### **Super Typhoon Mawar – Guam**




Situation: Locally executed, state managed, and federally supported recovery operations continue within the areas impacted by Super Typhoon Mawar.

Lifelines: (SLB as of 6:00 a.m. ET, June 5)

- Food, Water, Shelter:
- 4 (+1) shelters open with 730 occupants (ARC shelter as of 7:00 a.m. ET)
- Precautionary boil water notice remains in effect island-wide
- 58% of wells operational; 47% requiring new motors for minor repairs (Guam Water Authority Jun 5 Update)
- Energy: (Guam Power Authority Jun 5 Update)
- Power restored to 53% of customers;
   96% of substations; 88% of feeders/circuits restored
- Gas station: 34 (+1) of 42 public stations open; 5 (+1) of 5 military base gas stations open
- Communications:
- 54% of cell sites operational

<u>Territory/Local Response:</u> (SLB as of 6:00 a.m. ET, June 5)

- GU EOC at Full Activation
- Governor declared a State of Emergency addressing water shortages due to Mawar (R9 Spotrep as of 9:30 p.m. ET June 3)








- Northeastern Atlantic Ocean between the Azores and Canary Islands















### **Long Range Outlooks – June 10-14**




