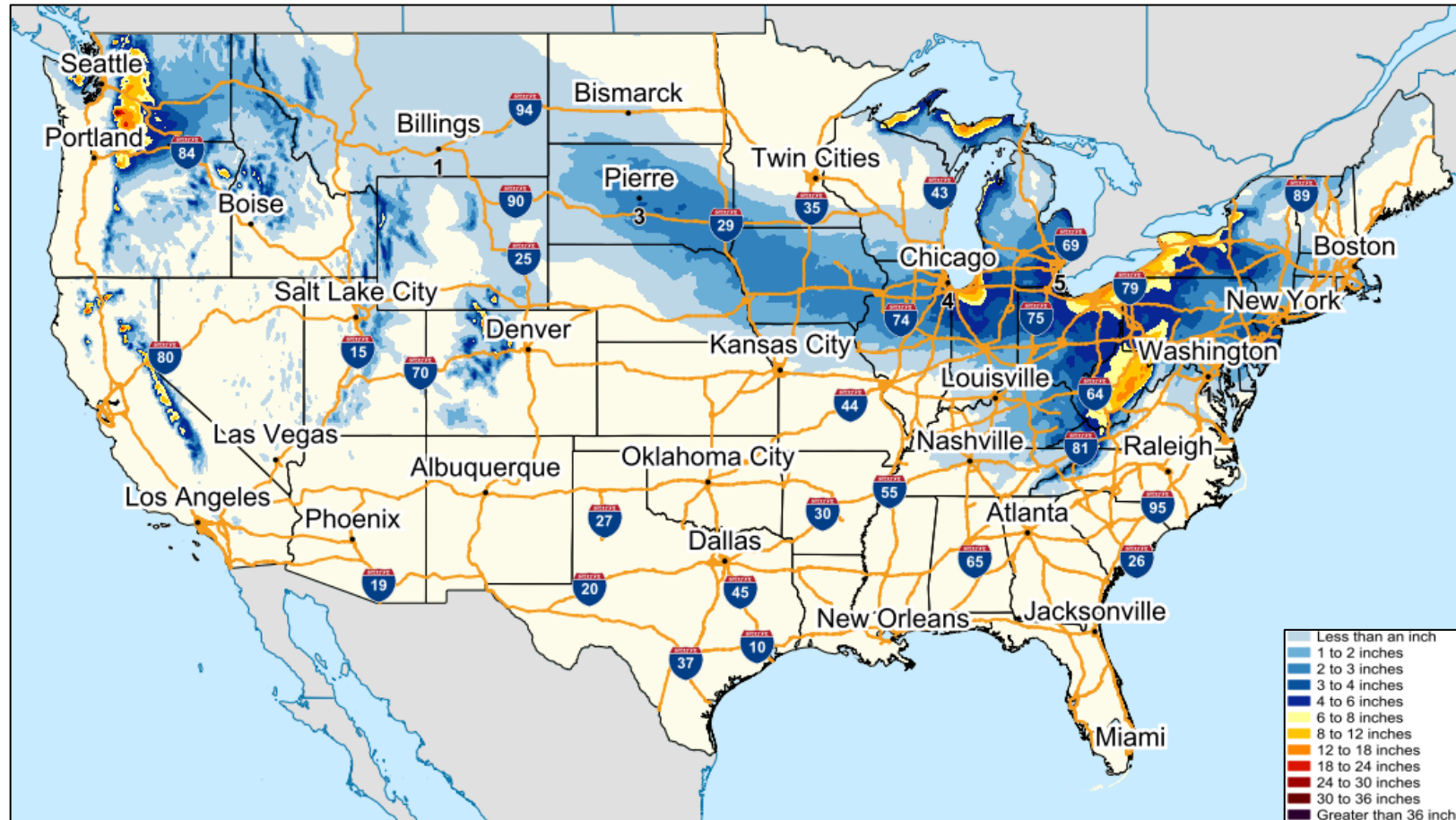
National Weather Forecast



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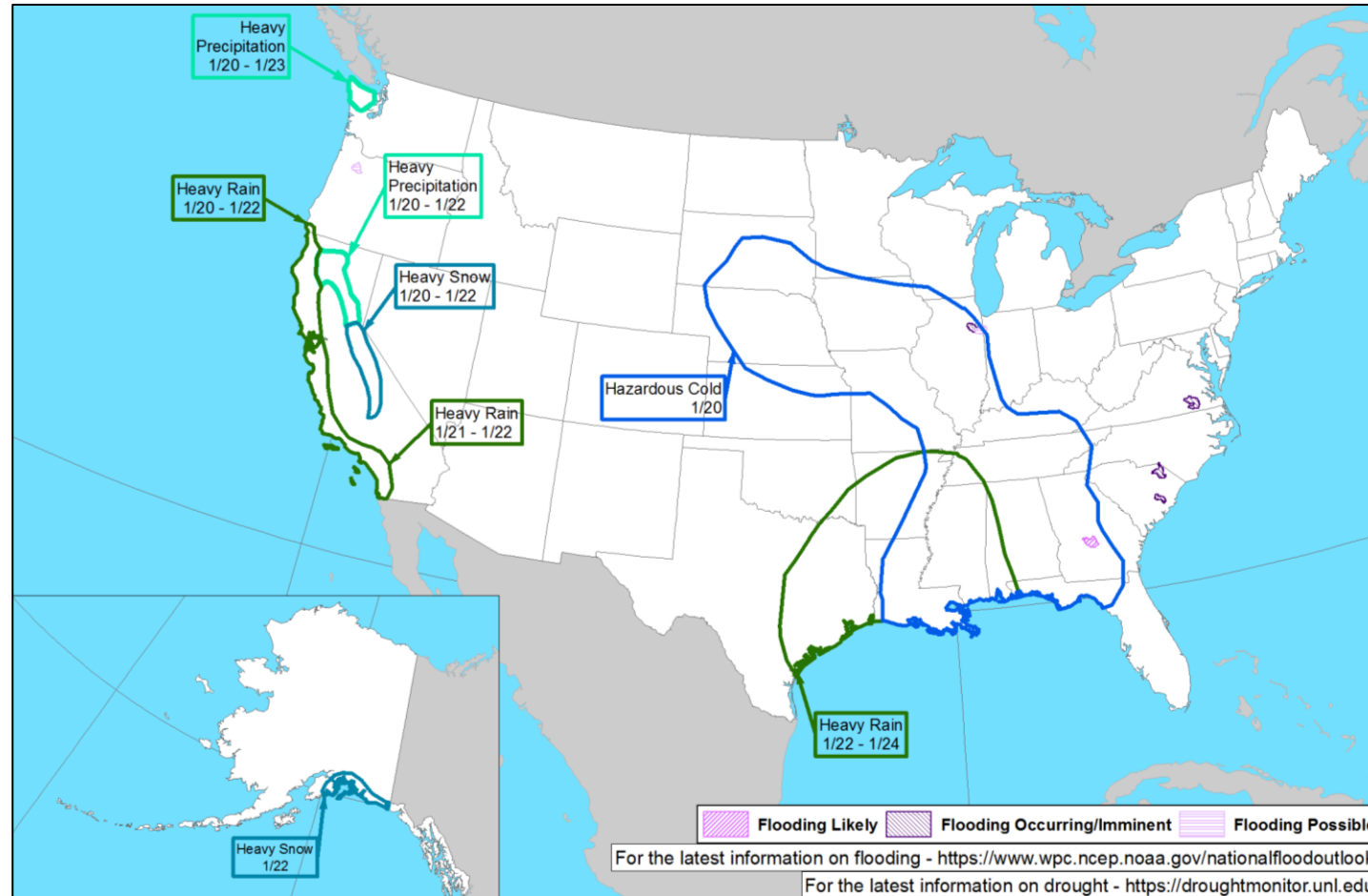

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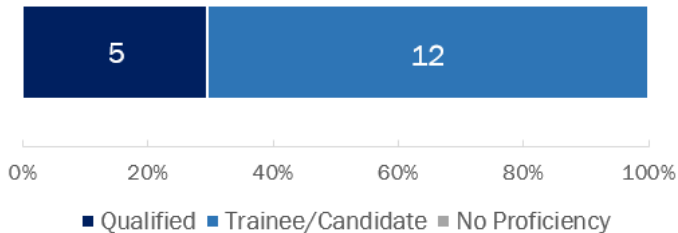

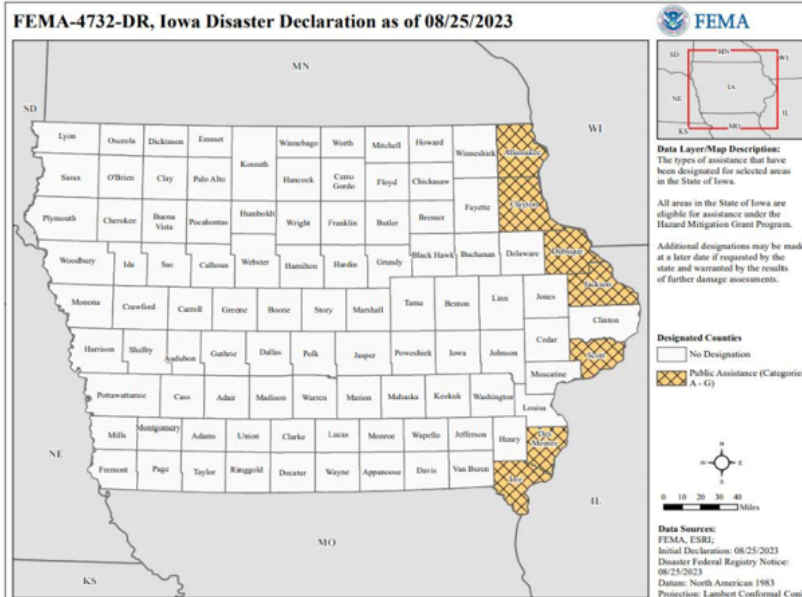

On August 25, 2023, a major disaster declaration was approved for Public Assistance and Hazard Mitigation due to flooding April 24 to May 13, 2023, for 7 counties in the State of Iowa, Allamakee, Clayton, Des Moines, Dubuque, Jackson, Lee, and Scott Counties.

- **Focus:** Deliver State-FEMA hybrid PA delivery model to heighten joint coordination, enhance assistance to applicants, and integrate program areas.

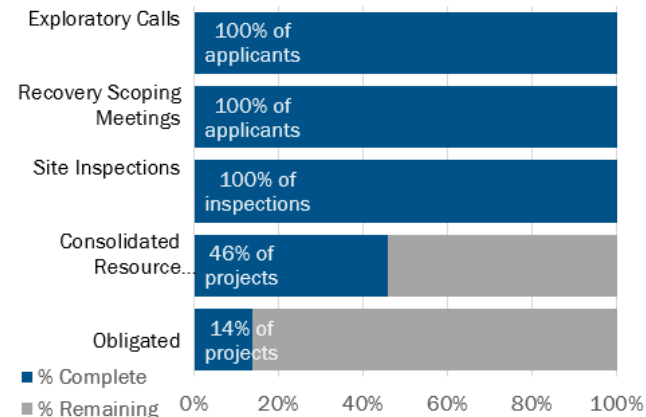
