Severe Weather / Flooding – Central and Eastern U.S. – FINAL



Situation: The Ohio and Mississippi Valley regions continue to feel the impacts from the severe storms and widespread flooding. Flood conditions are expected to persist as the Ohio river is still rising and expected to crest between April 11 - 15. Federal resources remain actively engaged, with search and rescue operations, restoring communications, addressing critical commodity needs, and assisting with the repair of compromised water systems.

Lifeline Impacts: (Region IV SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Apr 9)

Safety & Security: Safety and rescue ops ongoing

- FEMA RIV:
 - KY:
 - No mandatory evacuations in effect but potentially could be reinstated
 - The Rough River Dam may be forced to release water
 - All state offices open on 4/10

Food, Hydration, Shelter:

- FEMA RIV: (Region IV SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Apr 9)
 - KY: 14 shelters / 58 occupants
 - Food and water arrived at Bluegrass, Franklin and Wendell Ford Training Center
 - Additional resources staged at Ft. Knox
 - TN: 3 shelters / 17 occupants
- FEMA RV:
 - IN: 6 shelters / 43 occupants
- FEMA RVI: (Region VI DSAR, as of 1:30 p.m. ET, Apr 9)
 - AR: 3 (-1) shelters / 43 (-8) occupants
- FEMA RVII:
 - MO: 1 shelter / 3 occupants

Health & Medical: 23 (+3) fatalities have been reported for the affected regions

- FEMA RIV: (Region IV SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Apr 9)
 - KY: 5 (+3) fatalities / 6 injuries
 - TN: 10 fatalities / 0 injuries
- FEMA RV: (Region V Update, as of 9:50 p.m. ET, Apr 9)
 - IN: 3 fatalities / 1 injury
- FEMA RVI: (Region VI Update, as of 4:30 p.m. ET, Apr 8)
 - AR: 2 fatalities / 12 injuries
- FEMA RVII: (Region VII Update, as of 9:45 p.m. ET, Apr 9)
 - MO: 3 fatalities / 1 injury

Water Systems: Restoration of water systems depends on floodwaters receding

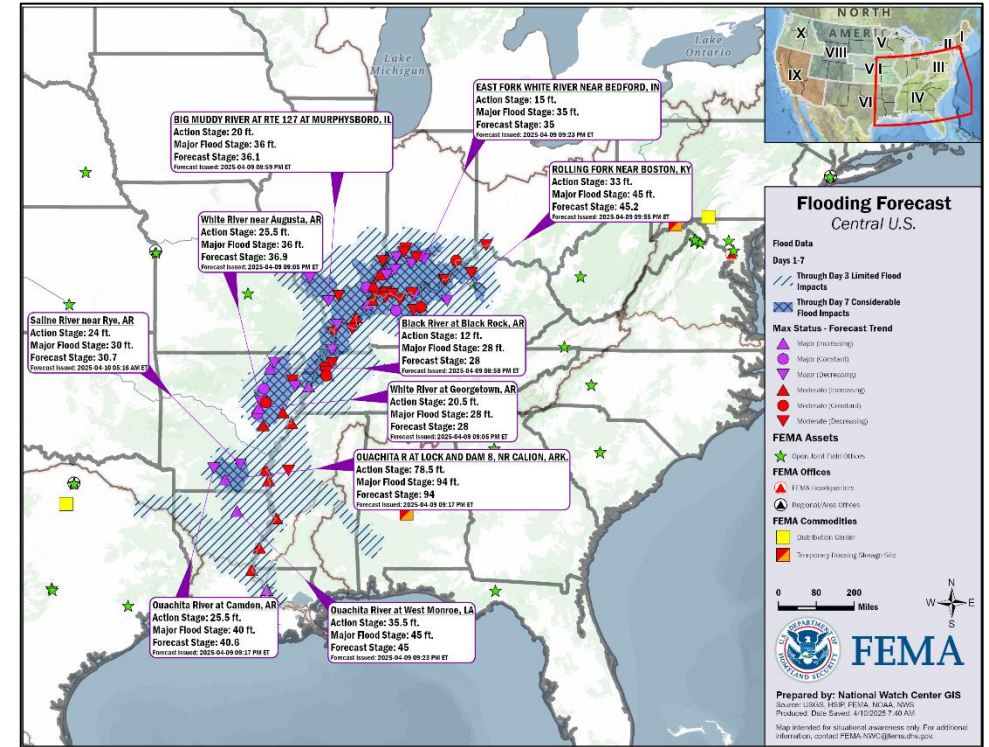
- FEMA RIV: (Region VI SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Apr 9)
 - KY: 3,800 (-285) water service connections under boil water advisories;
 - 5 (-9) water systems at limited operations
 - 700 (-127) people are without water service
 - 22 (-7) wastewater systems are under limited operations, and 3 (-1) are non-operational

Communications:

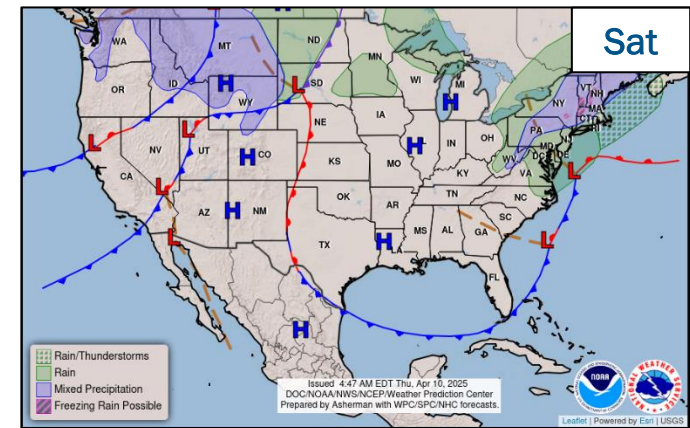
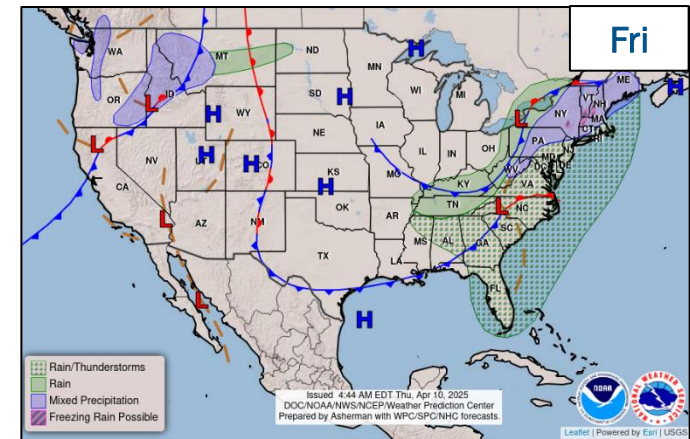
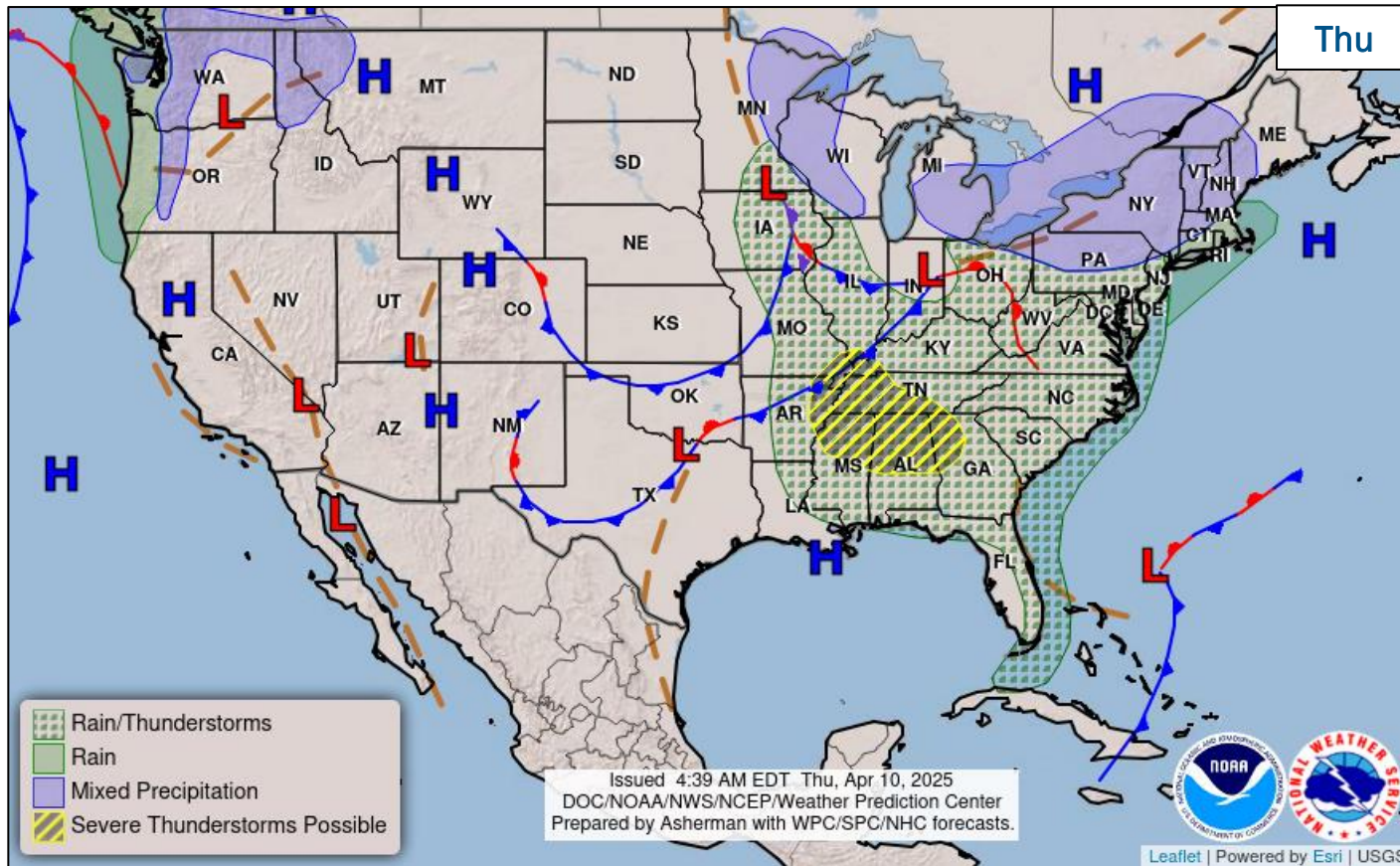
- FEMA RIV: (Region VI SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Apr 9)
 - TN: Fiber optic cable damage under repair in McNairy County; ESF-2 pushing communication and media messages to not cut fiber cables during debris cleanup

 - 63 highways with flooding impacts



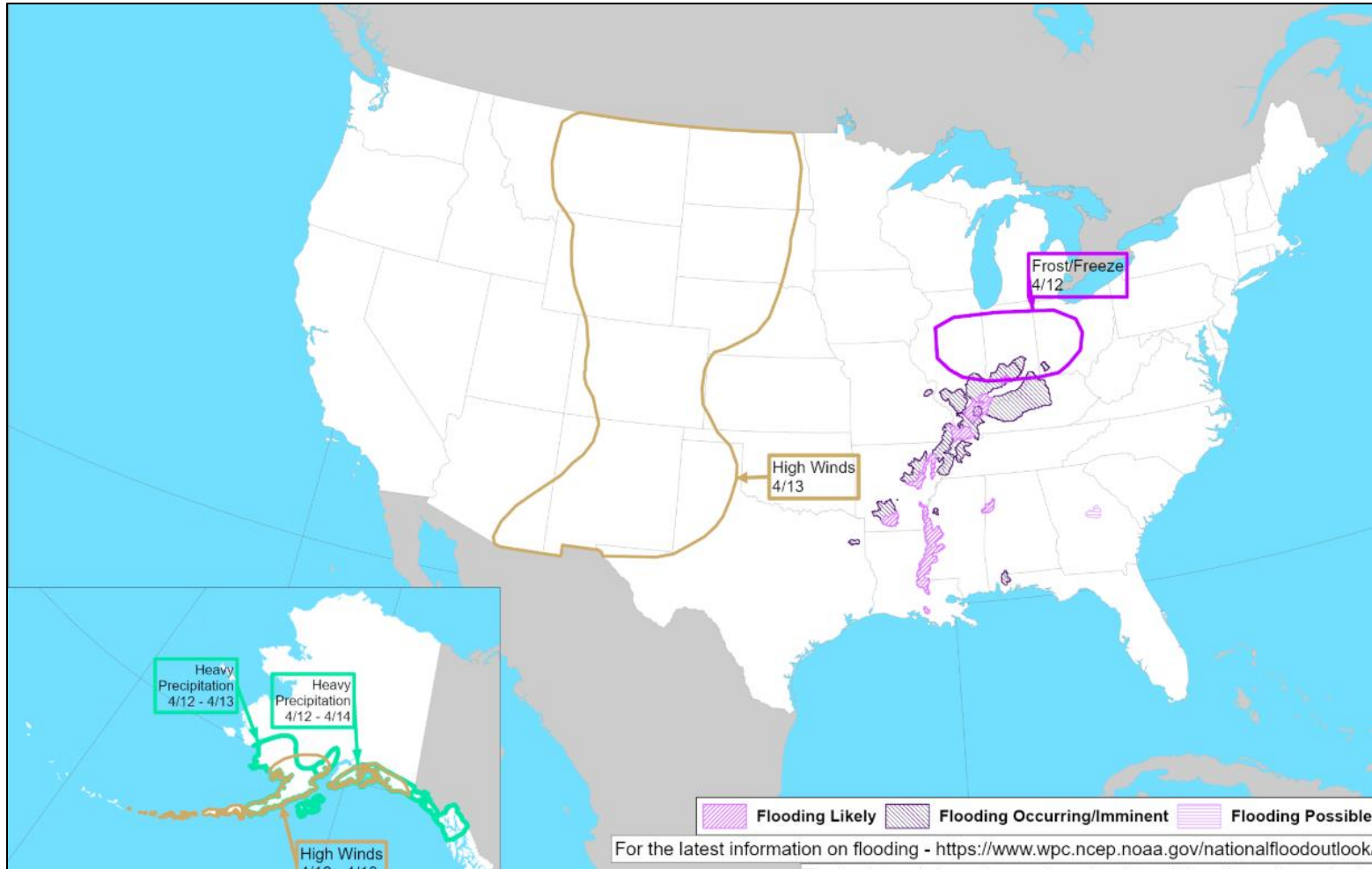
National Weather Forecast

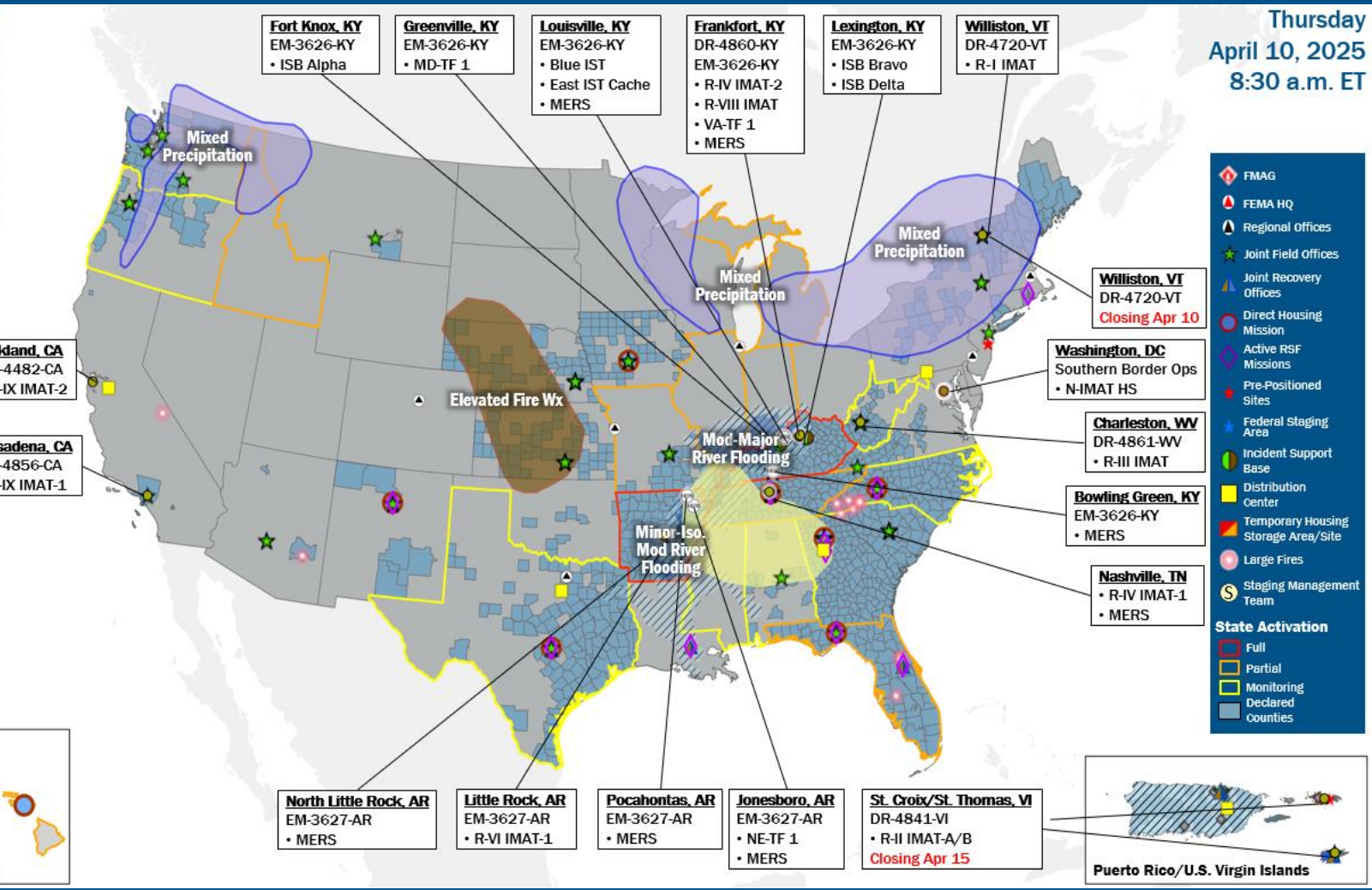
