- No new significant events



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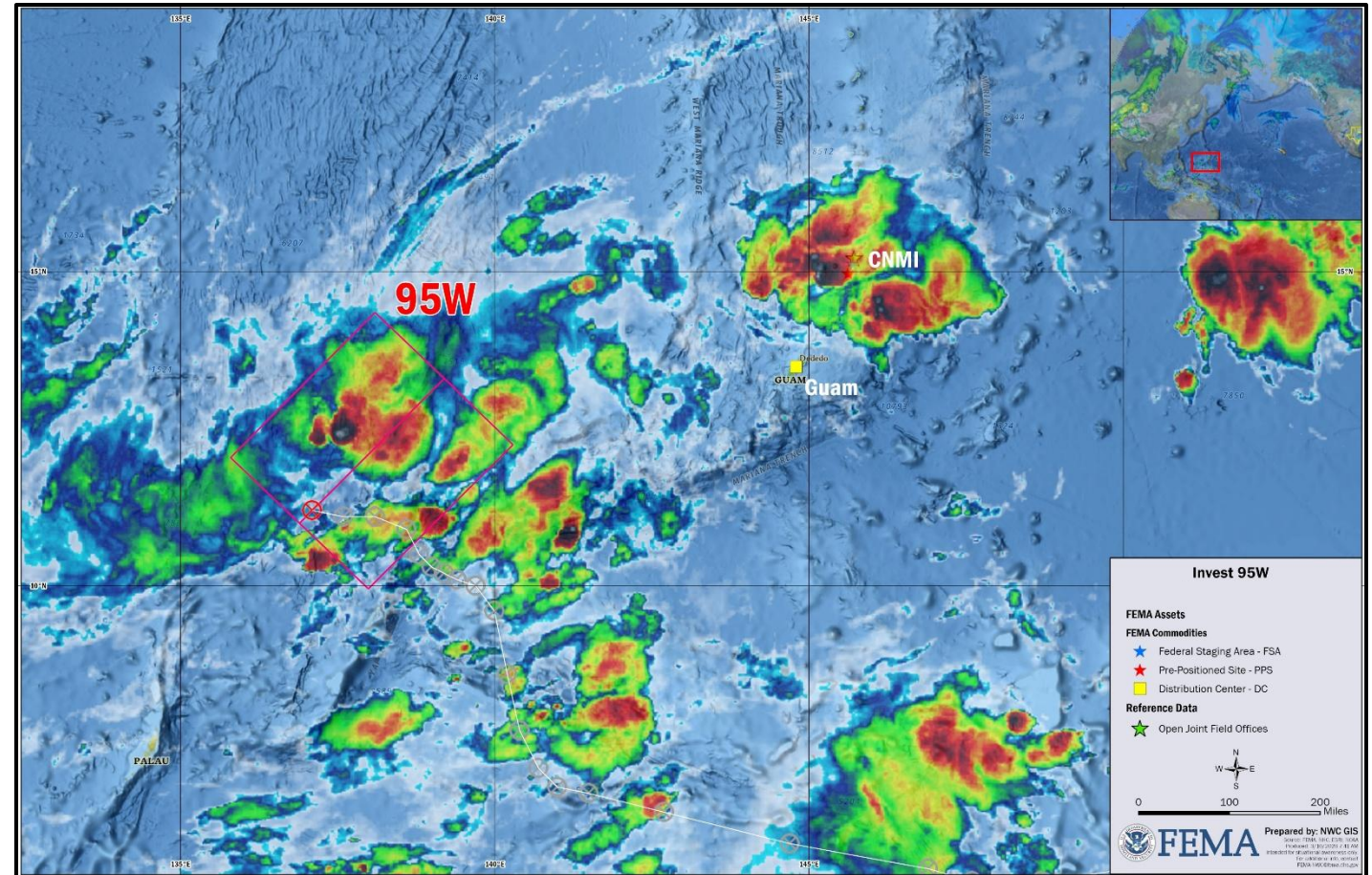
Western Pacific – Invest 95W

Invest 95W: (Joint Typhoon Warning Center, as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 530 miles WSW of Guam
- Maximum sustained winds 26-32 mph
- Continues to track slowly towards the northeast over the next 48 hours
- A Tropical Cyclone Formation Alert has been issued; tropical depression likely within the next 24 hours
- Tropical Cyclone Warnings have not yet been issued

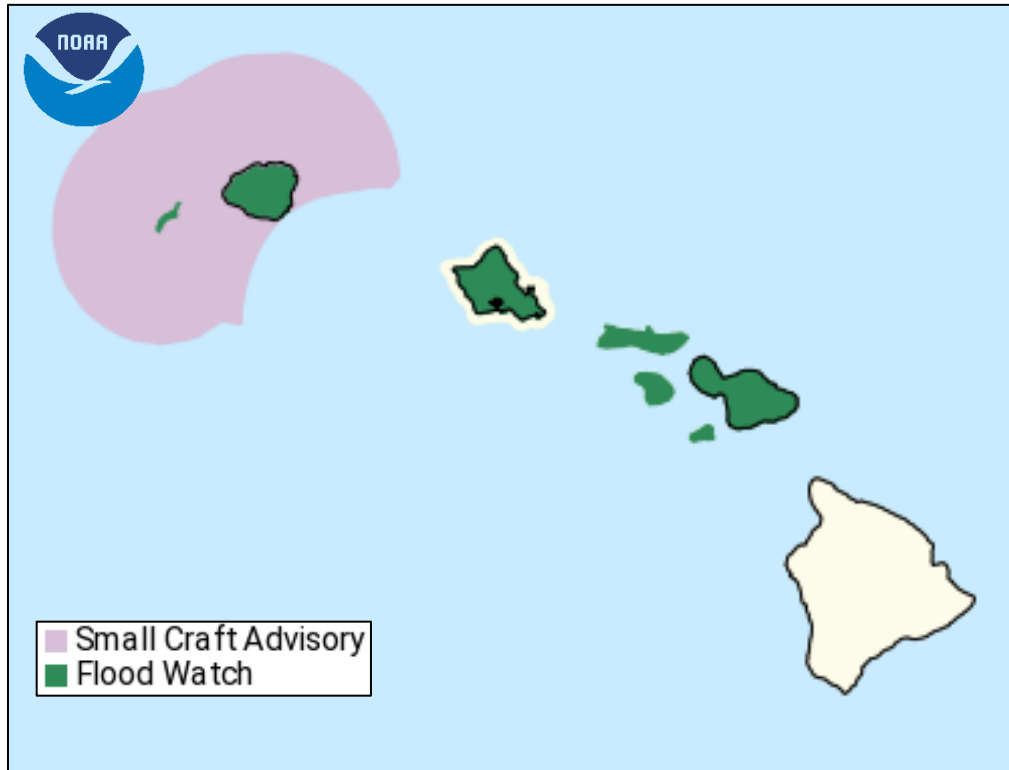
Potential Impacts: (NWS Guam, as of 12:30 a.m. ET)

- Rainfall of 2-4 inches, with locally higher amounts possible, are expected tonight through Thursday morning (ET) in Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands
- Sustained winds of 20-30 mph will develop, with gusts of 35-45 mph will be possible in heavier showers or thunderstorms

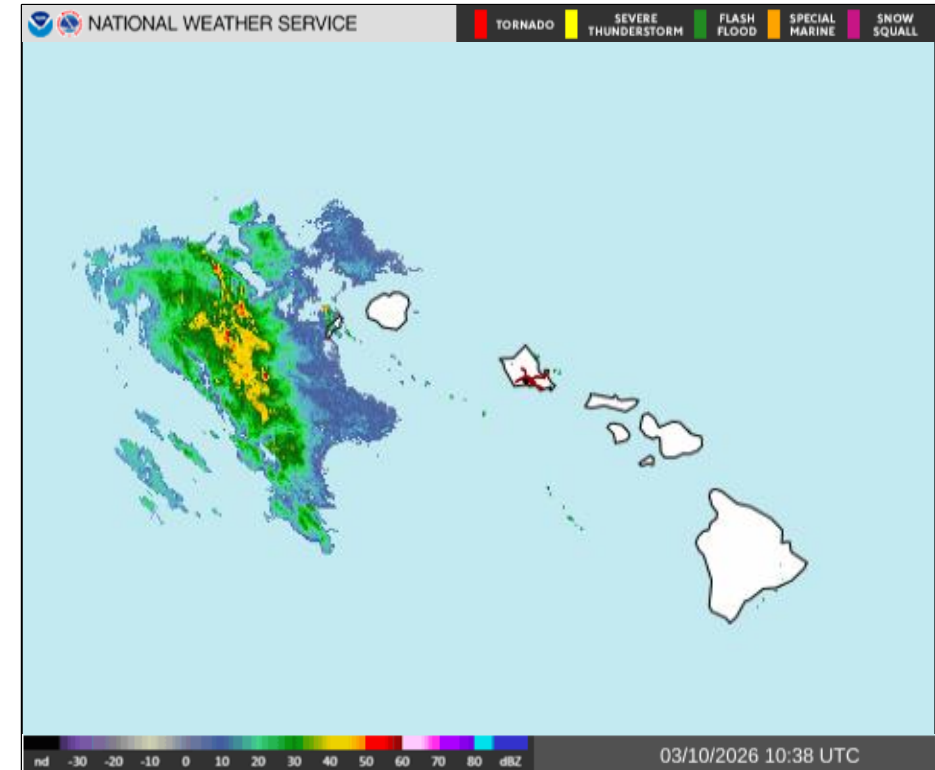


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Hawaii Weather Outlook

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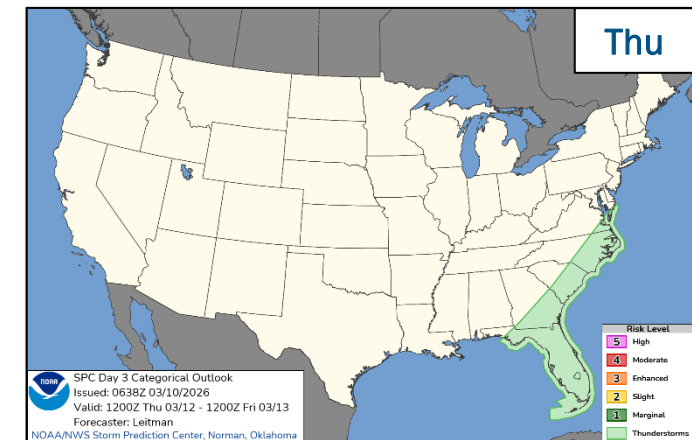
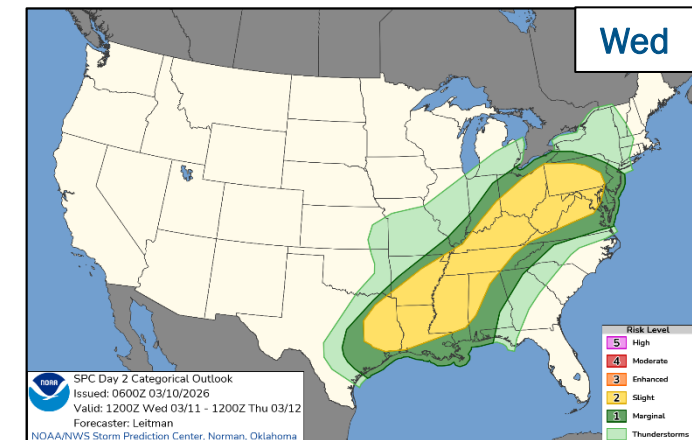
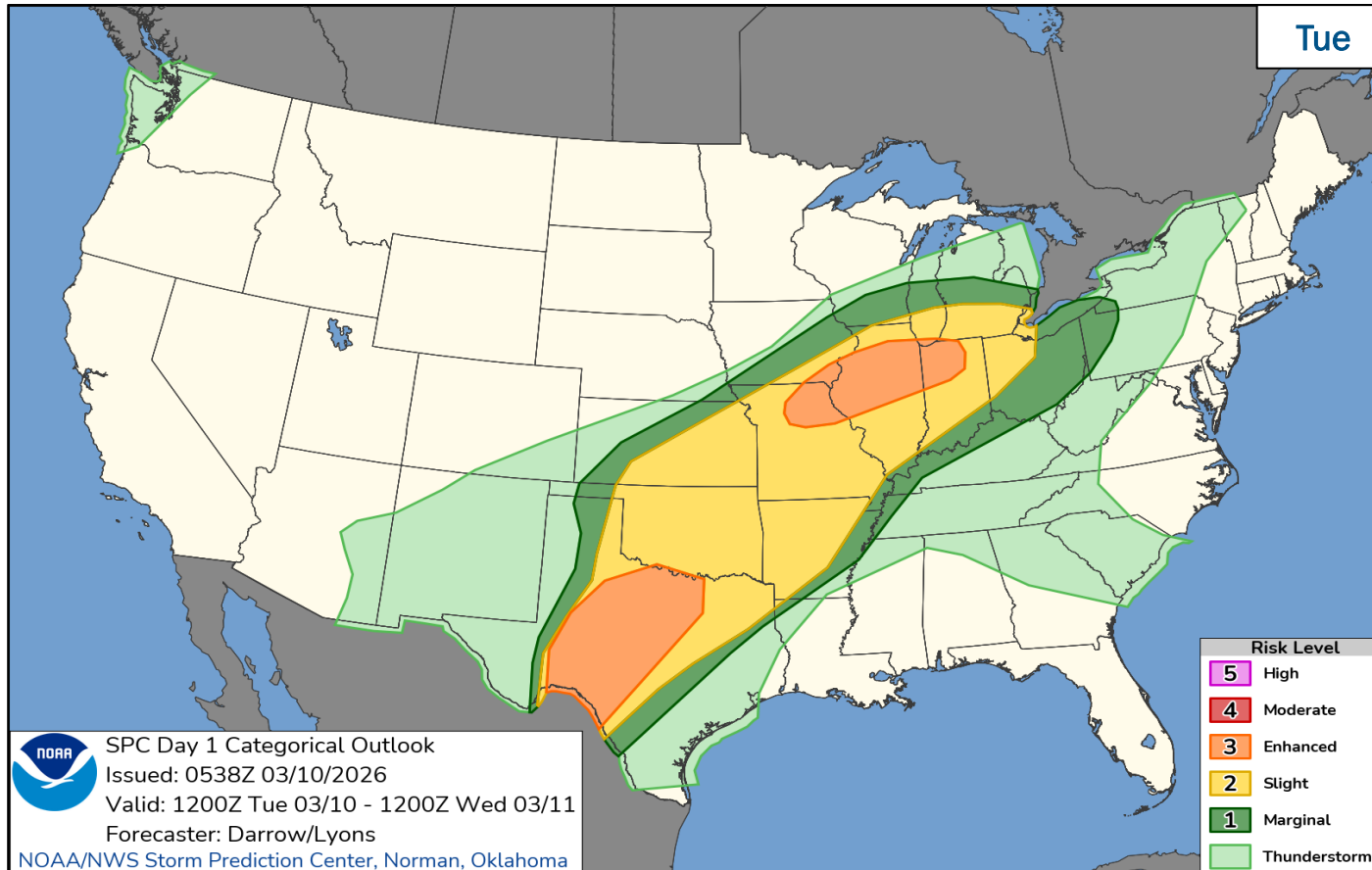
National Weather Forecast



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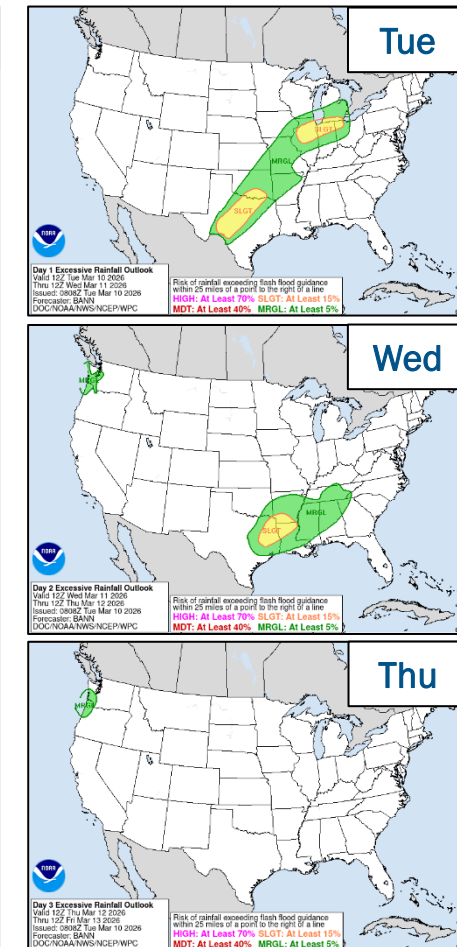
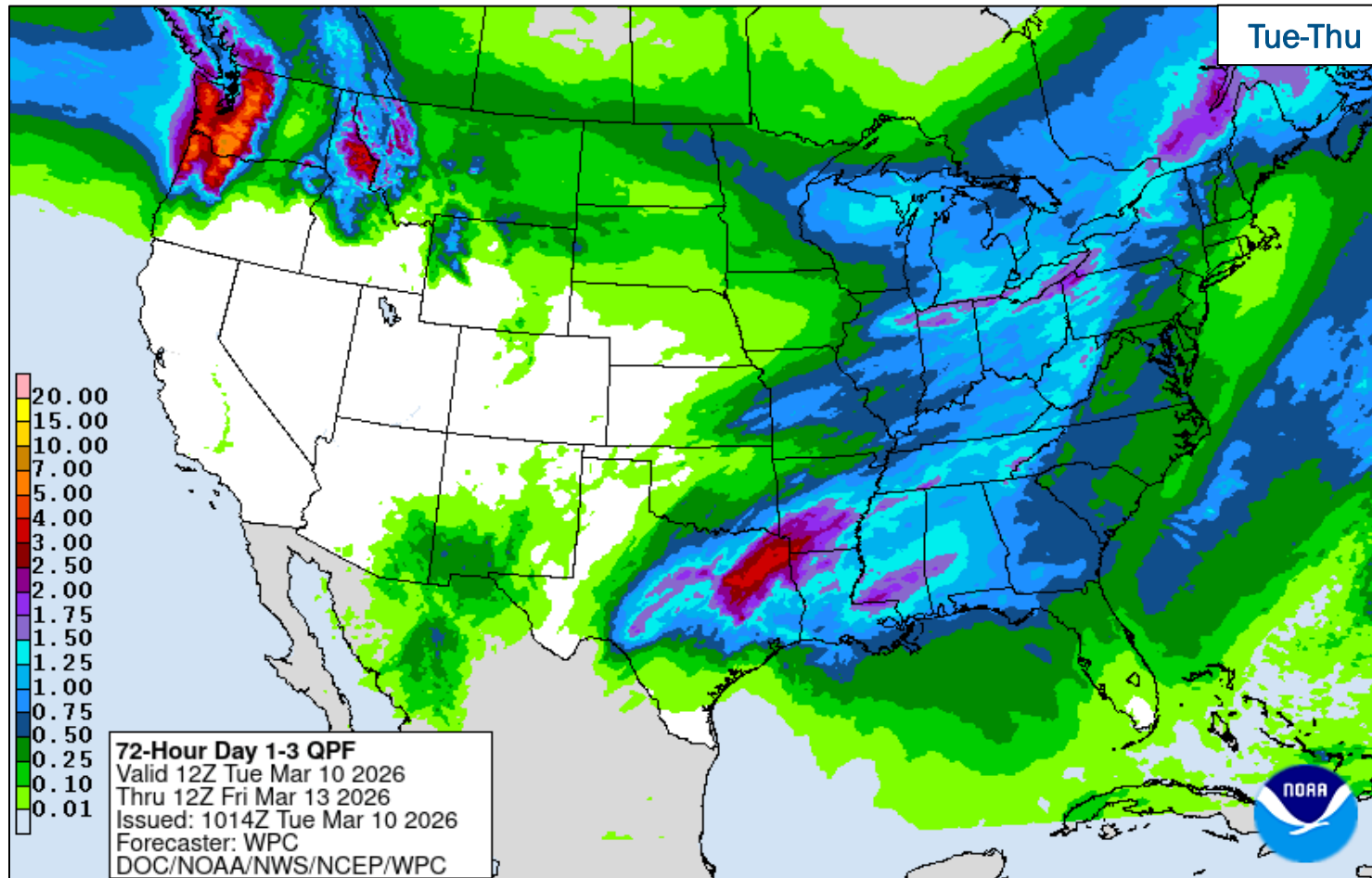
Severe Weather Outlook

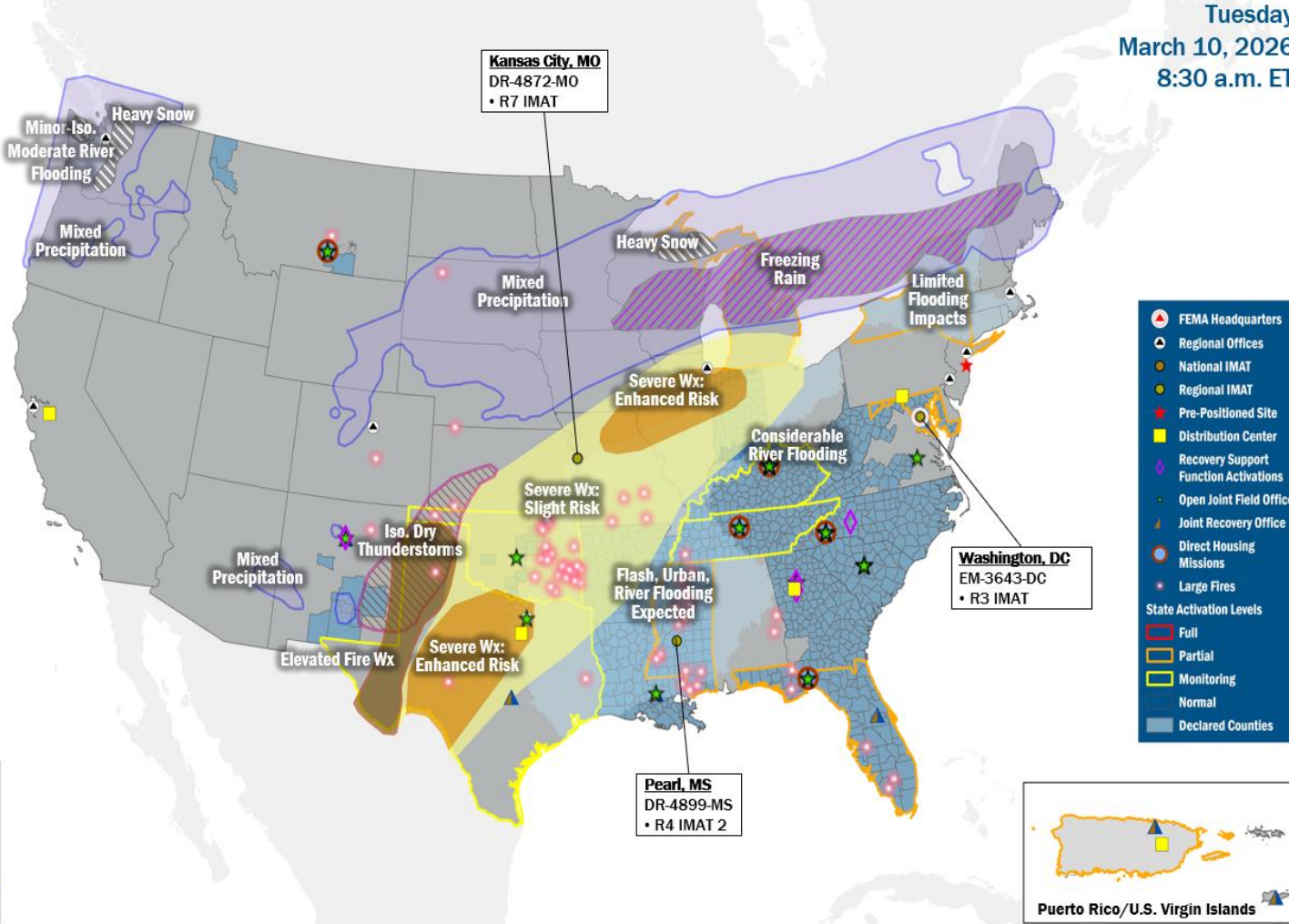
