Key Bridge Collapse – Baltimore, MD

Current Situation: (USCG, DoT, CISA, R3 SPOTREP as of 6:45 a.m. ET, Mar 26)

At 1:27 a.m. ET, a cargo vessel allided with the Francis Scott Key Bridge (I-695) over the Patapsco River, causing the bridge to collapse. The Key Bridge is the outermost crossing of the Baltimore harbor. The cause of the incident is under investigation. Local media reports two people were rescued, one in serious condition.

Impacts: (USCG, R3 SPOTREP as of 6:45 a.m. ET, Mar 26)

- All lanes of I-695 in the vicinity closed until further notice
- Alternate harbor crossings: Fort McHenry (I-95) and Baltimore Harbor (I-895) tunnels
- Vehicles transporting HAZMATs are prohibited in tunnels and should use the western section of I-695
- Port of Baltimore is closed and long-term interruptions to operations are expected
 - CISA coordinating with the Transportation Systems Sector Risk Management Agency (SRMA), the COMM-ISAC, and the USCG to determine impacts, including cascading impacts from the loss of the bridge







National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook





Hazards Outlook - Mar 28-Apr 1










Public Assistance (PA) Grant Program Activity – per Region




