Tropical Storm Mawar – Guam/CNMI Preparation

Situation: (Advisory #6 as of May 21, 6:02 a.m. ET)

Located 460 miles SSE of Guam and 530 miles SSE of Saipan moving NNW at 10 mph with maximum sustained winds of 70 mph. It is expected to reach CNMI as a CAT-2 typhoon Tuesday through Wednesday night with maximum sustained winds of 110 gusting to 130 mph. Typhoon Watch remains in effect for Guam, Rota, Tinian, and Saipan.








National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Long Range Outlooks – May 25-29



6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability
