



LA Basin precipitation totals, past 6 hours and Active Flash Flood Warnings at 6 am EST




Additional precipitation through early Tuesday will be focused across the LA Basin. 5 to 10 additional inches in the hills and mountains north and east of LA.



# Slight Risk remains in place Tuesday with increasing risk east across the Lower Colorado River and western AZ



### **Atmospheric River - California**

<u>Situation:</u> A slow-moving channel of moisture with a long duration atmospheric river is expected to produce significant rainfall through Tuesday for California. Today, there is a High Risk of excessive rainfall for portions of Southern California including Los Angeles and San Diego, with possible rainfall totals reaching 3-6 inches and 6-12 inches likely across south and southwest facing foothills and mountains. Flood Warnings and Watches remain in effect for portions of central and southern California.
