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National Current Ops / Monitoring

New Significant Incidents / Ongoing Ops

- Severe Weather – Lower Mississippi, Ohio, and Tennessee valleys

Hazard Monitoring

- Freezing Rain – Great Lakes to the Northeast
- Heavy Snow – Pacific Northwest, Northern Rockies to the Northern Plains, and the Great Lakes
- Mixed Precipitation – Pacific Northwest to Northern Intermountain, Northern California, and Central Plains to the Northeast
- Critical Fire Weather – Northern Texas to Southeast Colorado

Disaster Declaration Activity

- No new declaration activity

Event Monitoring

- No significant events



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Severe Weather – Lower Mississippi, Ohio, and Tennessee valleys

Current Situation: Storm Prediction Center reported eleven tornado touchdowns across Mississippi cities/counties including Rolling Fork, Silver City, Winona, Sharkey, Smithville, Amory, and Montgomery overnight. Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) deployed search and rescue units to Sharkey and Humphries counties.

Impacts: *(Media source)*

- Reports twenty-one unconfirmed fatalities
- Multiple injuries, destroyed homes, and numerous downed trees and powerlines across the affected areas

Power Outages: *(Eagle-I as of 7:00 a.m. ET)*

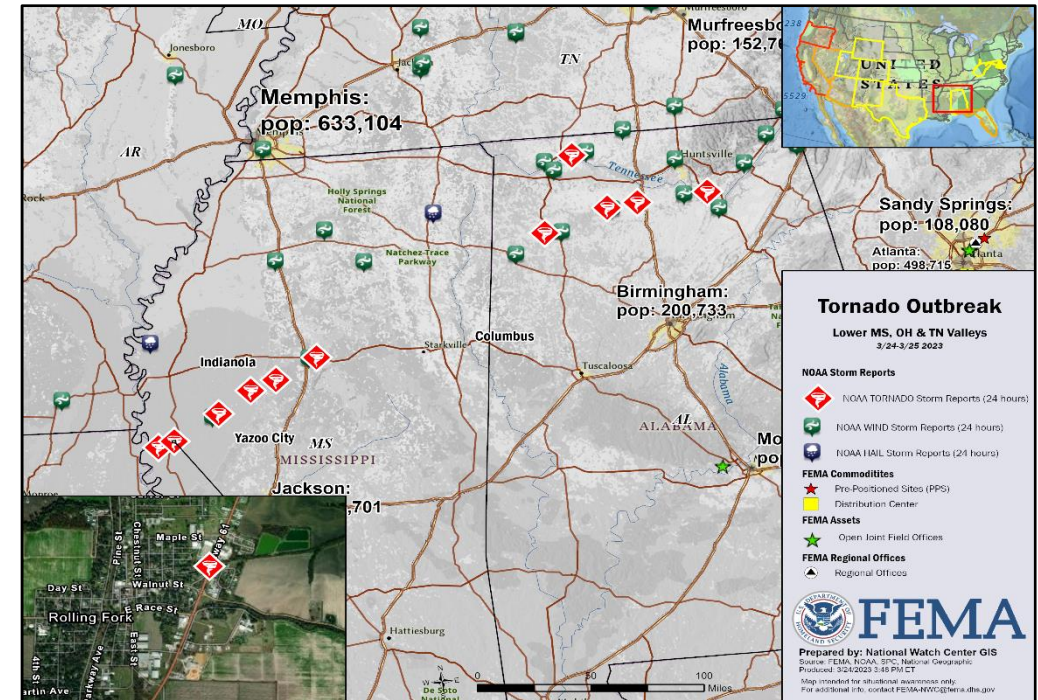
- Mississippi: 15K (1.3%)

- MS, AL, and TN EOCs at Normal Operations

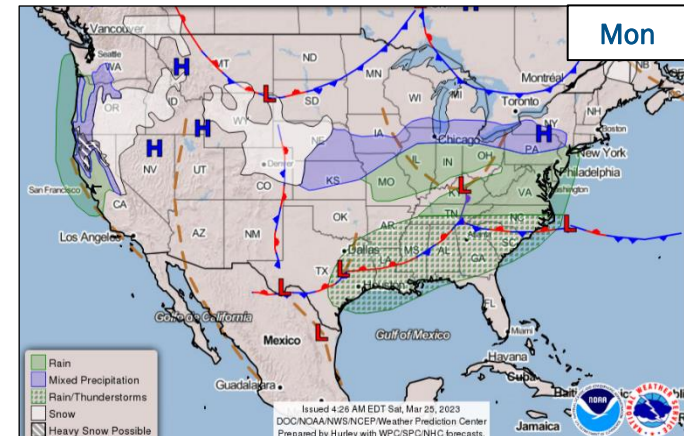
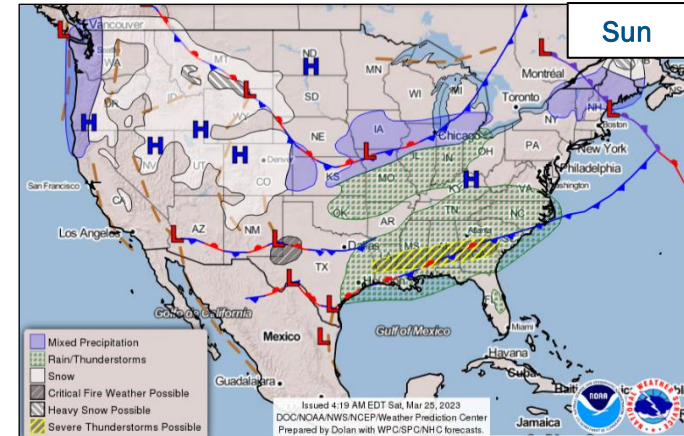
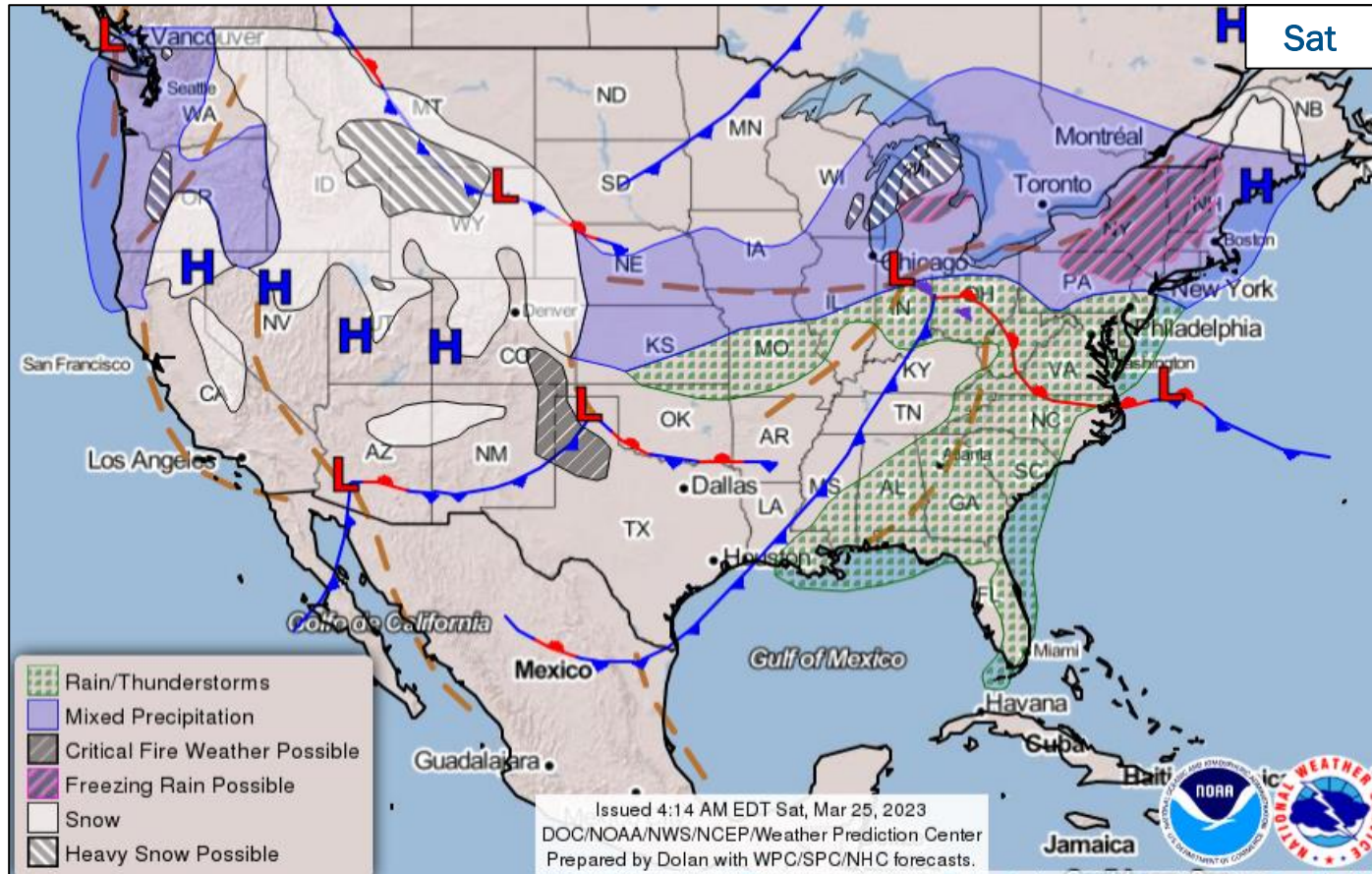
FEMA / Federal Response:

- NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with regional and federal partners; next update will be in the 5:00 p.m. ET National Situation Report



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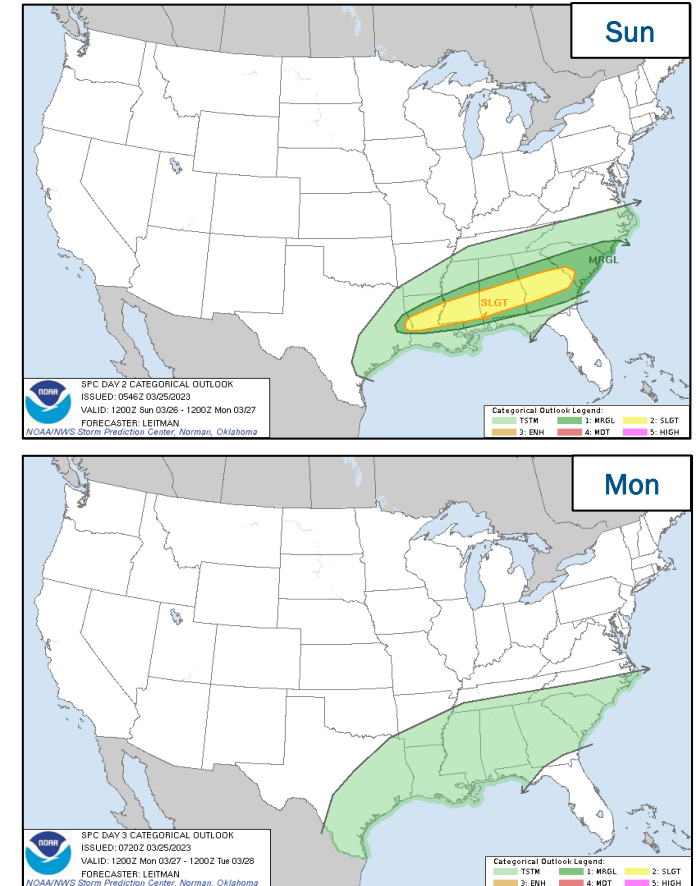
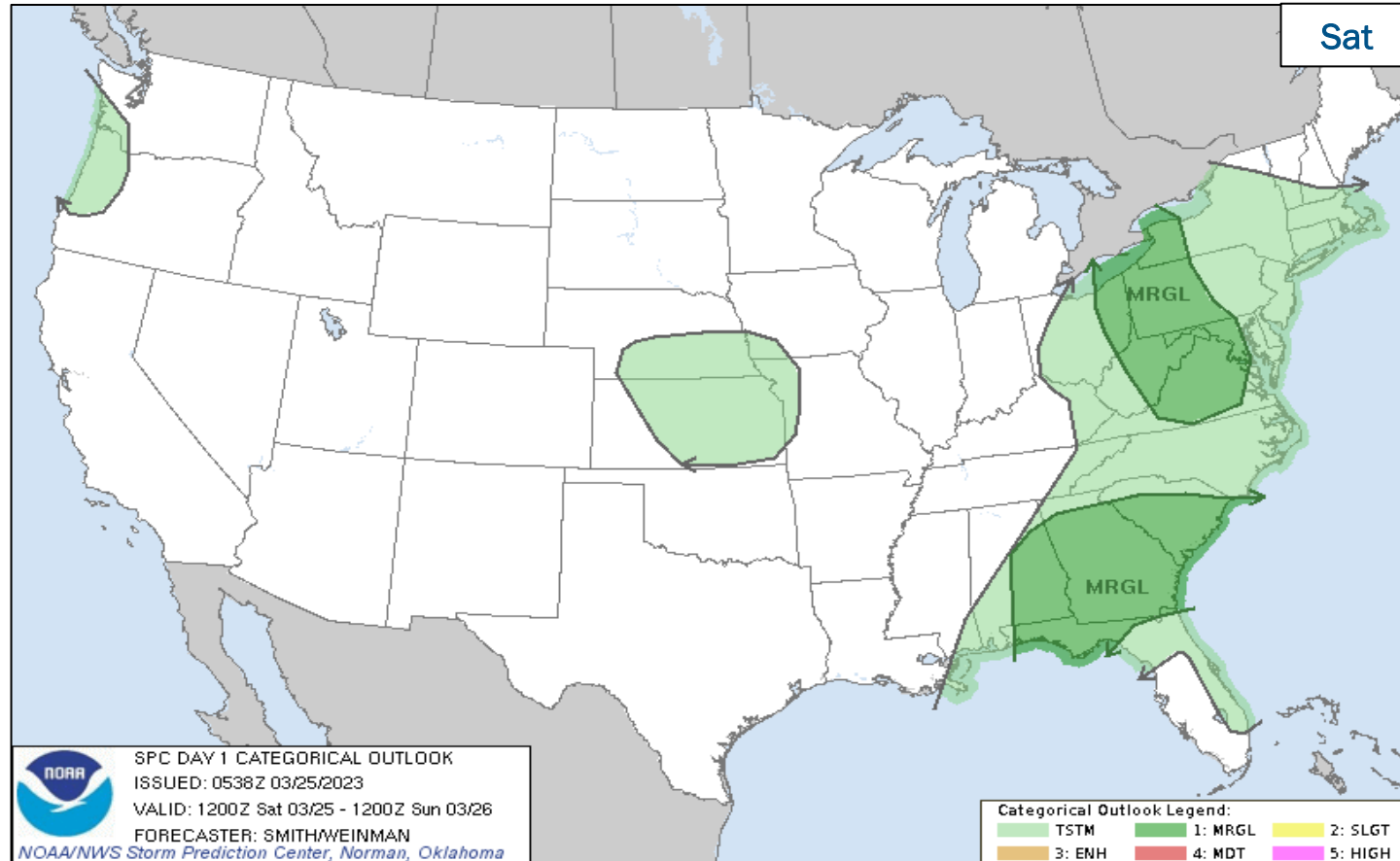

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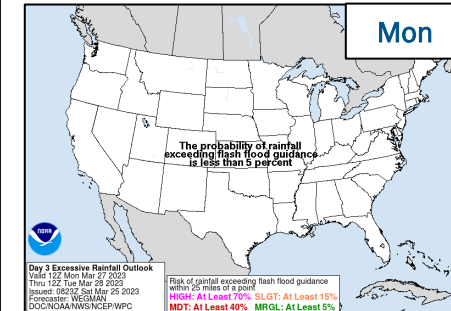
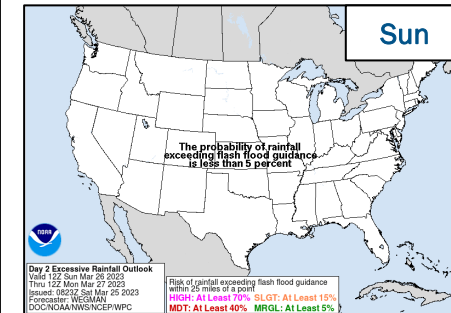
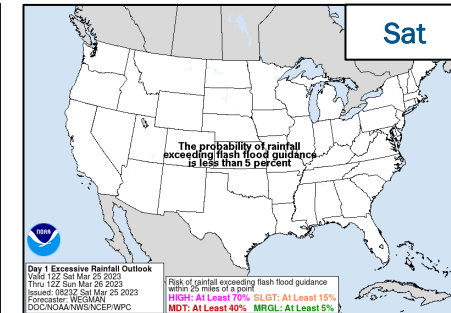
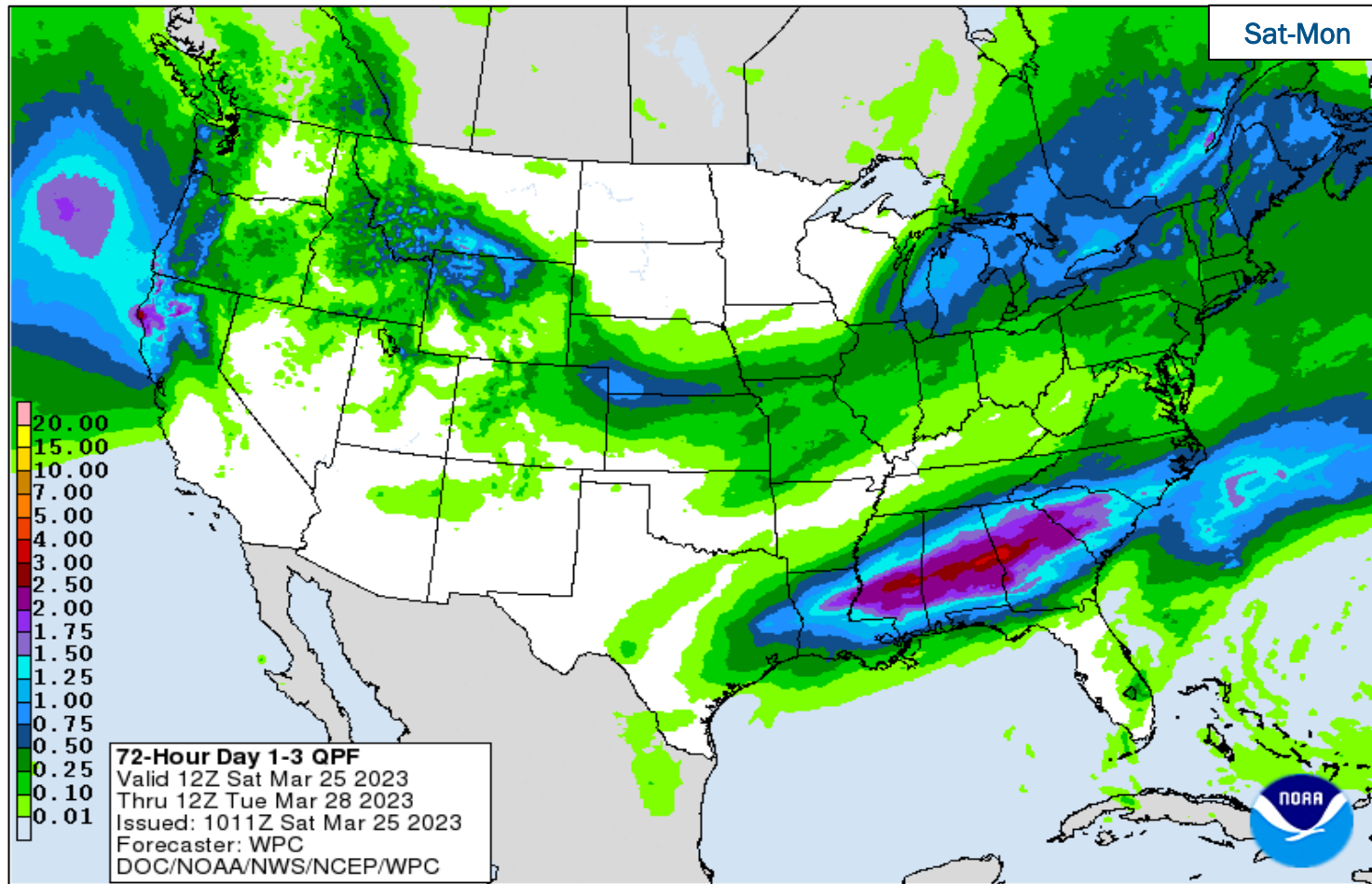
Severe Weather Outlook



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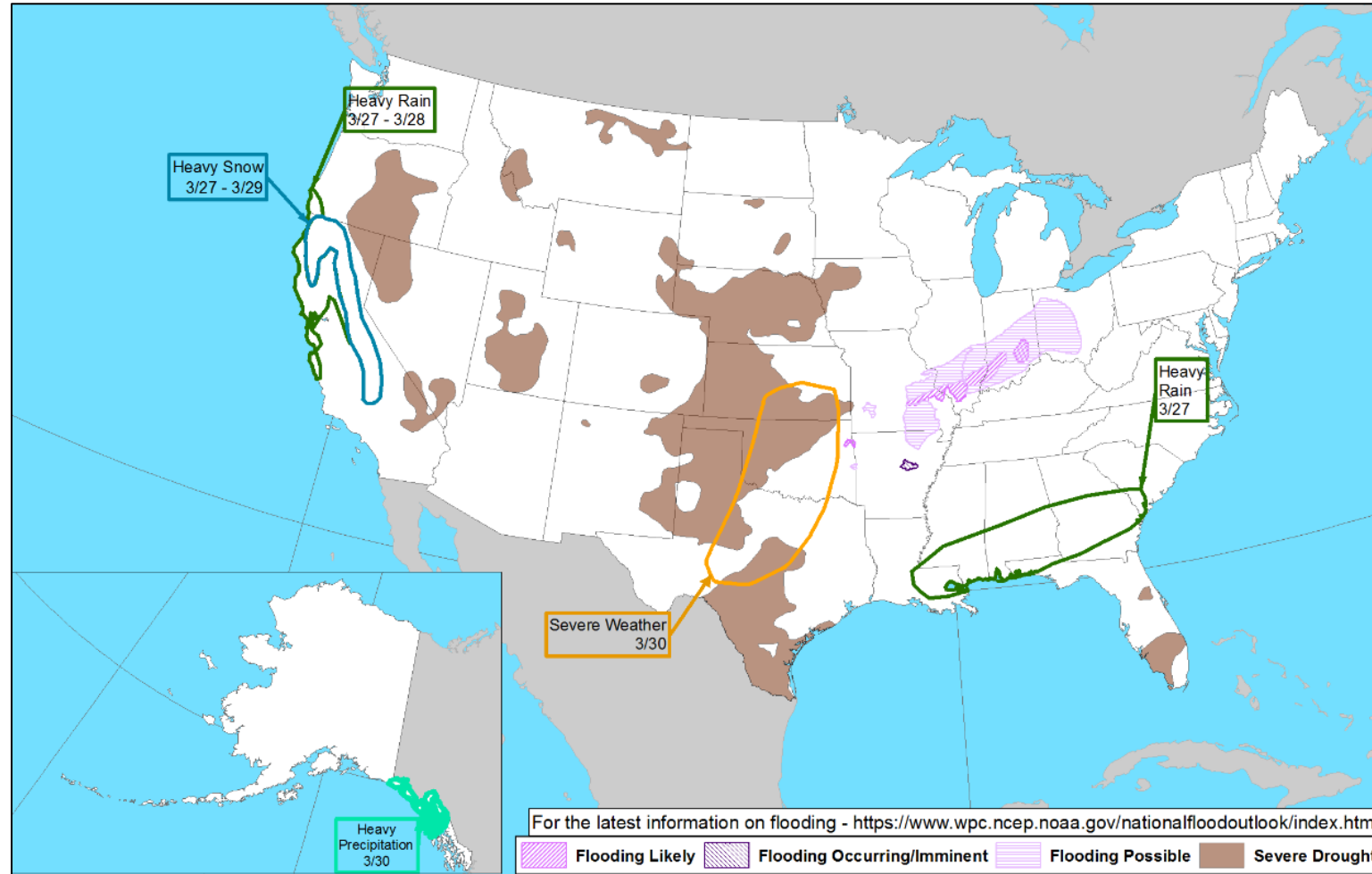
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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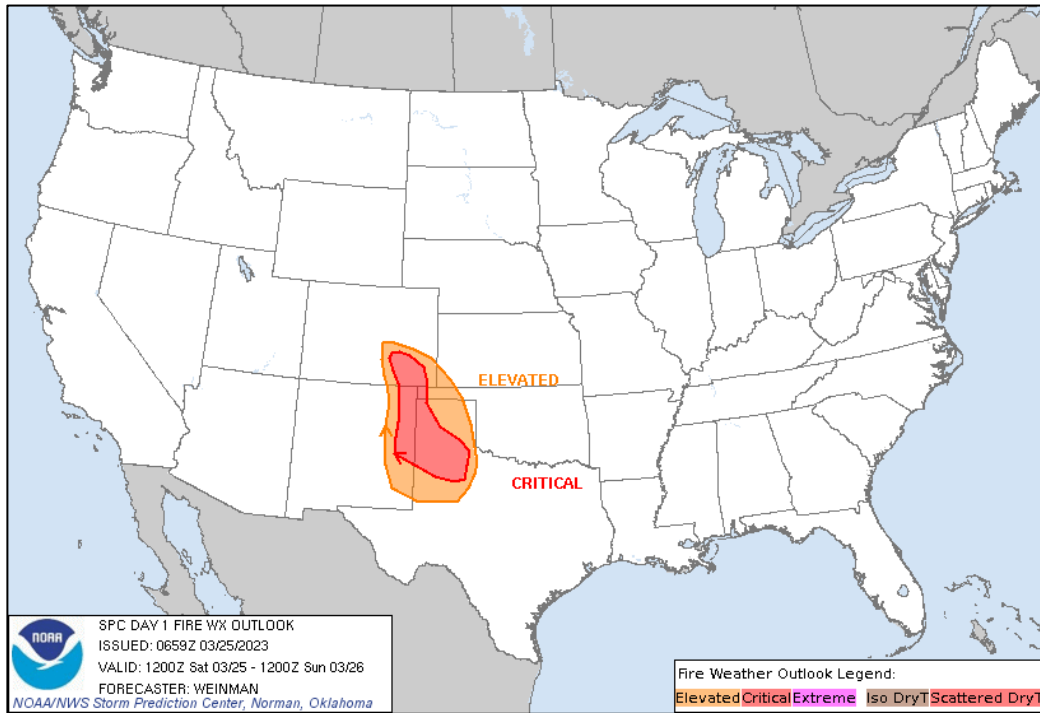

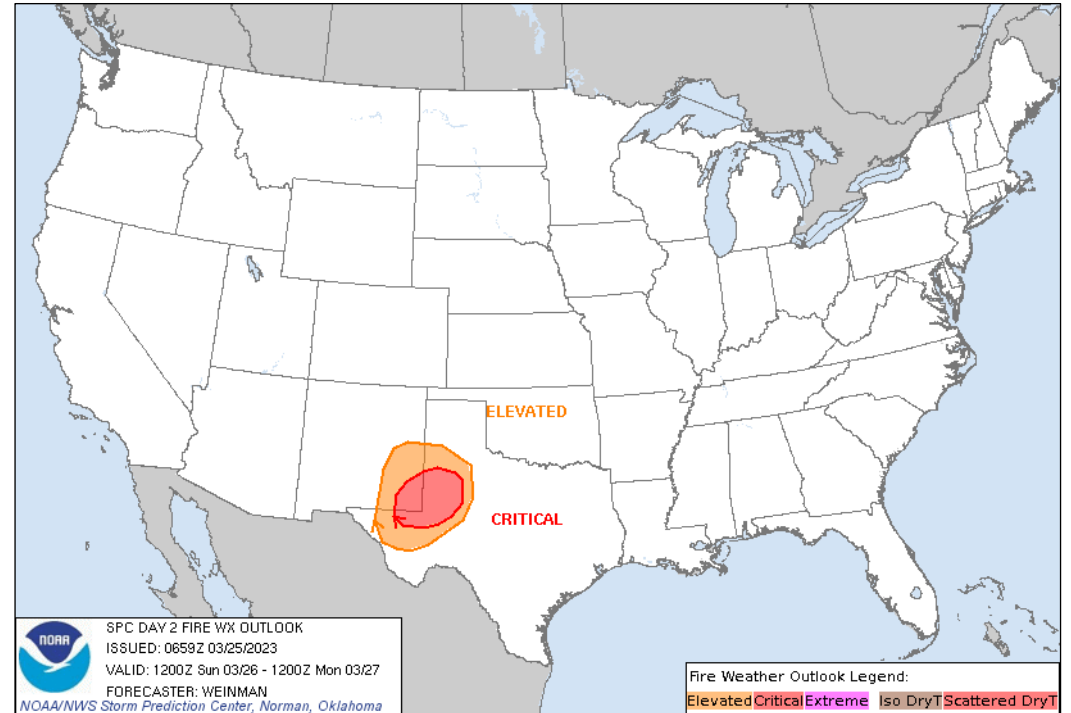

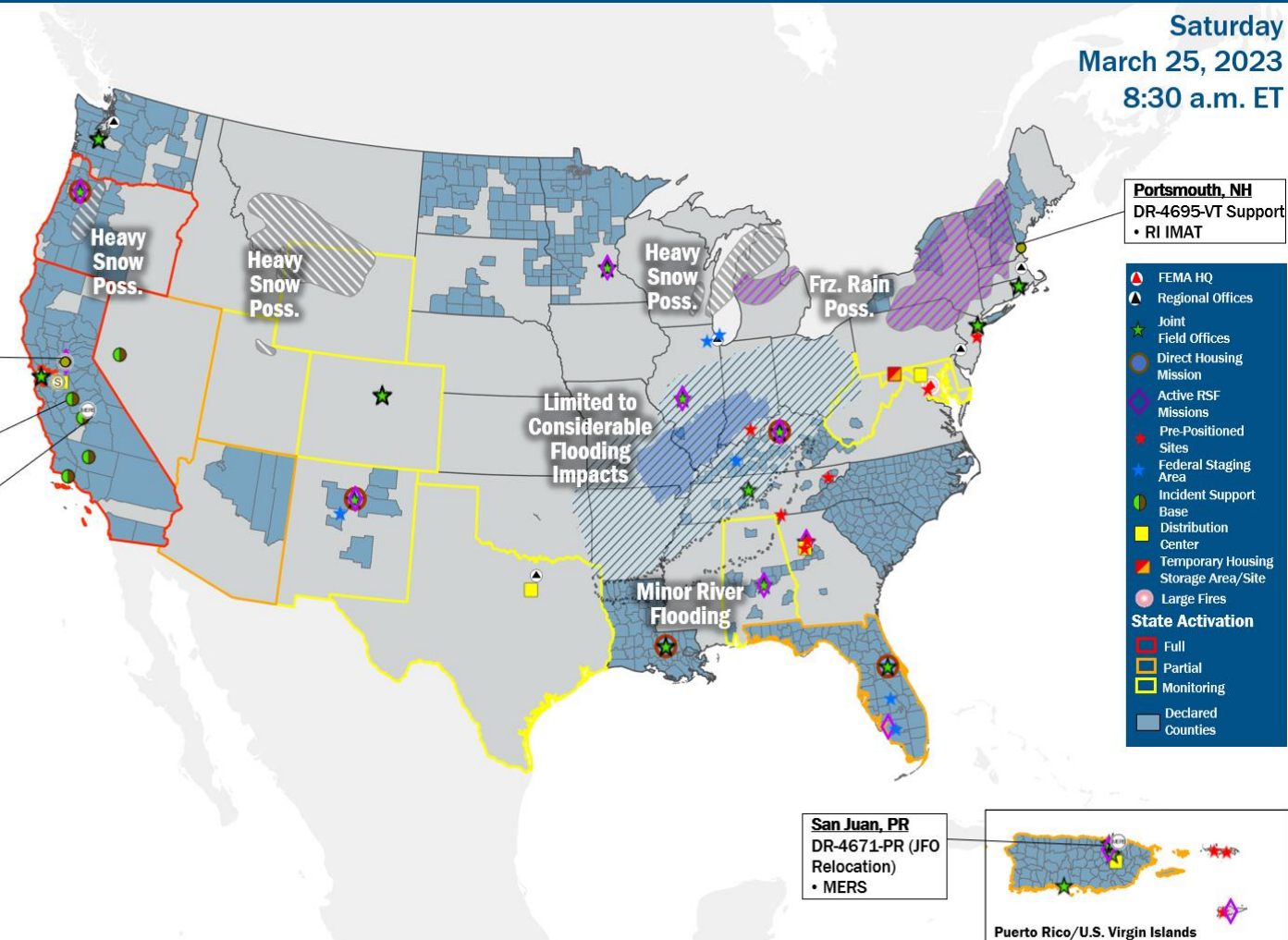
