Severe Weather Southern Plains to Ohio and Tennessee Valleys

#### **Hazard Monitoring**

- Heavy snow Pacific Northwest; Great Lakes to Northeast
- Heavy rain and flash flooding Lower Mississippi Valley to Ohio Valley
- Severe thunderstorms Southeast to Tennessee and Ohio valleys
- Freezing rain Mid-Atlantic to Great Lakes and Northeast

### **Severe Weather – Southern Plains to Ohio and Tennessee Valleys**

<u>Current Situation:</u> Preliminary reports of 6 tornadoes (5 in TX, 1 in LA), 101 wind, and 18 hail reports across the Southern Plains and Lower Mississippi Valley yesterday. Today there is an Enhanced Risk of severe weather in the Ohio and Tennessee valleys which includes Louisville and Lexington-Fayette, KY and Knoxville and Chattanooga, TN. Tornado Watches in effect until 9:00 a.m. ET for LA and AR and until 2:00 p.m. ET for AL, KY, MS, TN and IL.

#### Impacts:


- No injuries or fatalities
- TX: At least 7 homes in Como and Pickton (Hopkins County) destroyed (open source media)
- TX: Highway 11 and Farm to Market (FM) Road 269 (Hopkins County) closed due to downed trees, power lines, and debris
- Nearly 400 flights in and out of Dallas-Fort Worth Intl. and Dallas Love Field airports were cancelled
- TX: 108k (0.85%; peak 346k) customers without power statewide; Dallas County 22k (3%), Tarrant County 26k (3%) (Eagle-I as of 6:15 a.m. ET)

#### State / Local Response:

- AL and TN EOCs at Monitoring (severe weather)
- GA EOC at Partial Activation (previous severe weather)
- LA and OK EOCs at Monitoring (severe weather)
- TX EOC at Partial Activation (severe weather and critical fire weather)



  - O IMAT-1: PMC (Personnel); IMAT-2: Deployed (AL (DR-4684-AL)
- Region VI: RWC VI: Enhanced Watch (24/7)
  - IMAT-1 and IMAT-2 are both Available
- Regions IV and VI and the NWC continue to monitor
- No requests for FEMA assistance
- Follow-up reporting will be provided in the 5:00 p.m. ET National Situational Report






### **National Weather Forecast**






### **Severe Weather Outlook**






# **Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall**







