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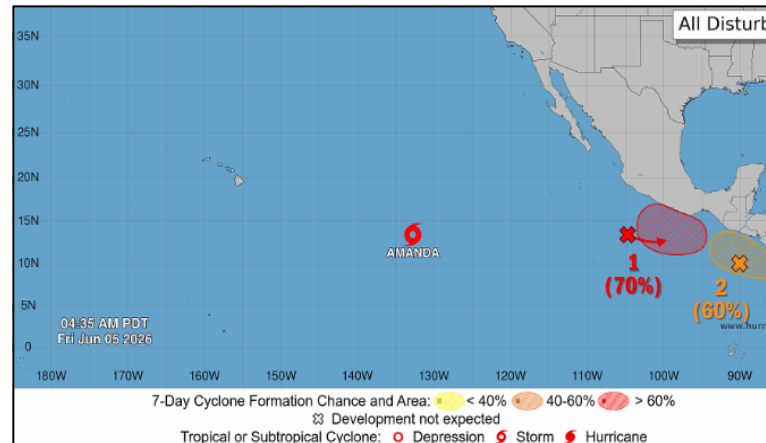

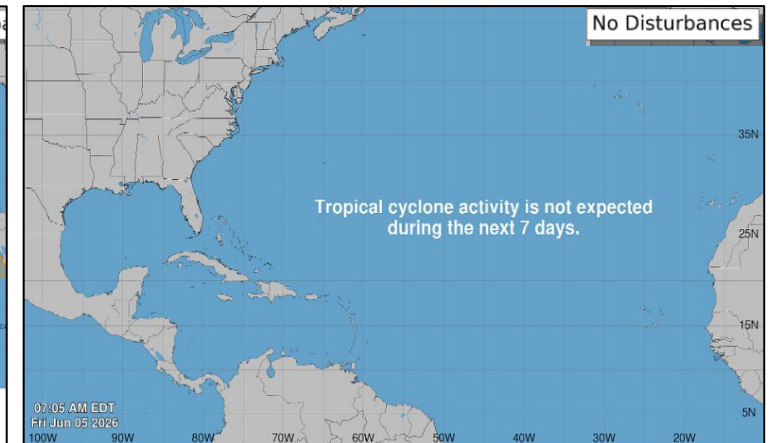
Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Offshore of southwestern coast of Mexico
- Moving **slowly to the NE or N**
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for development of this system; a tropical depression **is likely to form late this weekend or early next week**
- Formation Chance – 48-hour Low (40%); 7-day High (70%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Offshore of Central America
- **Moving slowly to the N**
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for development; a tropical depression **could form later this weekend or early next week if the system remains offshore**
- Formation Chance – 48-hour Low (30%); 7-day Medium (60%)

Atlantic



- No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days



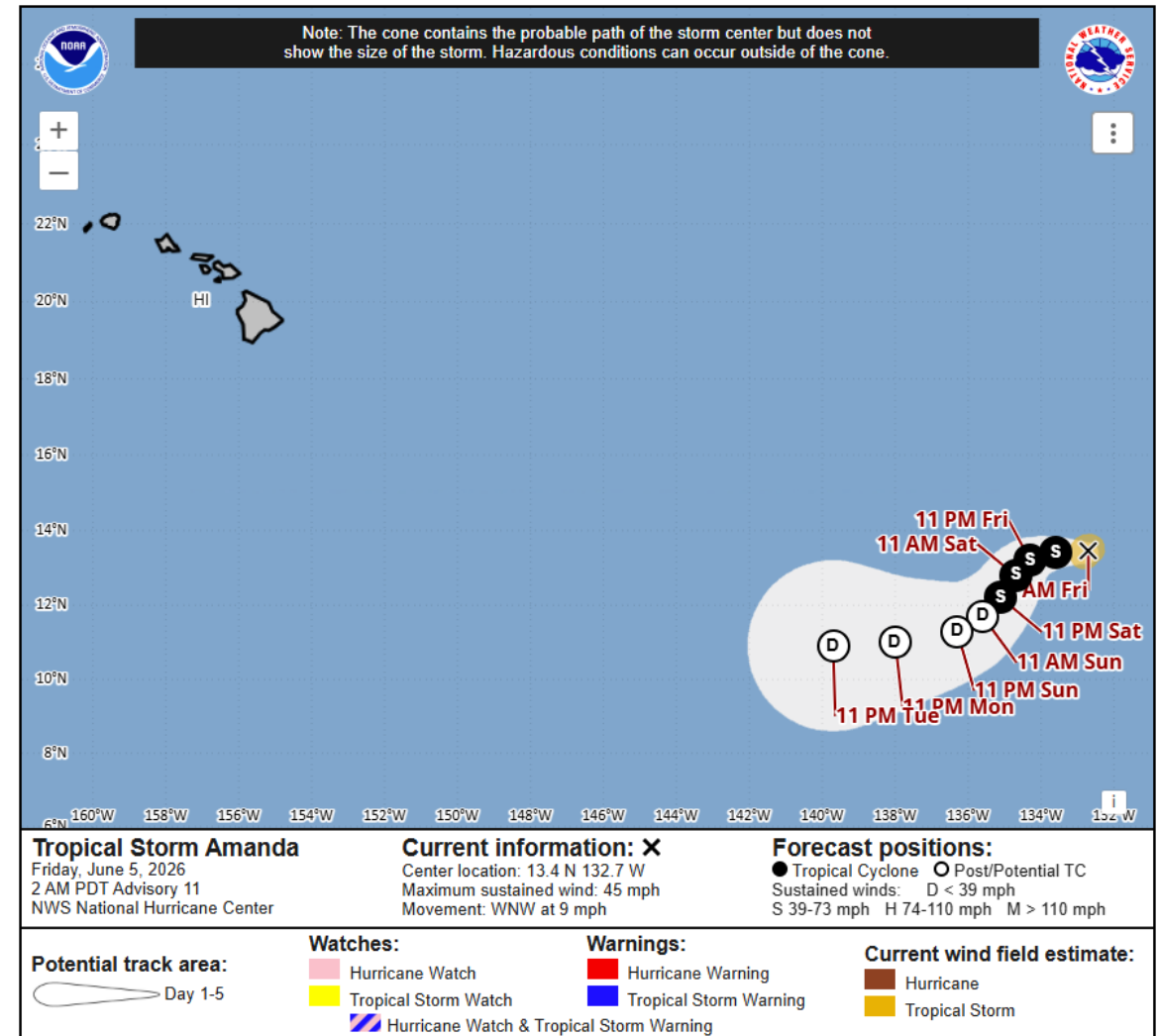
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Tropical Storm Amanda – Eastern Pacific

Situation: (Advisory #11, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 1,630 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving WNW at 9 mph
- Maximum sustained winds at 45 mph
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 35 miles from the center
- Little change in strength is forecast today
- A gradual weakening trend is expected to begin tonight; Amanda is forecast to become a post-tropical remnant low by Sunday



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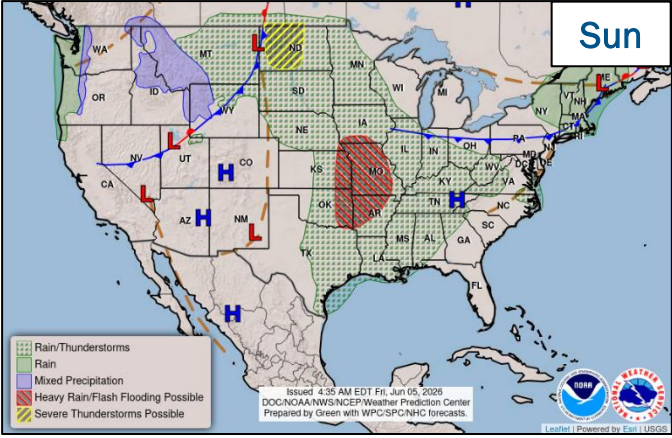
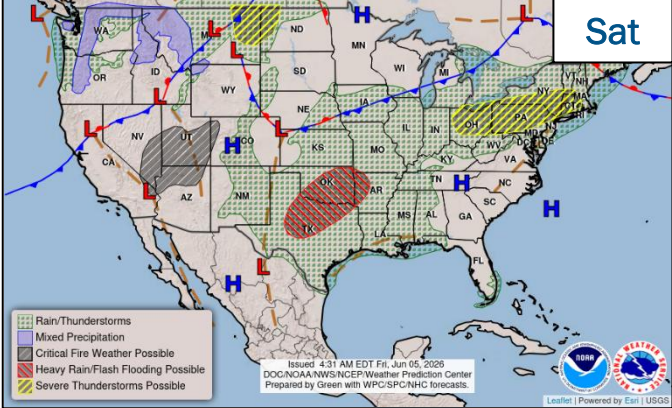
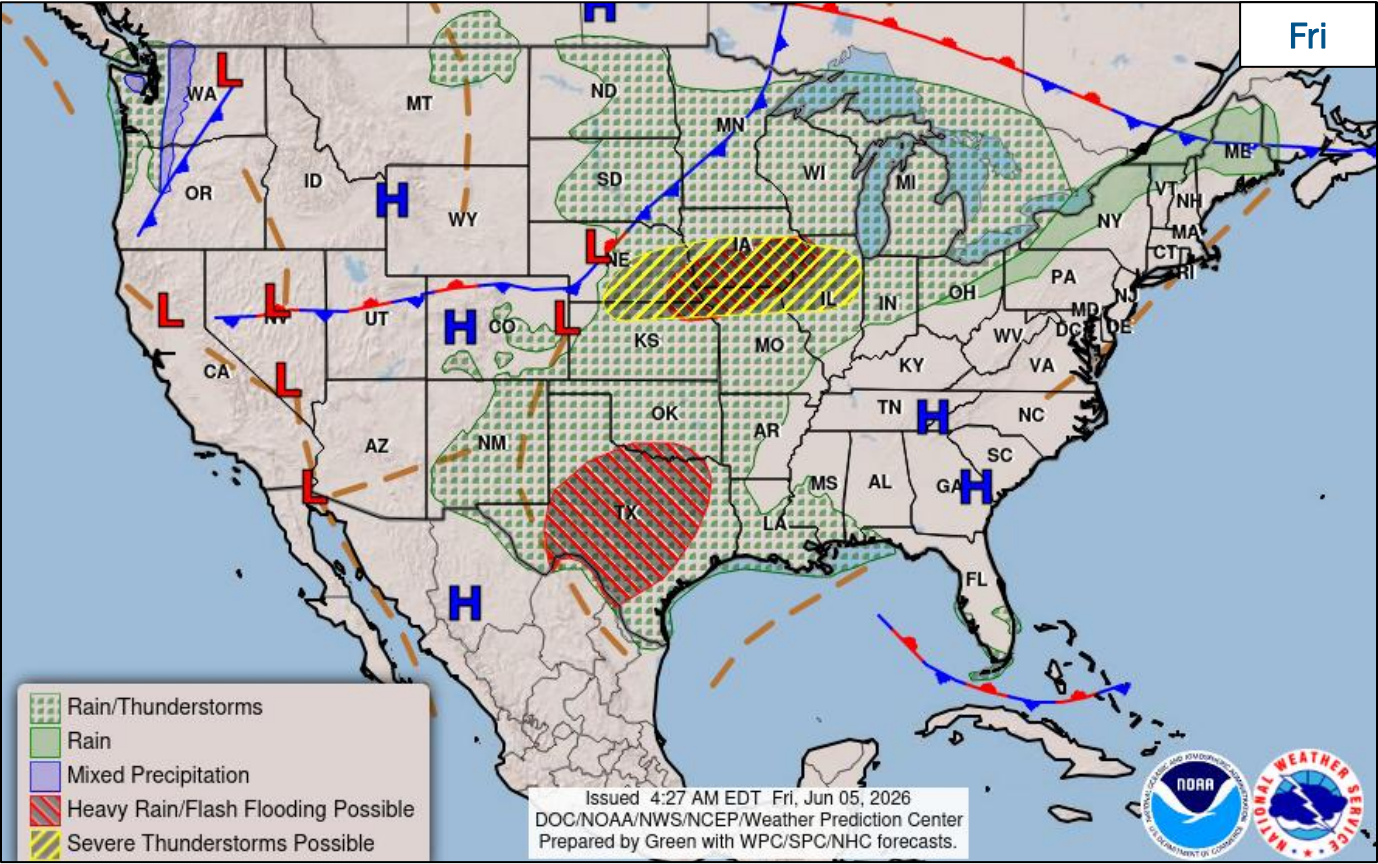
NOAA Typhoon Season Outlook – West Pacific

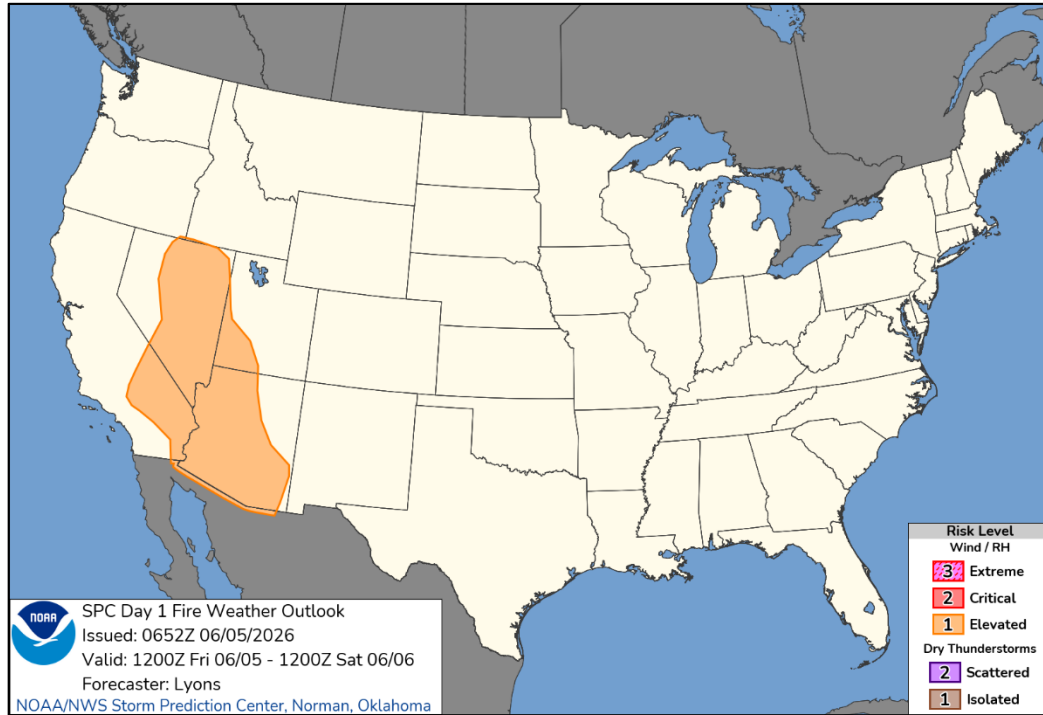

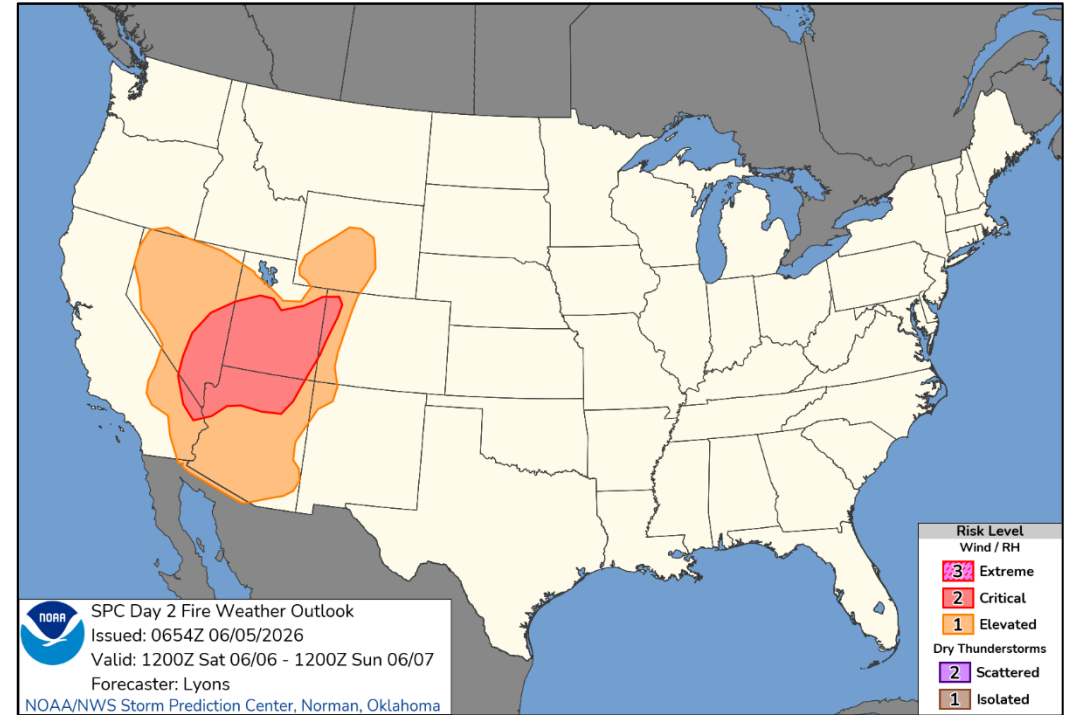


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Fire Weather Outlook

PL 4	High levels of fire activity and areas are competing for firefighting resources; 60% of the nation's wildland firefighting resources committed
PL 5	Extremely high levels of fire activity; 80% of nation's firefighting resources committed

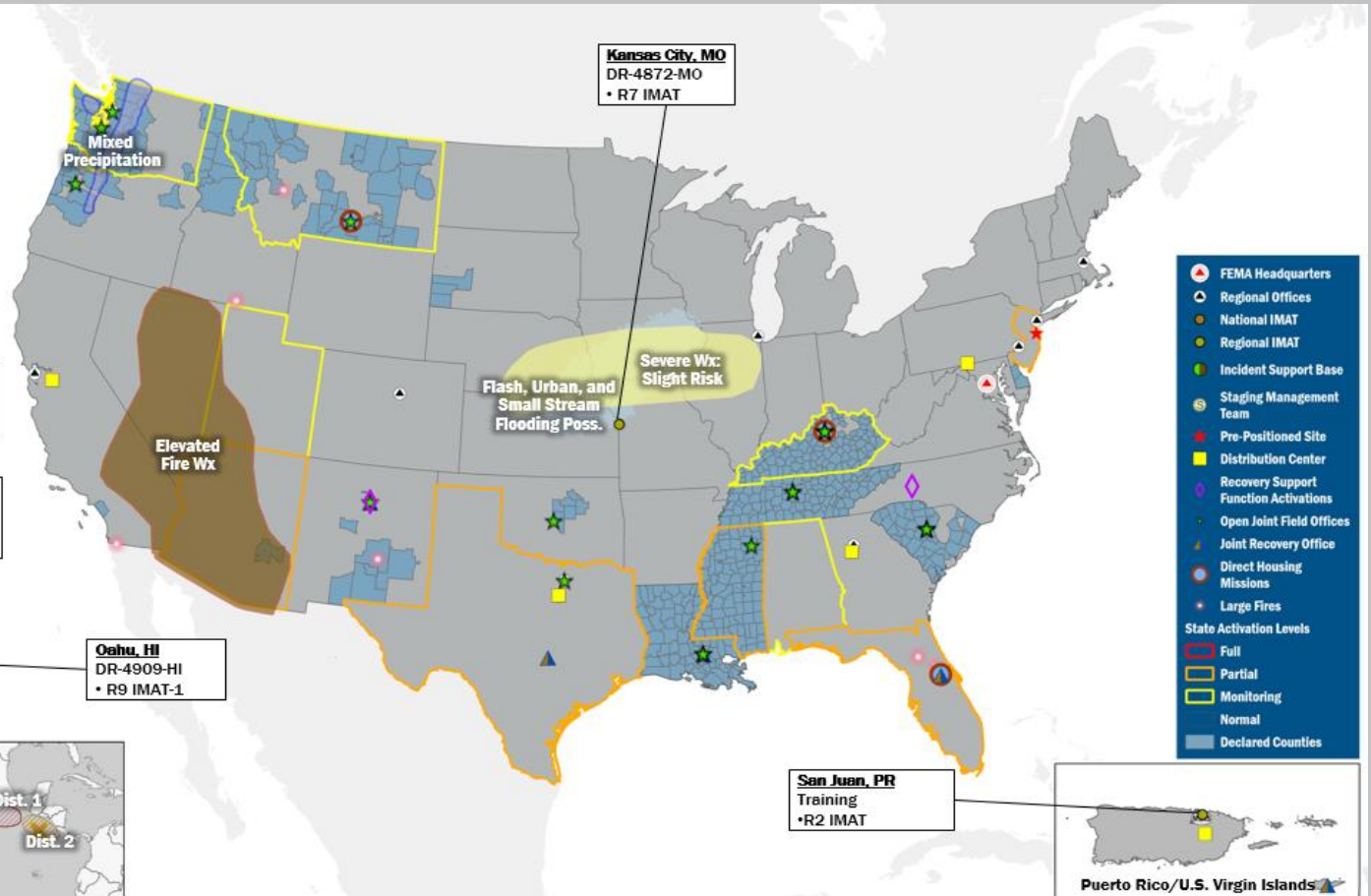

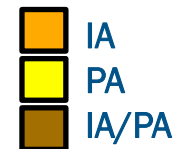
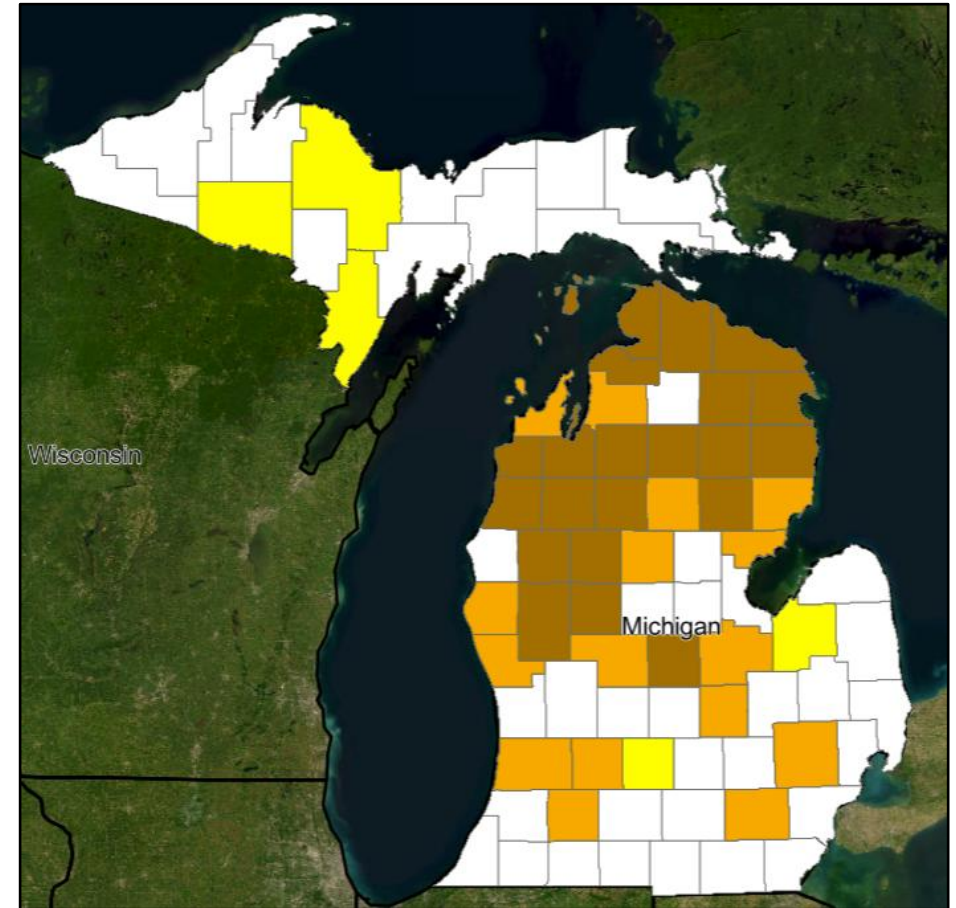
