Situation: Locally executed, state managed, and federally supported recovery operations continue within the areas impacted by Super Typhoon Mawar.

#### Lifelines: (SLB as of 6:00 a.m. ET, June 6)


- Food, Water, Shelter:
- 3 (-1) shelters open with 738 (+8) occupants;
   1 shelter open at Andersen AFB with 39 occupants
- 68% (+10) of wells operational; 3 of 8 drinking water systems operational, 5 partially operational
- 100% of wastewater systems operational; 6 of 9 are on back-up generators
- Health and Medical:
- Medical facilities operational; continuing to restore full operational capabilities

Energy:

 Power restored to 56% (+3) of system load (customer demand); 41% of customers restored; 96% of substations; 89% (+1) of feeders/circuits restored

Communications:

 $\circ$  53% of cell sites operational

- GU EOC at Full Activation
- Governor declared a State of Emergency addressing water shortages due to Mawar



#### **Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall**


