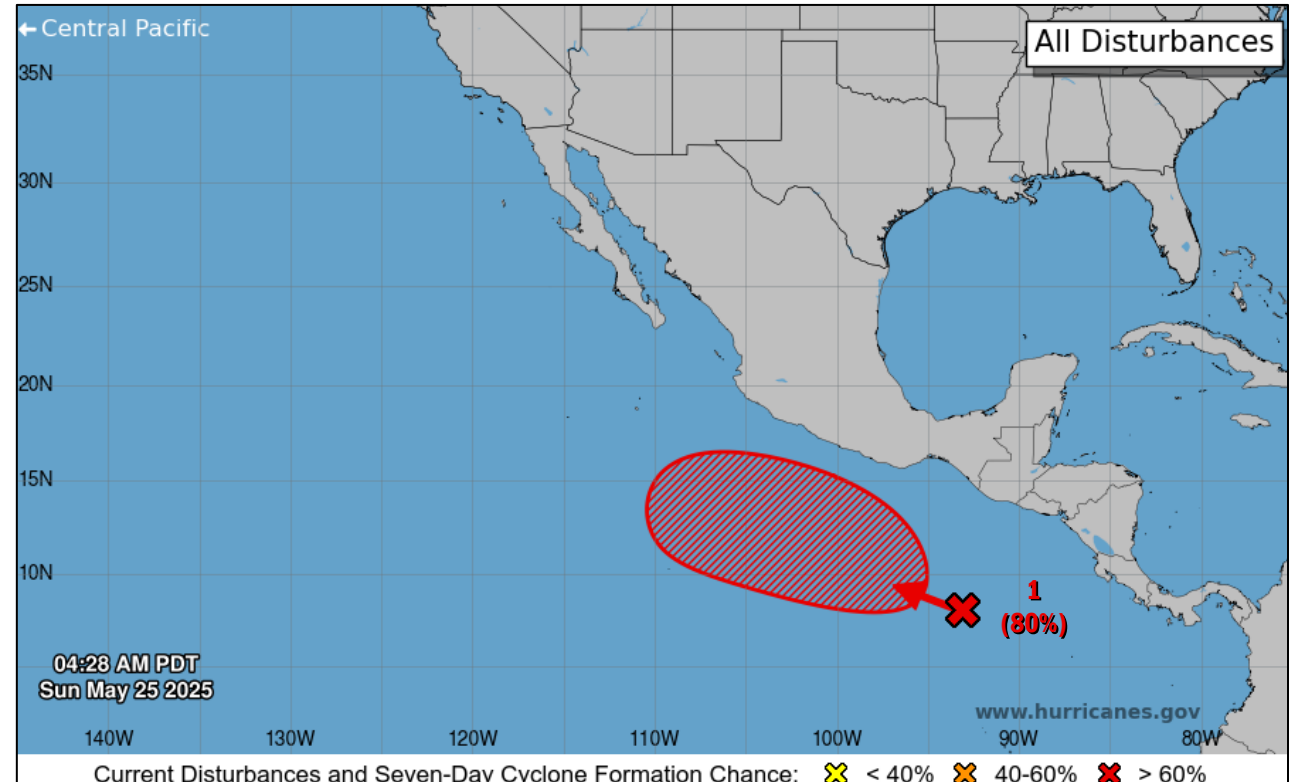


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Disturbance 1 – Eastern Pacific

Disturbance 1 (As of 7:00 a.m. ET)

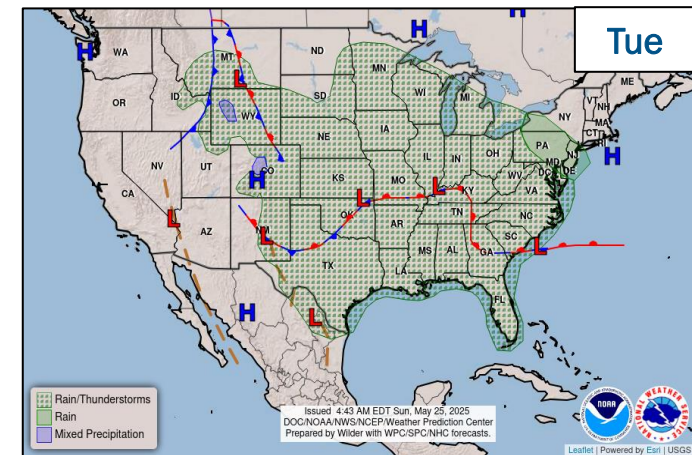
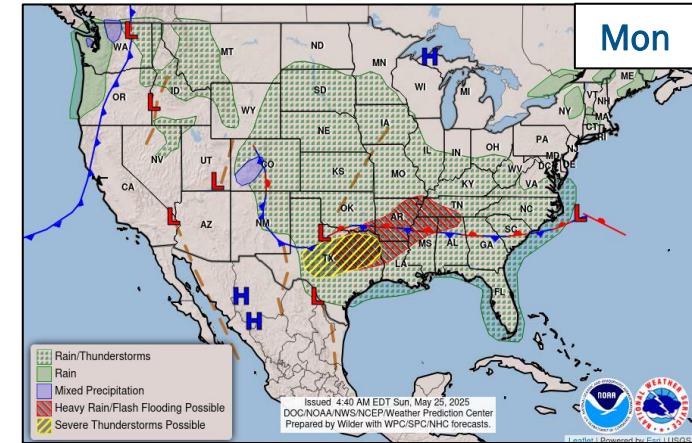
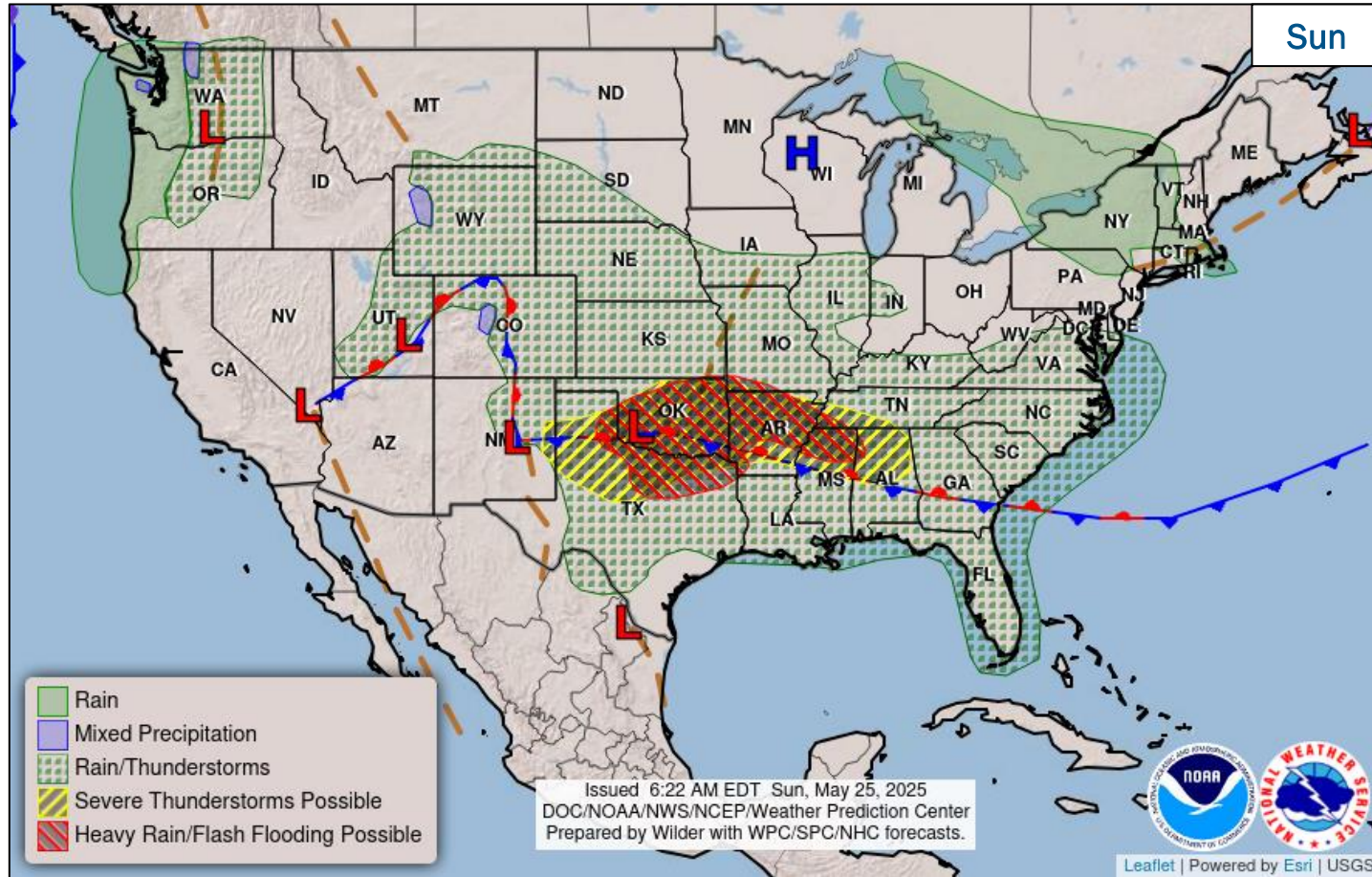
- Located several hundred miles S of the southern coast of Mexico

- Formation chance 48 hour: Low (10%); 7-day: High (80%)



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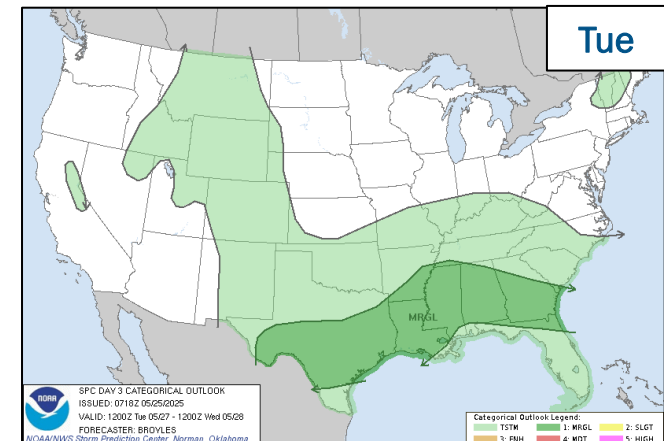
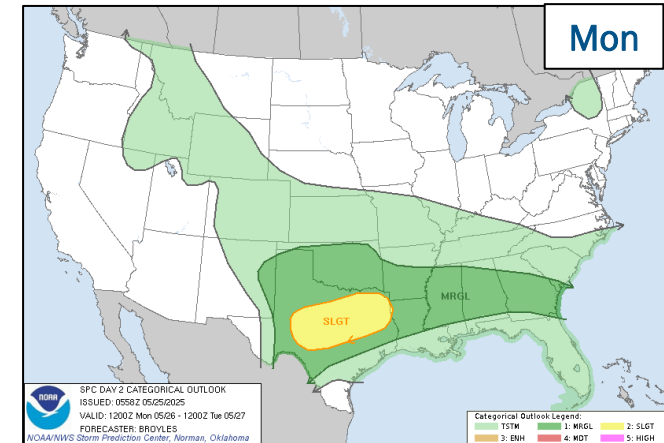
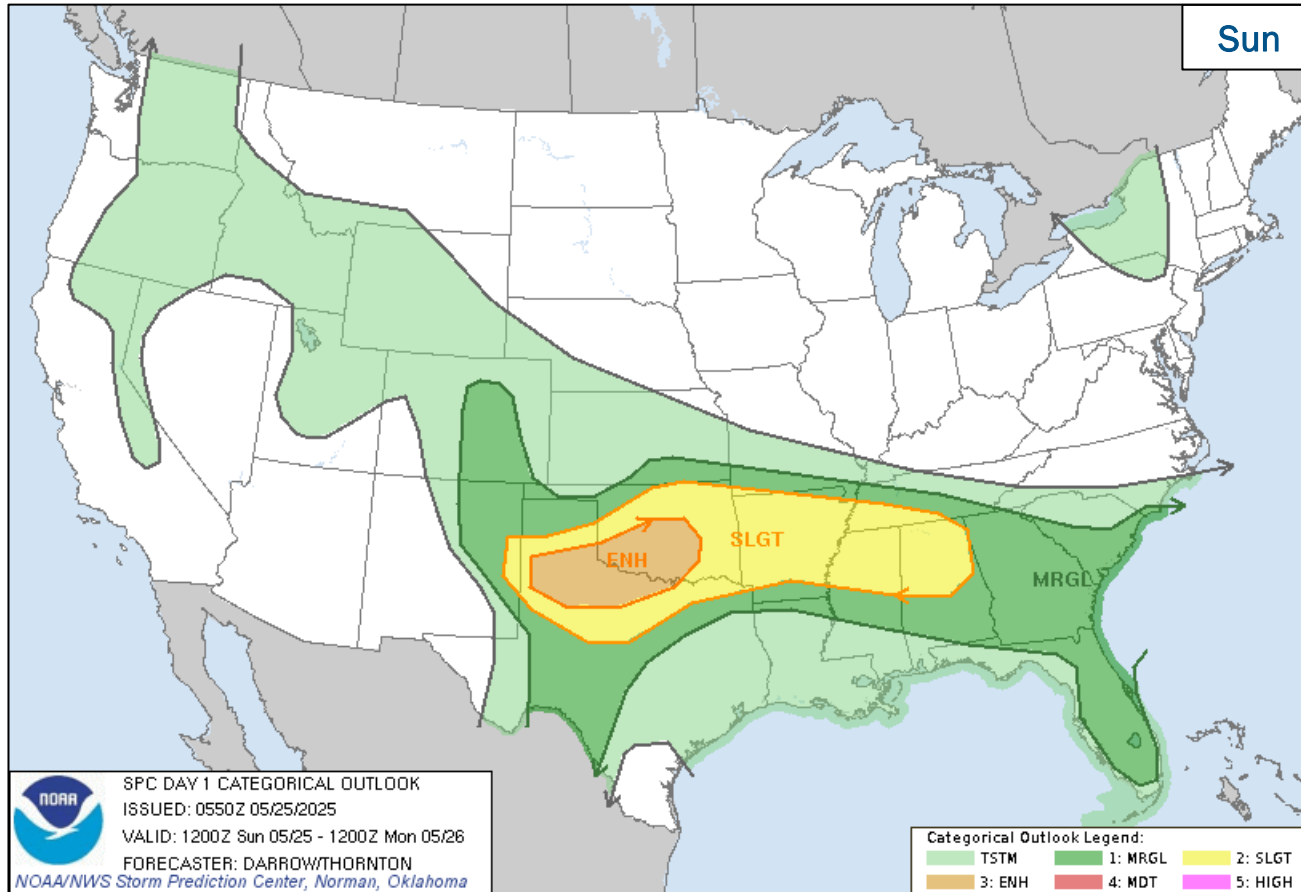

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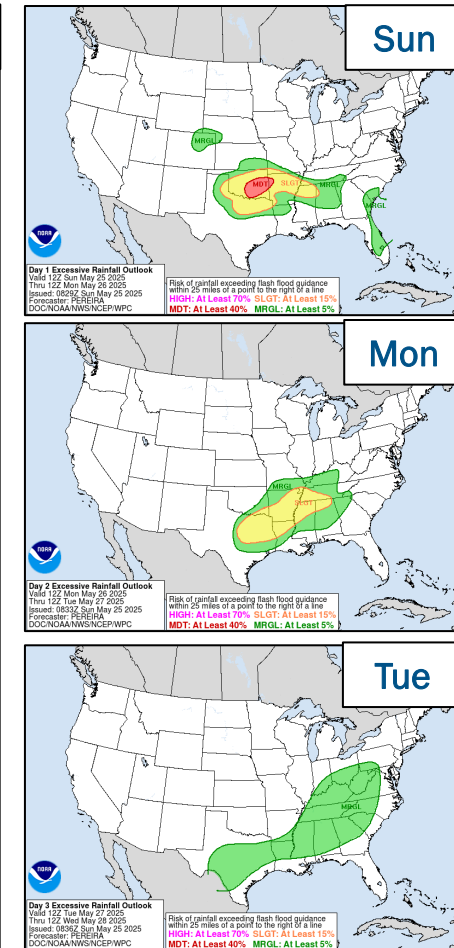
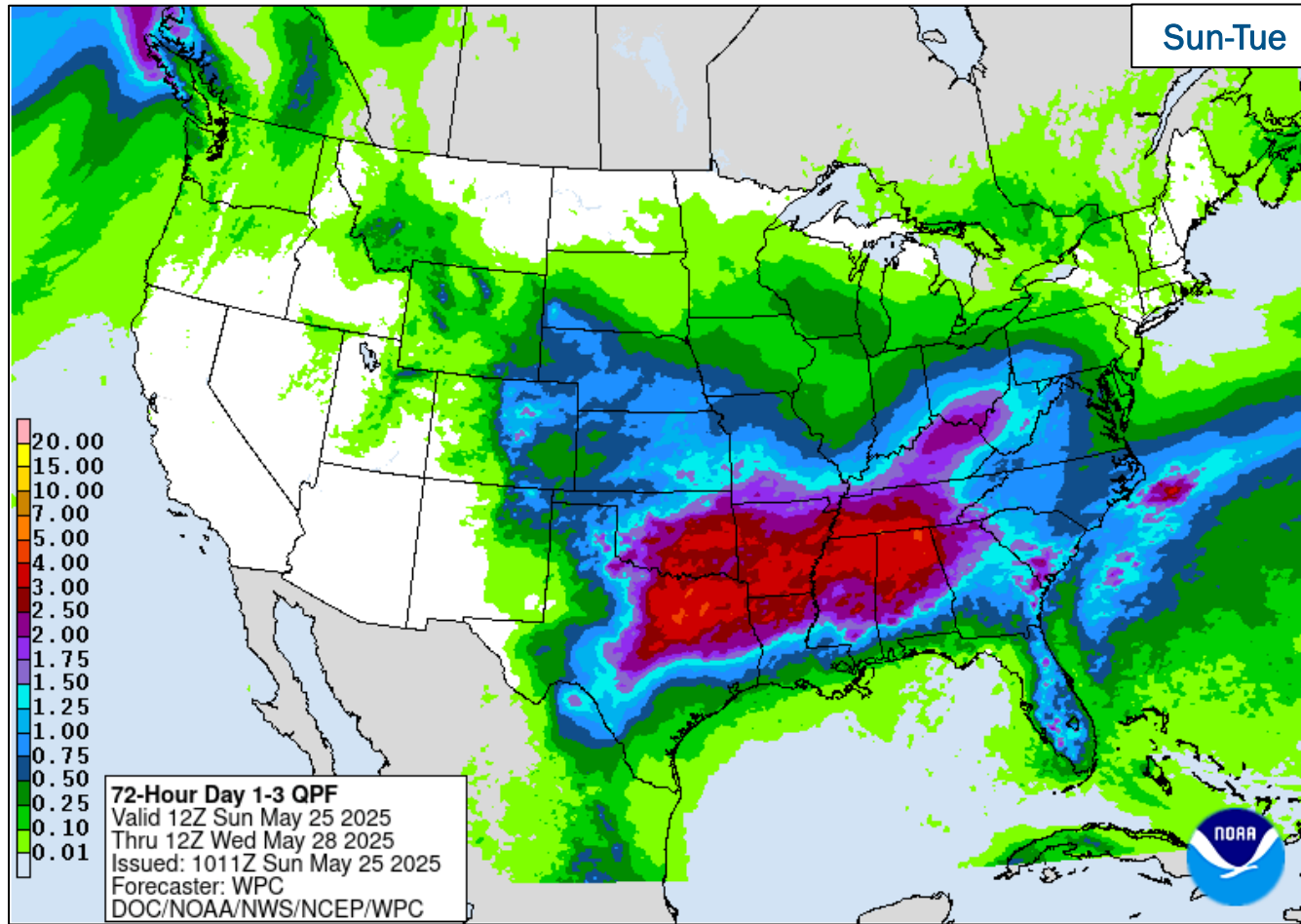
Severe Weather Outlook



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Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



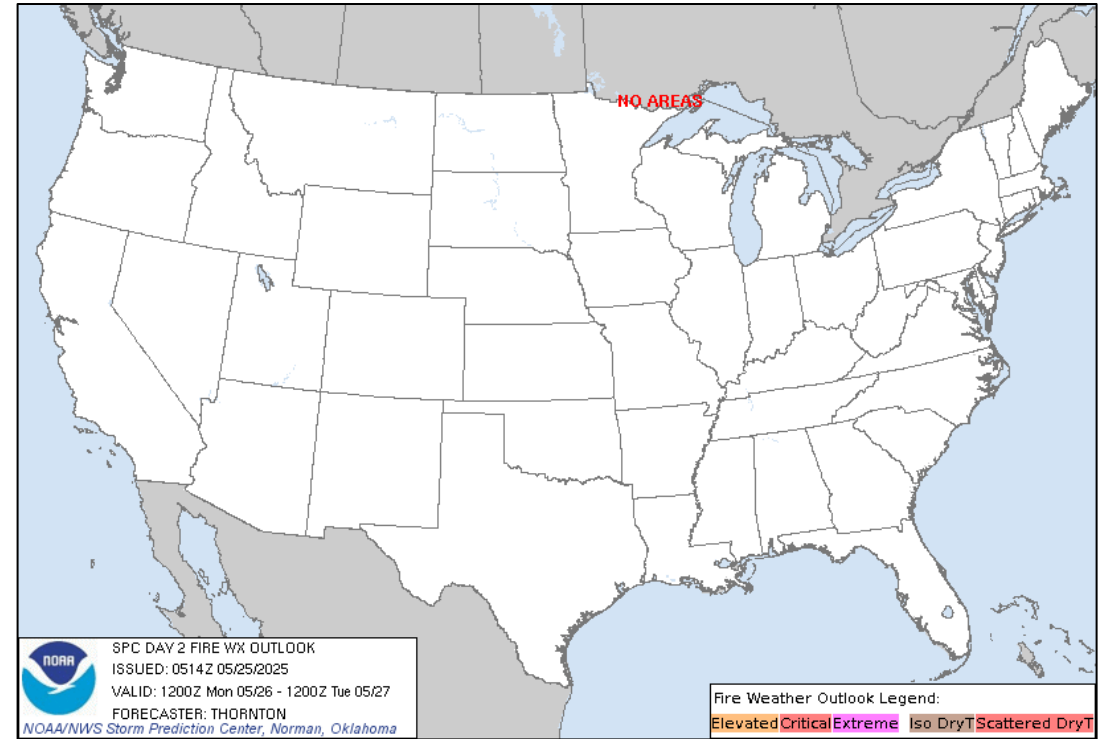
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Fire Weather Outlook

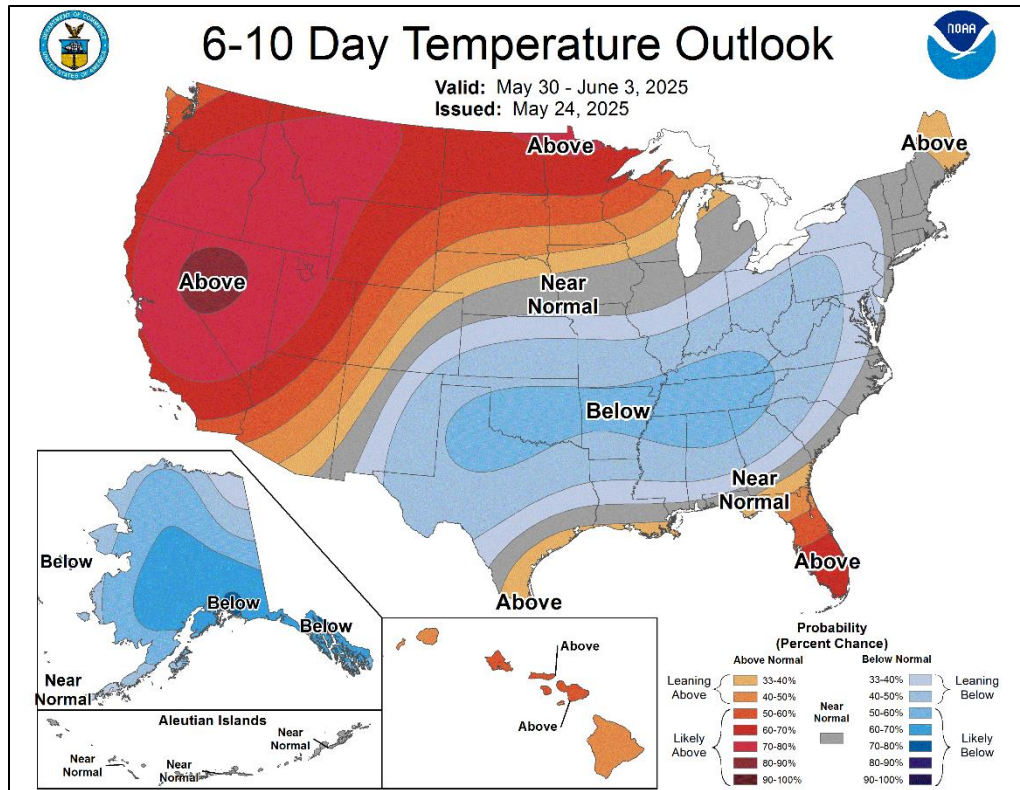

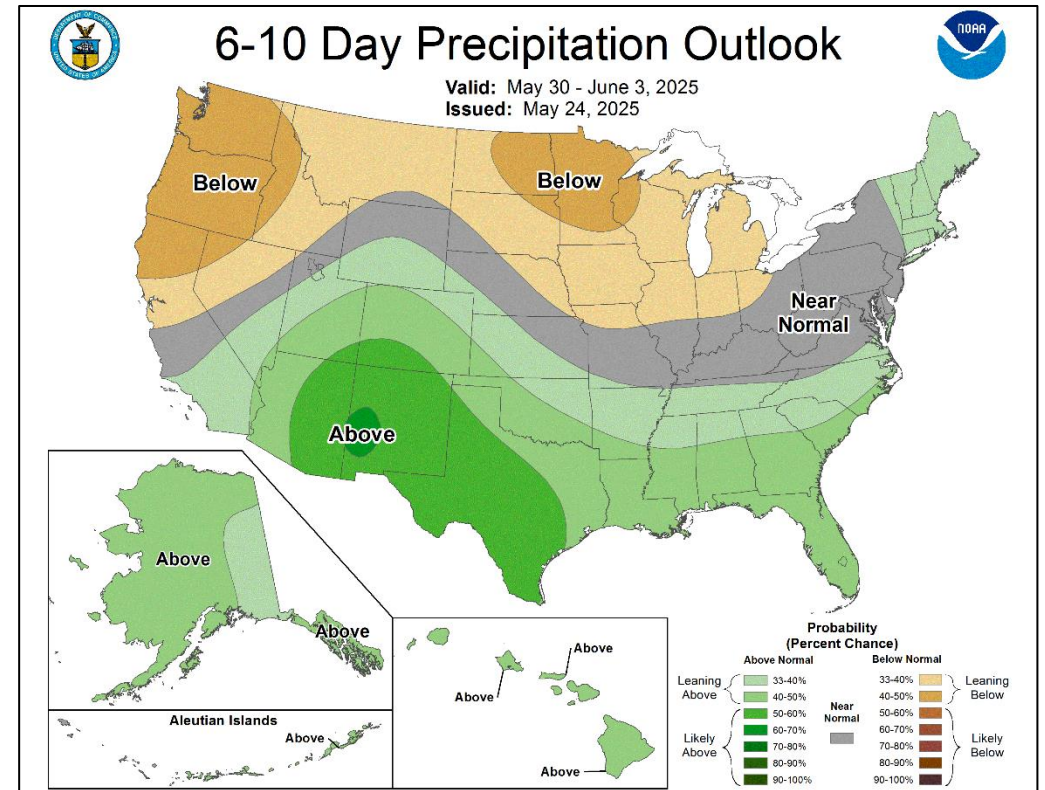
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Long Range Outlooks – May 30 – June 3

6-10 Day Precipitation Probability

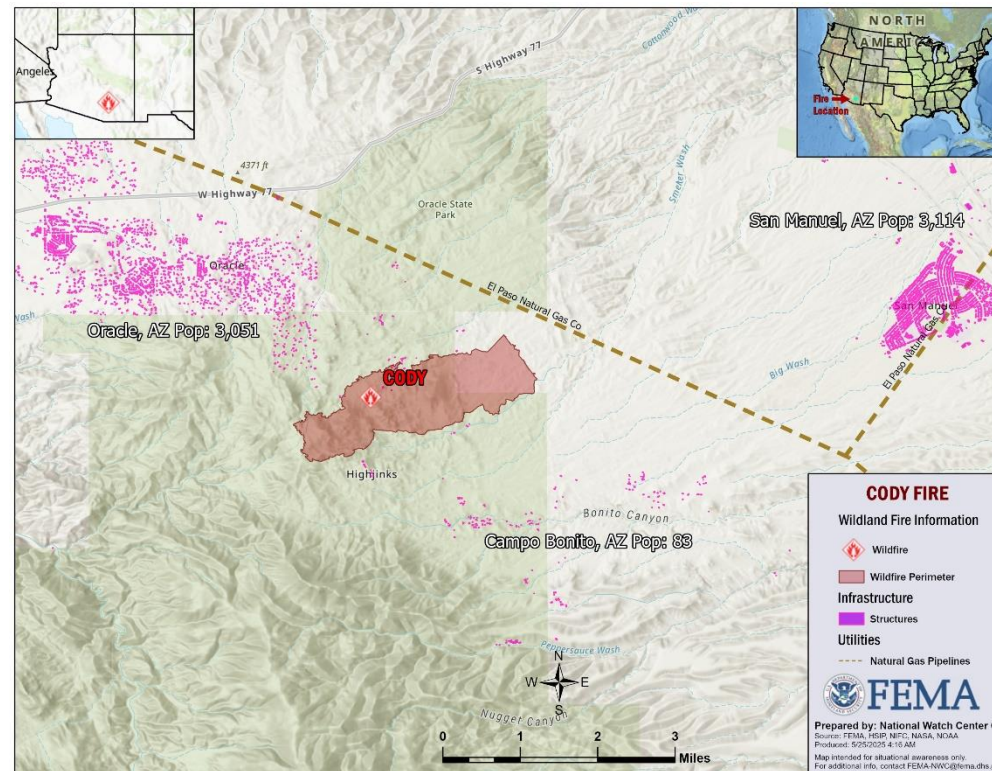
