Super Typhoon Mawar - Guam/CNMI

Situation: (Advisory #22, as of 6:00 a.m. ET)

- 195 miles NNW of Guam
- Moving WNW at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 165 mph (CAT 5)
- Rainfall: 1-3 inches of additional rain is possible
- HLT has issued the last report on Mawar

Super Typhoon Mawar - Guam/CNMI

Situation: (HLT Advisory #22, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

Typhoon force winds has diminished early this morning on Guam and Rota. Mawar is expected to have a slight increase in forward speed over the next 24 hours with little change in strength as it moves away from Guam. Tropical cyclone watches and warnings are no longer in effect. Flood Watches are in effect for Guam, Rota, Tinian, and Saipan.

Lifelines: (SLB #1, as of 7:30 a.m. ET)

- Safety and Security: Mandatory evacuations; schools and government offices closed
- Food, Water, Shelter: GU: 21 (+11) shelters open; CNMI: 13 (+6) shelters open combined total of 2,062 (+1,135) occupants
- Health and Medical: 10+ minor injuries reported: treated & released
- Energy: GU nearly all critical facilities have back-up generator installed; 62 generators enroute to Guam
- Approximately 51,000 (98%) customers are without power in Guam; 942 (100%) customers are without power in Rota;
- Transportation: CNMI 2 of 3 airports remain open with daytime operations only; GU Andersen Air Force Base is operational for rotary wing only; Won Pat International Airport remains closed with a 6/1 estimate for reopening
- GU and CNMI ports at condition ZULU (closed to all traffic); major transportation routes and hubs have been shut down



- GU EOC at Full Activation; Governor declared a State of Emergency
- CNMI EOC at Partial Activation (Rota is at Full Activation)
- GU, CNMI, and military bases placed at Condition of Readiness (COR) 1


- Region IX: RWC at Enhanced Watch; RRCC Rostered; IMAT-1 deployed to GU and CNMI
- ESFs 1,3,4,7,8,10-14, USCG, DCE, USACE SMEs and power Planning and Response Team (PRT) in Guam; DOD LNOs in GU
 and CNMI; DOD DCO supporting from CA; USCG SAR in HI; USACE roofing PRT SMEs in HI
- FEMA HO
- NRCC activated 24/7
- Emergency Declarations FEMA-3593-EM-MP and FEMA-3594-EM-GU approved May 22
- National IMAT Red deployed to HI for onward movement, Region VIII IMAT on alert to support Region IX
- Logistics: SMT Tracy/ISB Alpha deployed to GU; SMT HI on standby
- Distribution Centers in GU, HI, and CA adequately stocked and ready to deploy commodities; 105 generators staged in GU
- Transportation Augmentation Contract activated for Guam and CNMI for multi-modal transportation
- National Evacuation Air Transportation Support Service and Aviation Ground Support contracts activated to support emergency evacuation post impact
- MERS: 8 personnel and communications equipment deployed to GU; 2 personnel in Saipan; 3 on standby in HI
- US&R IST Blue capable to deploy on a 2-hour notice








National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall


