- No new declaration activity

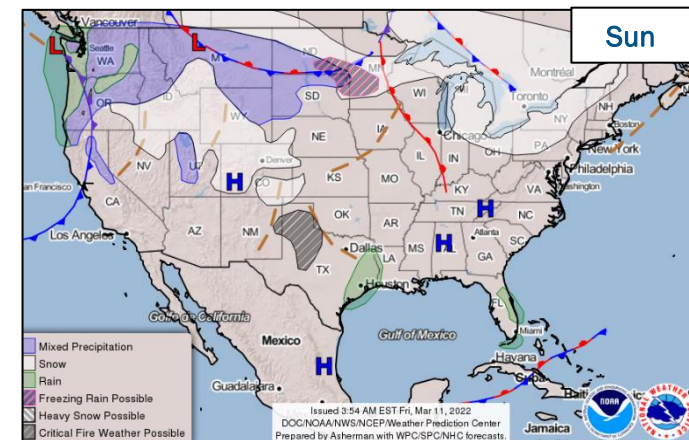
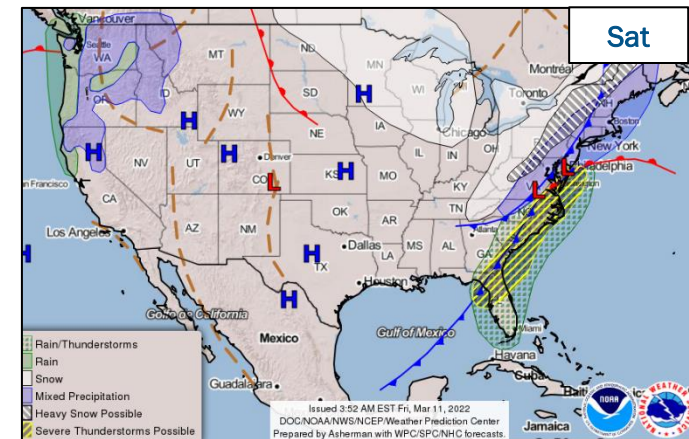
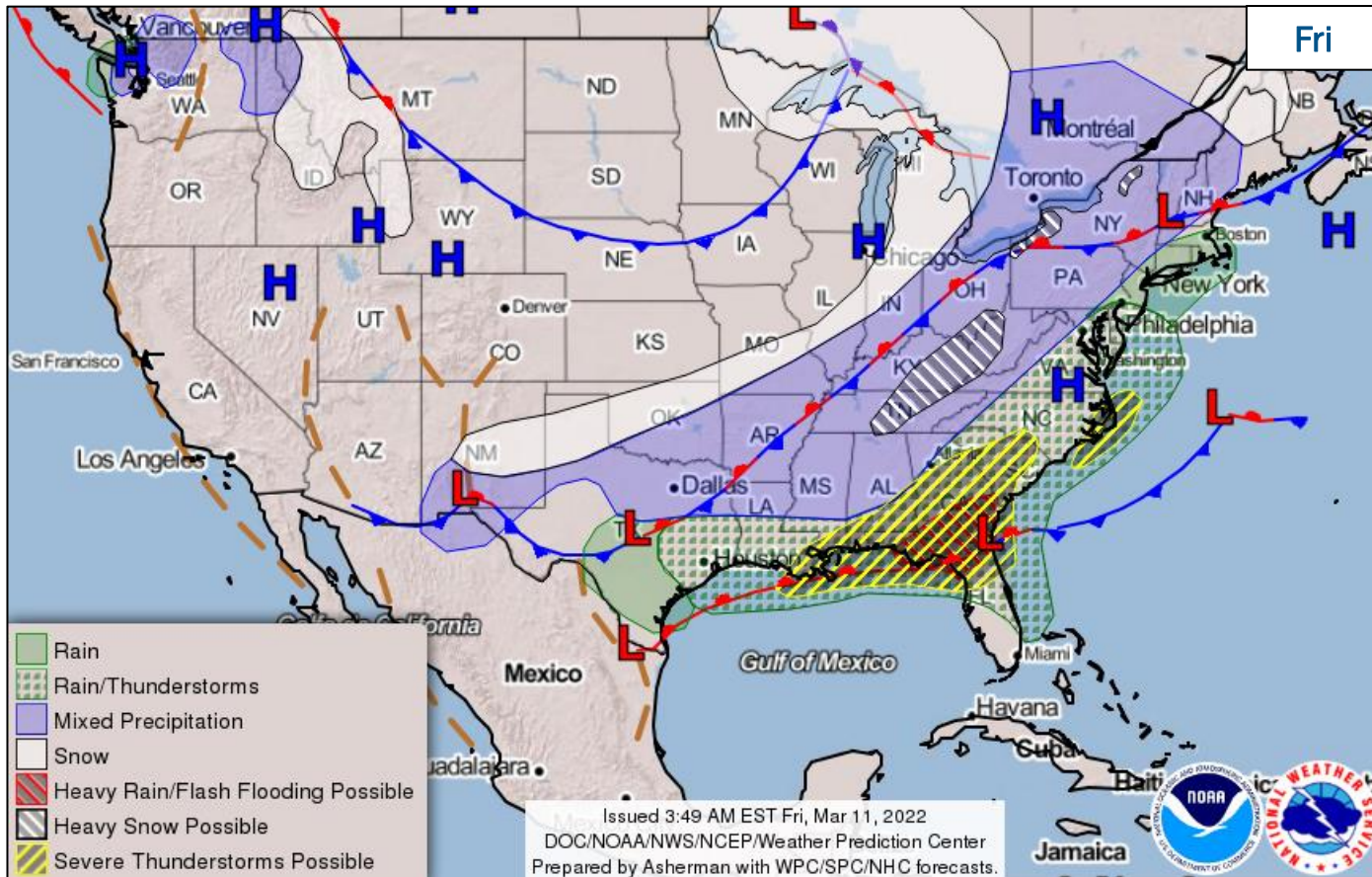

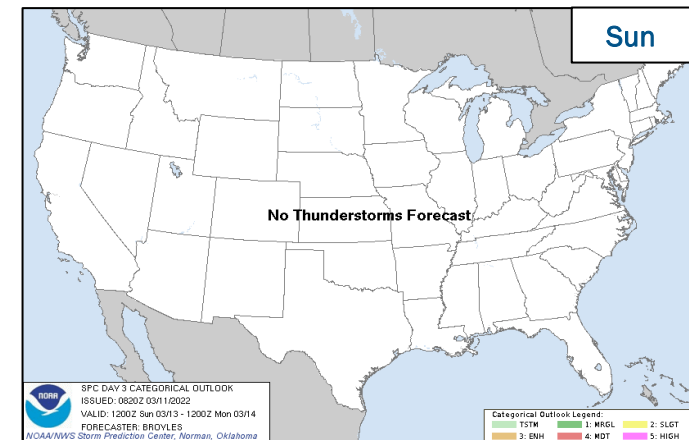
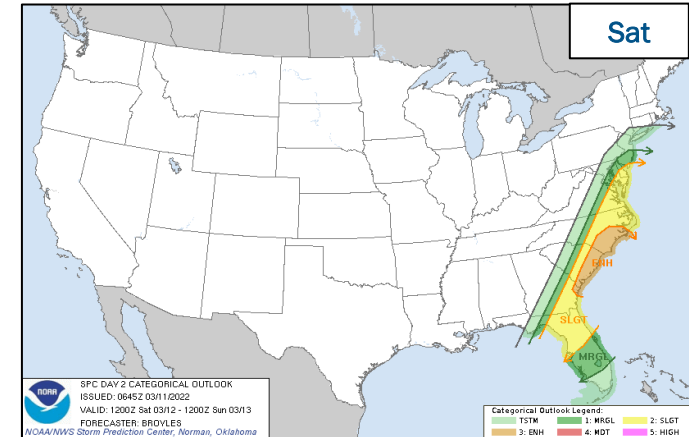
National Weather Forecast

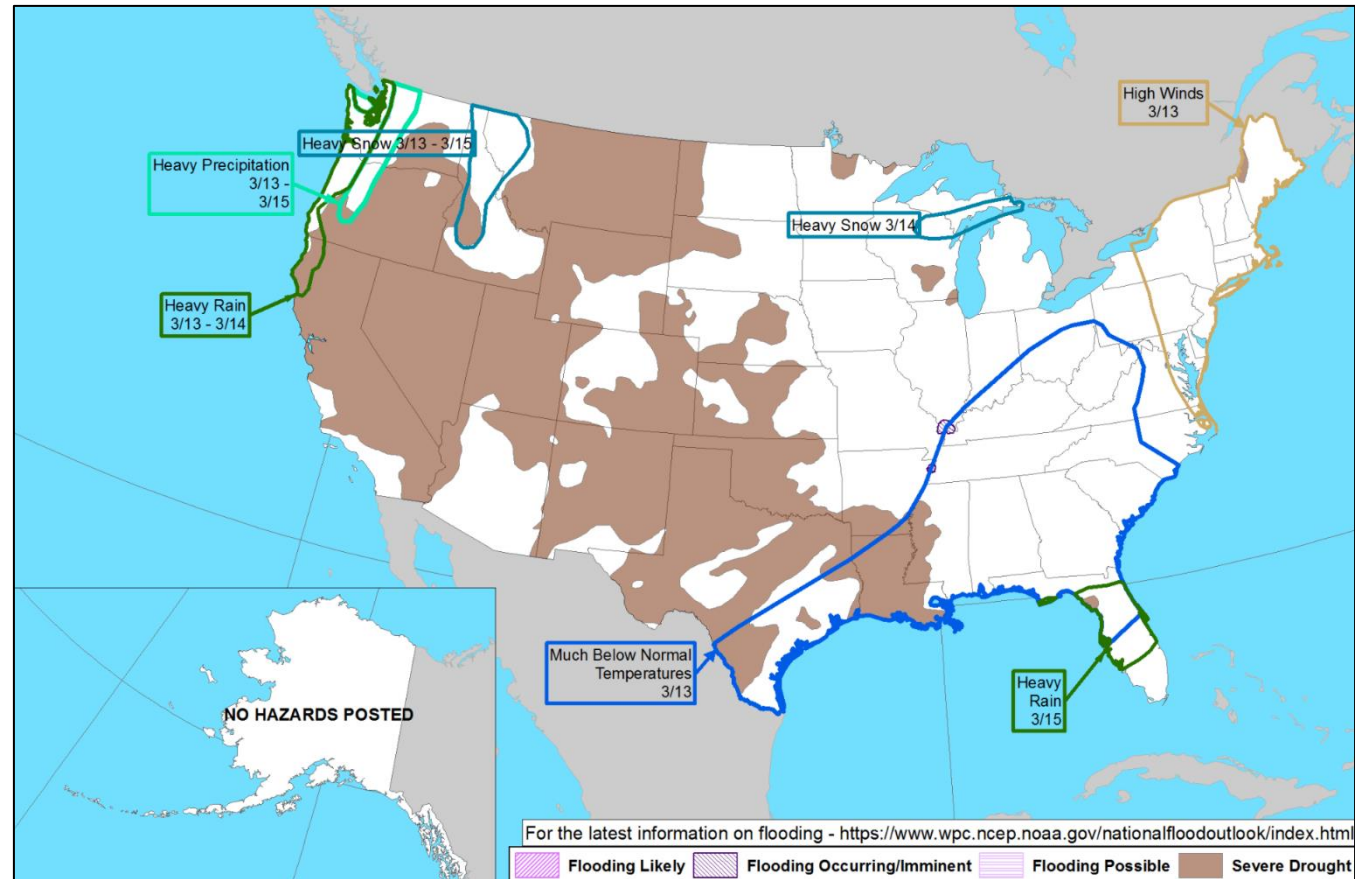
Severe Weather Outlook

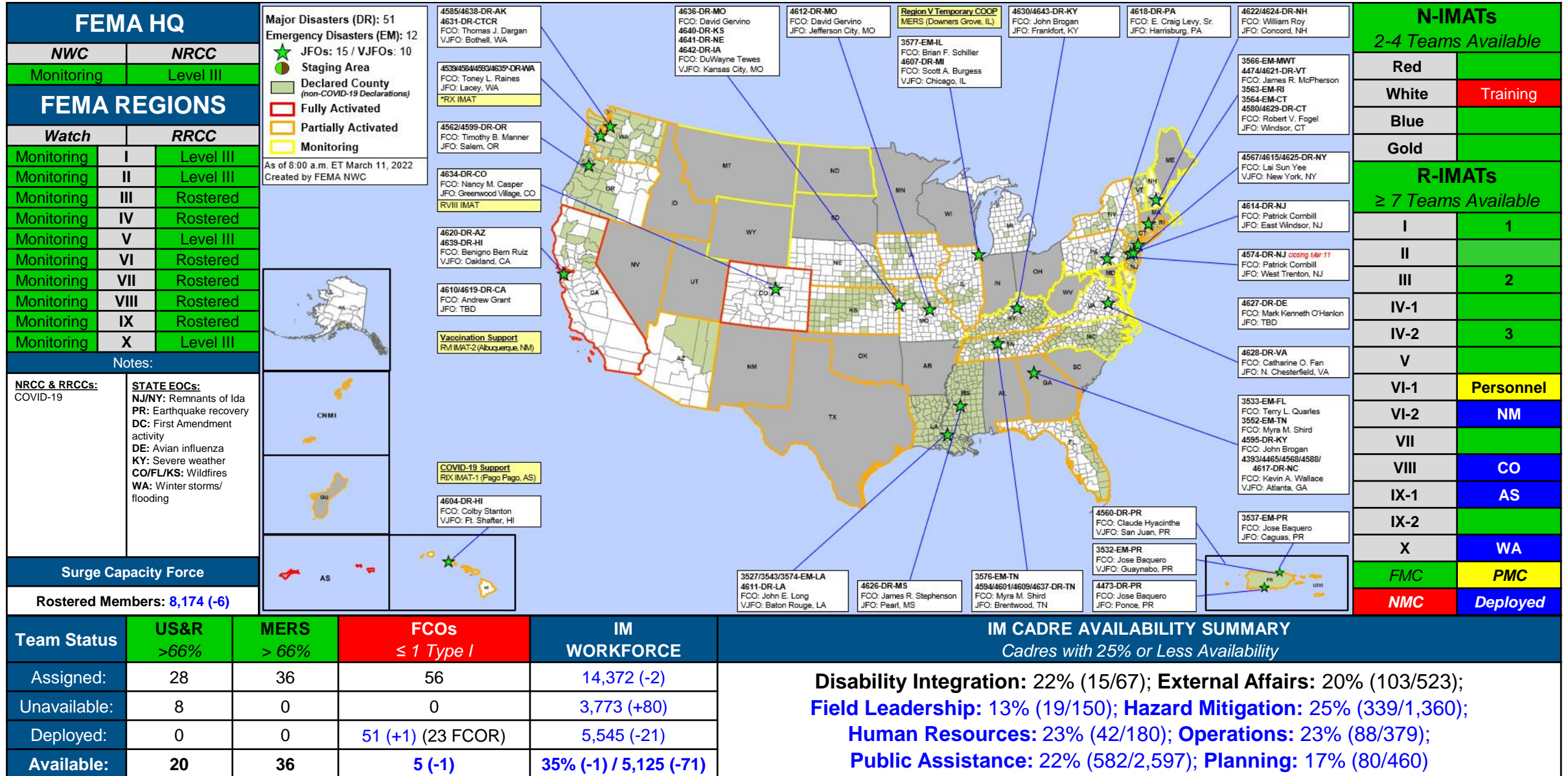
