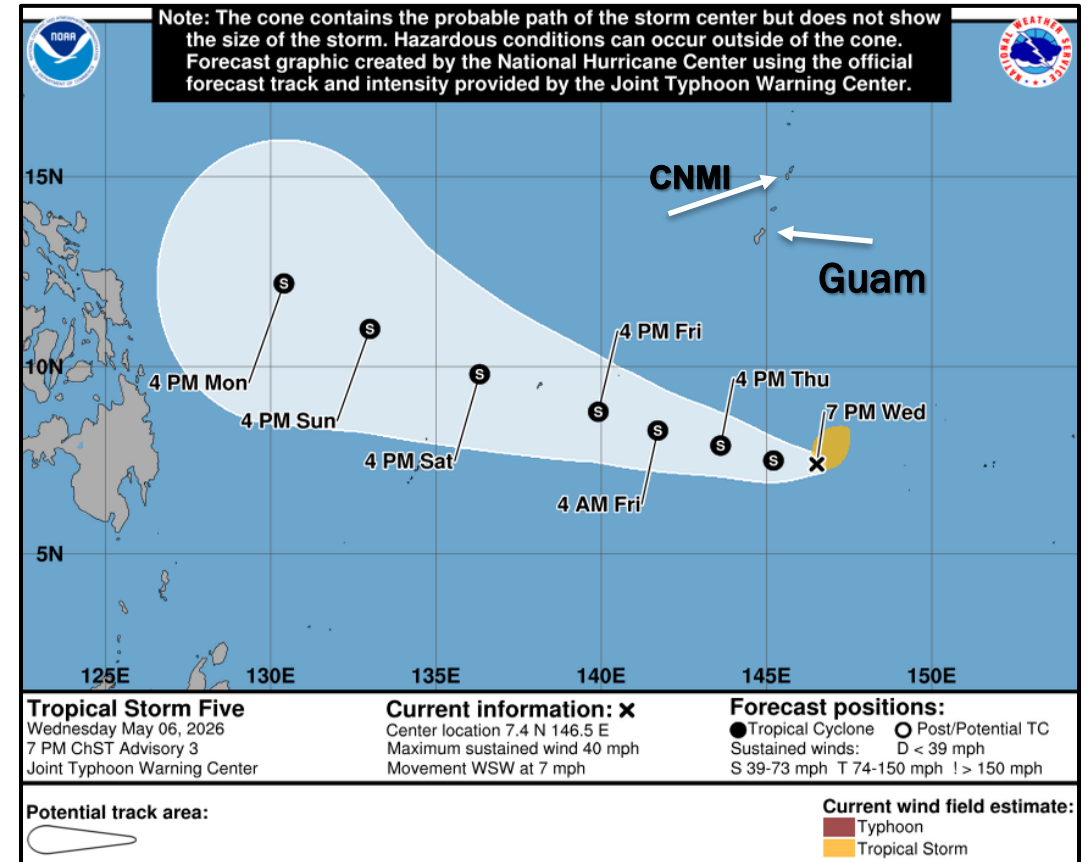

Situation: (Advisory #3, as of 7:00 a.m. ET)

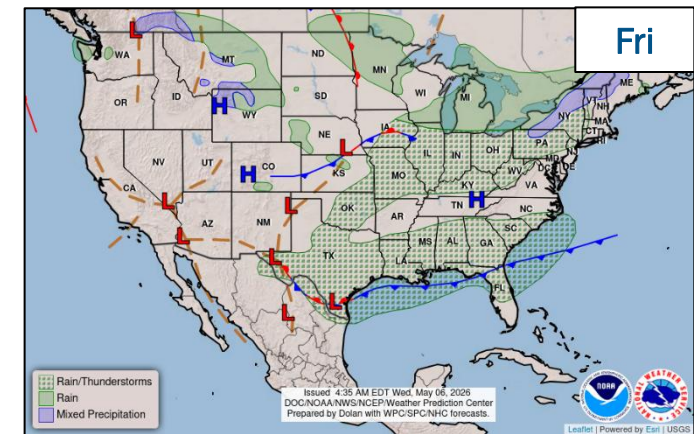
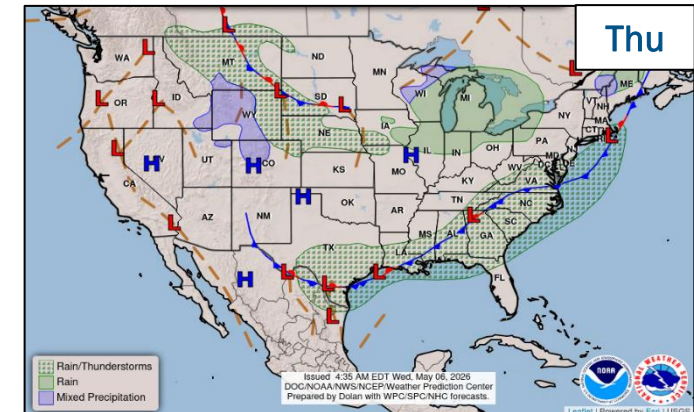
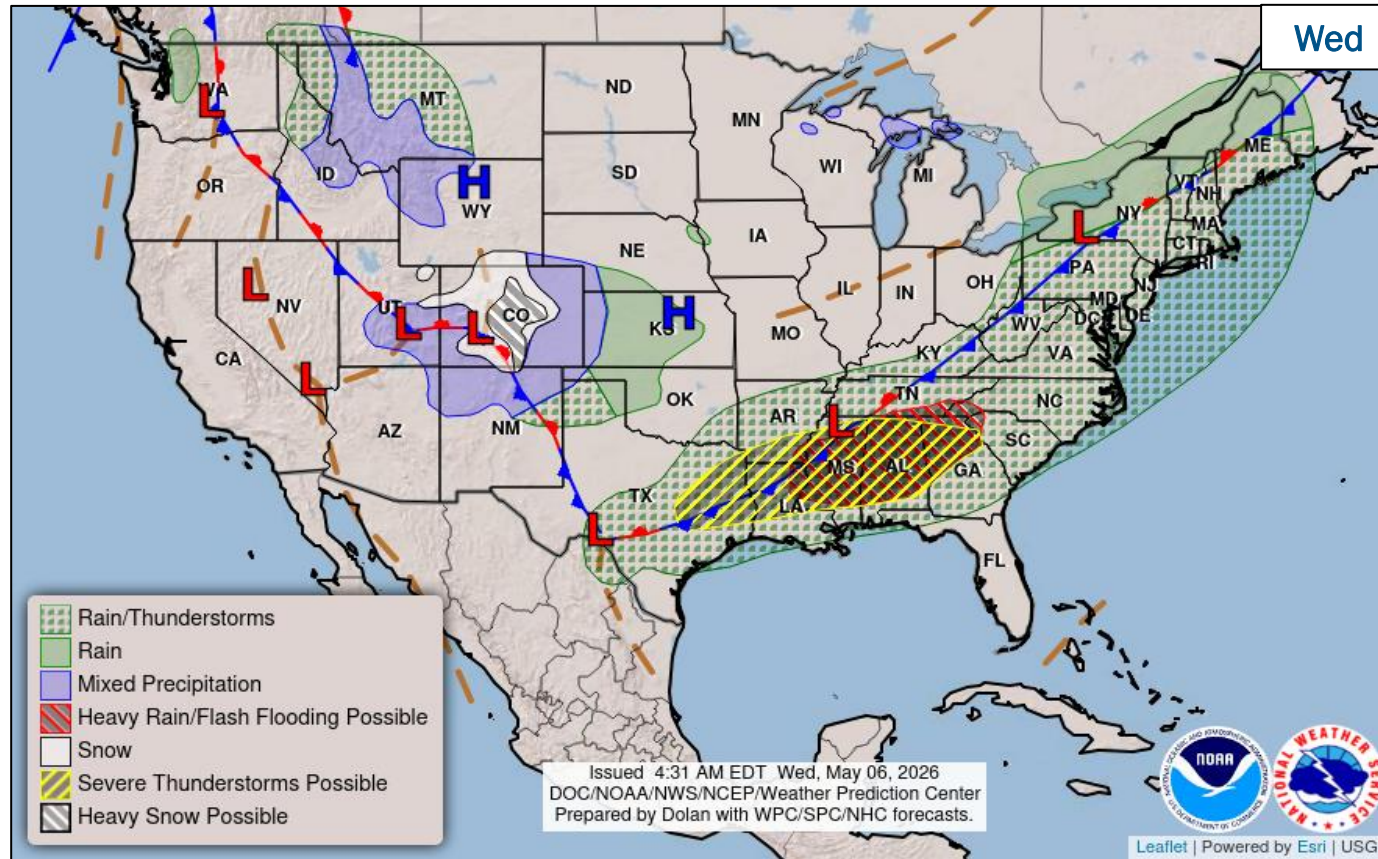
- Located 90 miles WSW of Satawal
- Located 435 miles SSE of Guam
- Tracking WSW at 7 mph
- System is forecast to maintain intensity through tonight, then begin to slowly strengthen tomorrow, possibly becoming a strong tropical storm Friday afternoon
- Maximum sustained winds at 40 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 100 miles from center

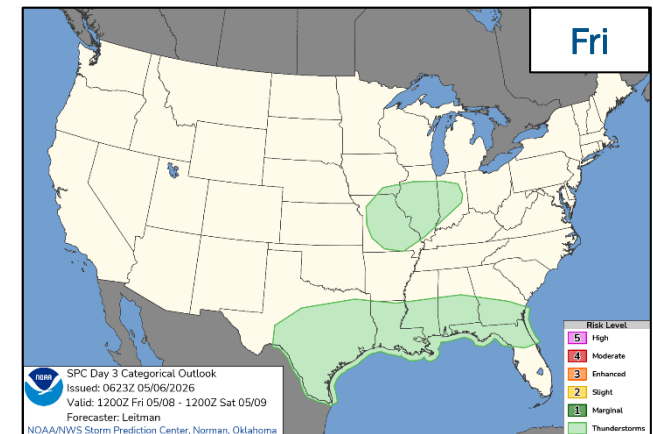
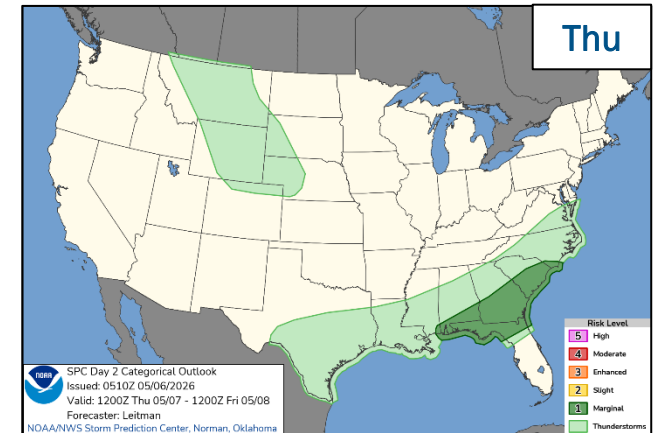
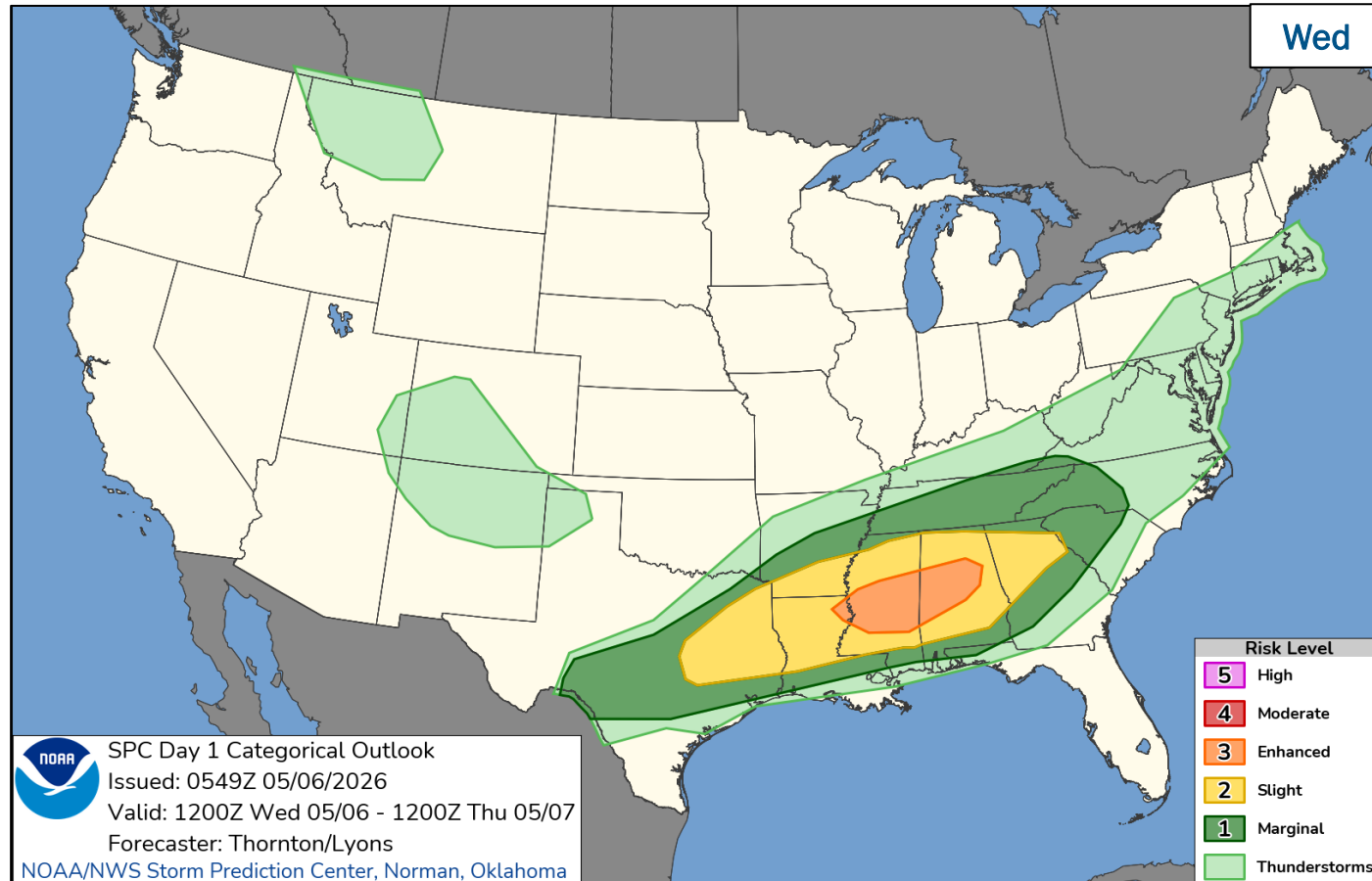
National Weather Forecast

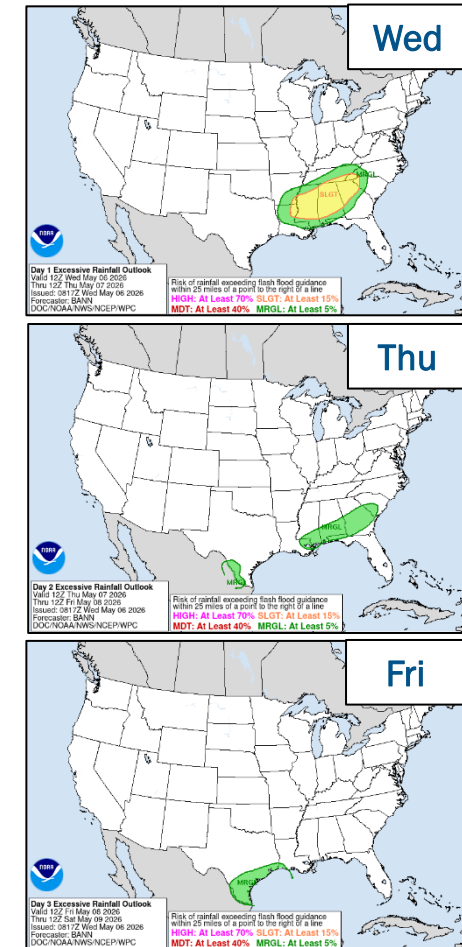
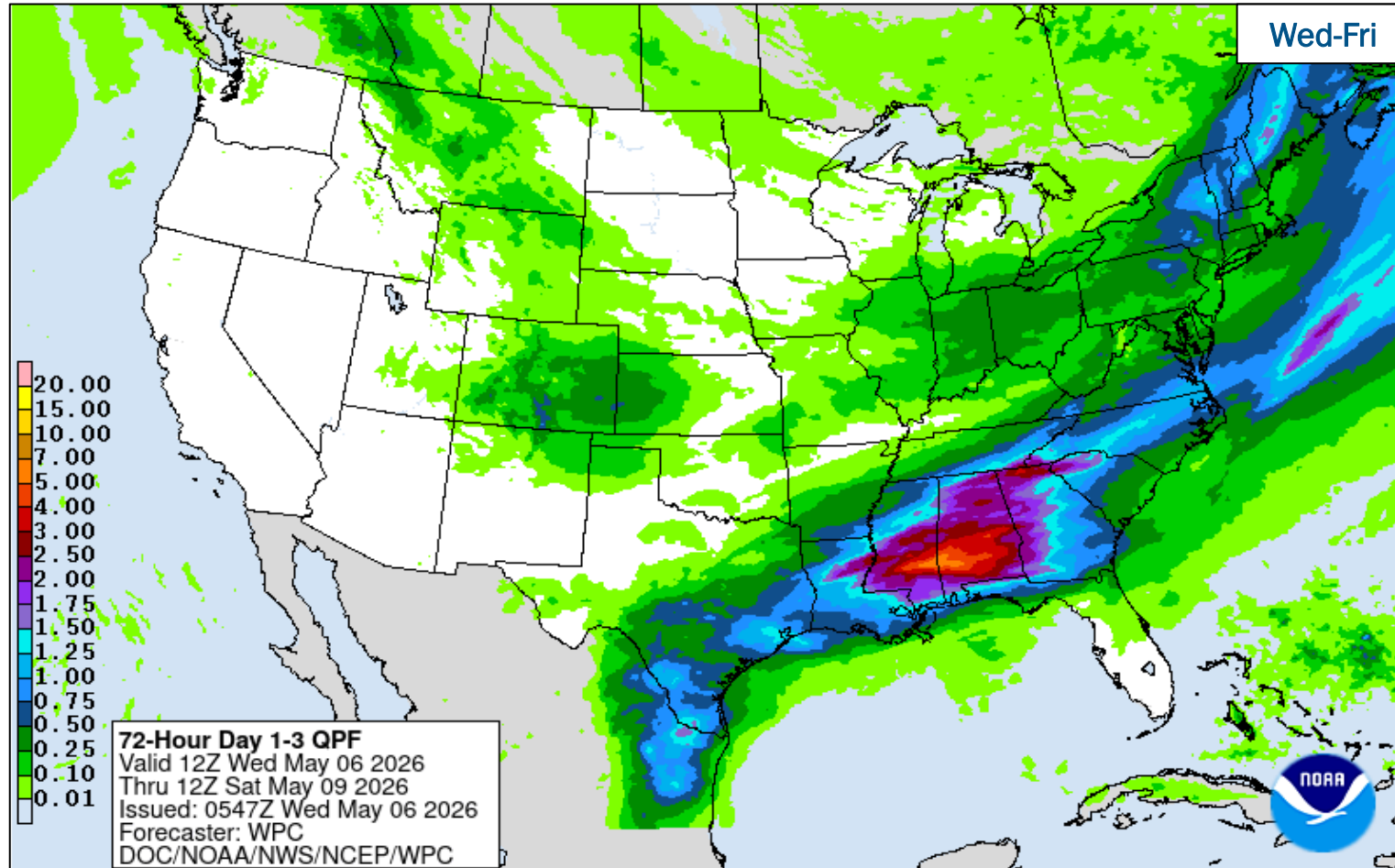
Severe Weather Outlook

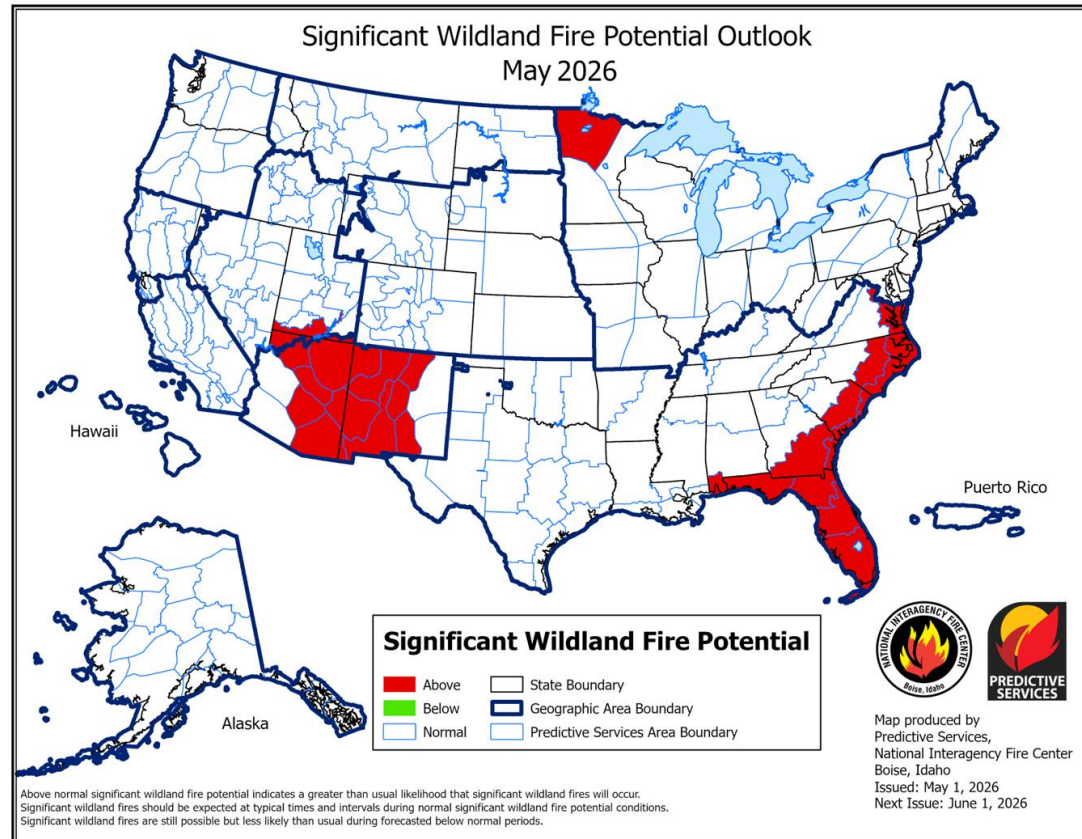

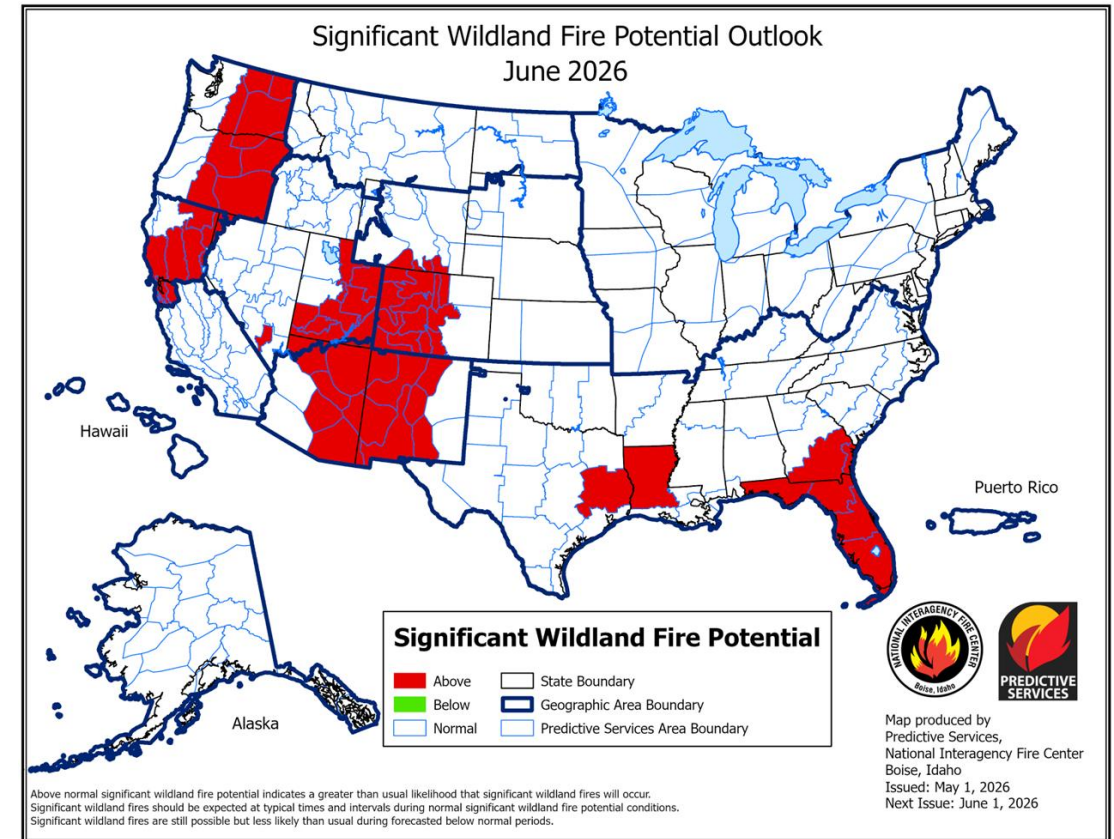
Preparedness Level: 2

PL 3	Wildfire activity ongoing throughout 25% of country; National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC) sets priorities, allocates resources, and mobilizes assets at national level
PL 4	High levels of fire activity and areas are competing for firefighting resources; 60% of the nation's wildland firefighting resources committed
PL 5	Extremely high levels of fire activity; 80% of nation's firefighting resources committed

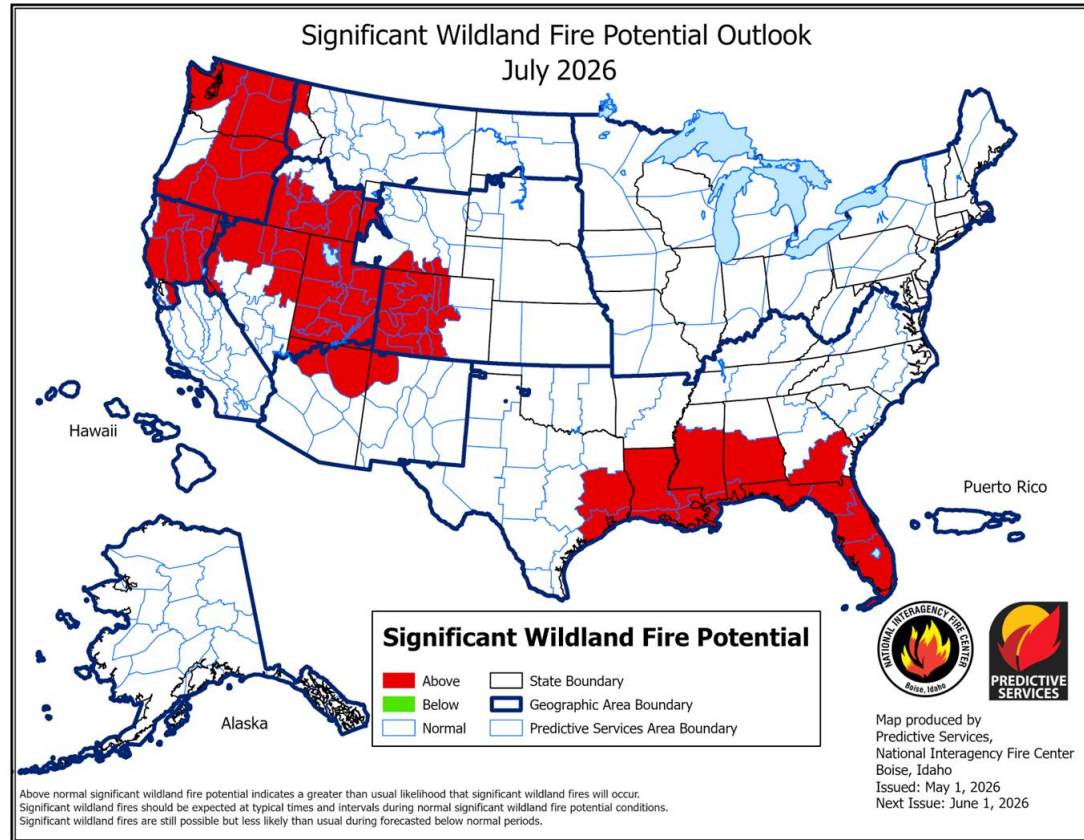

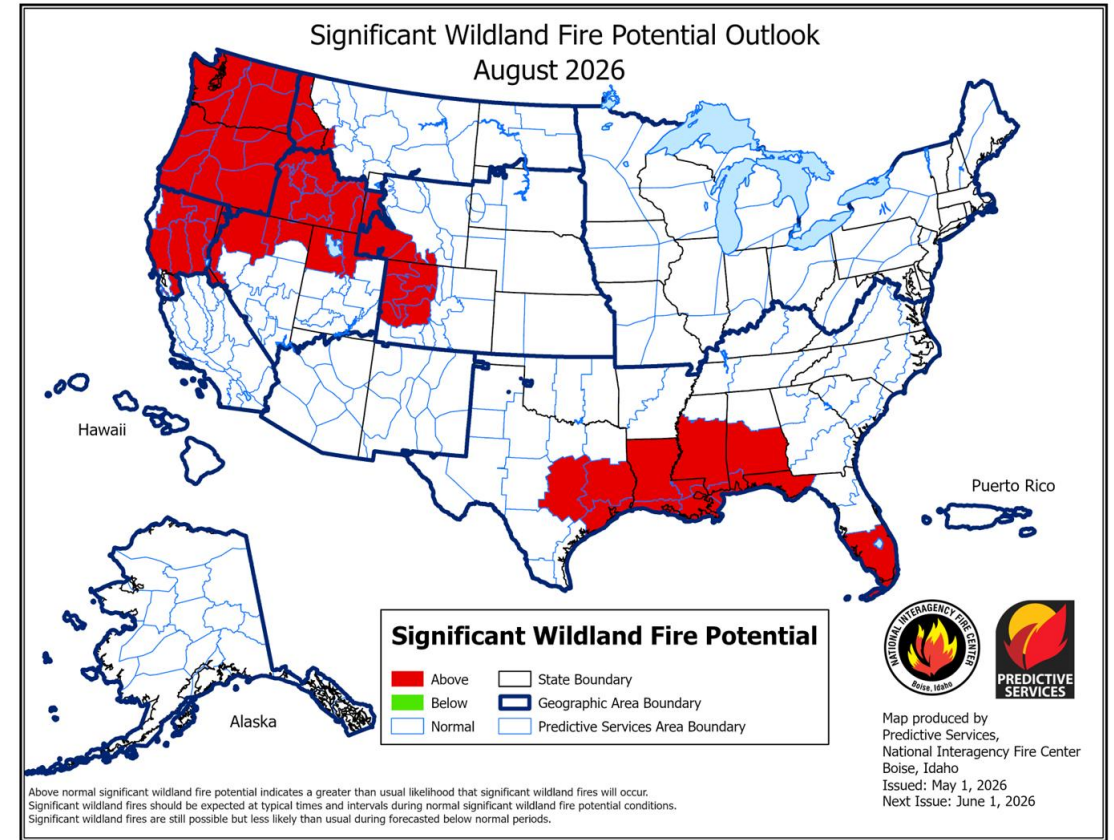
