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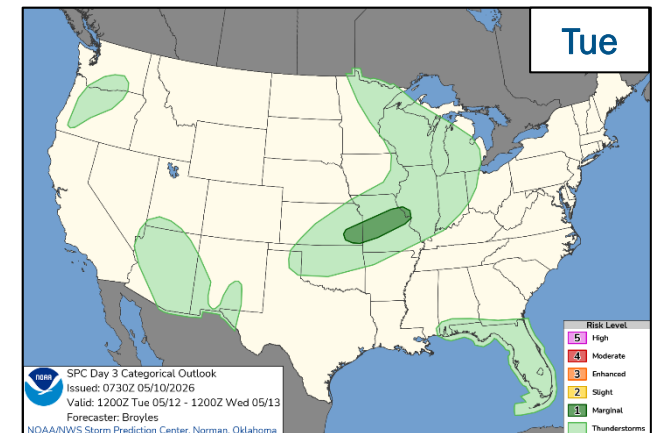
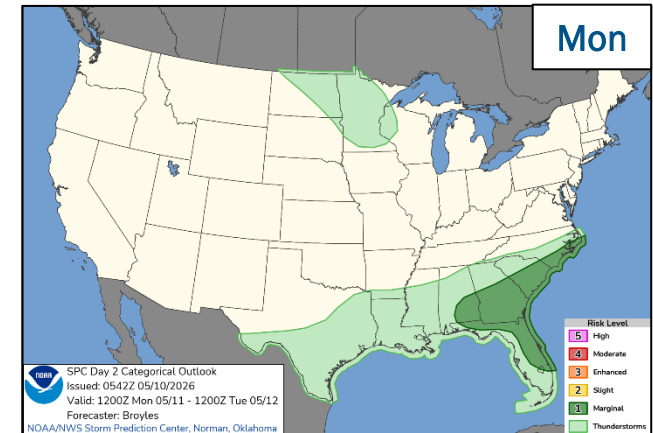
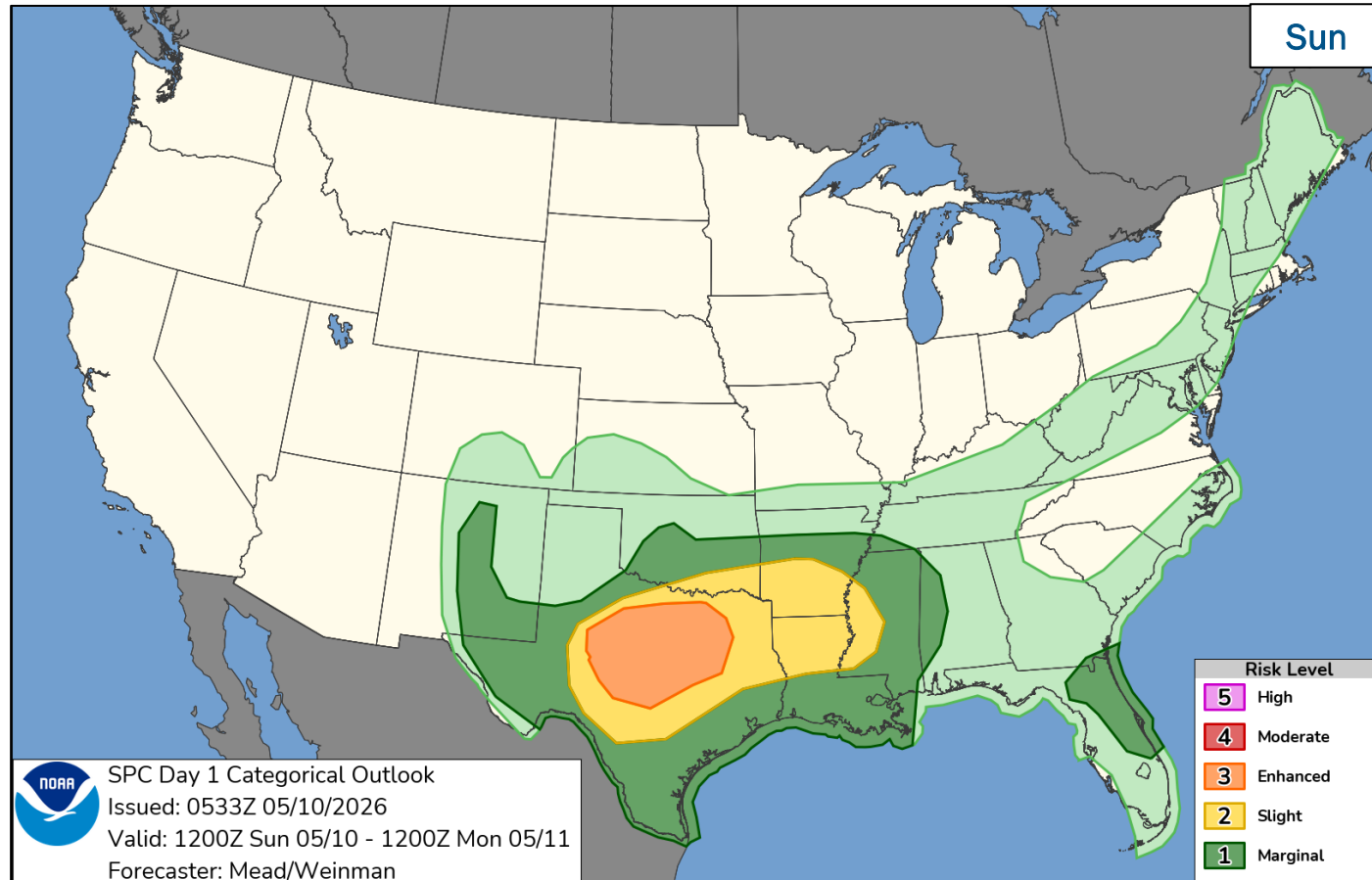
National Weather Forecast



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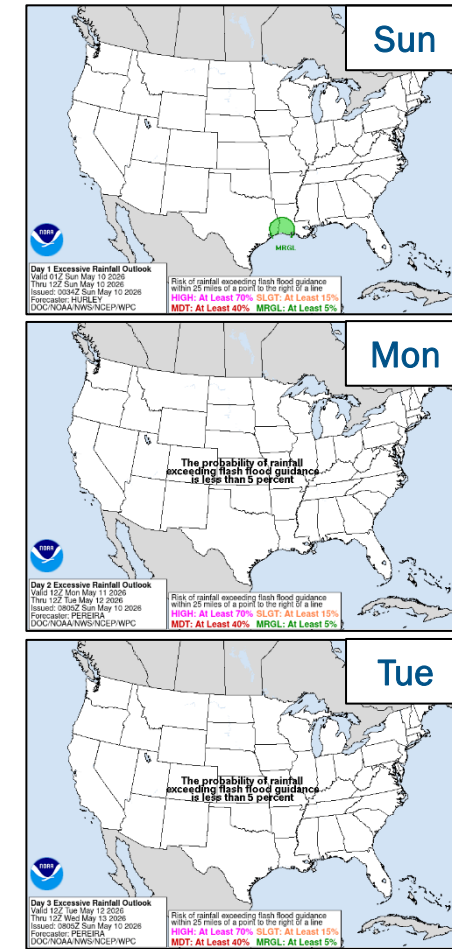
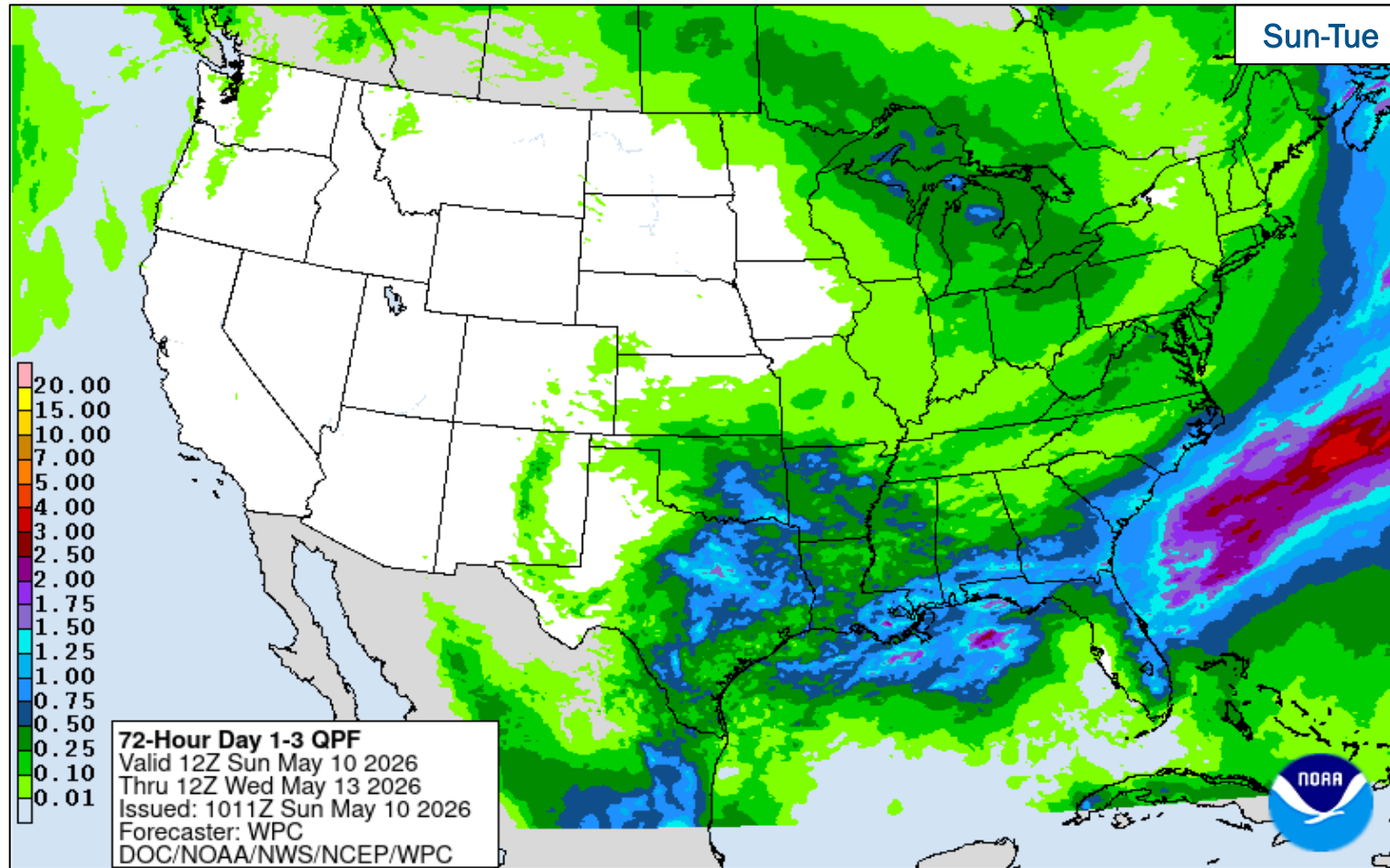
Severe Weather Outlook



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Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



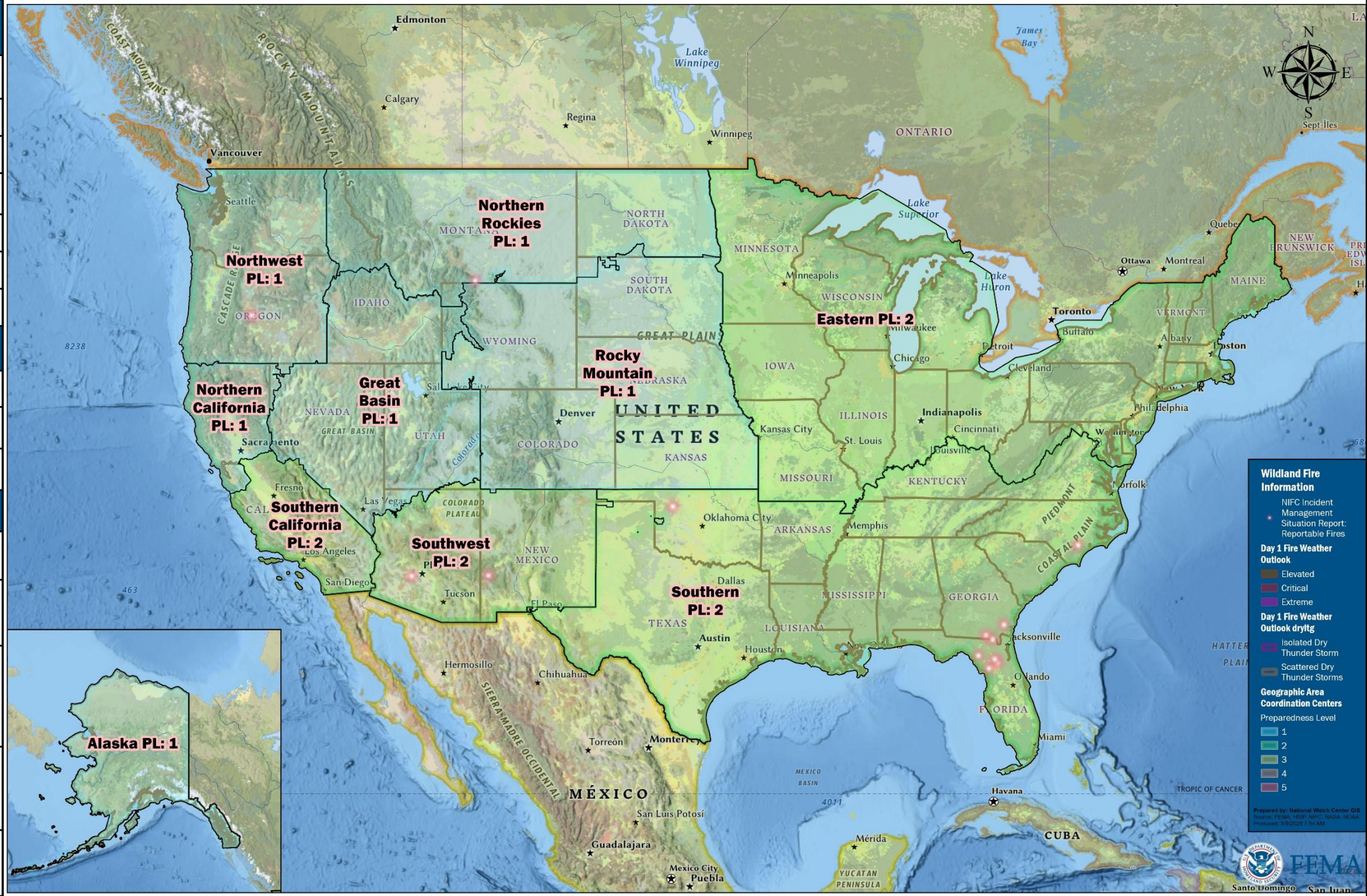
