Power Outages - Northeast

<u>Situation and analysis:</u> As of 7:45 a.m. ET, Eagle-I has reported a combined 341k (4%) customers without power in FEMA Region I. The following states and counties have the highest reported power outages:

- Maine 198k (25%) customers without power
 - o Cumberland County 54k (23%) customers countywide
 - o York County 54k (77%) customers countywide
- New Hampshire 111K (15%) customers without power
 - o Rockingham County 34k (22%) customers countywide
 - o Carroll County 17k (71%) customers countywide



FEMA / Federal Response:



The NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with FEMA Region I.






National Weather Forecast






Snowfall Forecast






Ohio River Basin - RFC River Forecasts


