Situation: *(as of 7:30 a.m. ET)*

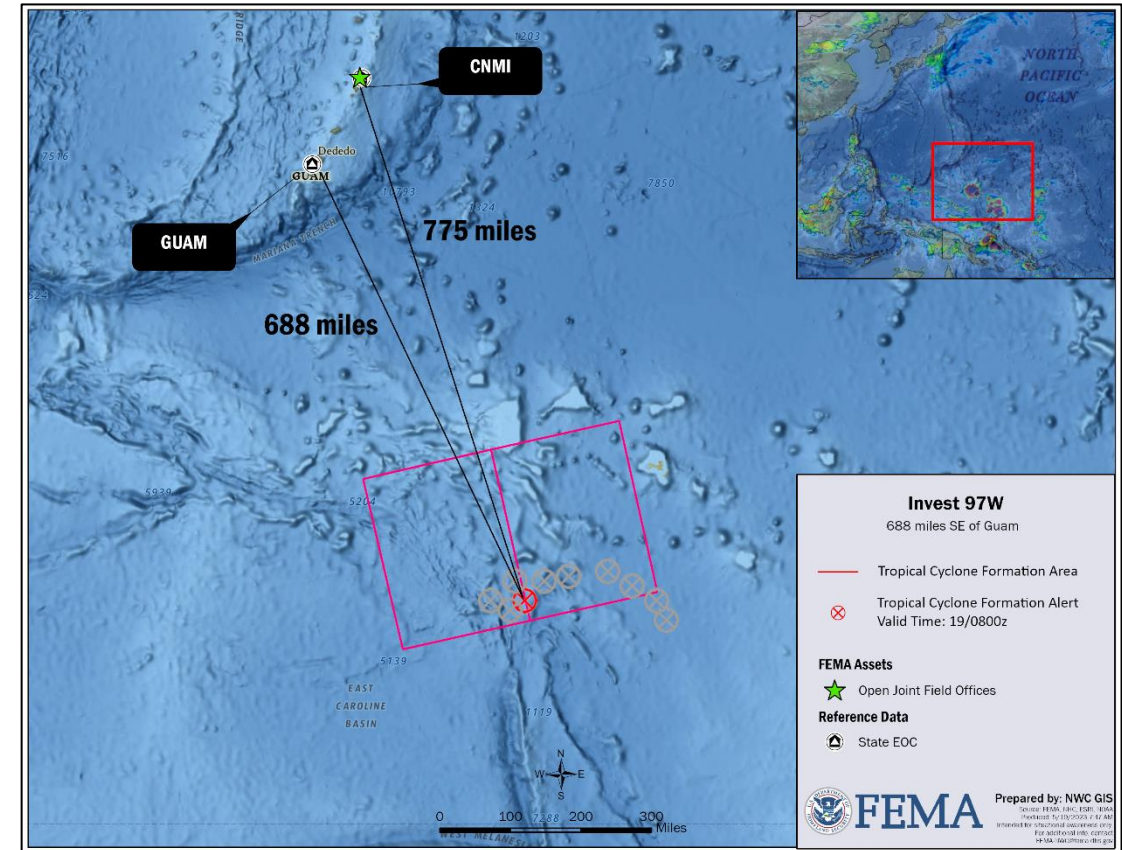
- 456 miles SSE of Guam and SW of Chuuk State
- Moving NNW at 6 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 20-25mph
- Forecast to become a tropical cyclone in the next 12 to 36 hours

Potential Impacts:

- Heavy rain for the Marianas Monday through Wednesday
- 5 to 9 inches is expected, with locally higher totals possible

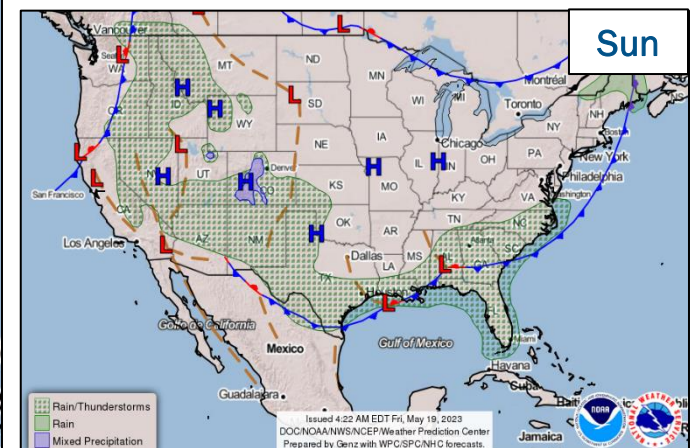
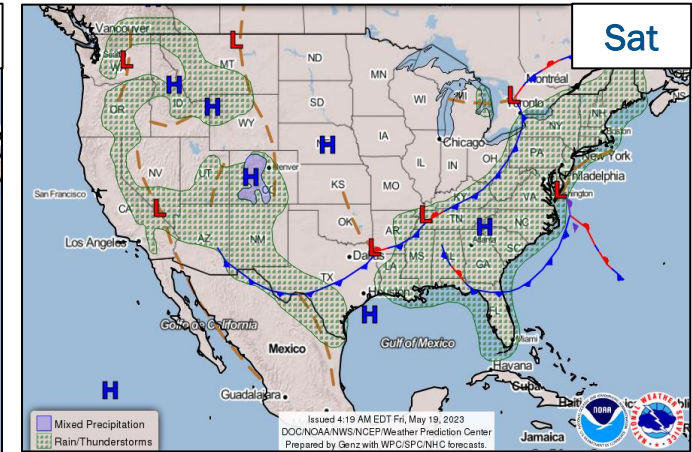
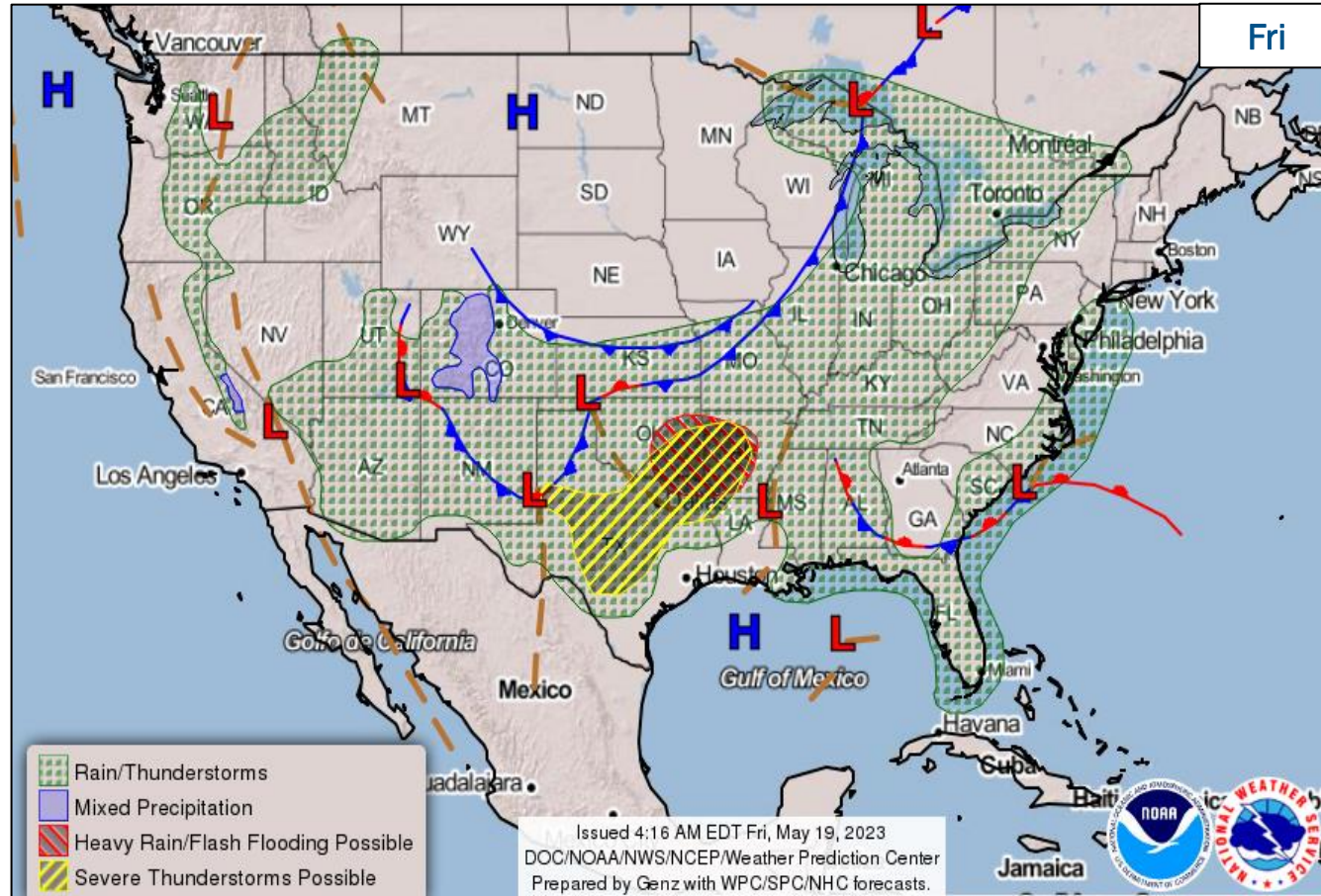

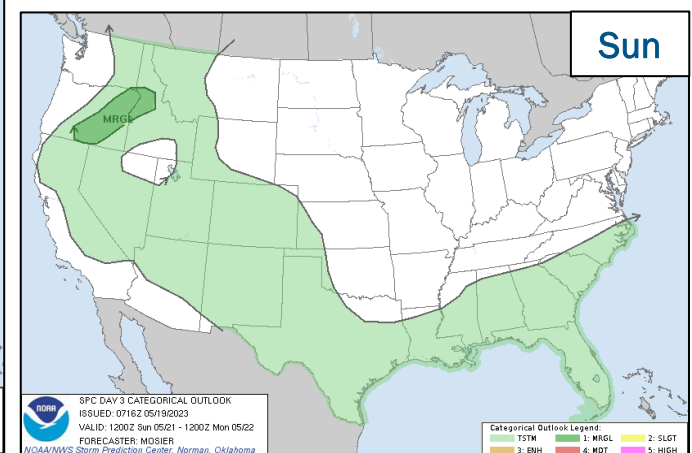
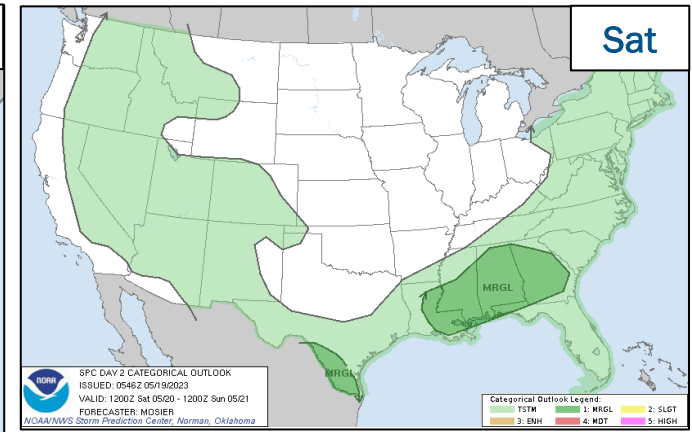
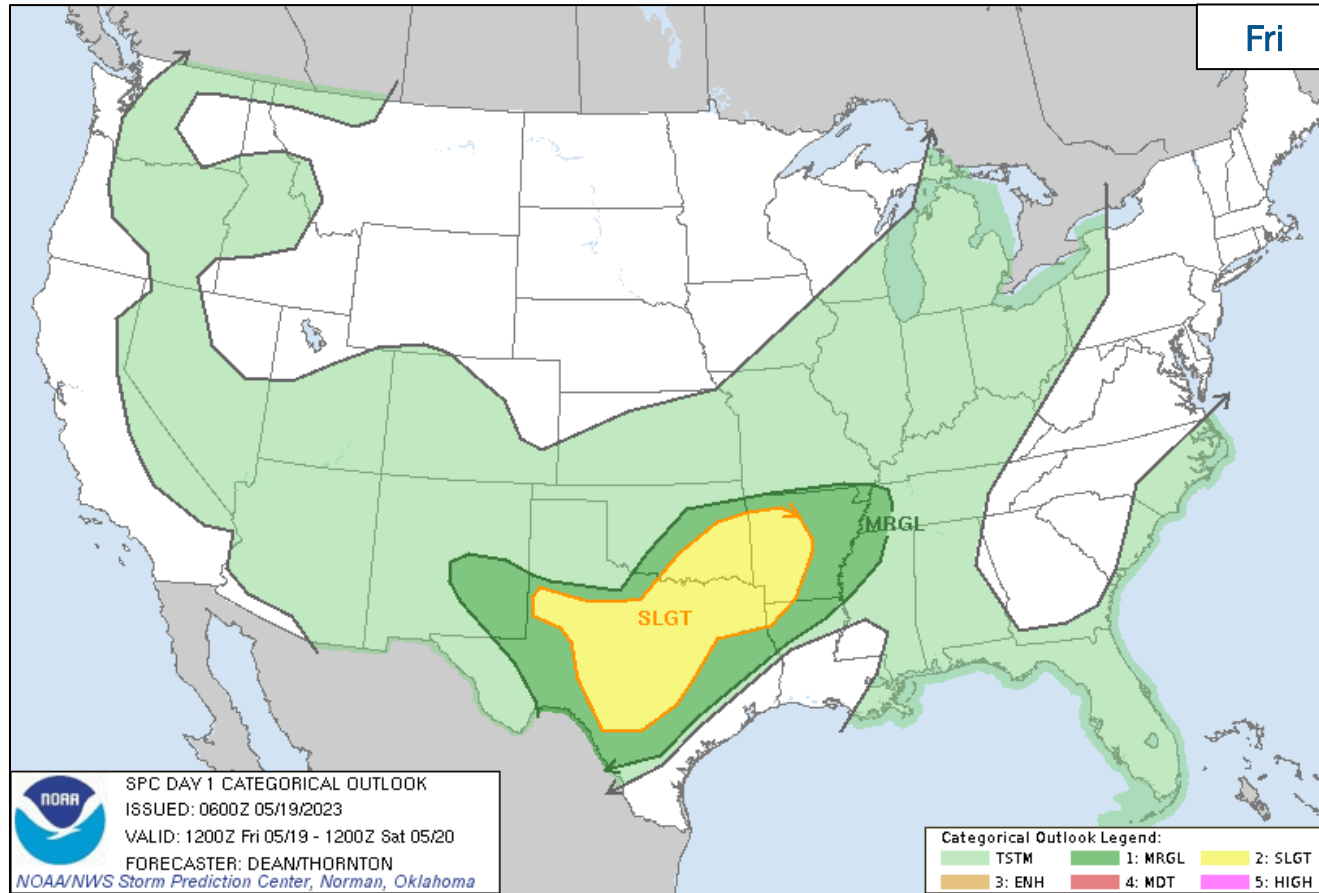
National Weather Forecast

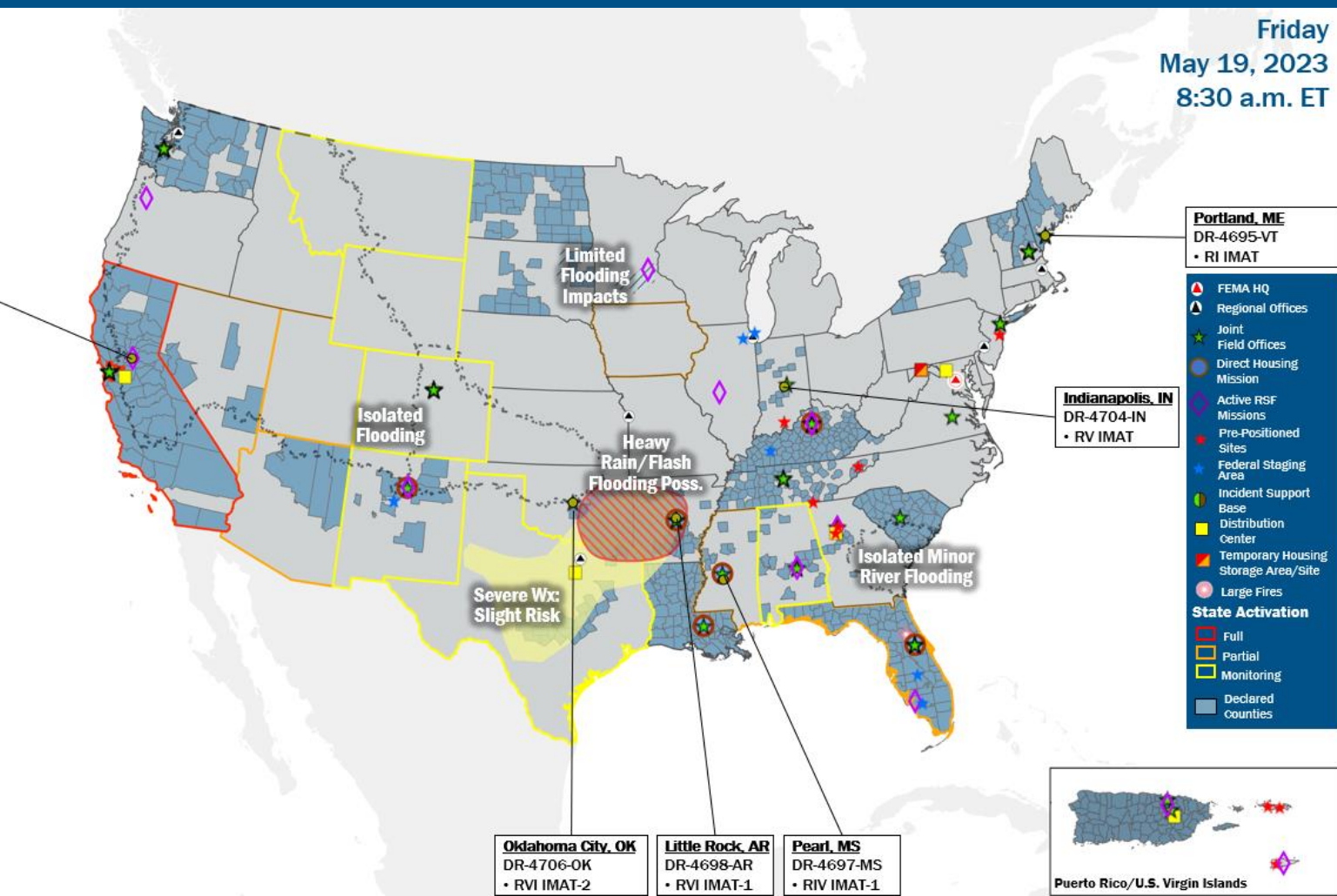

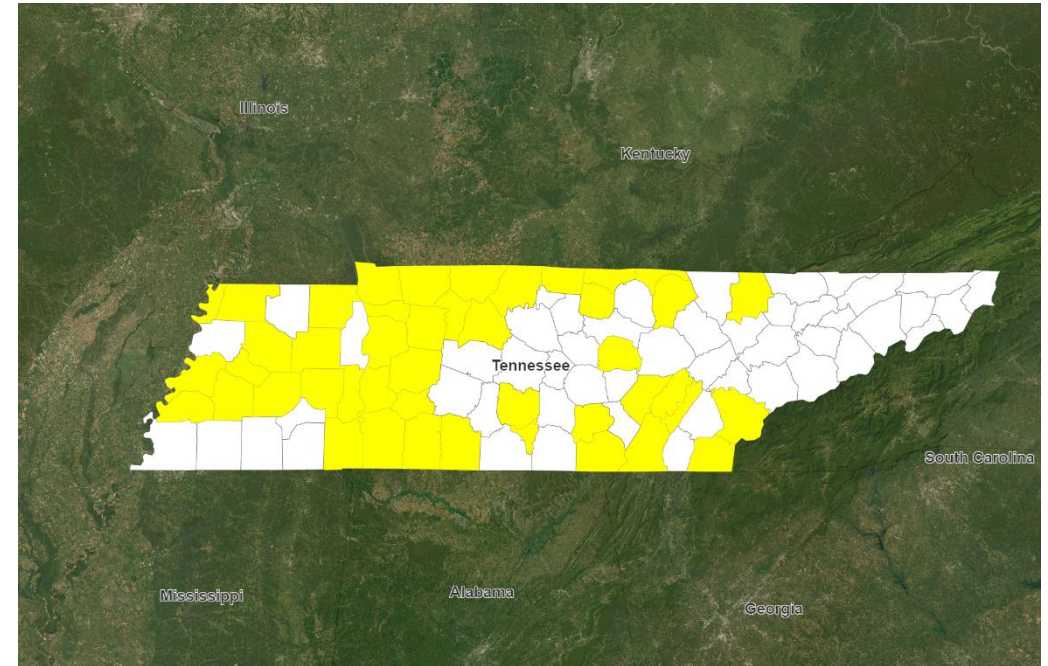
