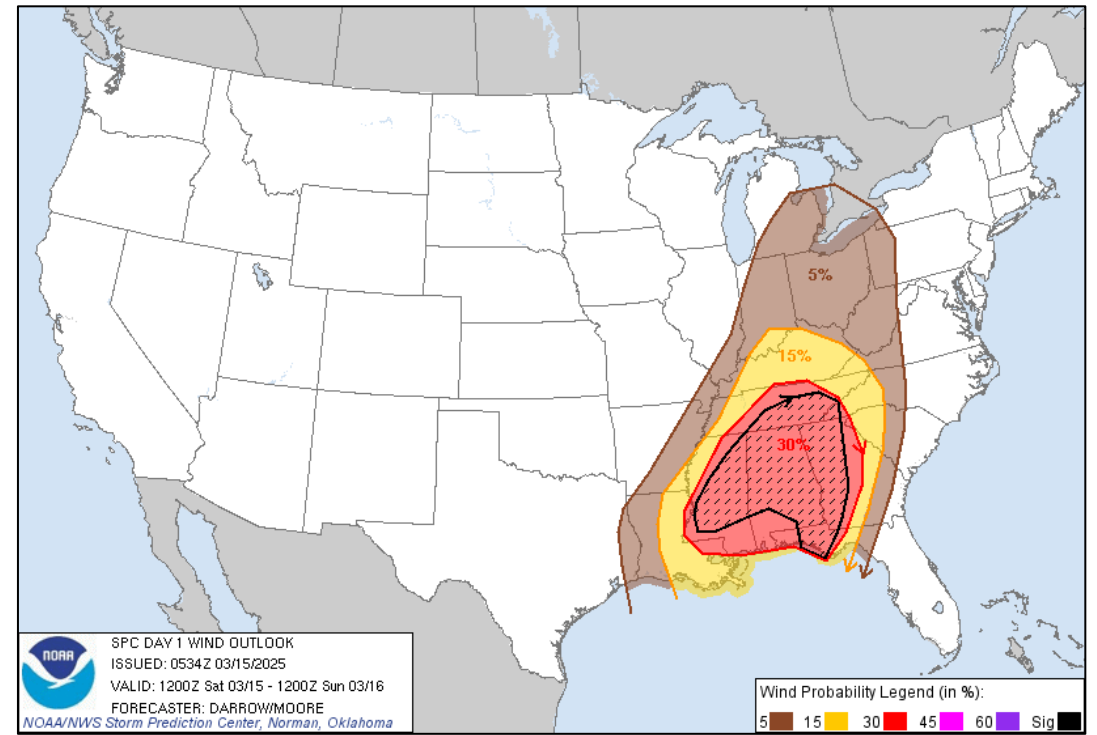
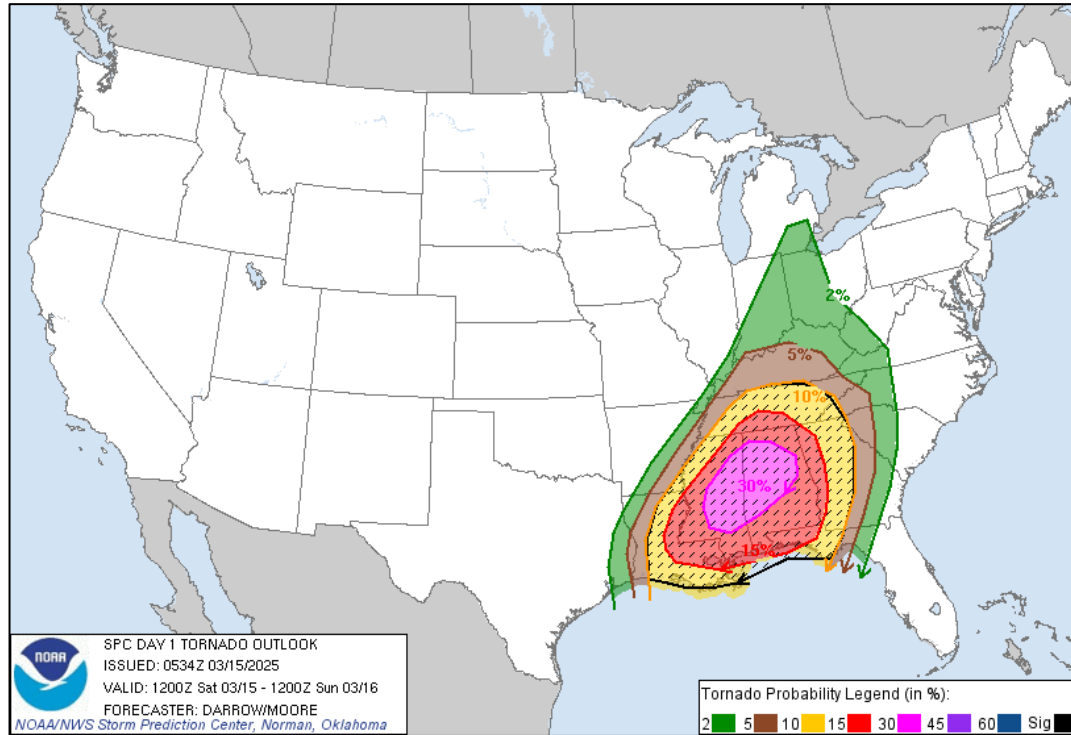
Severe Weather Outlook

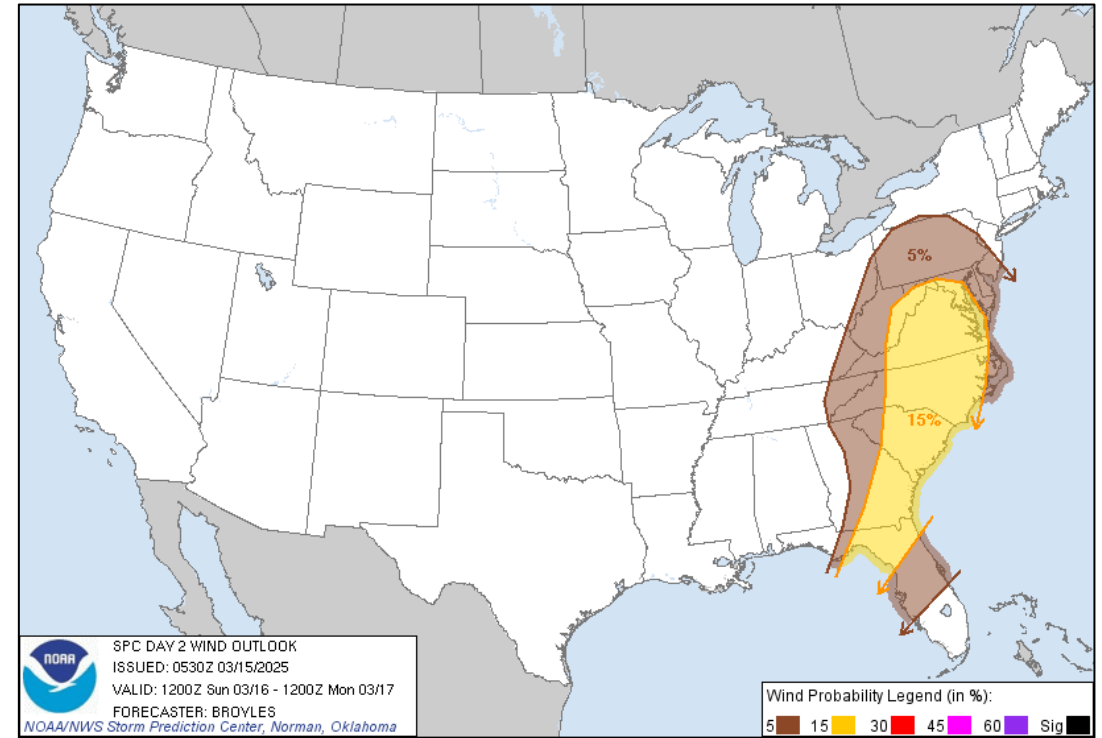
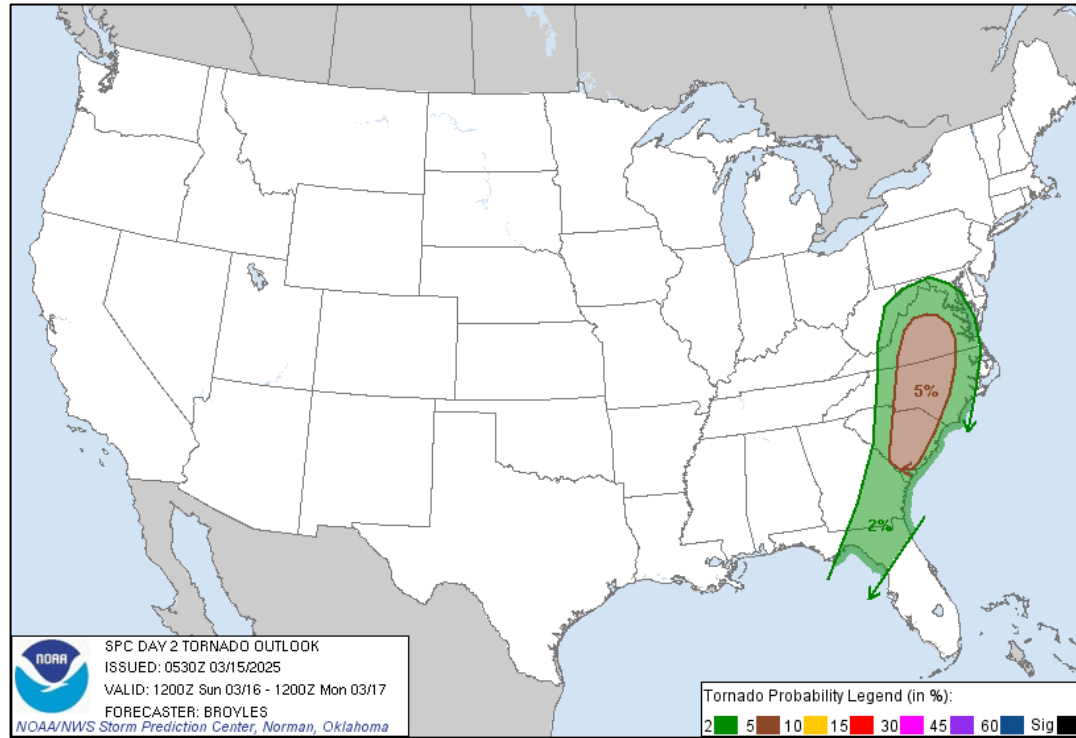

Day 1 Tornado and Wind Outlook



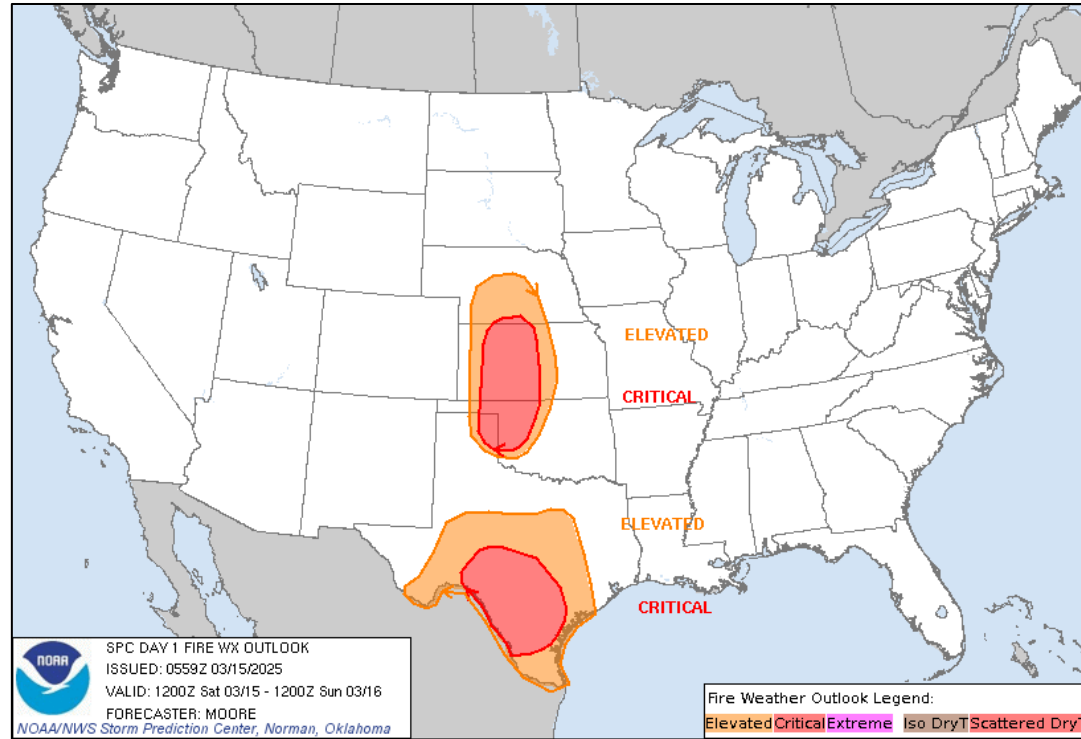

Day 2 Tornado and Wind Outlook

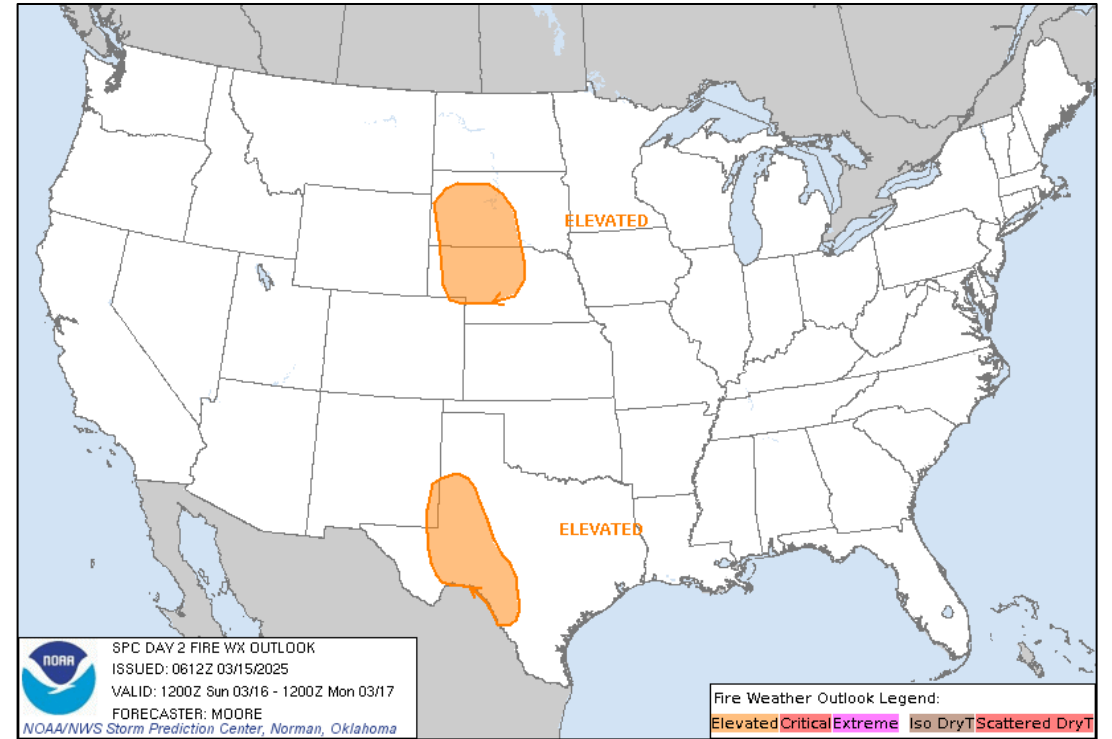

Severe Weather and Wildfires – Southern Plains to Southeast

Situation: A regional outbreak of severe thunderstorms and fire weather associated with high winds began on Mar 14. The Storm Prediction Center has received 23 tornado reports across Arkansas, Missouri, Illinois, and Mississippi, as well as 265 wind reports with 11 high wind reports (over 75 mph), and 106 hail reports with 4 large hail reports (over 2 inches in diameter) nationwide. Additionally, high winds and dry thunderstorms resulted in extremely critical fire weather on Mar 14, resulting in widespread wildfires and the approval of 10 Fire Management Assistance Grants (FMAGs) covering a combined 202,283 acreage, with 8,042 evacuations, 80 structures destroyed/damaged, and 9,473 structures threatened. Primary impacts have included power outages, residential damage, and shelter operations. (ARC and Region VI and VII, as of 4:36 a.m. ET) Today, the severe weather threat will continue into the Tennessee Valley and Southeast, along with a threat of excessive rainfall and flash flooding. A tornado outbreak is likely, with numerous significant tornadoes expected on Saturday afternoon and evening. Critical fire weather is also expected from southern Nebraska to southern Texas. (SPC, as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety & Security: Reports of damage due to severe weather and wildfires continue, damage assessment ongoing.

- **OK:** 166 large wildfires were reported to be burning uncontrolled within the state (Region VI FMAG Program, as of 2:09 a.m. ET)
- Residential damage was reported in the following locations:
 - MO: Tornado damage reported to an unknown number of homes in Bridgeton (pop. 11k), Poplar Bluff (pop. 16k), Morse Mill (pop. unknown), and Perryville (pop. 8.5k) (Region VII SPOTREP, as of 4:36 a.m. ET)
 - AR: Tornado damage reported to an unknown number of homes in Black Rock (pop. 590), Smithville (pop. 87), Cave City (pop. 1.9K), and Campbell (pop. 232) (Region VI, as of 2:22 a.m. ET)
 - OK: Over 80 homes destroyed from wildfires near Stillwater (pop. 49k) and Mannford (pop. 2k) (Region VI, as of 1:36 a.m. ET)

Food, Hydration, Shelter: Multiple shelters open across affected regions. (ARC, as of 6:51 a.m. ET)

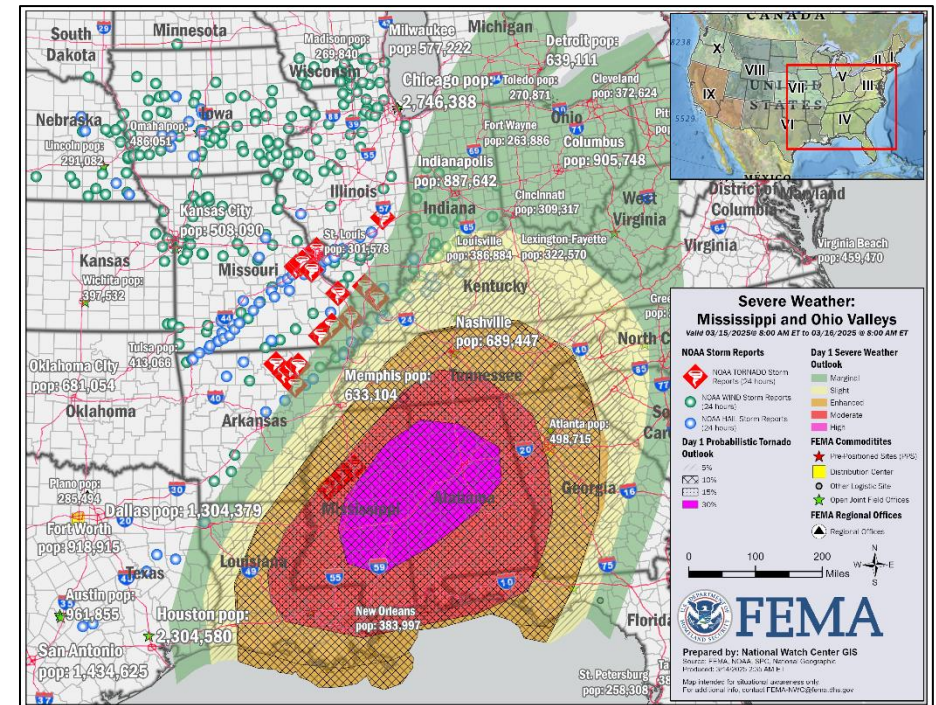
- KS: 1 shelter open / 11 occupants
- MO: 2 shelters open / 0 occupants
- OK: 7 shelters open / 114 occupants
- NM: 1 shelter open / 0 occupants
- MS: 1 shelter open / 0 occupants
- KY: 13 shelters open / 277 occupants

Health & Medical: Fatalities reported.

- MO: 1 unconfirmed fatality reported in Butler County (Region VII, as of 4:36 a.m. ET)
- TX: Open sources, citing Texas Department of Public Safety, report 3 fatalities due to vehicle crashes from dust storms associated with the weather system (Open source, as of 1:00 a.m. ET)
- TX: Eight (8) healthcare facilities in Texas were affected by power outages; power restoration is currently underway. (Region VI Administrator, as of 8:42 p.m. ET)

Energy: Minimal power outages in affected regions. (Eagle-I, as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Region IV: 17k customers without power region-wide (<1%)
- Region V: 123k customers without power region-wide (<1%)
- Region VI: 69k customers without power region-wide (<1%)
- Region VII: 154k customers without power region-wide (2%)

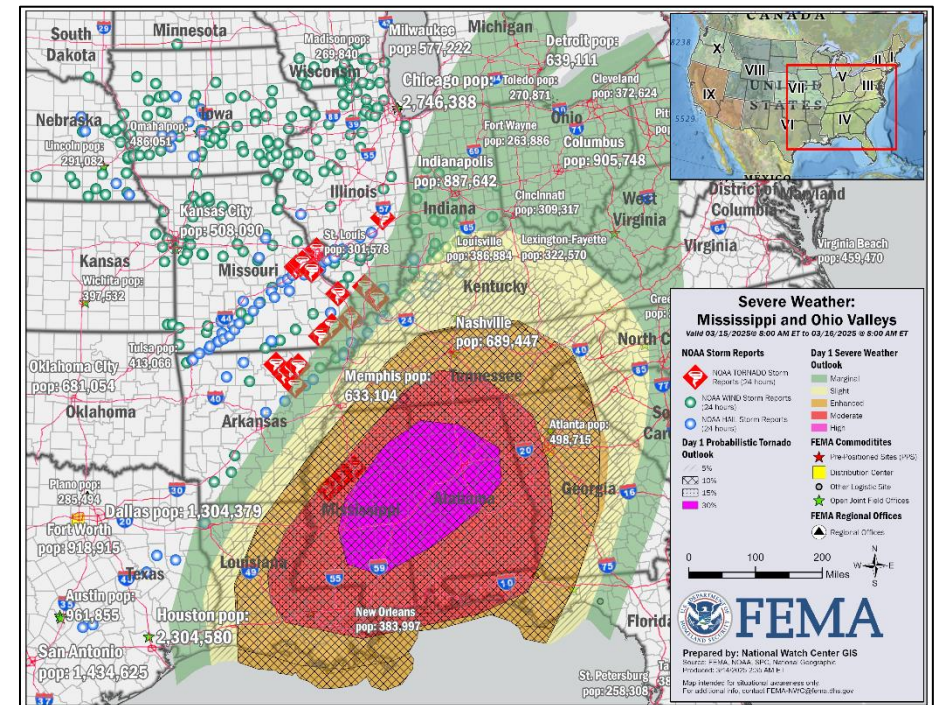

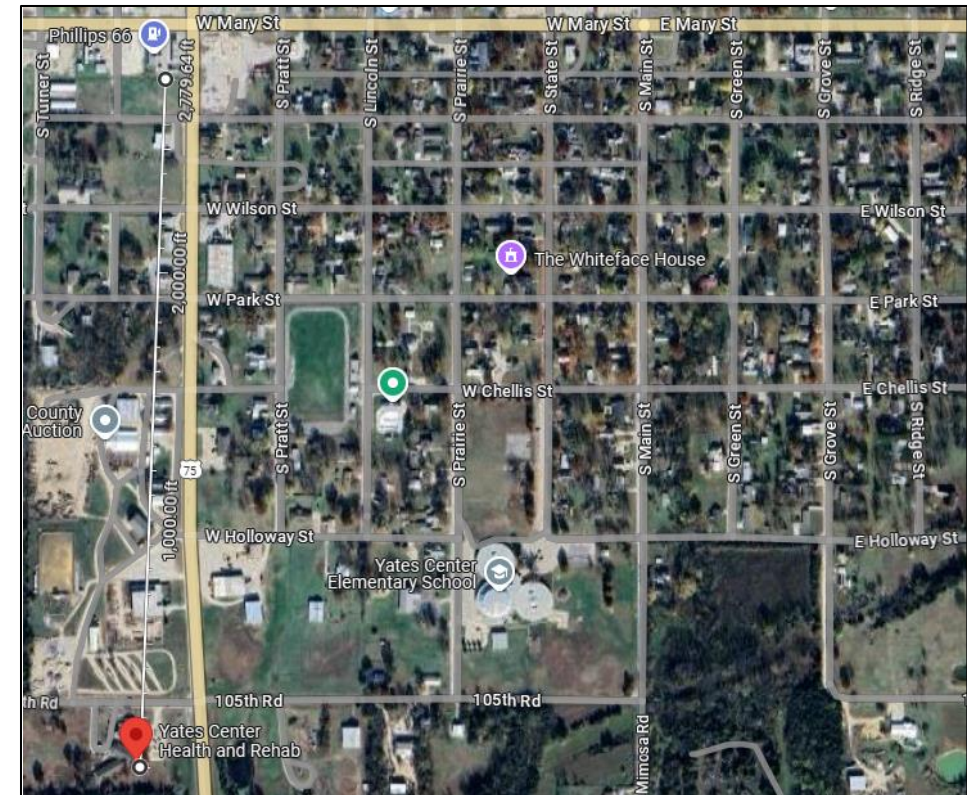
Situation: The FEMA Region VII Administrator approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Yates Center Fire, which remains uncontained and continues to burn an undetermined number of acres in and around Yates Center, KS (population 1,300). According to FEMA Region VII, a rehabilitation center in the southwest part of town caught fire, leading to the evacuation of 22 patients. No injuries were reported. In addition, one elementary school, one high school, and three gas stations, some as close as 0.5 miles from the rehab center were at risk.

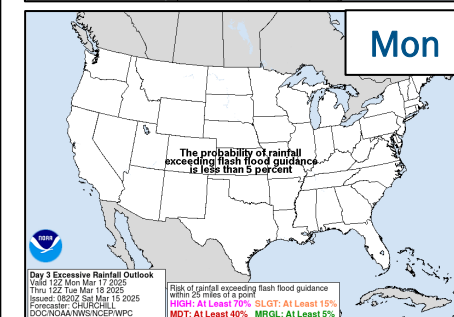
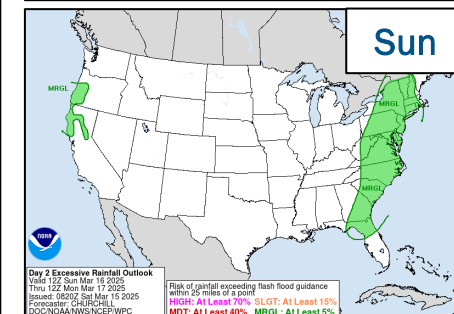
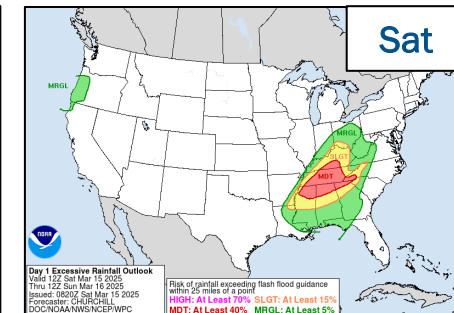
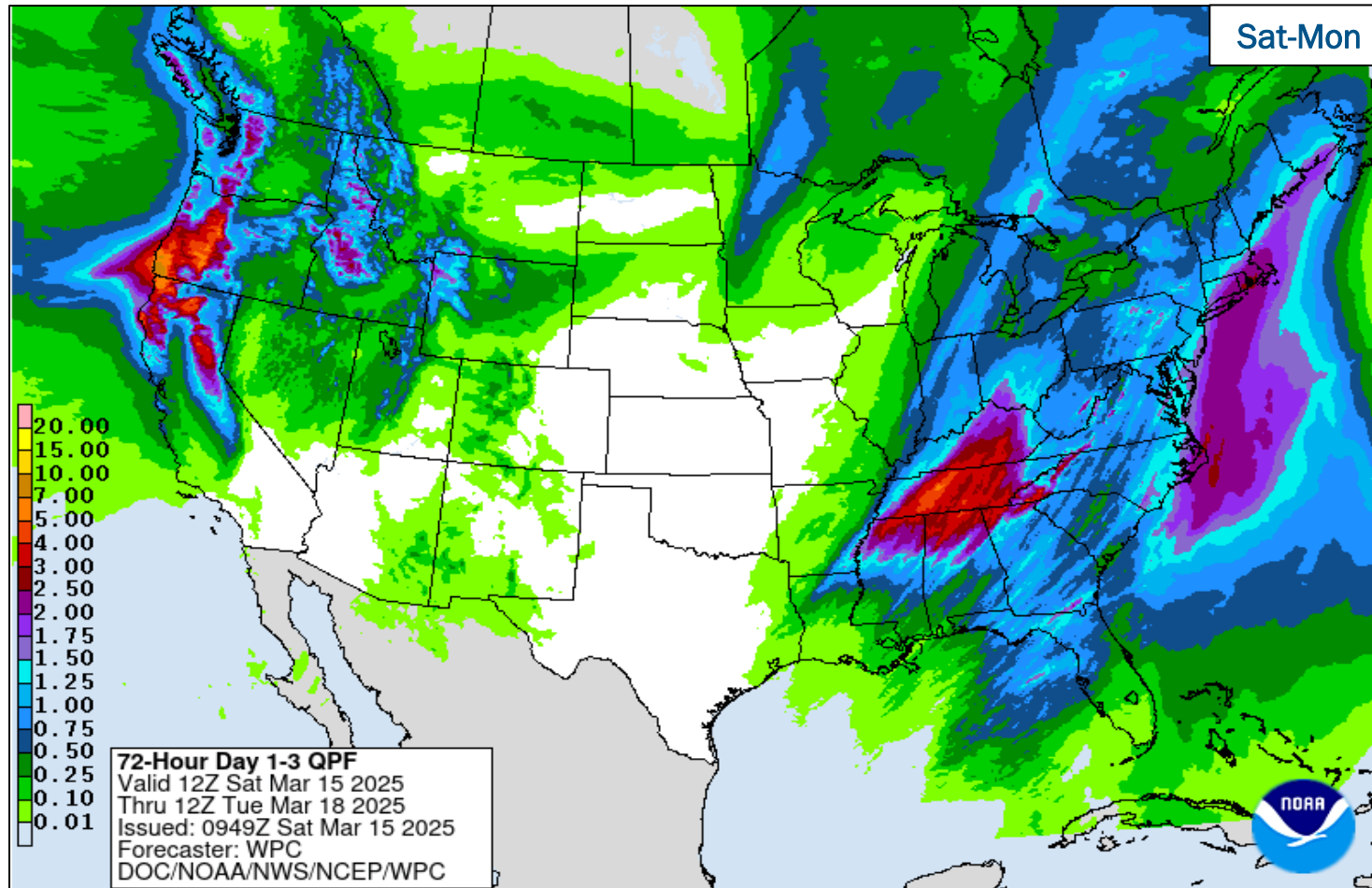


Snowfall Forecast



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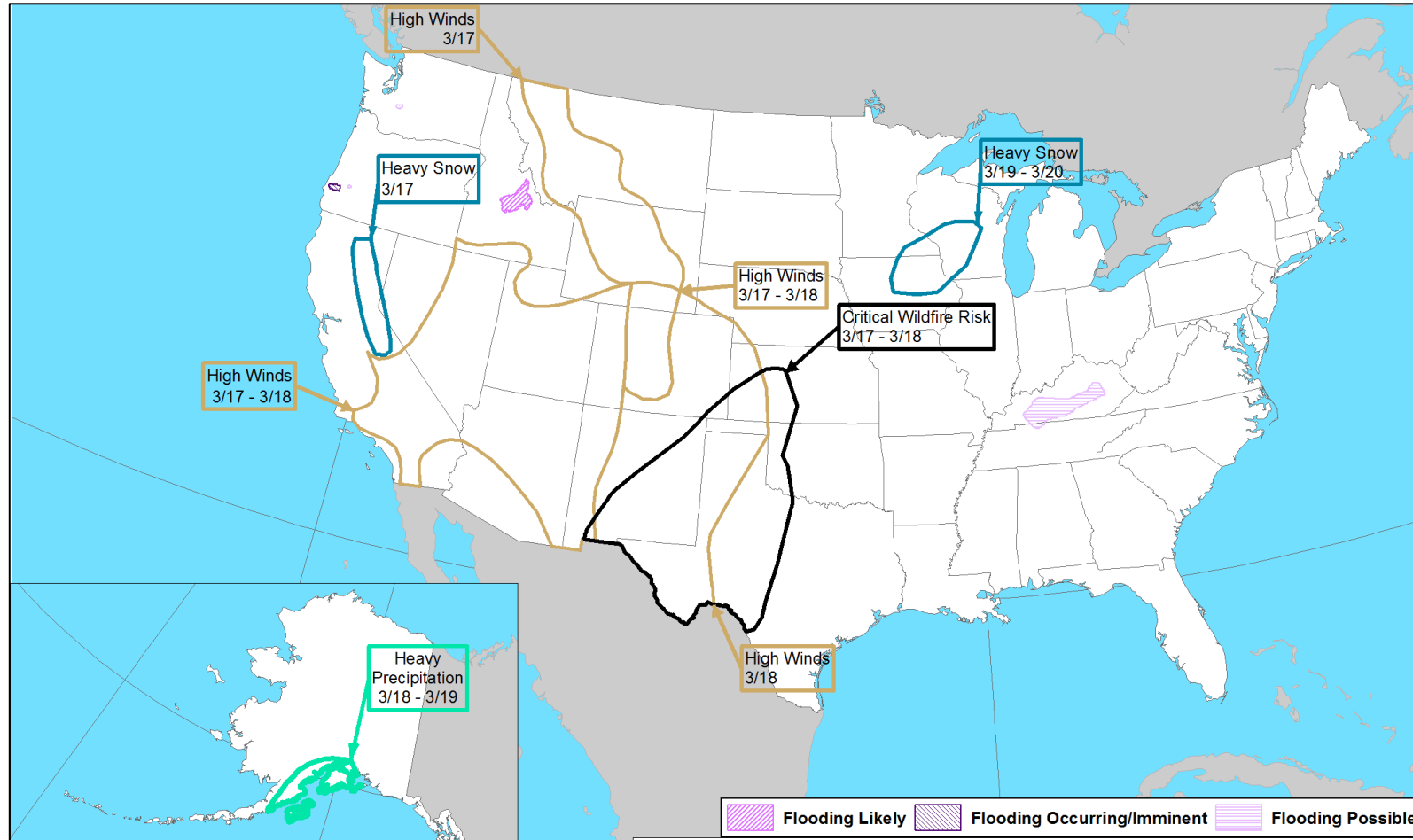
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

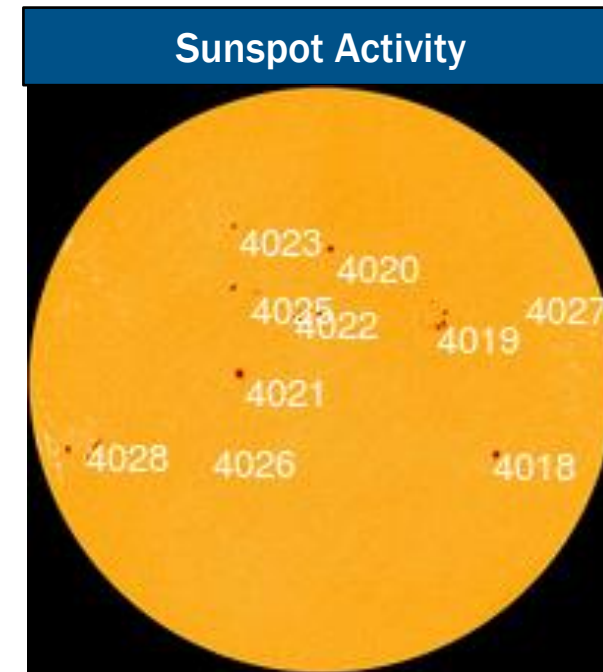
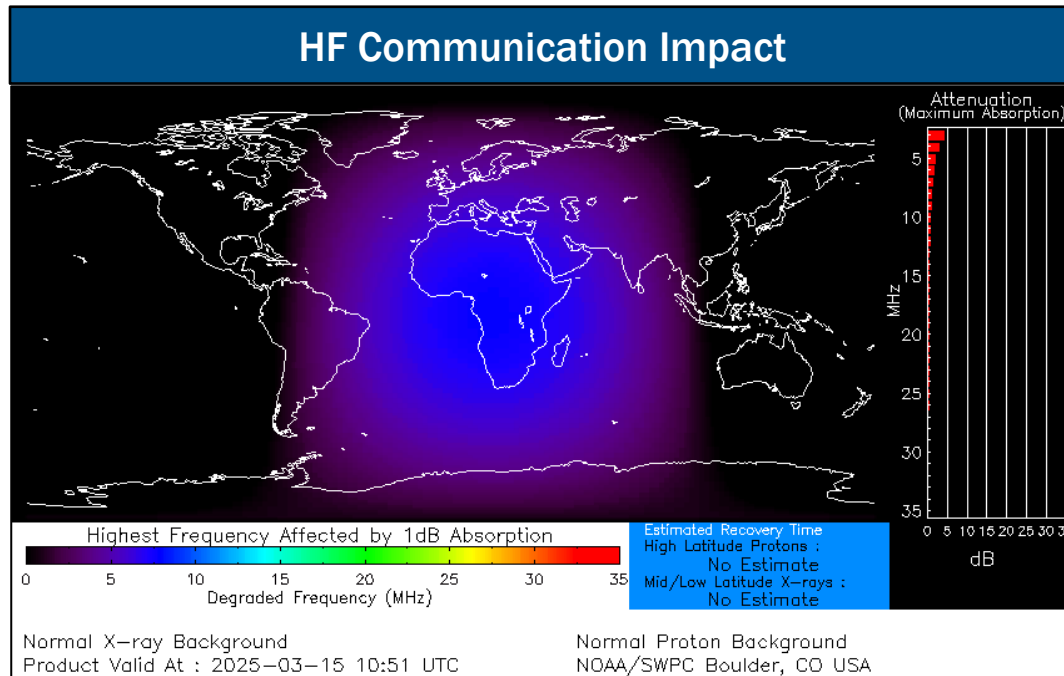

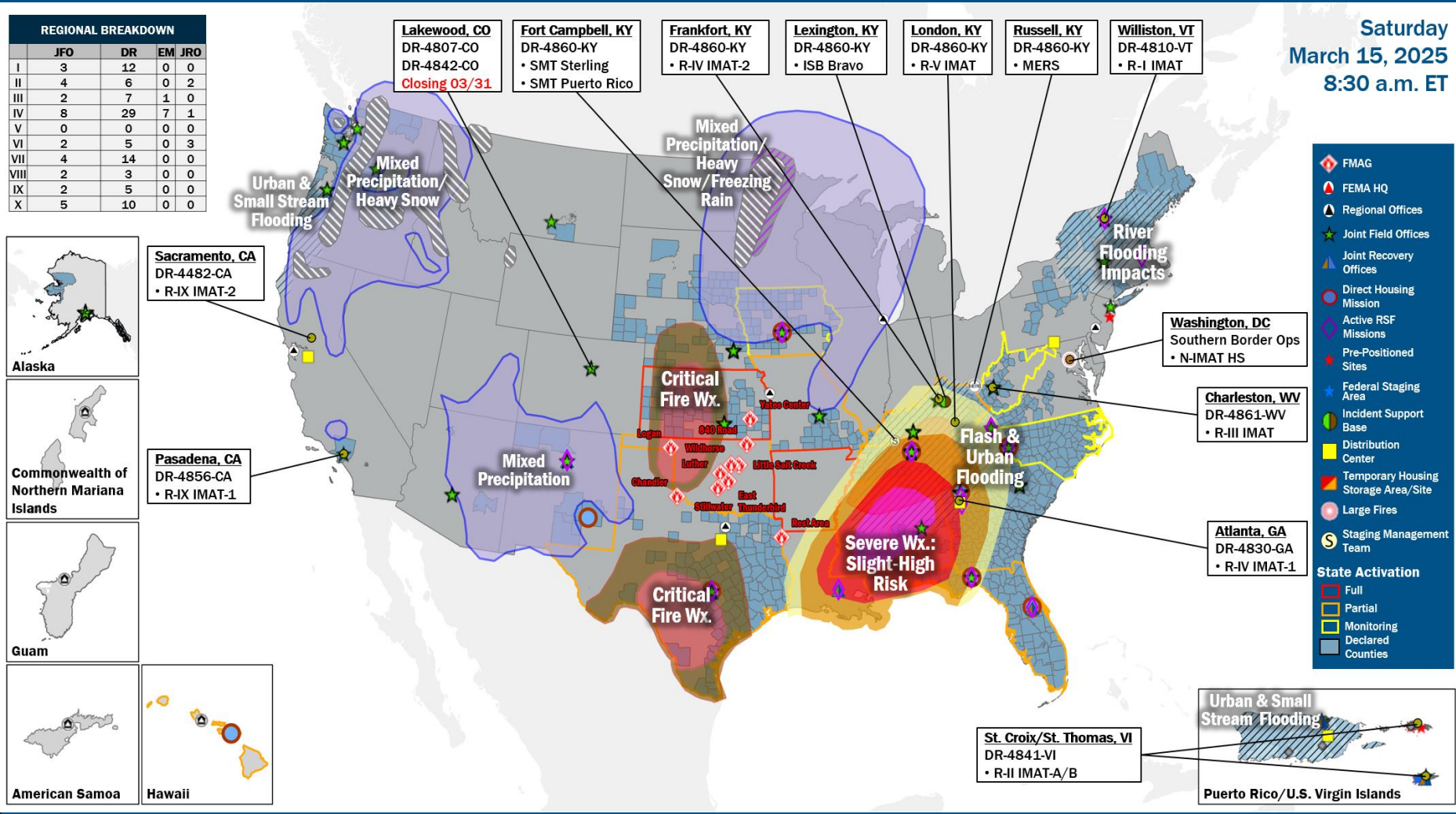
