
M7.8 and M7.5 Earthquakes – Southern Turkey – FINAL

<u>Current Situation:</u> Sunday, at 8:17 p.m. ET, a magnitude 7.8 earthquake occurred 14 miles east of Nurdagi (pop. 41k), Turkey, and 95 miles west of Adana (pop. 1.85 million) at a depth of 11 miles.

- Red PAGER alert for shaking-related fatalities and economic losses. Past red alerts have required a national or international response. Estimated economic losses are 0-2% GDP of Turkey
- Level IX on the Modified Mercalli Intensity (MMI) scale; 70k exposed to violent shaking, 540k exposed to severe shaking
- Media reports approx. 5k fatalities in Turkey and Syria. Thousands more injured.
- Portions of northern Syria were also severely impacted as the earthquake occurred about 100 miles from Aleppo
- Numerous aftershocks continue, the largest was a M6.7

On Monday, February 6 at 5:24 a.m. ET a magnitude 7.5 earthquake occurred near Ekinozu (pop. 6k), Turkey approximately 125 miles from Nurdagi

- Level VIII on Modified Mercalli Intensity scale 132k exposed to severe shaking
- At 5:35 a.m. ET an aftershock of magnitude 5.8 occurred; Green PAGER for fatalities and economic losses; MMI of VII – 3k exposed to very strong shaking



FEMA / Federal Response:

- USAID-US&R VA-TF1 and CA-TF2 awaiting air lift
- DOD waiting approval for helicopter support to transport a Turkish Search and Rescue team
- DoS personnel TDY in Hasakah, Syria report 100% accountability



Train Derailment and Fire - Ohio - FINAL

<u>Current Situation:</u> The breach of several rail cars was completed successfully. Operation to burn off the materials from the derailed cars took several hours. Ohio EMA is reporting the controlled vent and burn went as planned and risk of uncontrolled explosion is being mitigated. National Transportation Safety Board investigators say a mechanical issue with a rail car axle caused the derailment. (FEMA RV Update, as of 9:15 p.m. ET)

Impacts:

- SR 165 is closed; at least 19 local road closures in the vicinity
- A nursing home moved patients to another facility
- Evacuations continue within the 1-mile evacuation zone


State / Local Response:

- A State of Emergency declared for the Village of East Palestine
- Ohio SEOC is at Partial Activation (Derailment/HAZMAT)
- National Guard Activated Feb. 5
- HAZMAT teams activated
- 1 shelter open with 20 occupants

FEMA / Federal Response:

- EPA continues to monitor air quality
- IMAAC modelling remains open in support of the EPA
- No request for FEMA assistance
- FEMA NWC and Region V continue to monitor
- EPA airborne assets on standby at Pittsburgh International Airport





State of the Union Address – Washington, DC

<u>Current Situation:</u> On Feb 7, the President will deliver the State of the Union Address to a Joint Session of Congress in Washington, DC. The event has been designated a National Special Security Event; FEMA has primary responsibility for the coordination of federal emergency management planning.


DC HSEMA will go to Full Activation at 3:00 p.m. ET, Feb 7

- R3 IMAT will deploy to DC HSEMA


FEMA HQ Response:

- NWC will activate its Enhanced Watch at 3:00 p.m., Feb 7
- ONCRC LNOs are deployed within NCR
- NRCS Blue Team, ESFs, N-IMAT Blue, CMCU, DEST on alert
- US&R issued ESF#9 Advisory
- MERS providing communications and mobile command post functions to Region III and other federal agencies






National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Snowfall Forecast





Hazards Outlook - Feb 6-10






