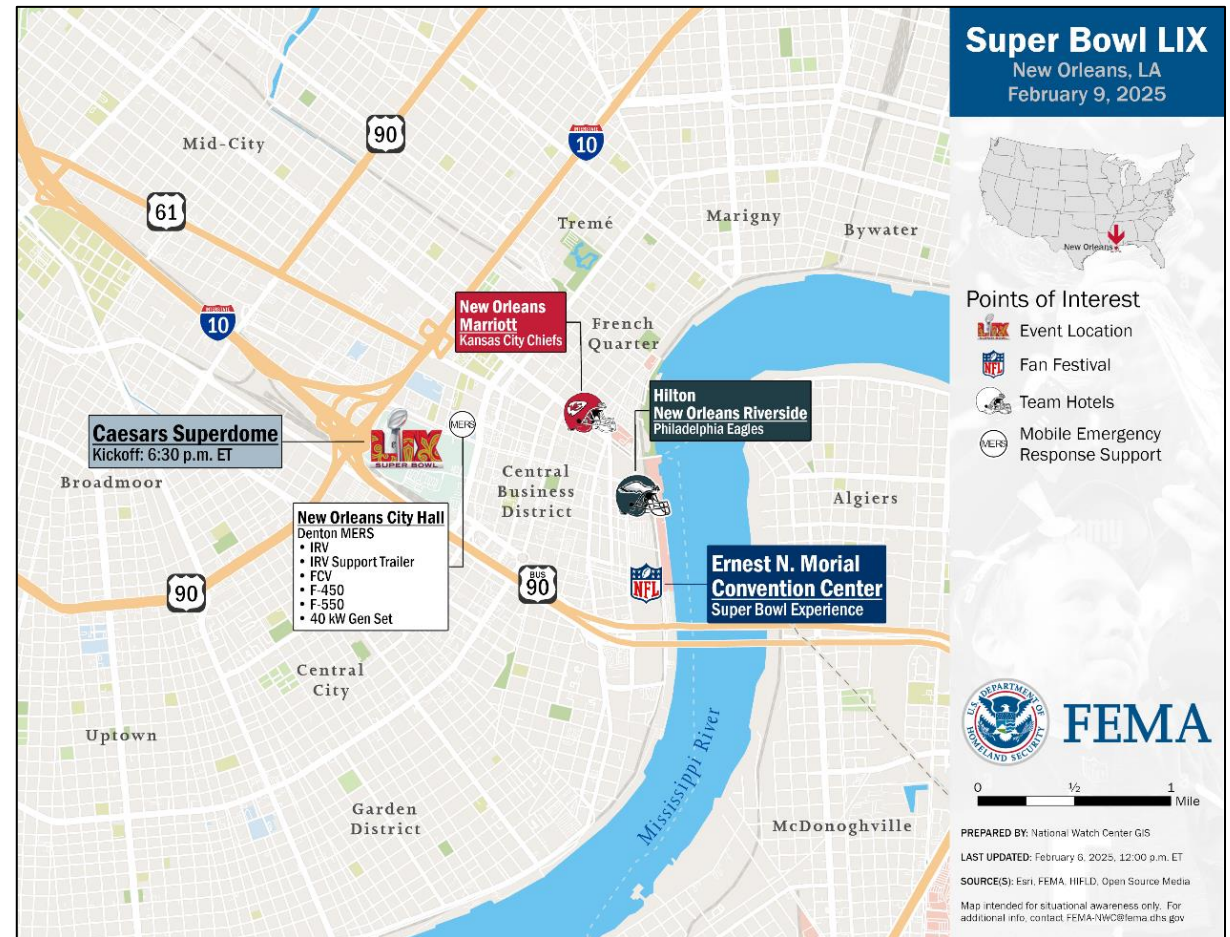

- New Orleans Police Department (NOPD) is the lead local law enforcement agency

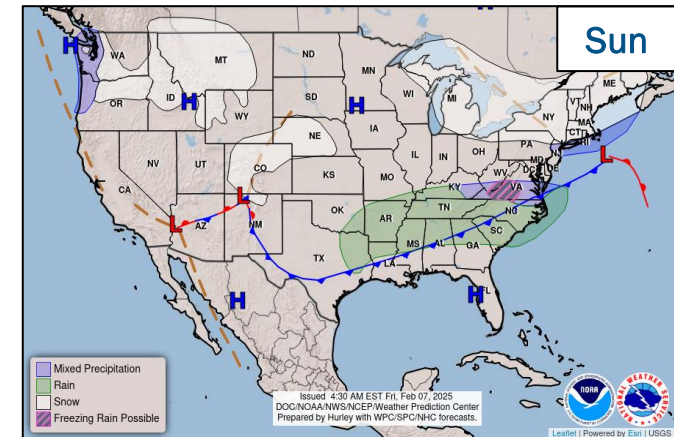
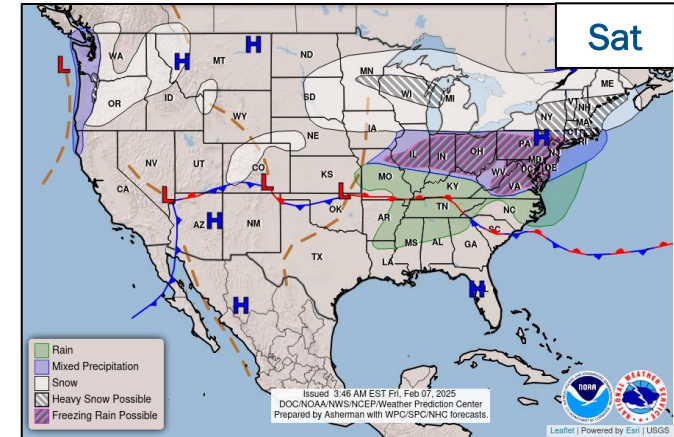
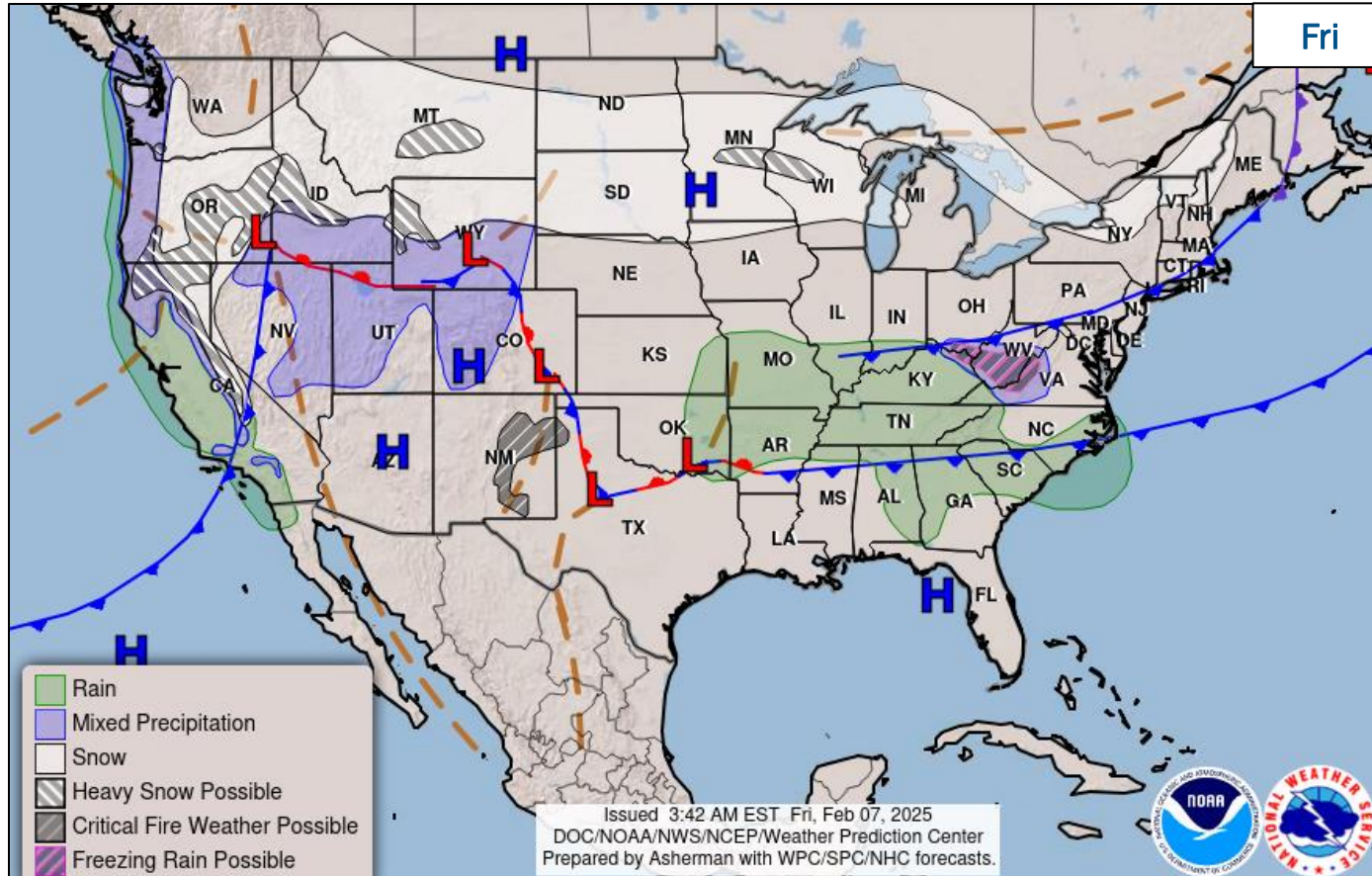

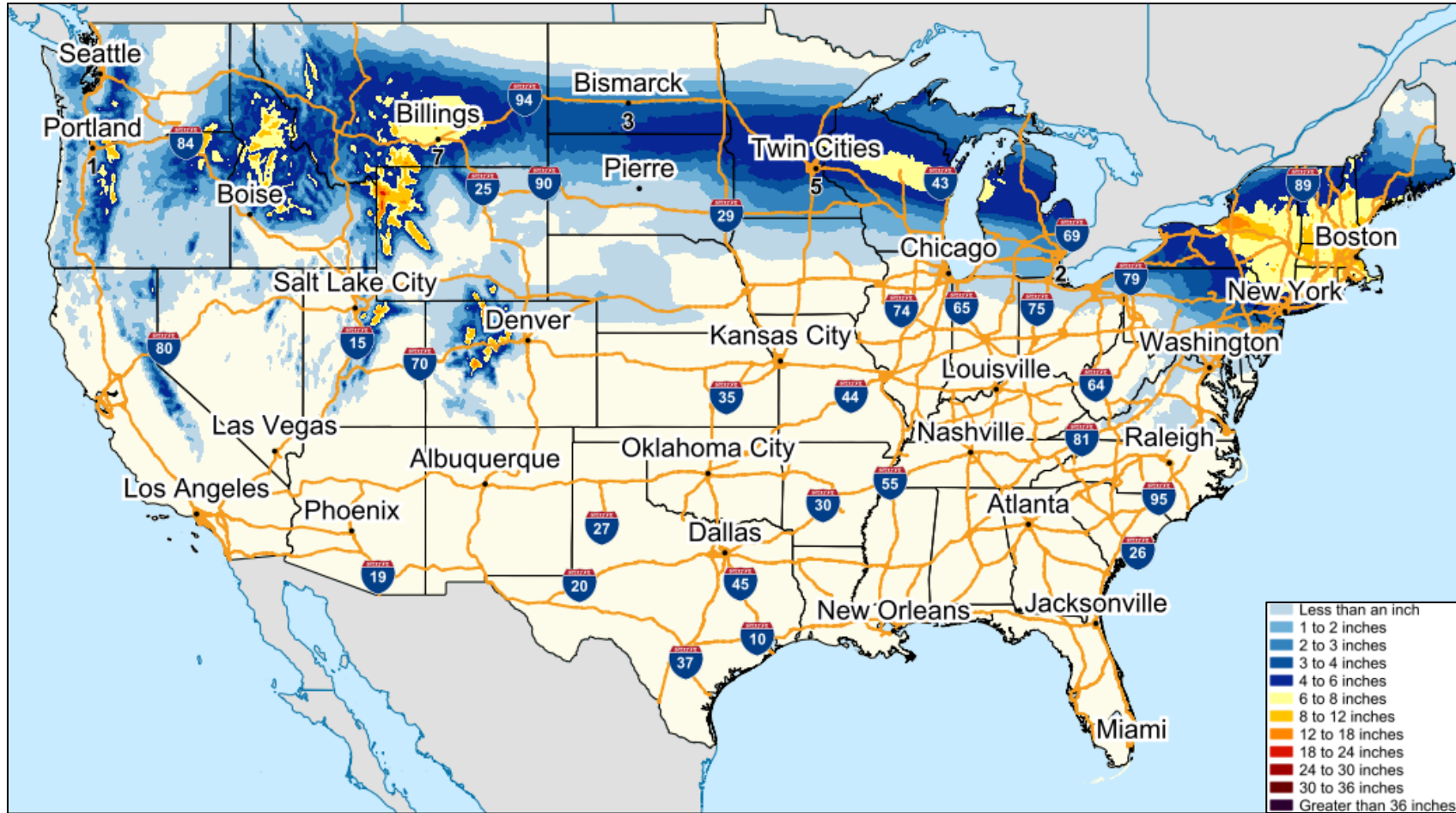
National Weather Forecast

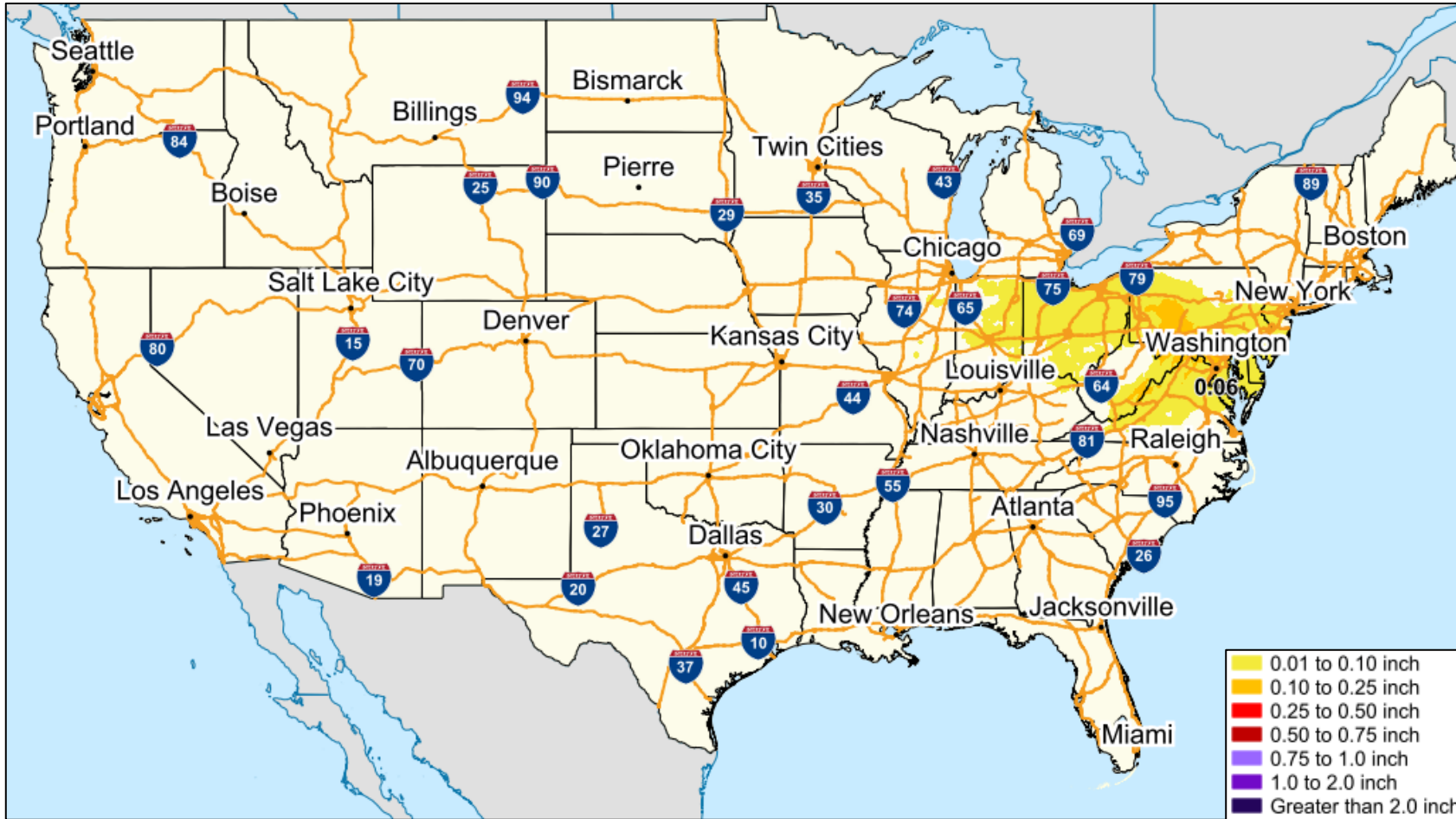

Snowfall Forecast



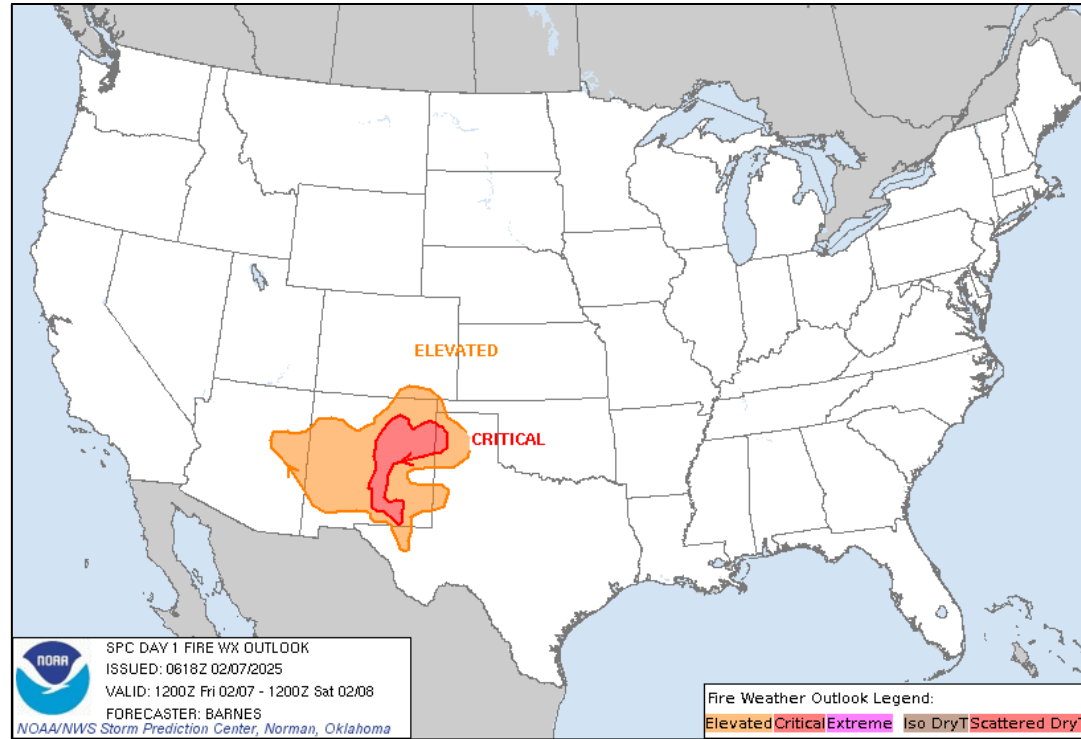

Ice Accumulation Forecast

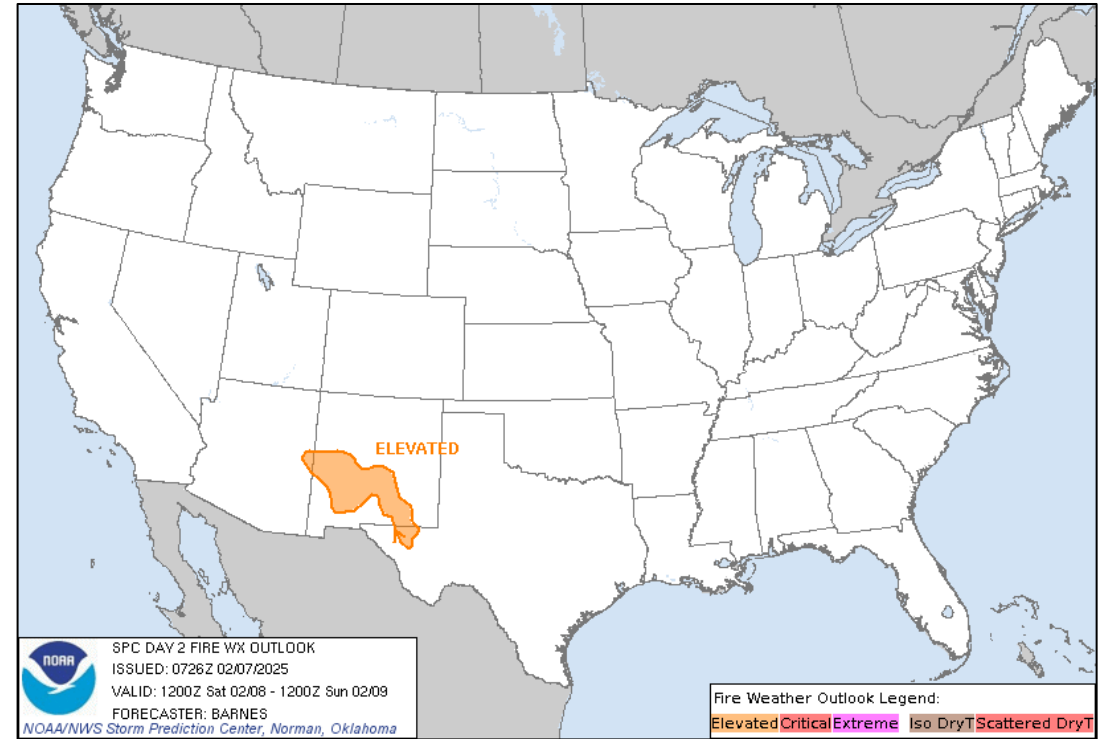

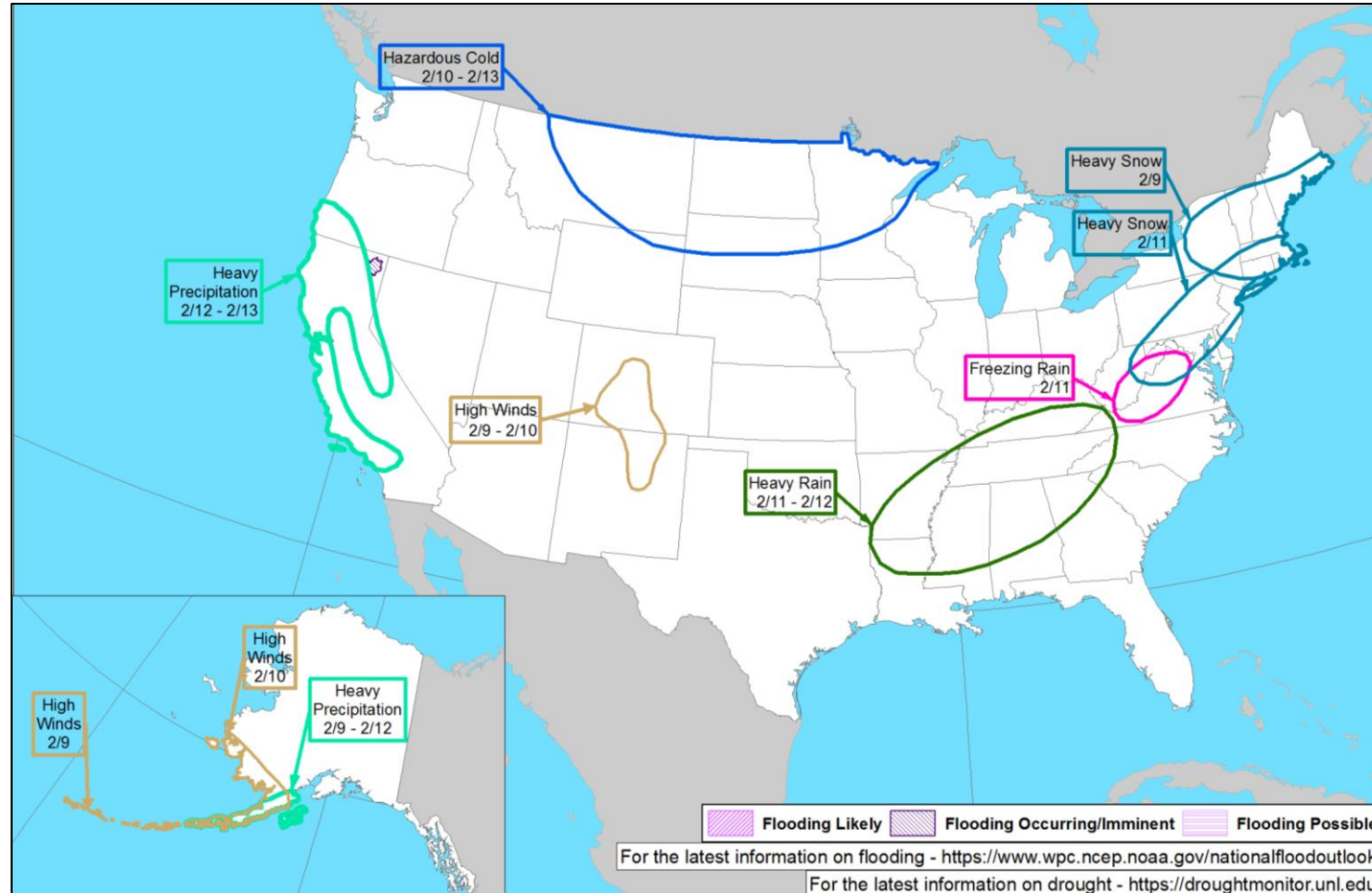
