




Spring Flooding – RFC River Forecasts / Snow Water Equivalent

Spring Flooding – Alaska River Flood Outlook




Flood Hazard Messages

Yukon River-Ice jams have been reported upstream of Fort Yukon with major flooding observed. There have been reports of the ice moving through the Middle Yukon. Moderate flooding is possible along much of the Yukon River in the next 48 hours.

Kuskokwim River-Ice jams have been reported downstream of Napaimute. As the breakup front continues to move downstream along the Kuskokwim, moderate flooding remains possible.


Warmer temperatures are causing snowmelt and localized flooding from Moose Creek in Glennallen and along the old Edgerton Highway.

National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall


