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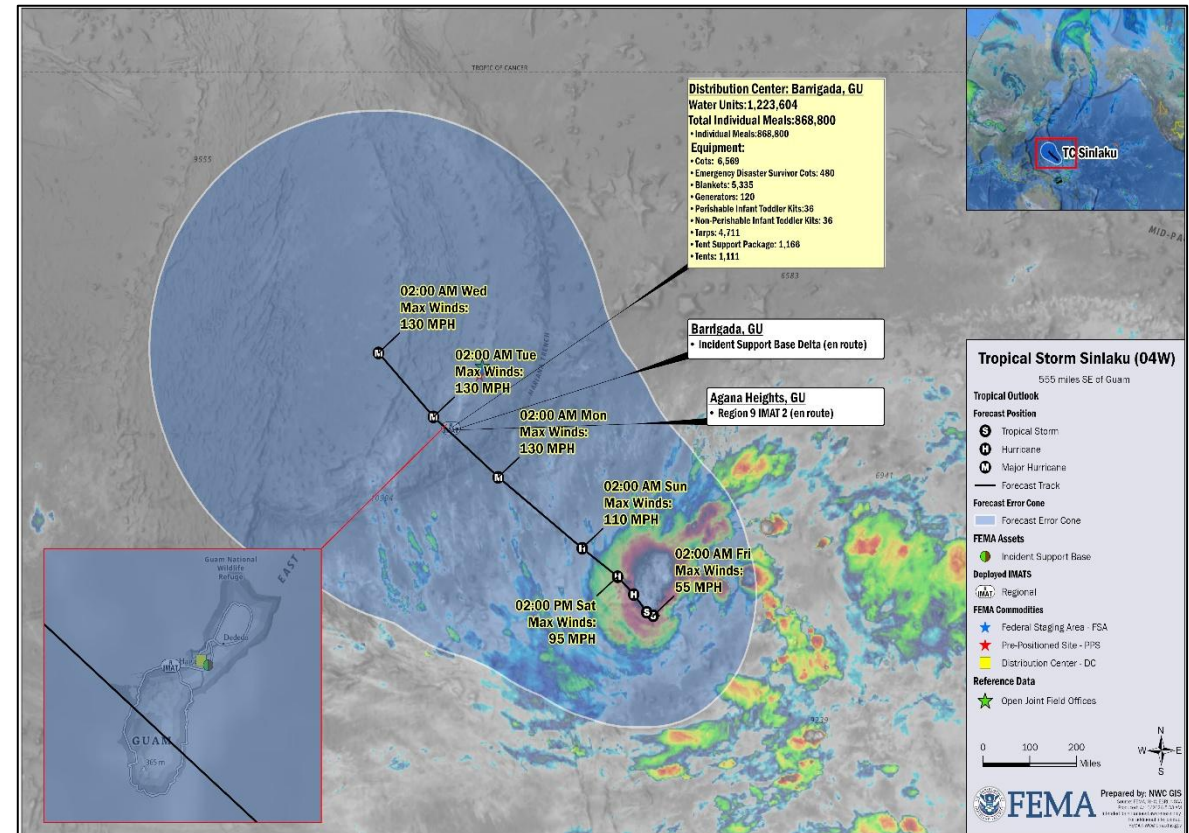
Tropical Storm Sinlaku – Western Pacific

Situation: (Advisory #6, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 570 miles SE of Guam
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Moving W at 2 mph
- System is forecast to intensify over the next several days, possibly becoming a typhoon tomorrow
- Current path brings Sinlaku near Guam by Monday Evening Chst
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward from the center up to 140 miles to the north and up to 80 miles to the south

Potential Hazards:

- Widespread Power Outages, Downed Trees, Debris
- Rainfall totals between 15-20 inches possible
- Flash Flooding and Landslides possible in areas of steep terrain.

Situation: Tropical Storm Sinlaku is forecast to intensify into a typhoon over the next several days and is expected to impact Guam Sunday. The system is forecast to produce heavy winds and rain, high surf, and potentially life-threatening flooding impacts to the island. Response preparations are underway.

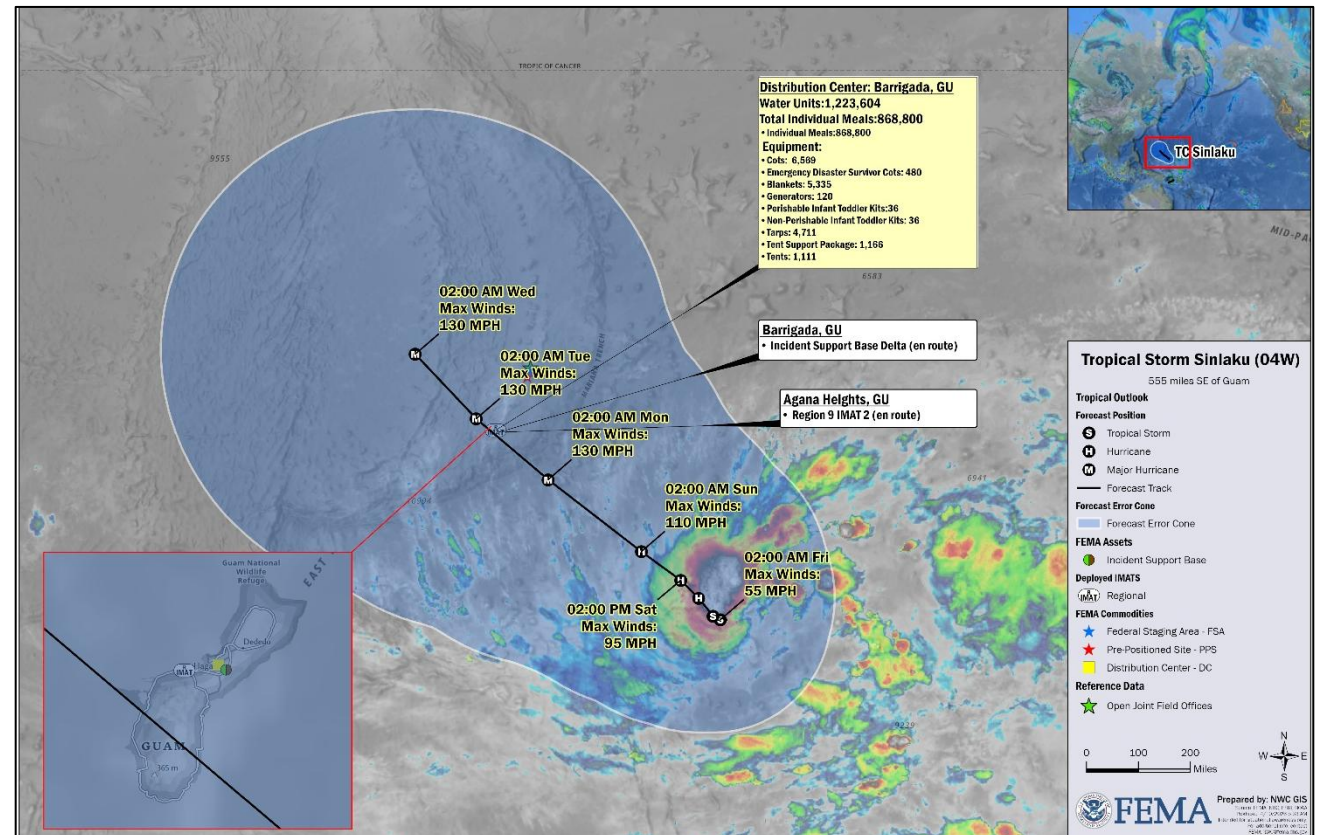

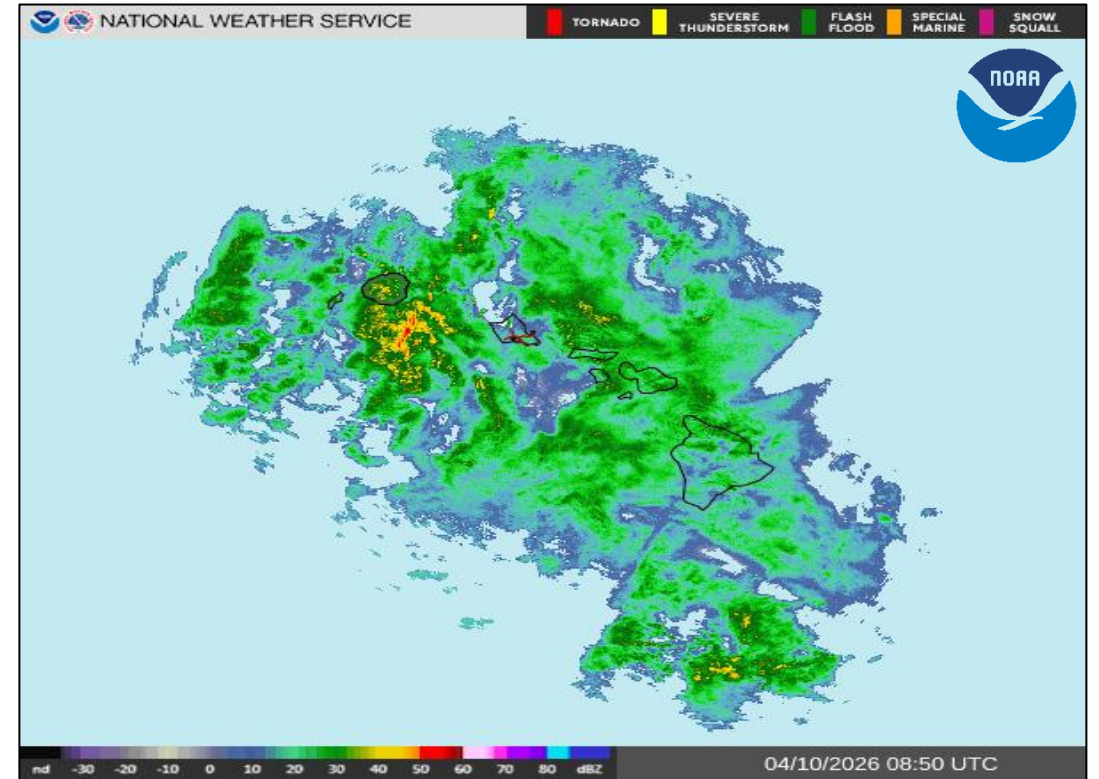


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Excessive Rainfall / Flash Flooding – Hawaii

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Severe Weather – Hawaii

Situation: Tropical moisture will bring periods of heavy rainfall, thunderstorms, and an increased flash flooding risk. A Flash Flood Warning is in effect for the island of Kauai and Flood Watches remain in effect for all Hawaiian Islands through this afternoon. Heavy winds are forecast across the island with power outages and downed trees expected.

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA R9 SPOTREP Update #3, as of 11:53 p.m. ET, Apr 9)

Food, Hydration, Shelter: (ARC Report, as of 6:51 p.m. ET, Apr 10)

- Honolulu County: 5 shelters open / 53 occupants
- Maui County: 3 shelters open / 35 occupants
- Hawaii County: 1 shelter opened / 13 occupants

State / Local Response:

- HI SEOC is at Full Activation (Kona Low / Wildfire Recovery / Severe Weather)
 - Governor requested an Emergency Declaration (IA/PA)

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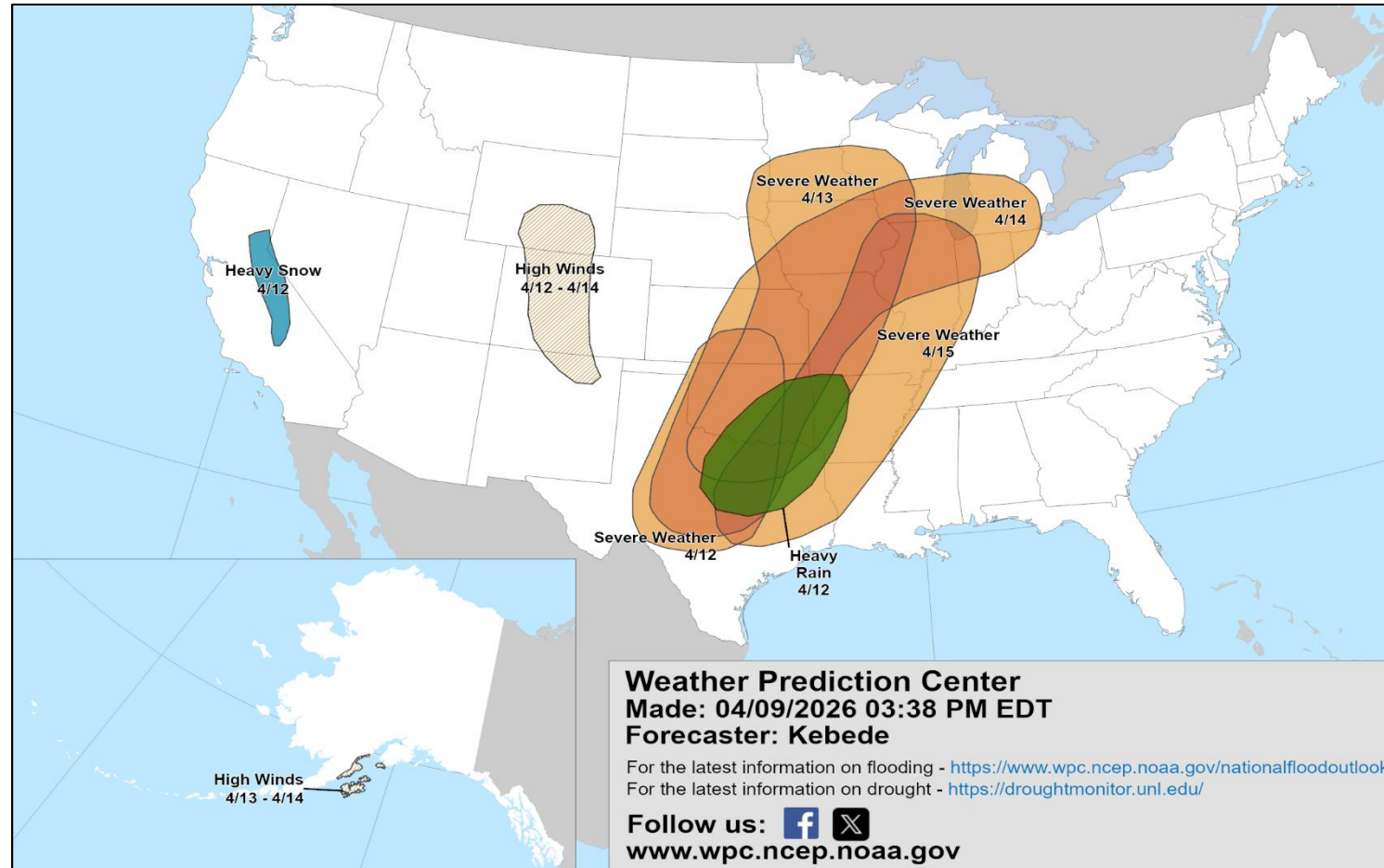
National Weather Forecast

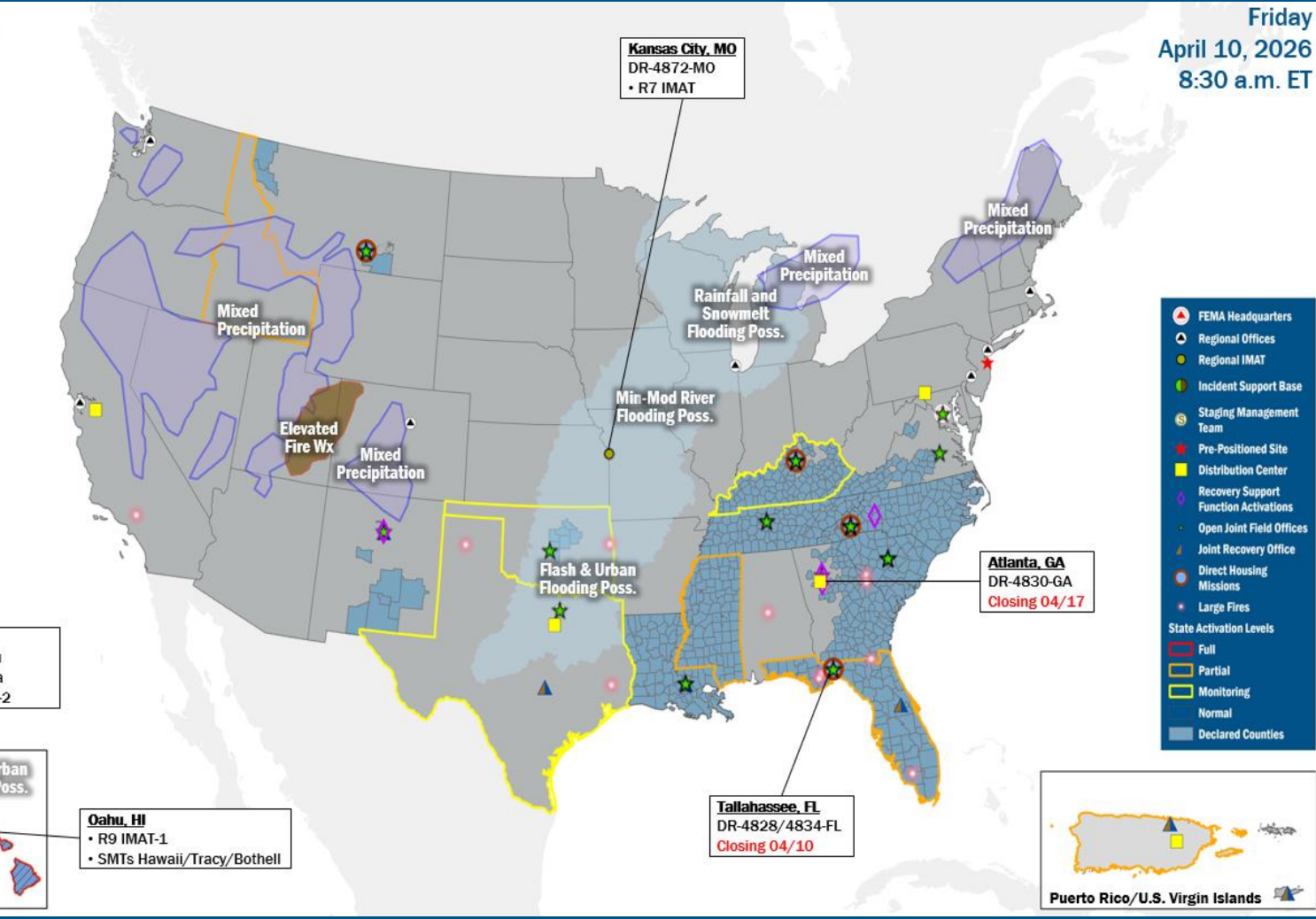

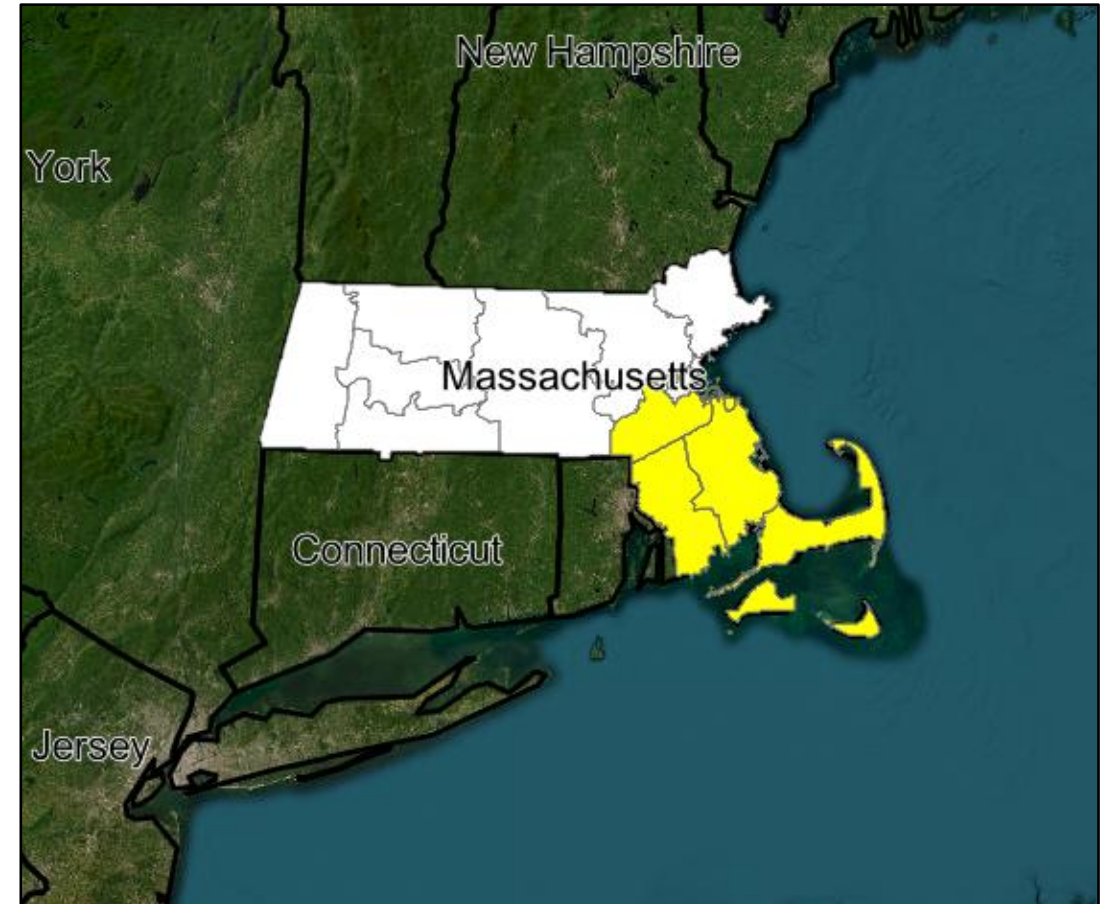

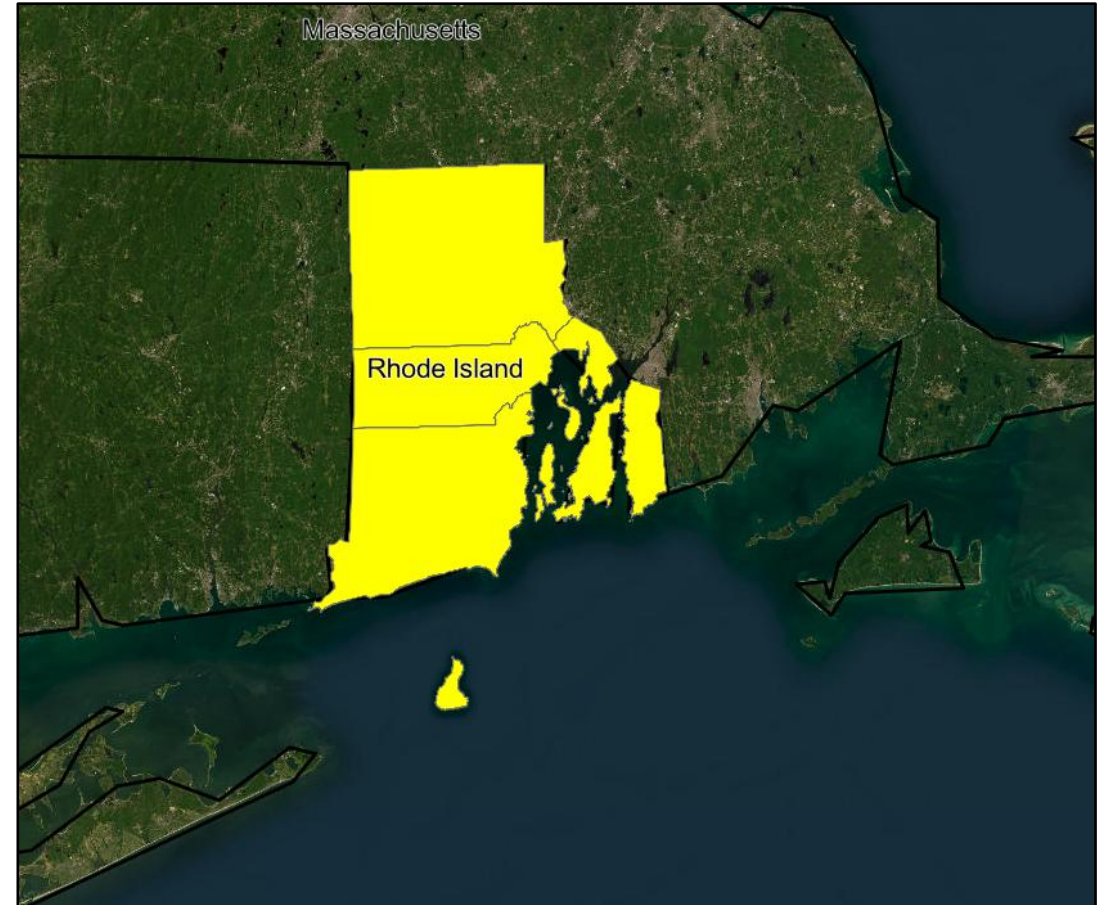
