Severe Weather – Lower Mississippi Valley and Southeast

<u>Current Situation:</u> A Moderate Risk of severe thunderstorms is expected from the Lower Mississippi Valley into portions of the Ohio and Tennessee Valleys today. The primary threats are large hail, damaging winds with gusts over 75 mph, and several tornadoes which could be strong (EF2+). This threat is likely to persist into the evening before the thunderstorms move eastward and gradually weakening Thursday morning.

Impacts

- Possible tornado touchdown in AR; multiple homes/businesses damaged; injuries unknown
- Minimal power outages reported



- AL EOC will transition to Partial Activation at 7:00 p.m. ET (Severe Weather)


FEMA Preparations:

- FEMA Region VI RWC is at Enhanced Watch; RRCC is rostered
- IMAT-1 is PMC (Personnel Shortages)
- IMAT-2 deployed to LA (Previous Severe Weather Support)
- FEMA Region IV is monitoring; Enhanced Watch and RRCC are rostered
 - IMAT-1 and 2 are FMC
- FEMA HQ: NWC is monitoring; NRCC is at Level III (COVID-19)
 - Response Operations Coordination Call conducted
 - US&R IST White ready for deployment
 - Logistics and SMTs standing by to support
 - Denton & Thomasville MERS ready to deploy
 - Field Operations Division working to fill RVI IMAT vacancies
 - Planning and Recovery offices are coordinating with Regions IV & VI
- No requests for FEMA assistance






National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook


