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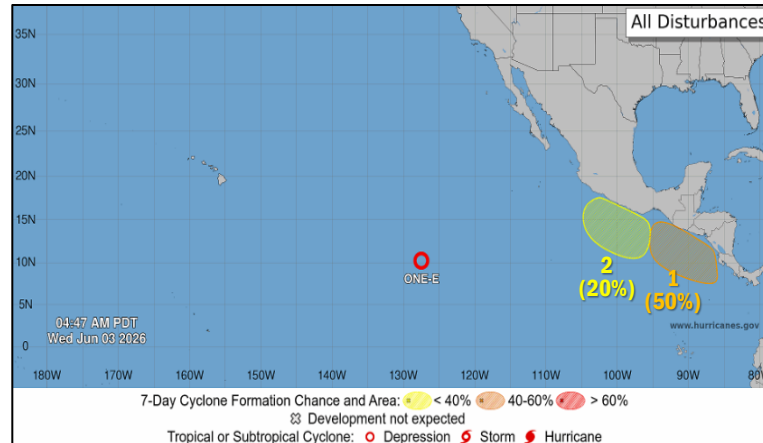
Tropical Outlook

Western Pacific



- No tropical activity is threatening the U.S. territories

Eastern and Central Pacific



Tropical Depression One-E (Advisory #3, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 1,450 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California
- Maximum sustained winds at 35 mph
- Moving NW at 6 mph
- Depression gradually strengthening and expected to become a tropical storm today

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- S of the southern coast of Mexico
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for a tropical depression to form early next week
- Formation Chance – 48-hour Low (near 0%); 7-day Med (50%)

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- S of the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Environmental conditions could allow for some gradual development of this system
- Formation Chance – 48-hour Low (near 0%); 7-day Low (20%)

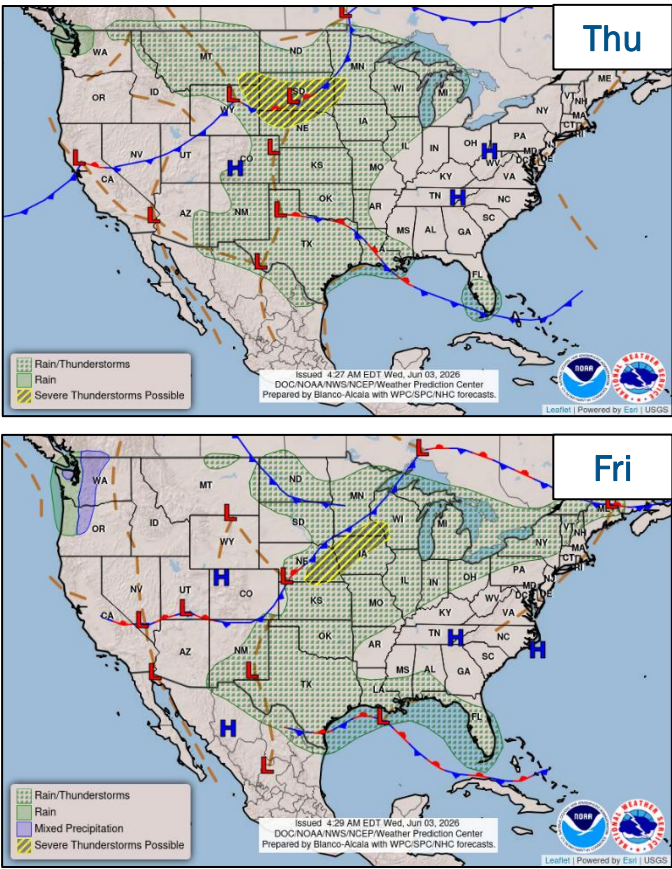
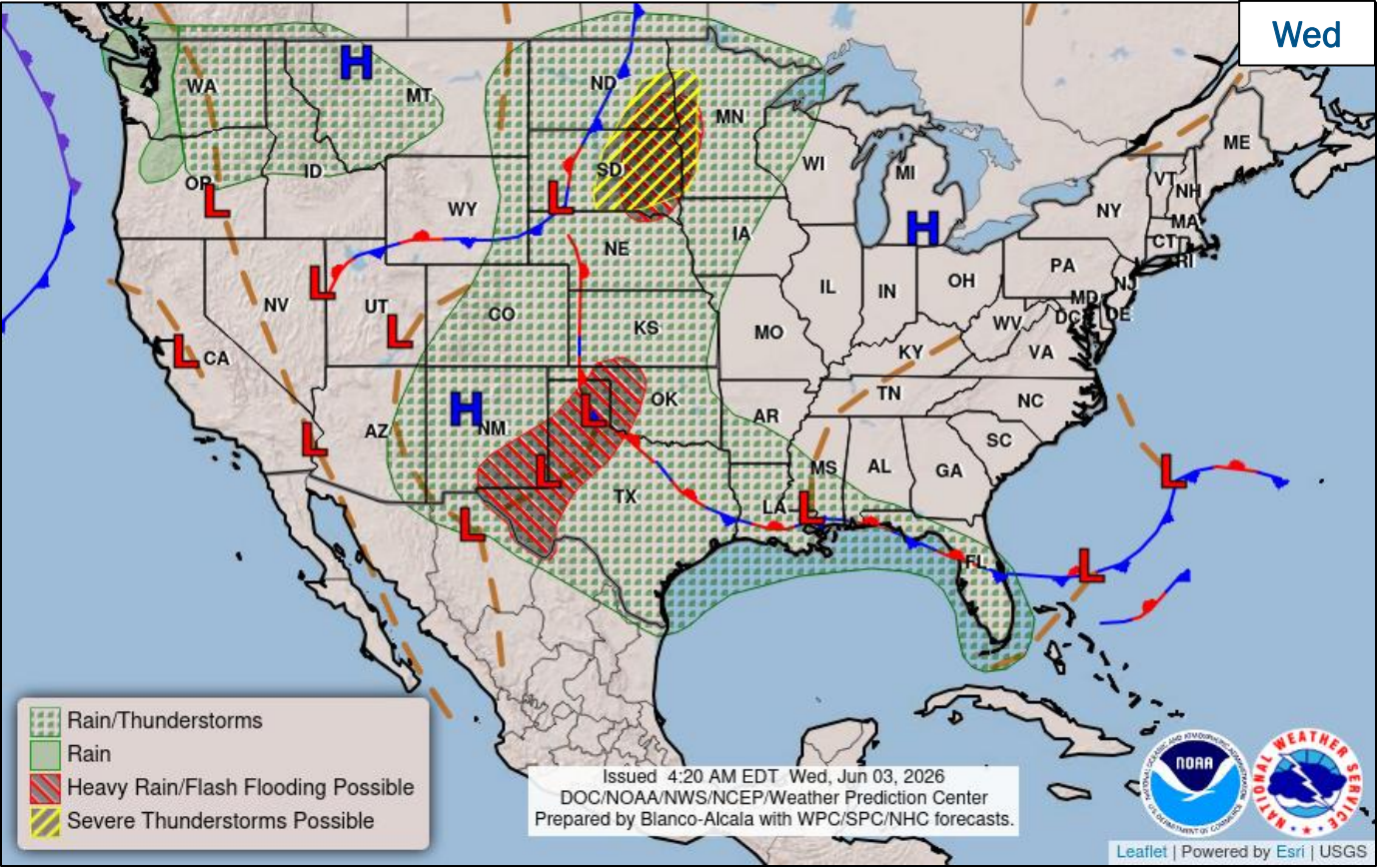

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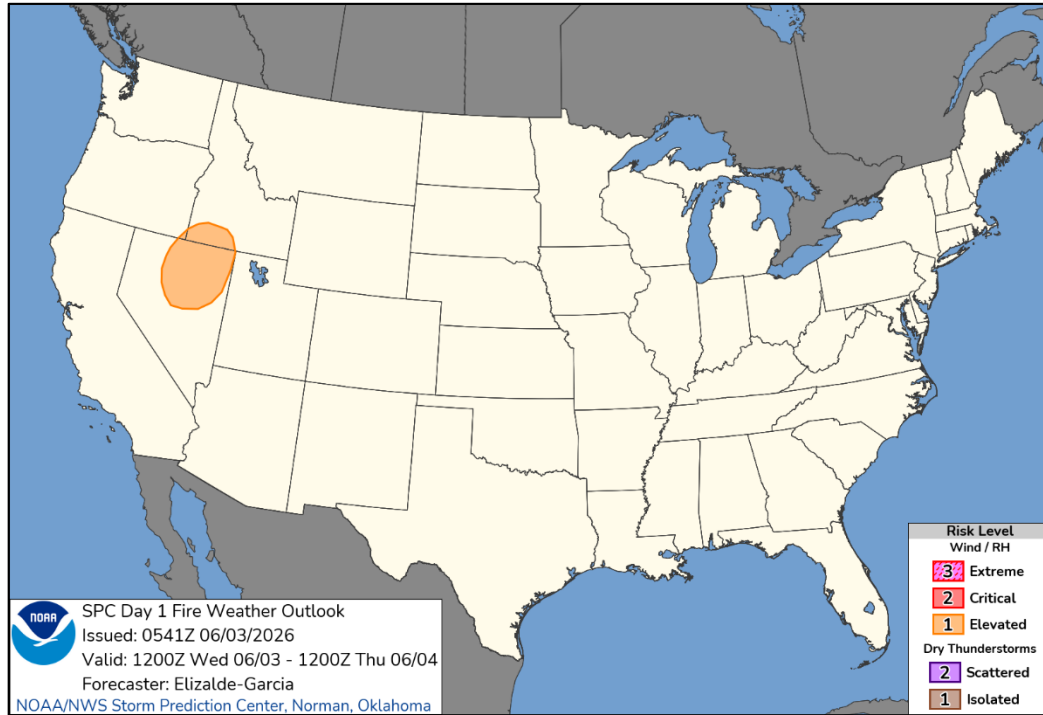
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National Weather Forecast

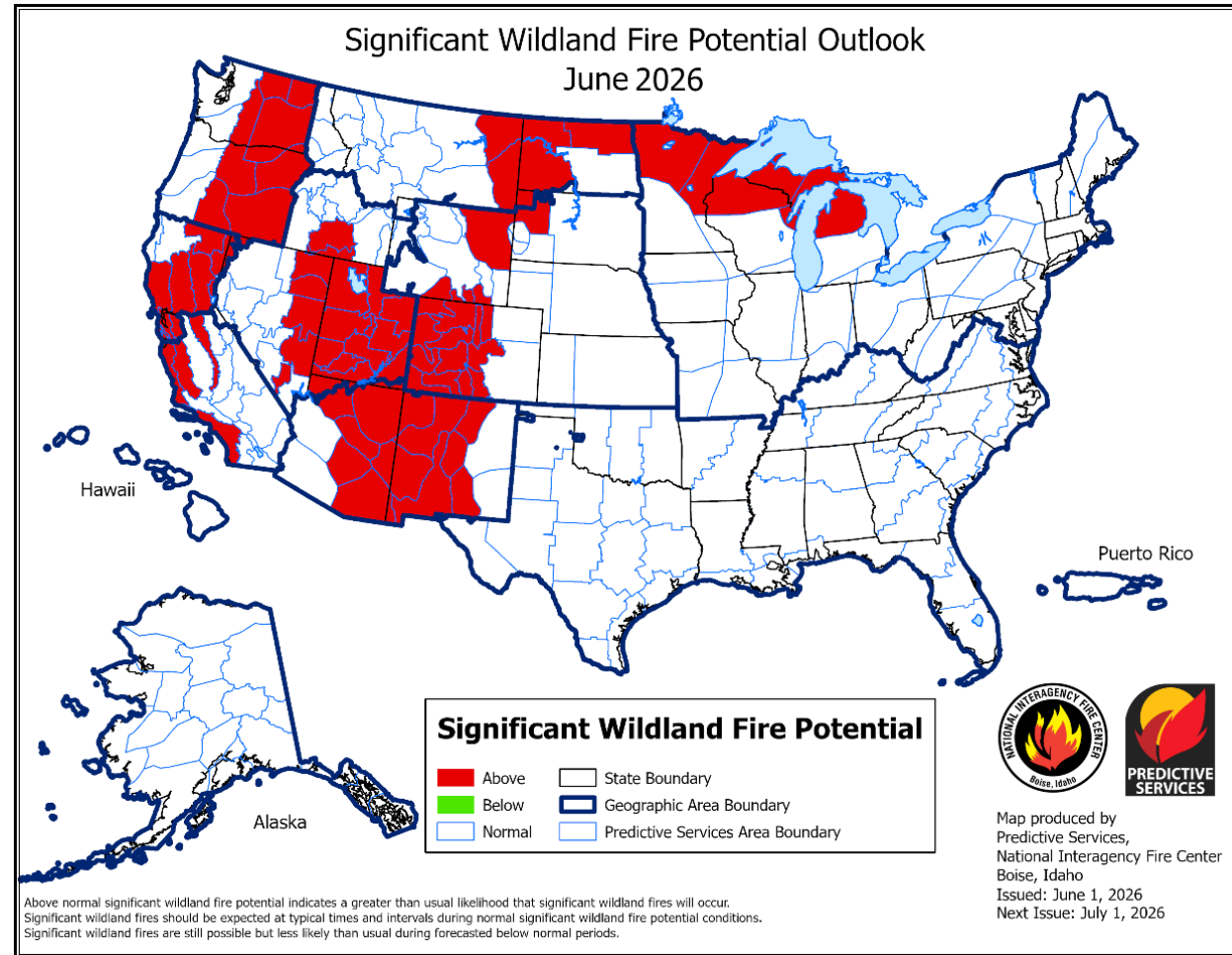

PL 4	High levels of fire activity and areas are competing for firefighting resources; 60% of the nation's wildland firefighting resources committed
PL 5	Extremely high levels of fire activity; 80% of nation's firefighting resources committed

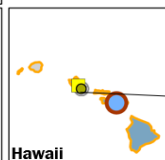

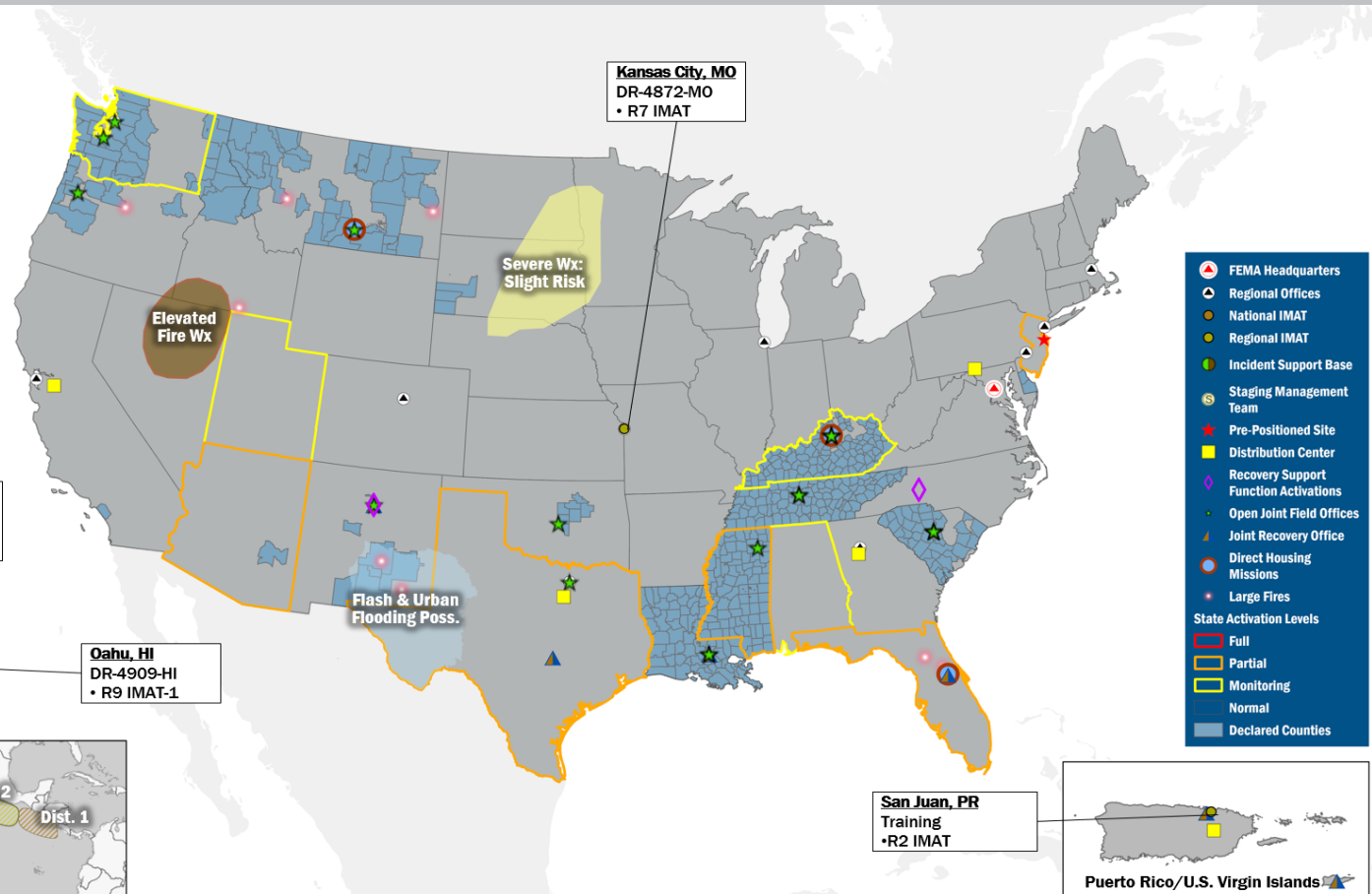
