




### **National Weather Forecast**





#### **Economic: Sustainable, diversified and resilience economy**

Outcome Indicators (E 1): Business activities are resumed and restored, including those local and marginalized businesses and major employees

#### **Vermont Everyone Eats**

- Goal Resilient local supply chain
- Target Audience Support for individuals facing hunger
- Services Integrated system of emergency feeding involving service providers/state paying restaurants to buy food from local Farmers to feed hungry people
- Results to date Over 2M meals, 20k meals a week to diverse households (10K on average)
  - Over 300 restaurants saved through participation; 35% of their meals using local food
  - Over 300 local farms saved

#### Coordinating Ongoing Support & Collaboration With Other Federal Agencies:

- FEMA and USDA working together in discovery phrase, ideating on benefits from VEE and collaborating on how this could be funded and possibly turned into future policy
- Outcome Local food supply chains end hunger with economic development and mental health benefits for wider community
