### **Heavy Rain and Flooding – California**















**Current Situation:** Another round of rain and mountain snow arrived overnight in northern and central CA. Monday to Wednesday, another atmospheric river event will bring more widespread rain, heavy mountain snow, and gusty winds. Planning is underway for potential cascading impacts that may occur next week. California reports no shortfalls or unmet needs.

**Lifeline Impacts:** (EM-3592-CA SLB as of Mar 18, 9:00 p.m. ET)

Safety and Security: Mandatory Evacuations Orders: 10k (+492) residents; Evacuation Warnings: 50k (+20k) residents

Health and Medical: 5 confirmed storm-related fatalities

Food, Water, Shelter: 24 (+2) shelters open / 609 (-9) occupants

**Energy:** Minimal power outages (Eagle-I, as of 6:45 a.m. ET)

Transportation: Multiple road closures due to flooding, estimated time of restoration TBD


 Tule River Indian and Hoopa Valley Tribes report restricted access due to damaged roads and bridges, no unmet needs

#### State / Local Response:

- CA EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19, Seismic Activity, Flooding); Governor declared a state of emergency for 43 counties
- NV EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19); Governor declared a State of Emergency for 13 counties and 1 tribe


#### **FEMA / Federal Response:**

- NWC and Region IX RWC in coordination with CA & NV EOCs continue to monitor
- Region IX IMAT-1 / IMAT-2 deployed to CA EOC
- National IMAT Red deployed to CA EOC; FEMA Region VII IMAT deployed to CA EOC
- ISB / SMT deployed to CA; ISB / SMT deployed to NV
- MERS assets deployed to Sacramento, Tracy, and NAS Lemoore, CA
- US&R Red IST rostered and prepared to deploy; US&R resources with full water rescue capability are available to support as required
- Emergency Declaration FEMA-3592-EM-CA approved on Mar 10 for 43 counties










## **Long Range Outlooks – Mar 24-28**



6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




