Severe Weather – Lower Mississippi and Tennessee valleys

Current Situation: Overnight, March 24, severe thunderstorms developed across the Lower Mississippi Valley and into the Tennessee Valley. The NOAA Storm Prediction Center reported at least 12 tornadoes and 84 high wind events with most impacts occurring within the FEMA Region IV states of MS, AL, and TN. Today severe weather is forecast to move across AL and GA with NOAA SPC issuing an Enhanced Risk of severe weather which includes scattered thunderstorms and large hail as the primary threats.


Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA RIV SPOTREP March 25, 4:00 p.m., ET)

- Safety and Security:
 - 2k homes impacted
 - Search and Rescue operations ongoing
- Food, Water, Shelter:
 - MS: 3 shelters / 65 occupants
 - Localized damage to potable water
- Health and Medical:
 - MS: 25 confirmed fatalities / 55 injuries reported
 - Sharkey County Issaquena Nursing Home in Rolling Fork is without power. All patients were transferred to other healthcare facilities
 - Sharkey County Hospital fully operational
- Energy:
 - O Power Outages: (Eagle-I, as of 5:30 a.m. ET)
 - AL 10.5k statewide
 - MS 5.2k statewide
 - TN 1.8k Statewide

State / Local Response:

- MS EOC at Partial Activation
- Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MSEMA) deployed search and rescue units to Sharkey/Humphries Counties
- Mississippi State Dept of Health (MSDH) has been activated



- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4697-DR approved on Mar 26
- Thomasville MERS deployed a MEOV package / EOV-11 package to Pearl, MS
- One Division Supervisor deploying to Mississippi today
- One DSA Branch Director, Deputy DSA Branch Director, 2 DSA Group Supervisors have been identified
- F1 and S1 will travel to MS today; FIT LNO deployed to MS SEOC
- NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with regional and federal partners; next update will be in the 5:00 p.m. ET National Situation Report





Severe Weather Outlook







Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall





Fire Weather Outlook









