- No new significant events



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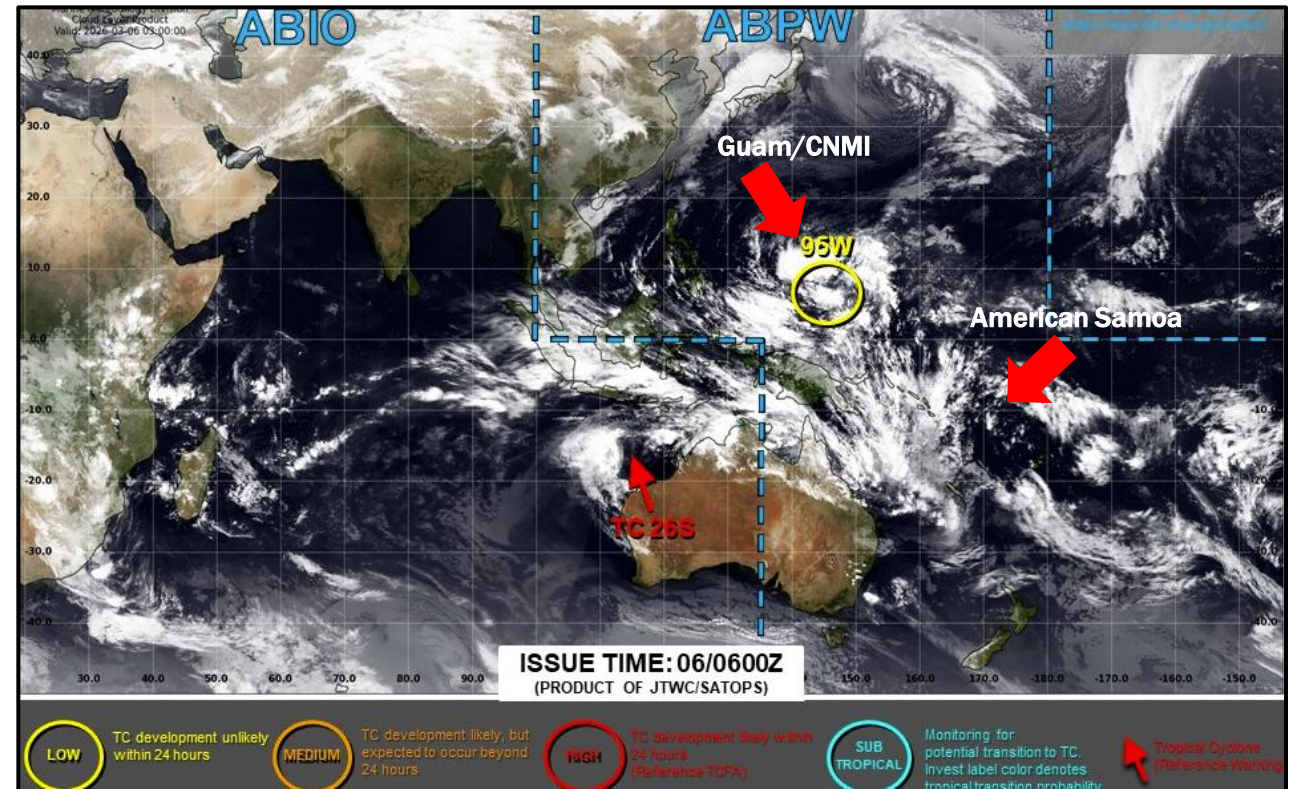
Western Pacific – Invest 95W

Invest 95W: *(Joint Typhoon Warning Center, as of 1:00 a.m. ET, Mar 6)*

- Located 397 miles S of Guam
- Maximum sustained winds 15-20 mph
- Moving N with some development expected over the next 48 hours
- Heavy rainfall and flash flooding likely for Guam and CNMI with Flood Watches in effect

Potential Impacts:

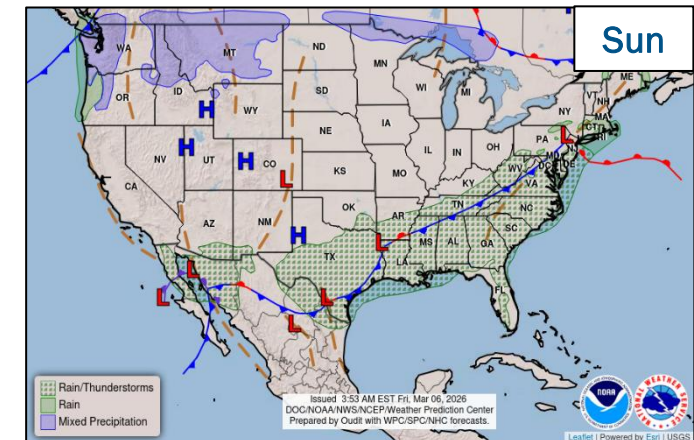
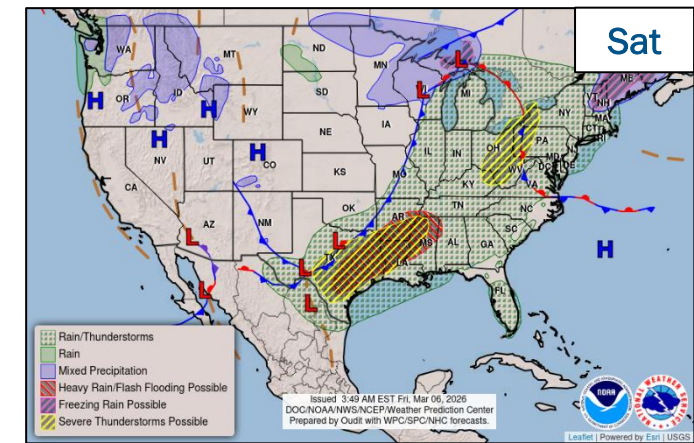
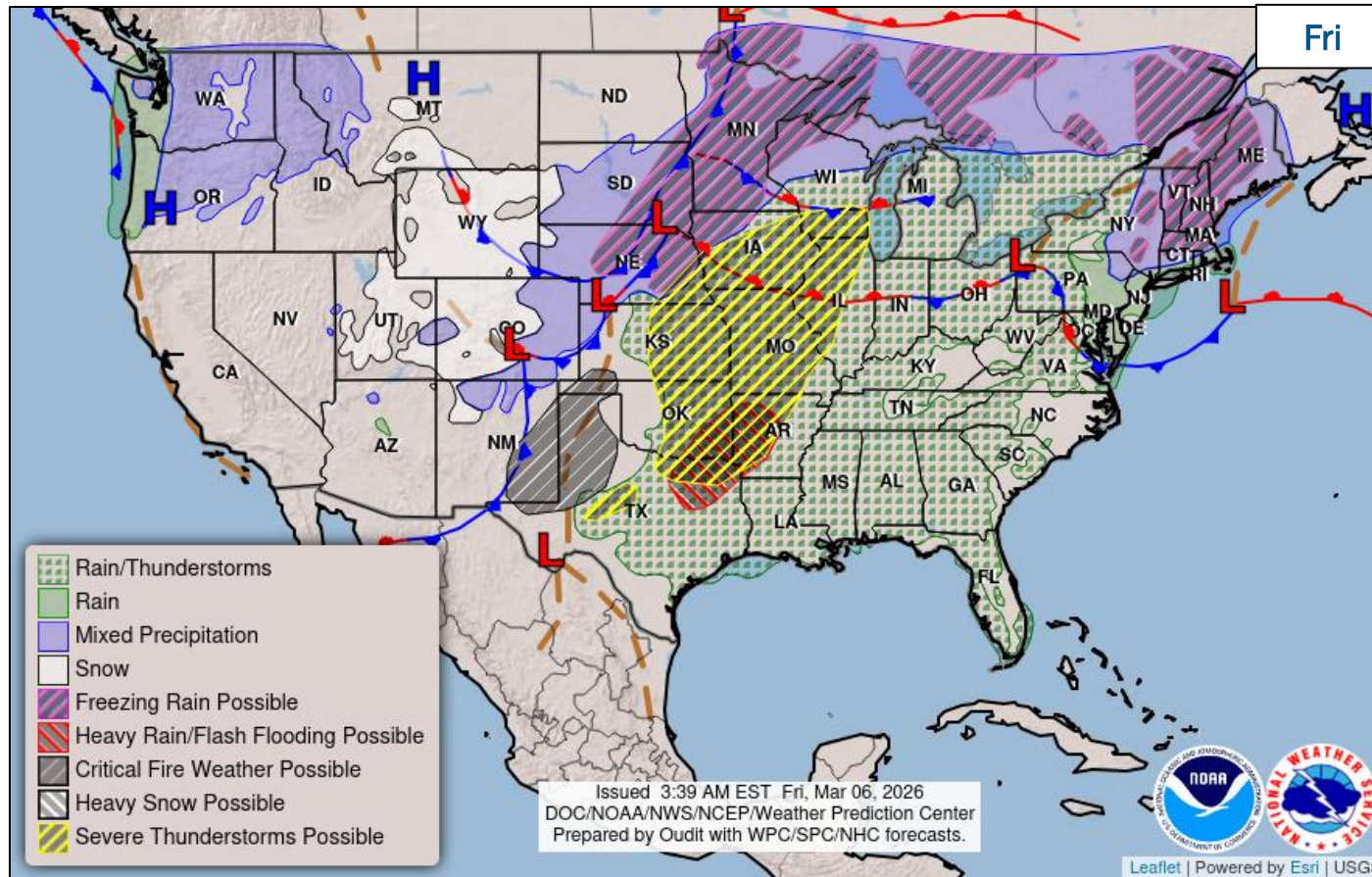
- 5 to 10 inches of rain are expected across the Marianas with locally higher amounts
- Excessive runoff may result in flooding of rivers, creeks, streams and other low-lying flood prone locations



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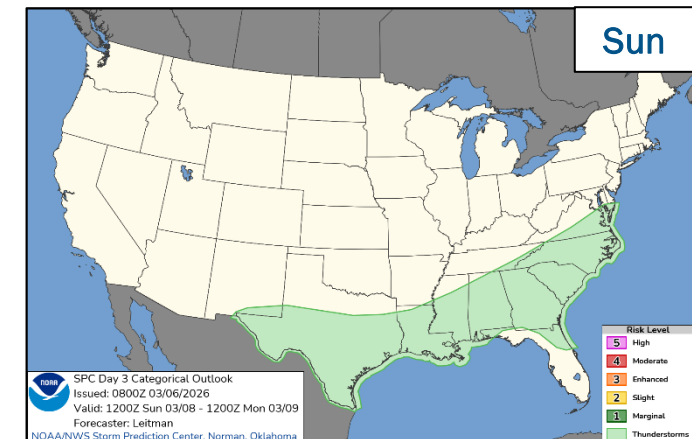
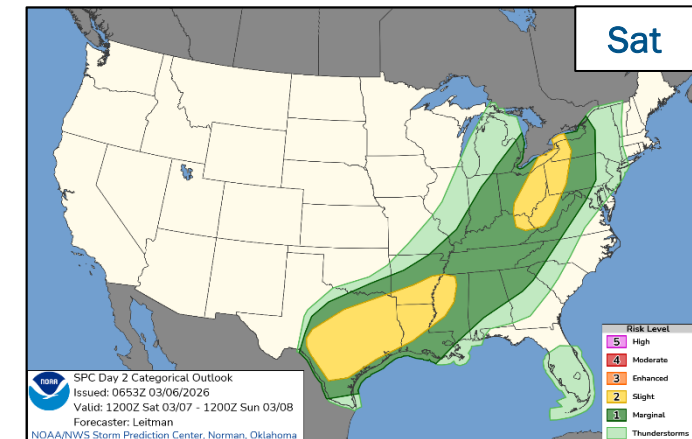
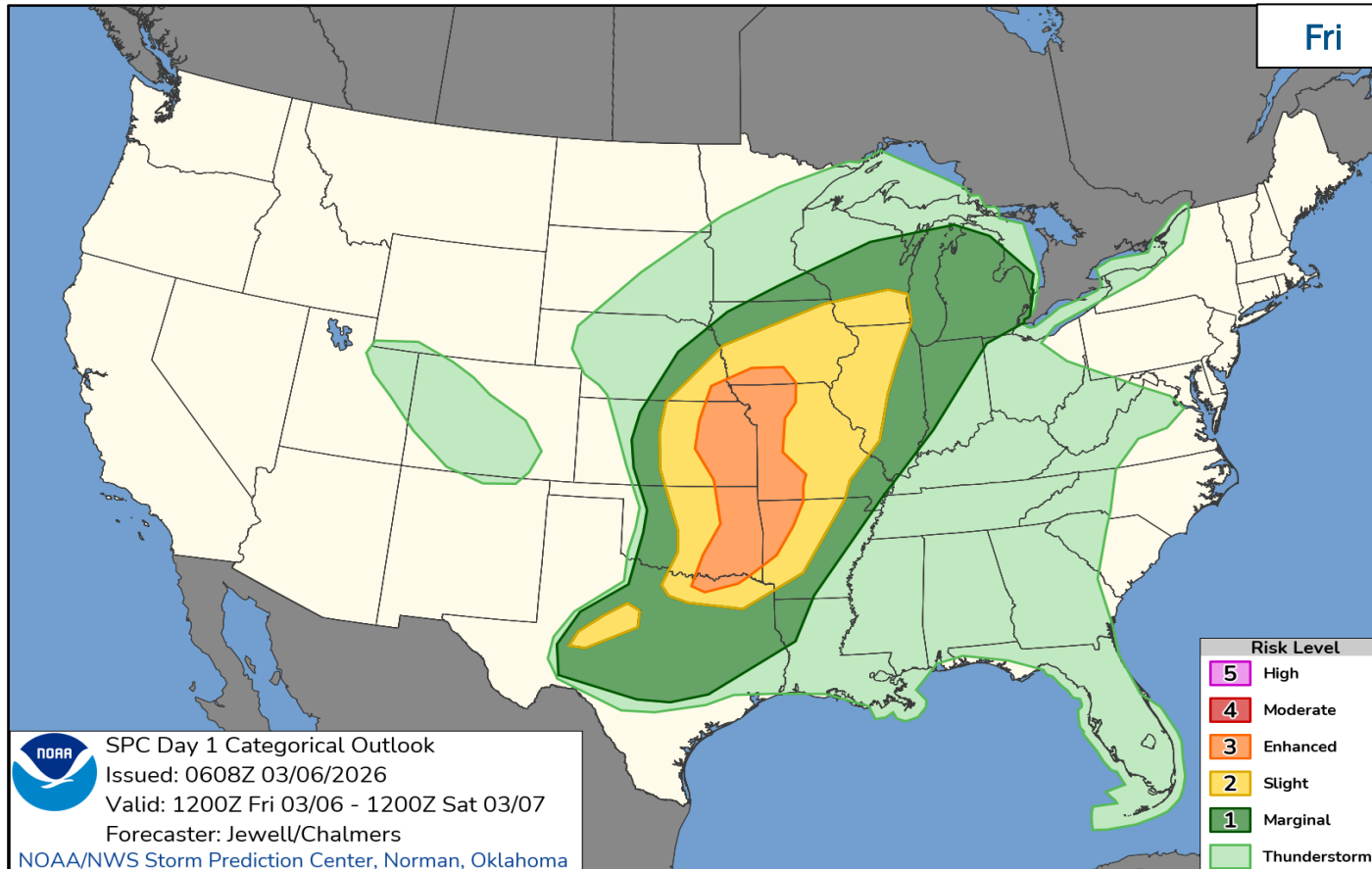
National Weather Forecast



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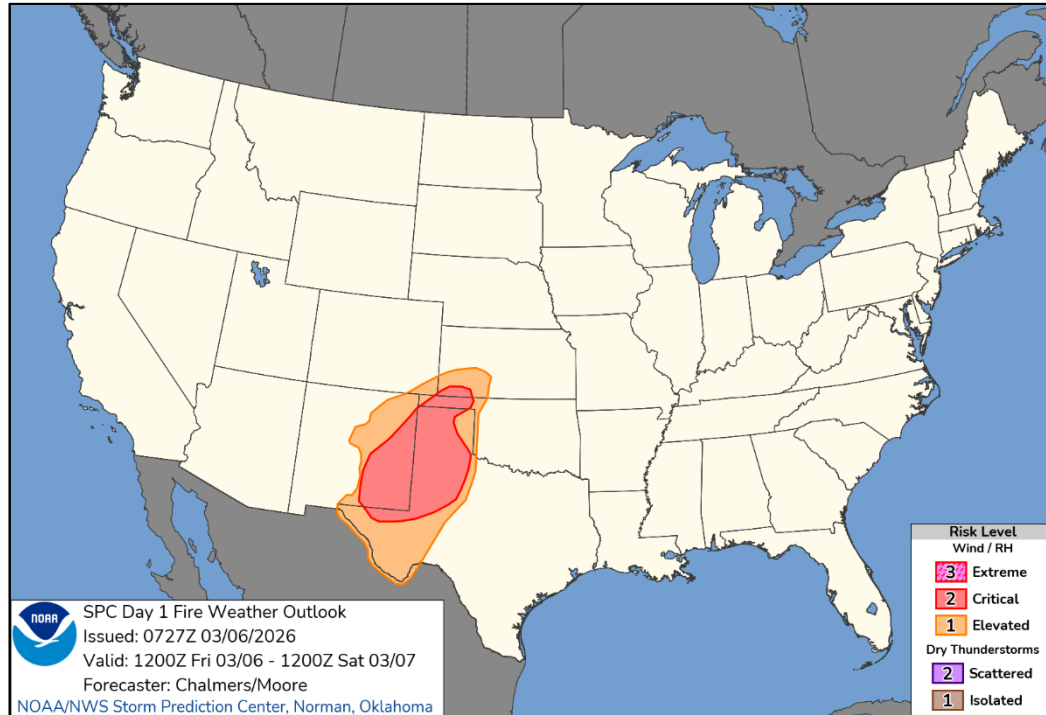
Severe Weather Outlook
