
Situation: (Region 6 SLB as of 4:00 p.m. ET Feb 29) Multiple wildfires have been burning since Feb 27 across the Southern Plains due to dry, windy conditions. Wildfire activity is concentrated in the Texas panhandle and western Oklahoma. As of 11:45 p.m. ET, Feb 29, these three fires have burned a combined total of 1.3m (Smokehouse Creek 1,075,000, Windy Deuce 142k, and Catesby 90,570) acres of public and private land. Fire weather will continue through the weekend. Incident response remains within the capability of the state, tribal, and territorial partners.






National Weather Forecast






Snowfall Forecast


