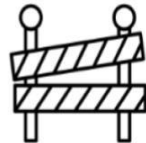


Generalized flooding with water surge along rivers & small streams.

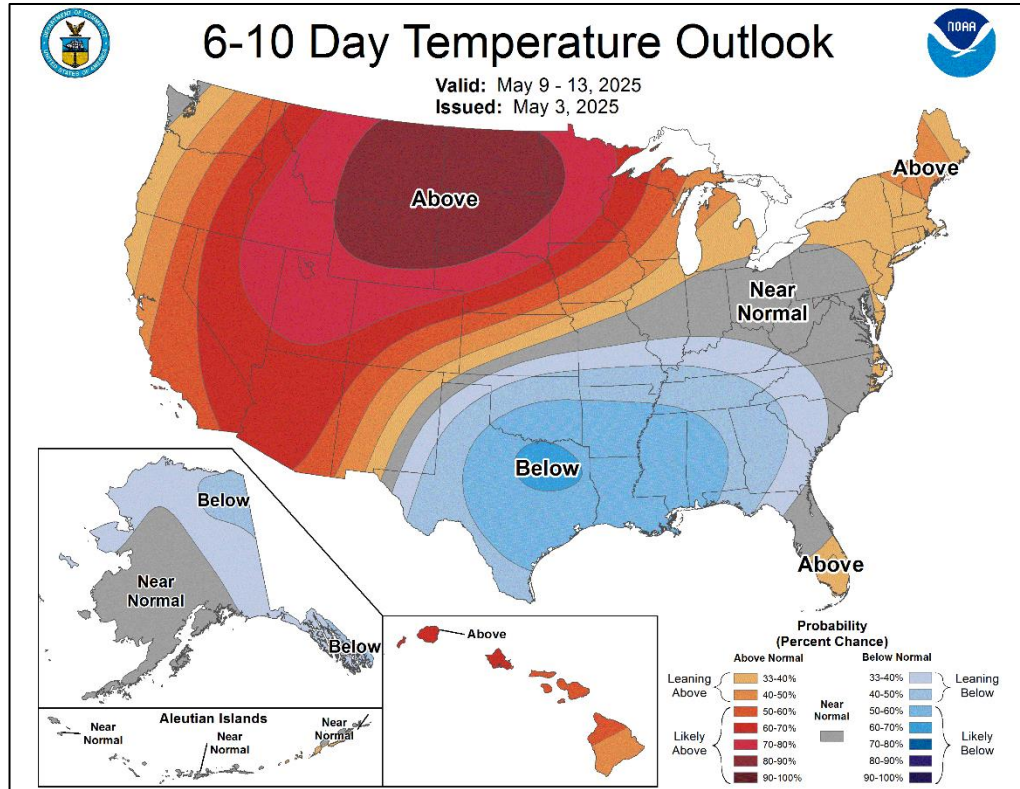

Severe Weather Outlook

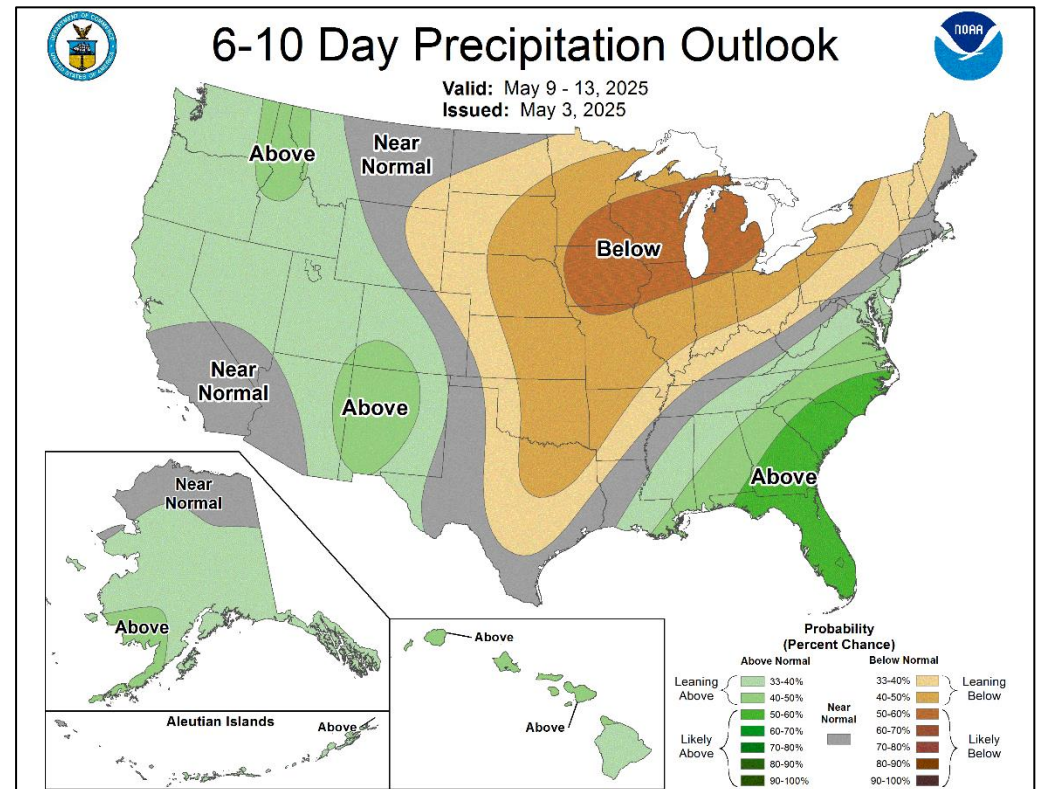

6-10 Day Precipitation Probability

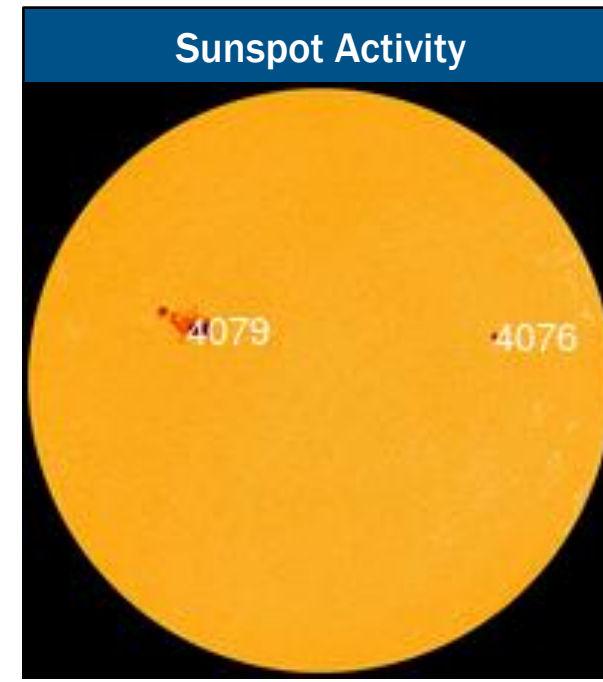
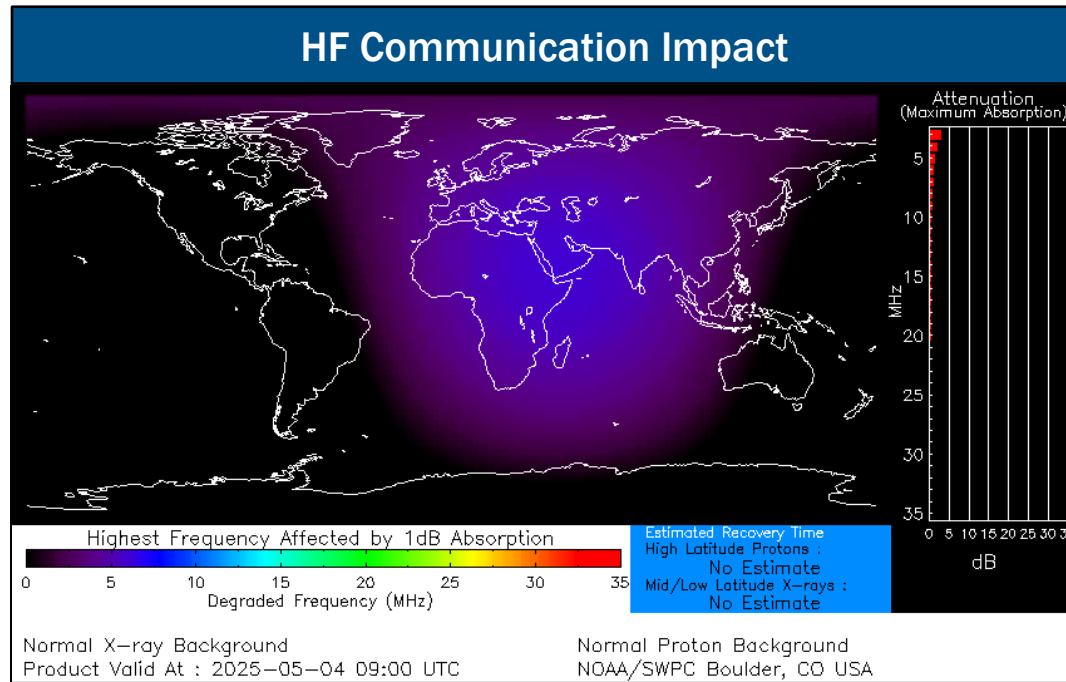

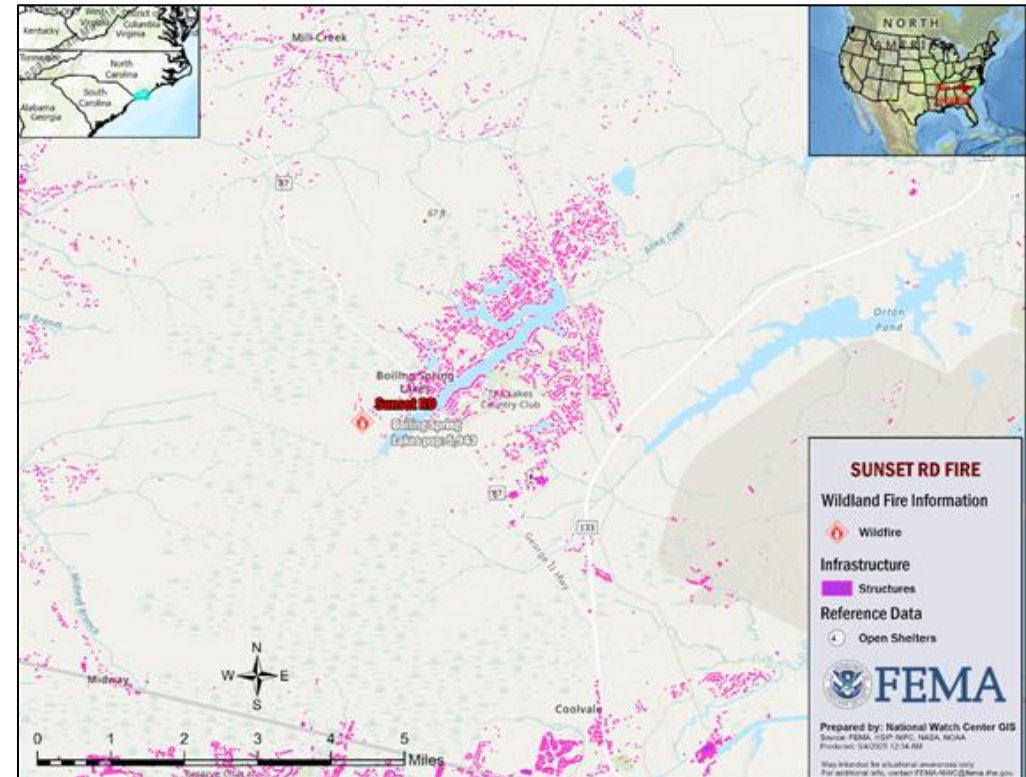
Situation: The FEMA Region IV Regional Administrator has approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Sunset Drive Fire, which has burned 750 acres with 0% containment. The fire is burning on state and private land in and around the communities of Boiling Spring Lakes (est. pop 7k). Aside from the FMAG approval, no additional federal assistance has been requested.

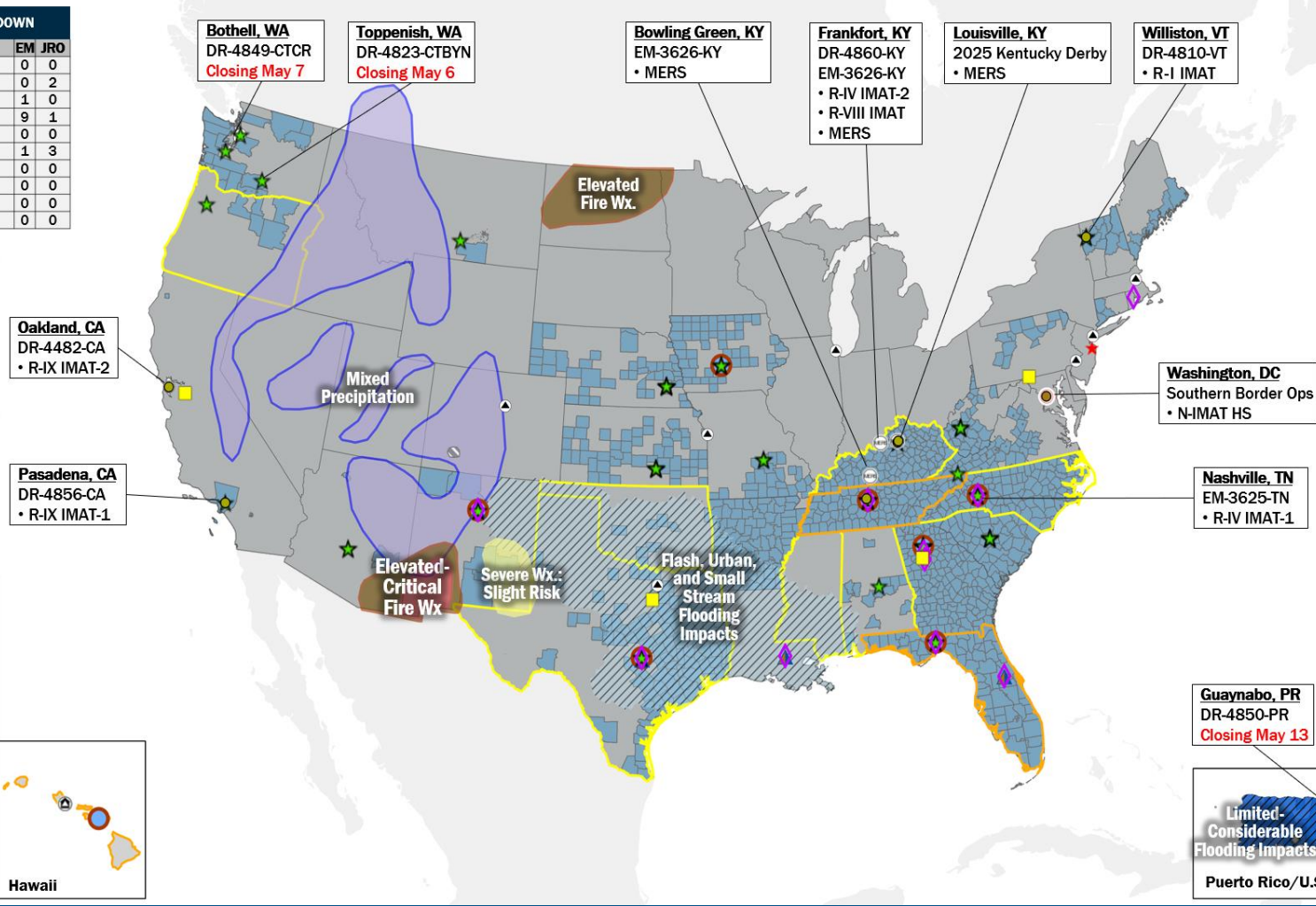
