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# Severe Weather – Central and Eastern U.S.

**Situation and Impacts:** The severe thunderstorm threat is winding down in the northeast as the line of storms has moved offshore. However, a strengthening storm system in the Central and Southern Plains is forecast to bring a significant and potentially life-threatening combination of hazardous weather to portions of the Plains, Mississippi Valley and the Midwest this week. As Local assessments continue, no major or widespread property damage has been reported. The most significant impact this far appears to be the power outages caused by downed trees and power lines, however, damage assessment due to significant tornado activity in region 5 is still being assessed. Over the last operational period, the Storm Prediction Center has received 696 wind reports with 10 being high wind reports, 246 hail reports, 18 large hail reports (hail larger than 2" in diameter), and 18 tornado reports in the affected areas.

## Lifeline Impacts:

**Energy:** (DOE Eagle-I as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Apr 1)

- FEMA RIV: Power outages remain minimal
- FEMA RV:
  - IN – 27k (-39k) / 1% customers without power
  - MI – 194k (-140k) / 4% (-1) customers without power outages
  - WI – 31k (-30k) / 1% customers without power

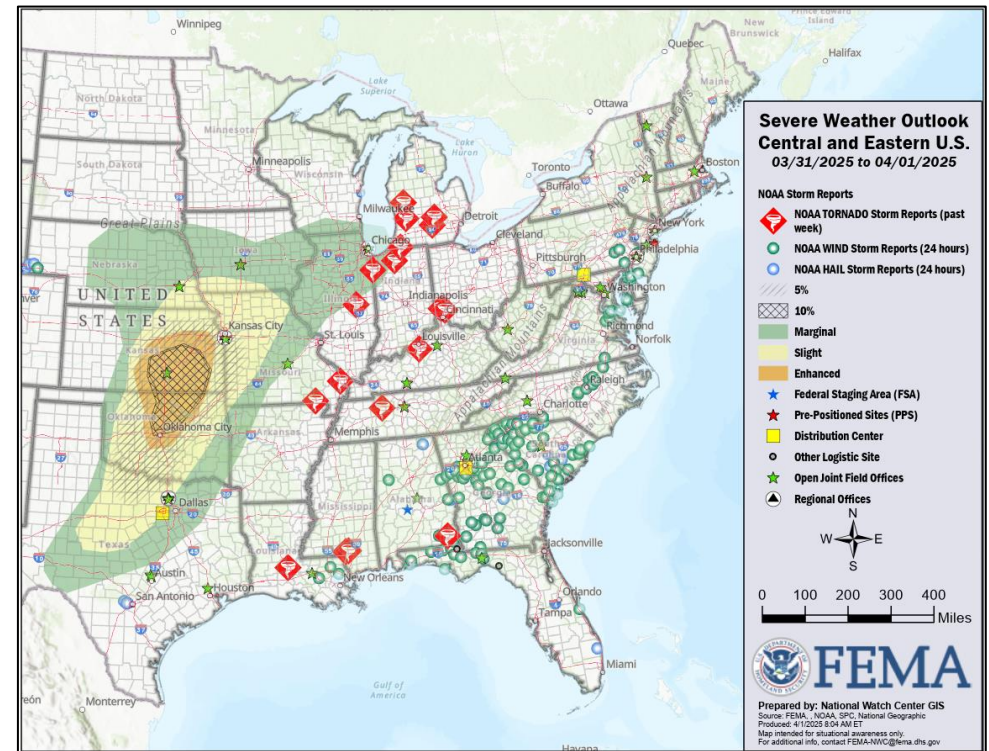

  - MI SEOC at Partial Activation (Ice Storm)
- FEMA RVI:
  - AR SEOC is at Normal Operations
  - TX SEOC is at Partial Activation

  - NE, KS, IA SEOCs at Normal Operations
  - MO is at Partial Activation

- FEMA RVI: MOC is Monitoring; RRCC is Rostered; R-IMAT 1 FMC; R-IMAT 2 is PMC (Personnel)
- HQ: NWC is Monitoring; NRCC is Steady State

The NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with FEMA Regions IV, V, VI, and VII, with continued reporting twice daily in the FEMA National Situation Report (5:00 p.m./3:00 a.m. ET) and the FEMA Daily Operations Briefing (8:30 a.m. ET)

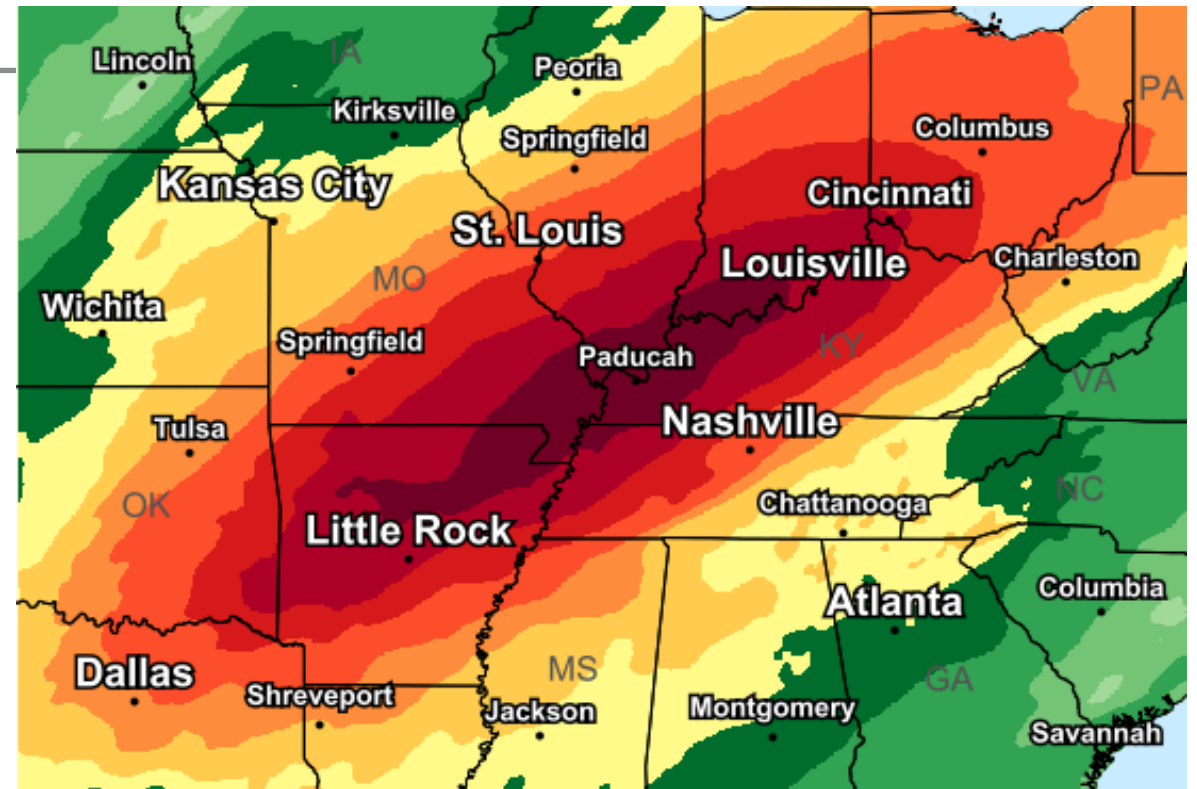

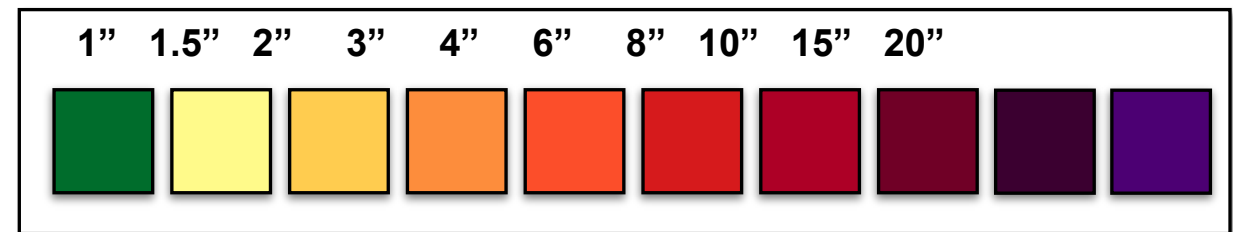
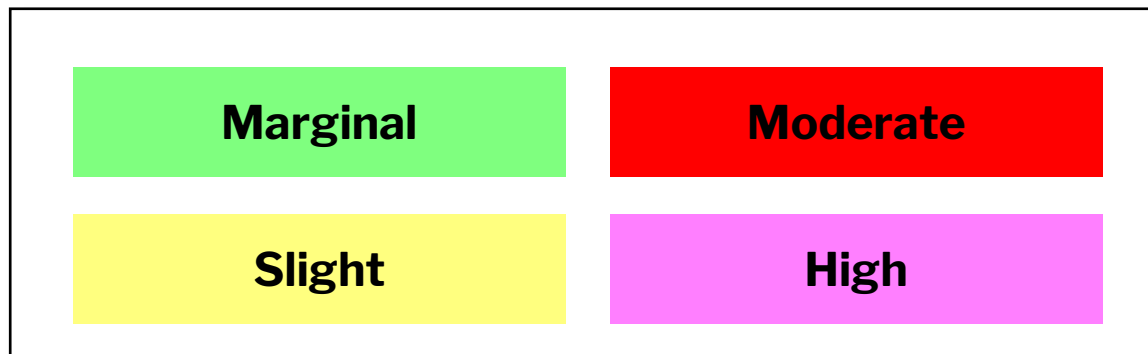
## FLOODING RISK AND RAINFALL FORECAST



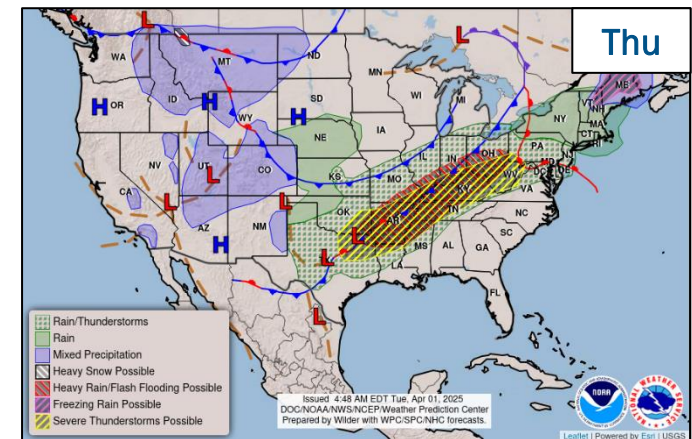
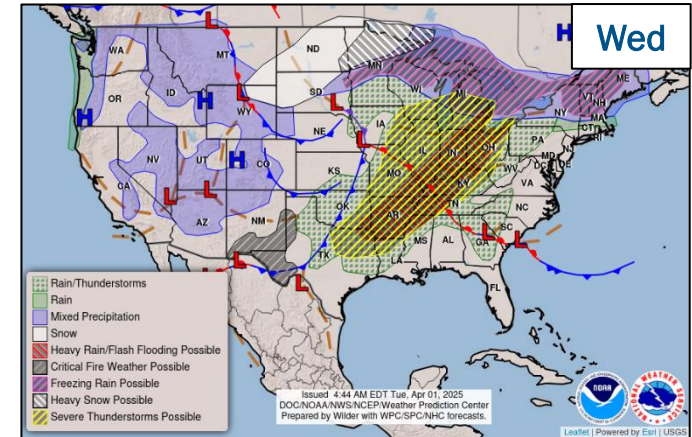
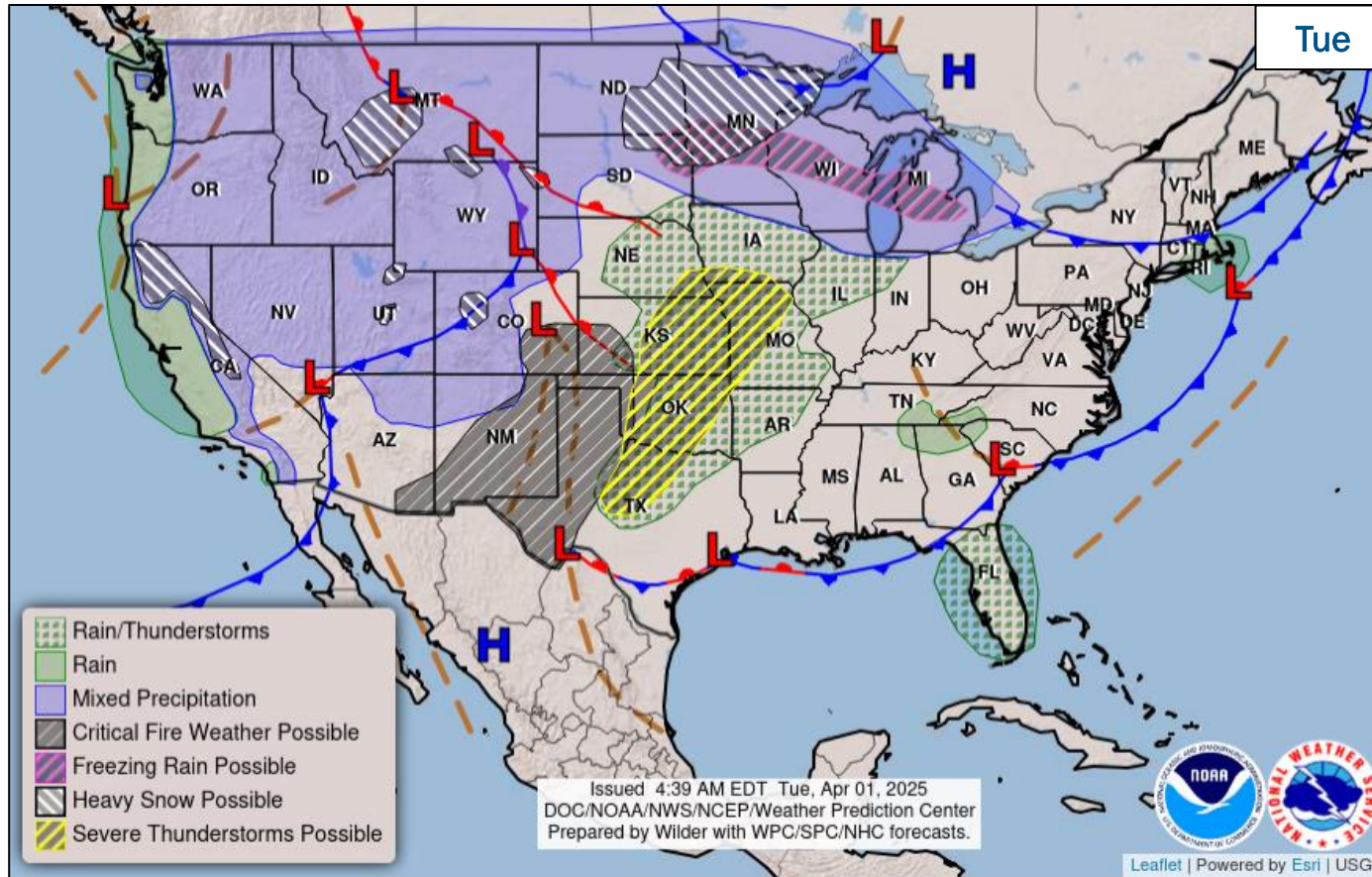
**Risk of Flash Flooding Wed - Sat**



**Rainfall Forecast through Saturday**



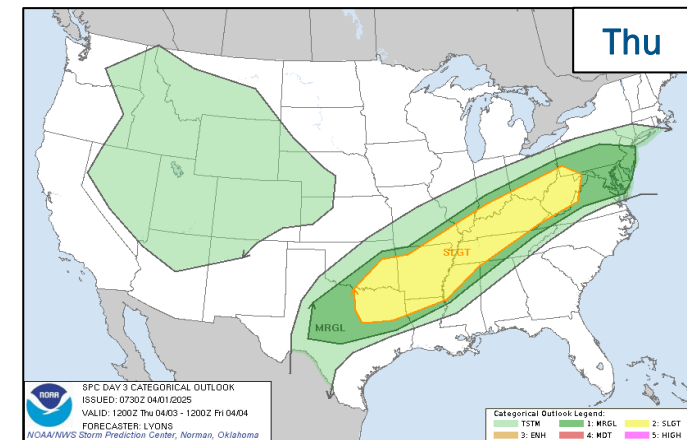
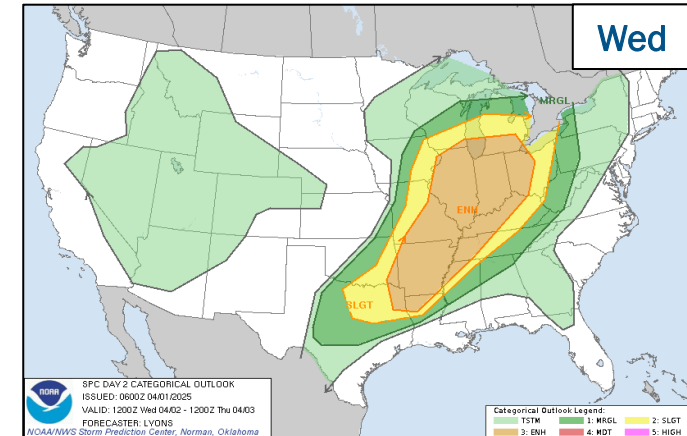
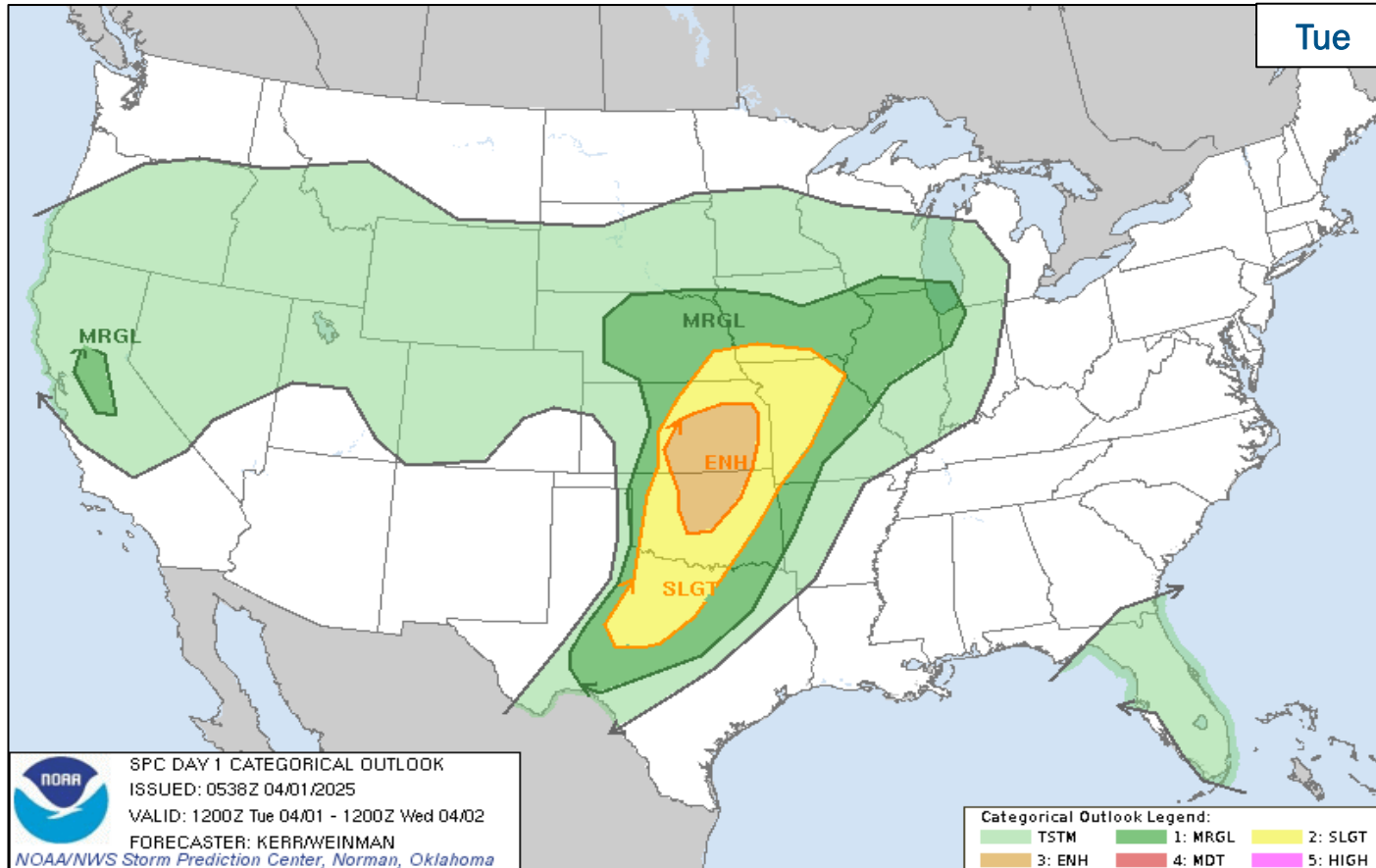

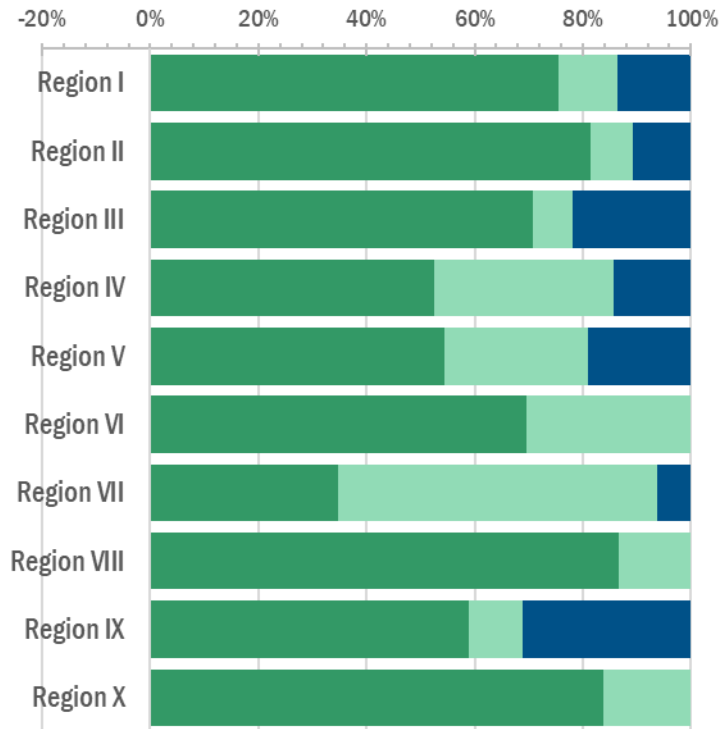

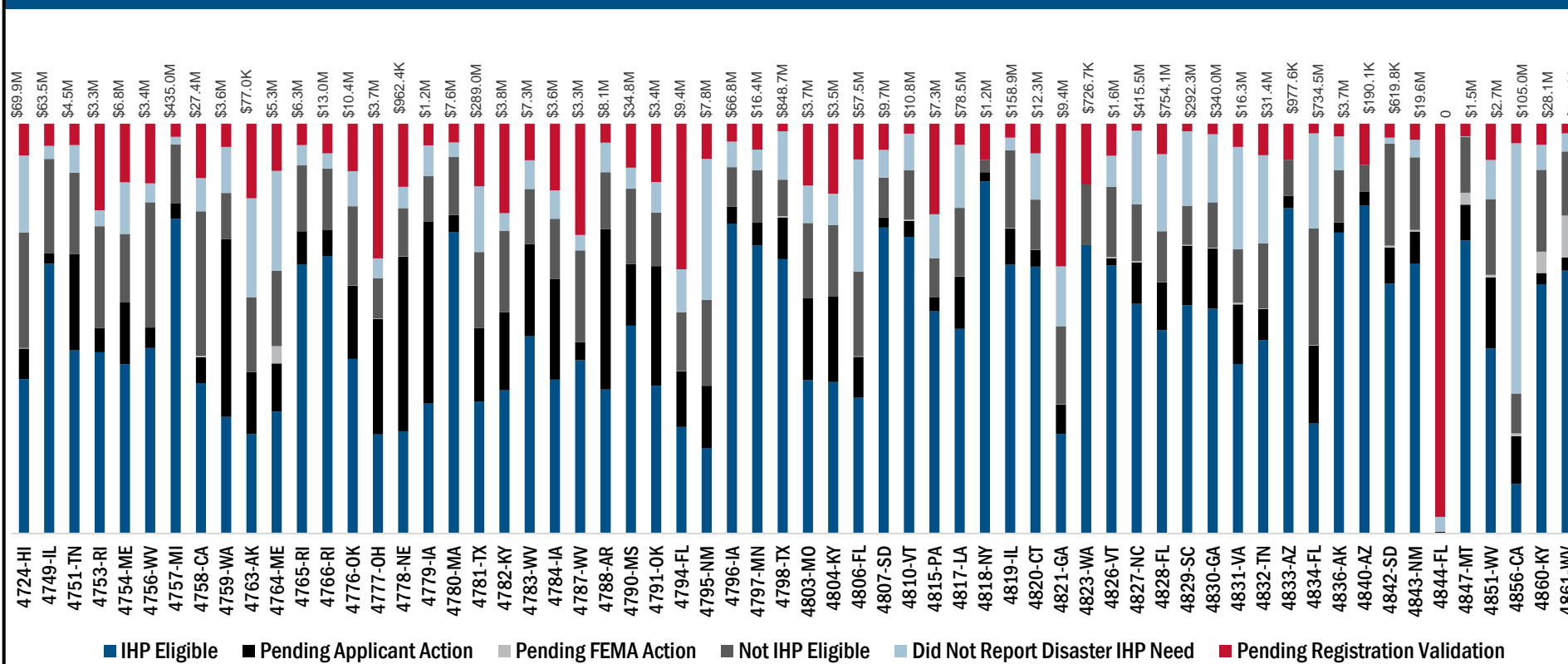

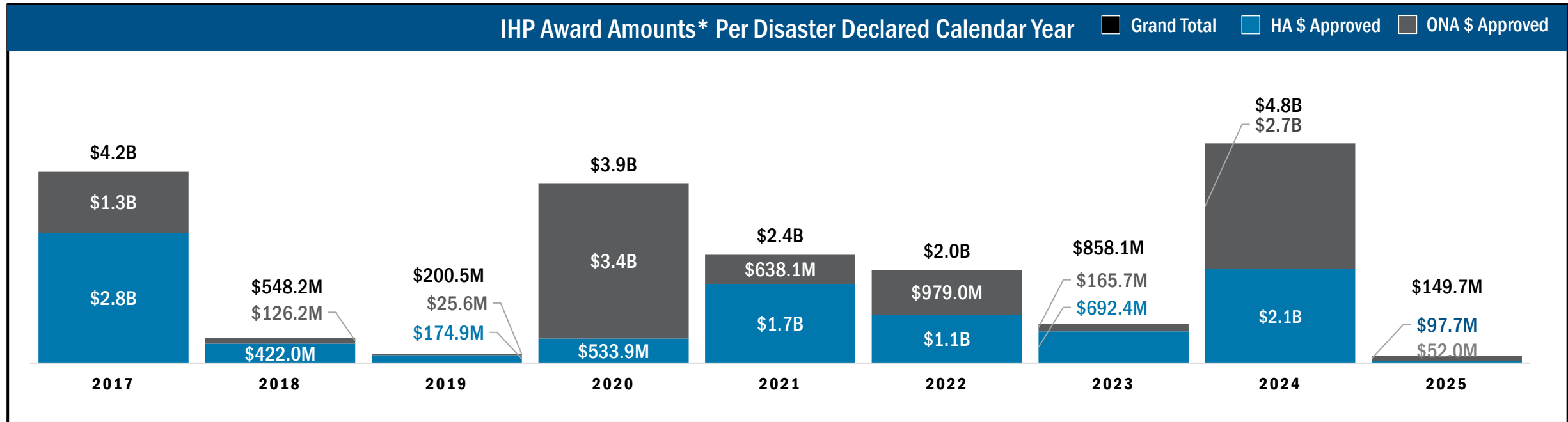
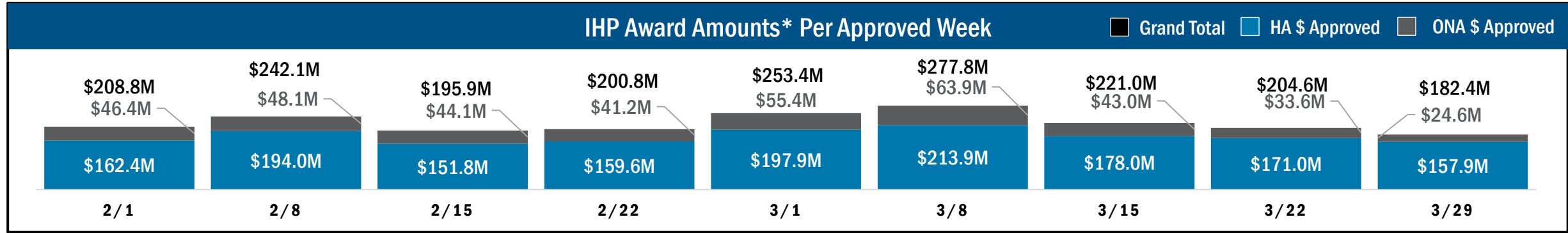
## Registrations in Active Declarations

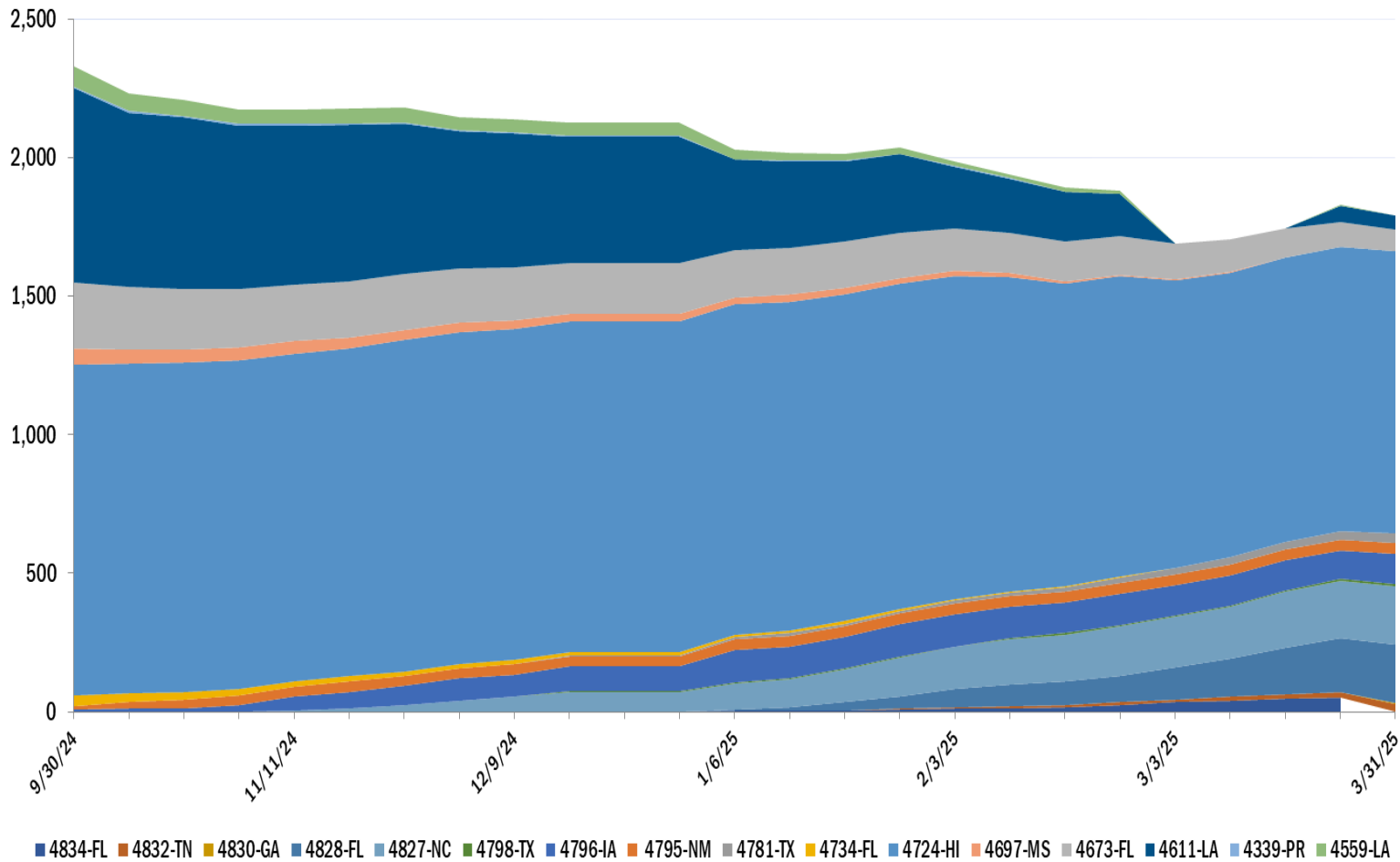

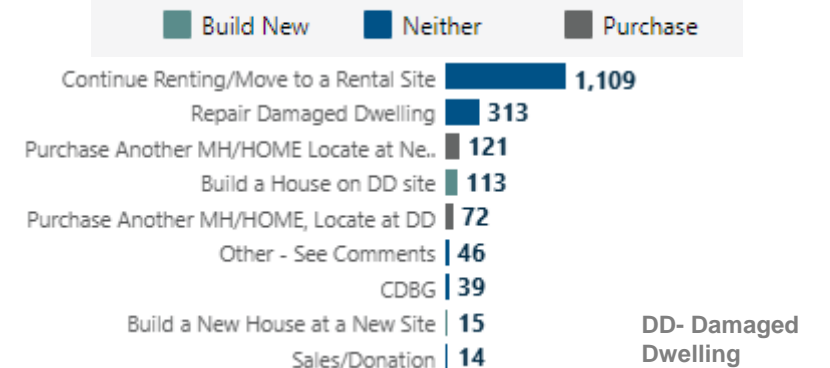
