Severe Weather - Midwest


<u>Situation:</u> Moderate-to-Enhanced severe weather passed through the Central Plains to the Upper Mississippi Valley overnight. The Storm Prediction Center issued preliminary reports of 5 tornado touchdowns, 68 hail, and 162 wind events. FEMA Region V reported one of the five tornado touchdowns caused damage to several homes in Forada, Minnesota (Douglas County). No injuries/fatalities have been reported. Eagle-I reports 38k power outages in MN statewide. No FEMA personnel or facilities were in the Moderate or Enhanced risk area. There are no requests for FEMA assistance.

Chemical Plant Fire – Omaha, NE


Situation: Media sources report a large chemical plant fire at the Nox-Crete Facility in downtown Omaha, NE. Nox-Crete produces concrete products and exterior waterproofing chemicals. The Union Pacific railway is near the fire and has stopped all rail traffic. There are reports of explosions and heavy smoke moving east. According to the local emergency management officials, the smoke from the fire was posing NO toxicity to residents and firefighters planned on working through the night to fully extinguish the fire. The Omaha Fire Department has recommended evacuation and shelter-in-place orders. One shelter is open with unknown occupants. No reports of fatalities or injuries. The fire does not exceed local capabilities; no requests for FEMA assistance.



Tropical Outlook - Five Day


Eastern Pacific



Tropical Storm Agatha (Advisory #14A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 55 miles N of Salina Cruz, Mexico; moving NE at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Expected to dissipate over southern Mexico by this afternoon

Atlantic




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Low pressure is expected to develop near the Yucatan Peninsula and the northwestern Caribbean Sea in a couple of days
- This system could become a tropical depression while moving northeastward
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (10%); 5-day: Medium (60%)




National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






FEMA Common Operating Picture




