Atmospheric River - California

<u>Situation:</u> The Atmospheric River will continue to bring significant impacts to California through today. Southern California will see the most significant rainfall. Widespread Flood Watches and localized Flash Flood Warnings are in effect across Southern and Central California counties. Winter storm warnings are in effect through this morning for areas of Northern California and the Sierra Nevada range, as well as portions of coastal Southern California mountains; through this evening for most of central and southern Nevada; and through Wednesday afternoon for mountainous areas in central Arizona. The current storm will begin dissipating today. Considerable flooding impacts are possible across portions of Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange, and San Diego counties, as well as the western Inland Empire and coastal slopes of the San Bernardino mountains, through this afternoon.








National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Snowfall Forecast


