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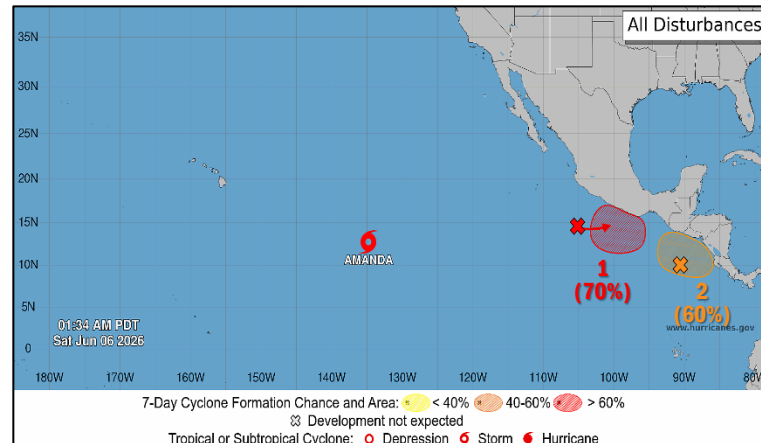

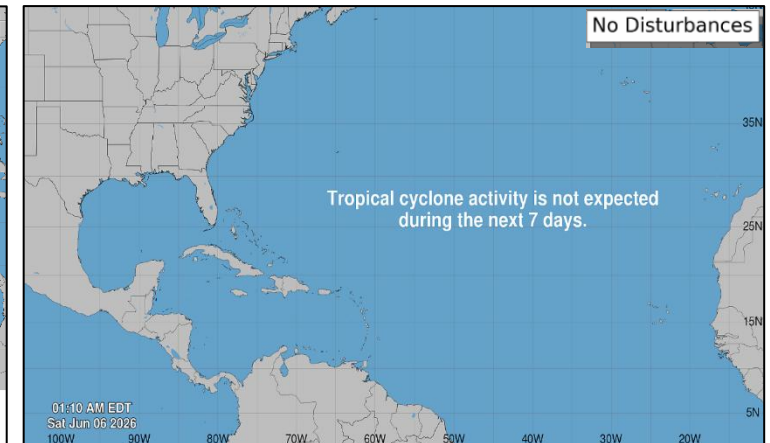

- [Forecast to move northward near the coast of southern Mexico during the next few days](#)
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for development of this system; a tropical depression is likely to form late this weekend or early next week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: [High \(70%\)](#); 7-day: High (70%)

[Disturbance 2:](#) (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Offshore of Central America
- Moving slowly to the N
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for gradual development; a tropical depression could form later this weekend or early next week if the system remains offshore
- Formation chance – 48-hour: [Medium \(50%\)](#); 7-day: Medium (60%)

Atlantic



- No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days



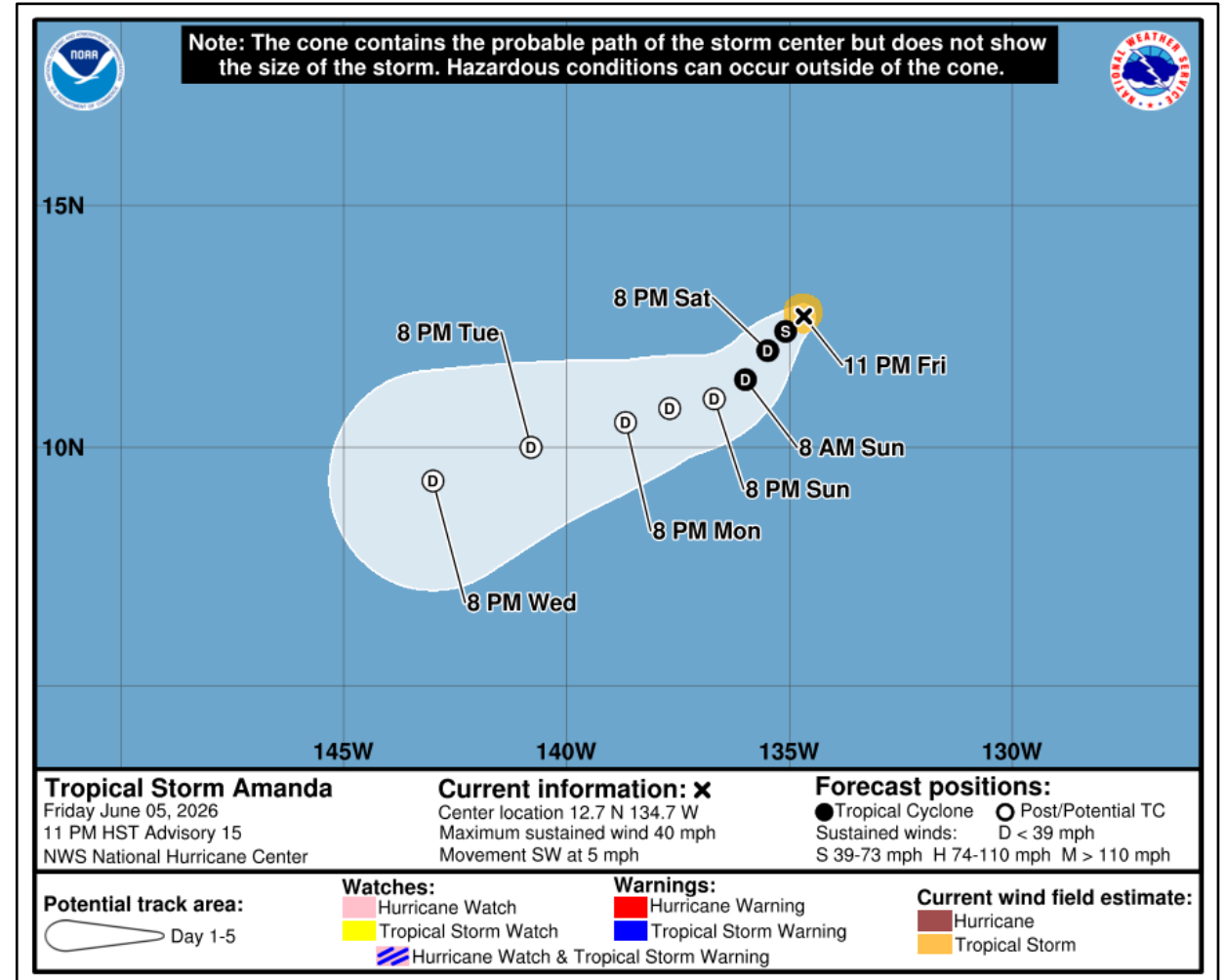
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Tropical Storm Amanda – Eastern Pacific

Situation: (Advisory #15, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

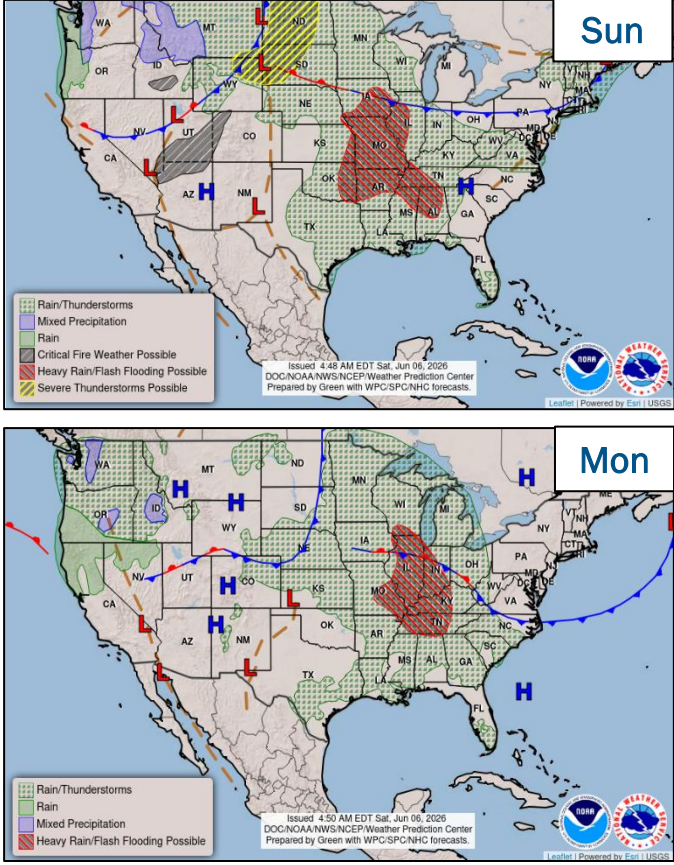
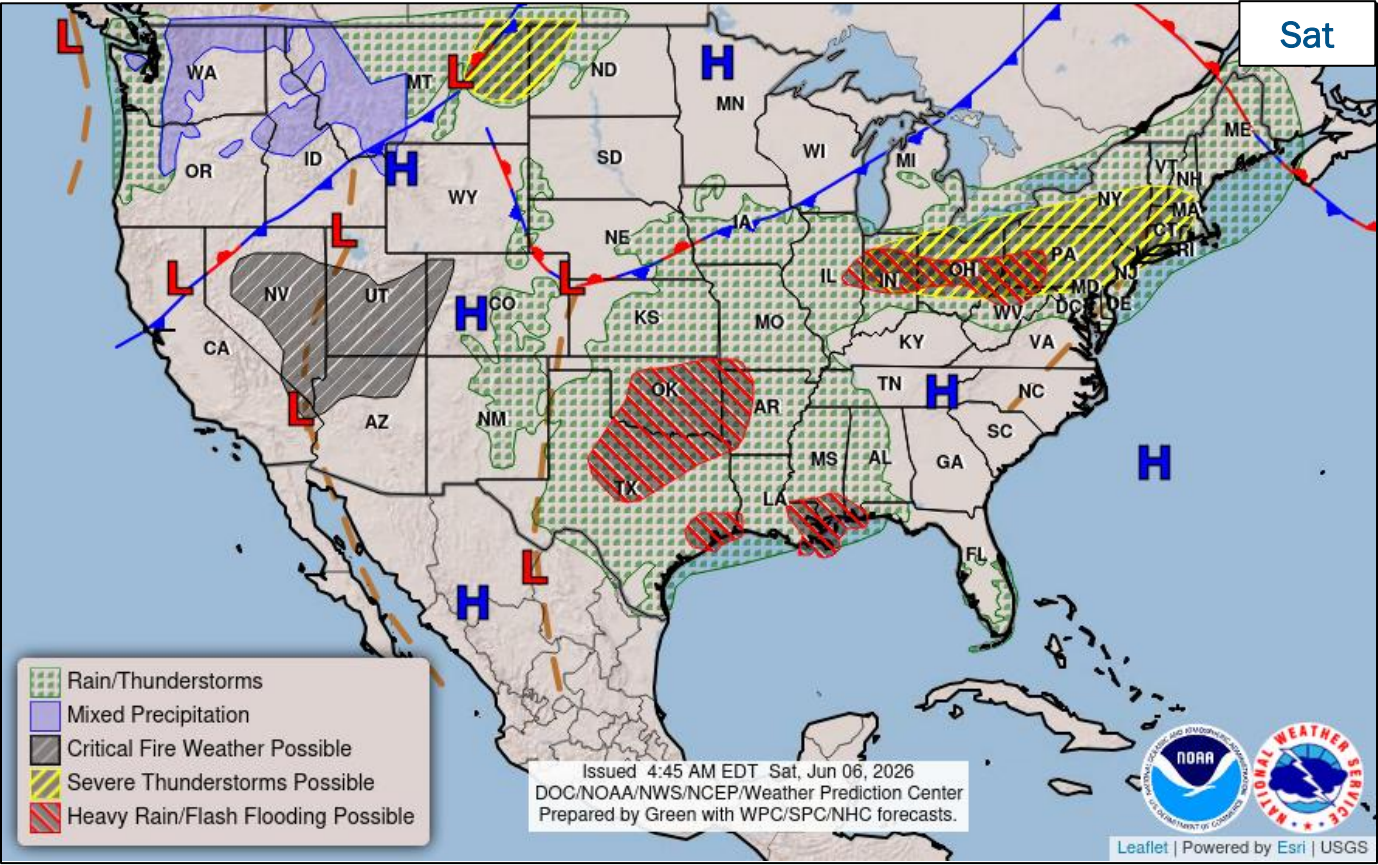
- Located 1,435 miles ESE of Hilo, HI
- Moving SW at 5 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 35 miles from the center
- Gradual weakening expected through the weekend; forecast to degenerate into a remnant low on Sunday



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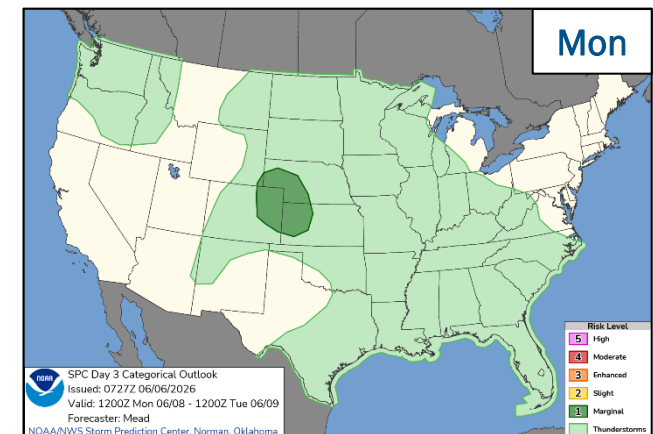
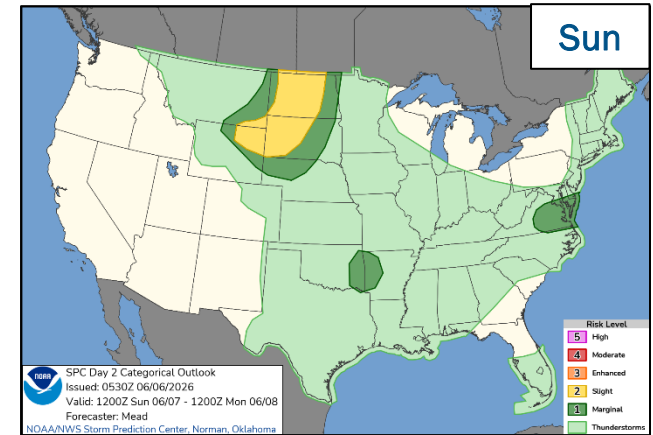
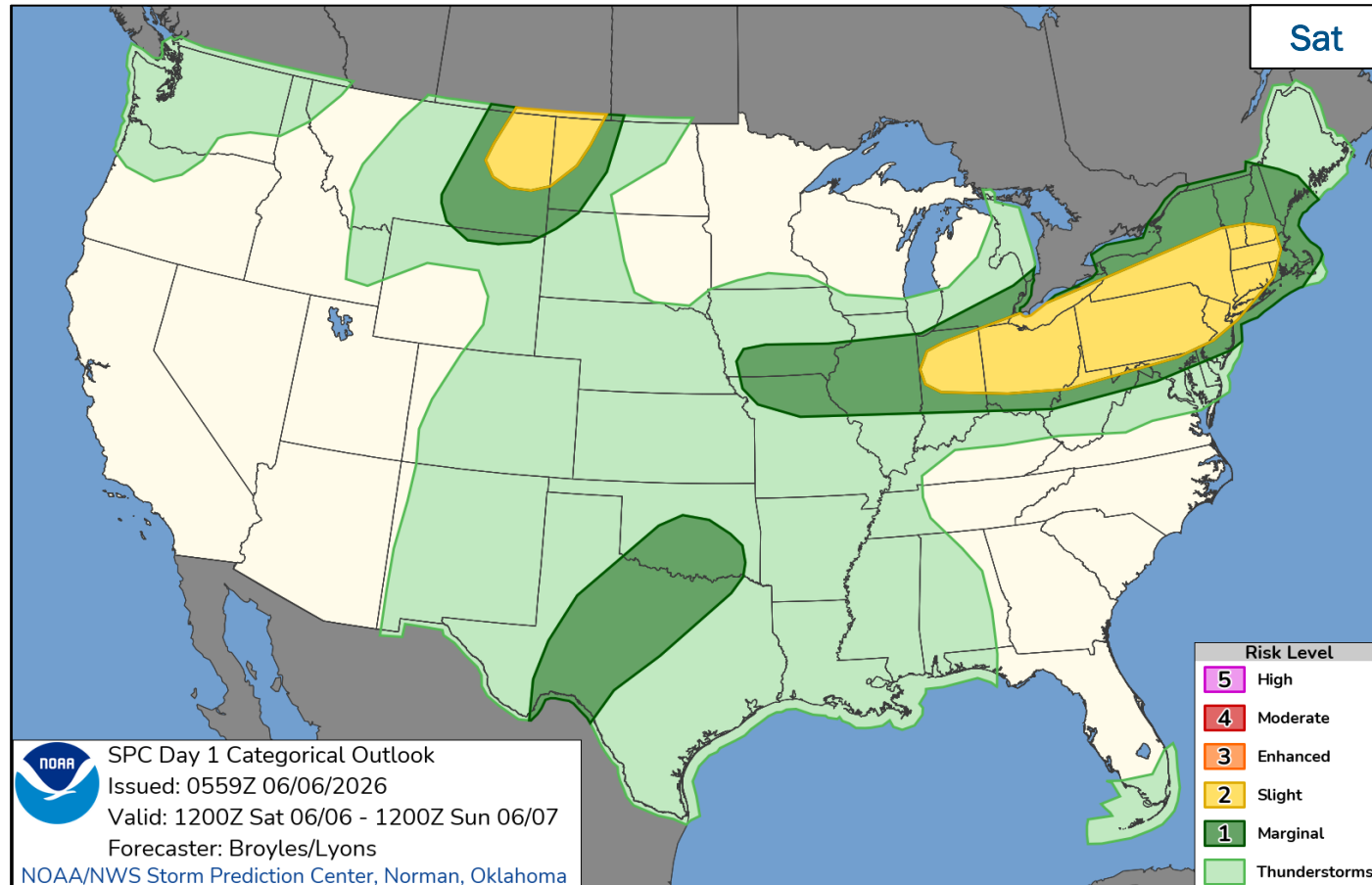

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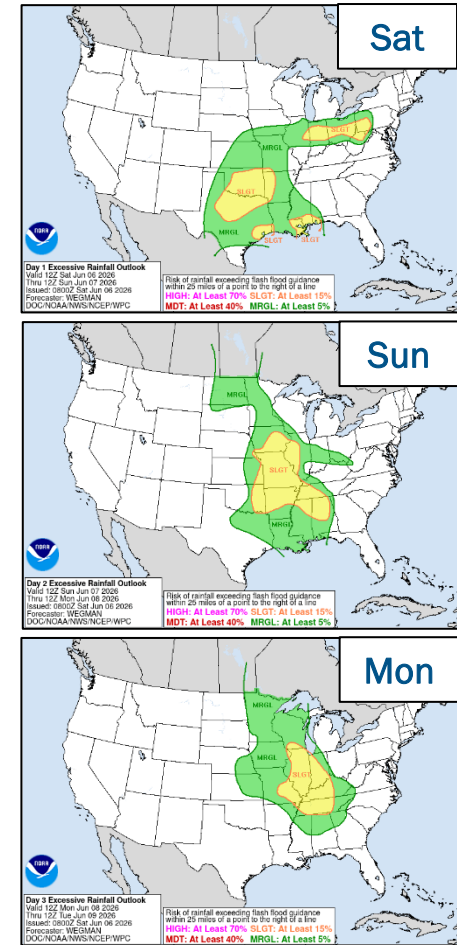
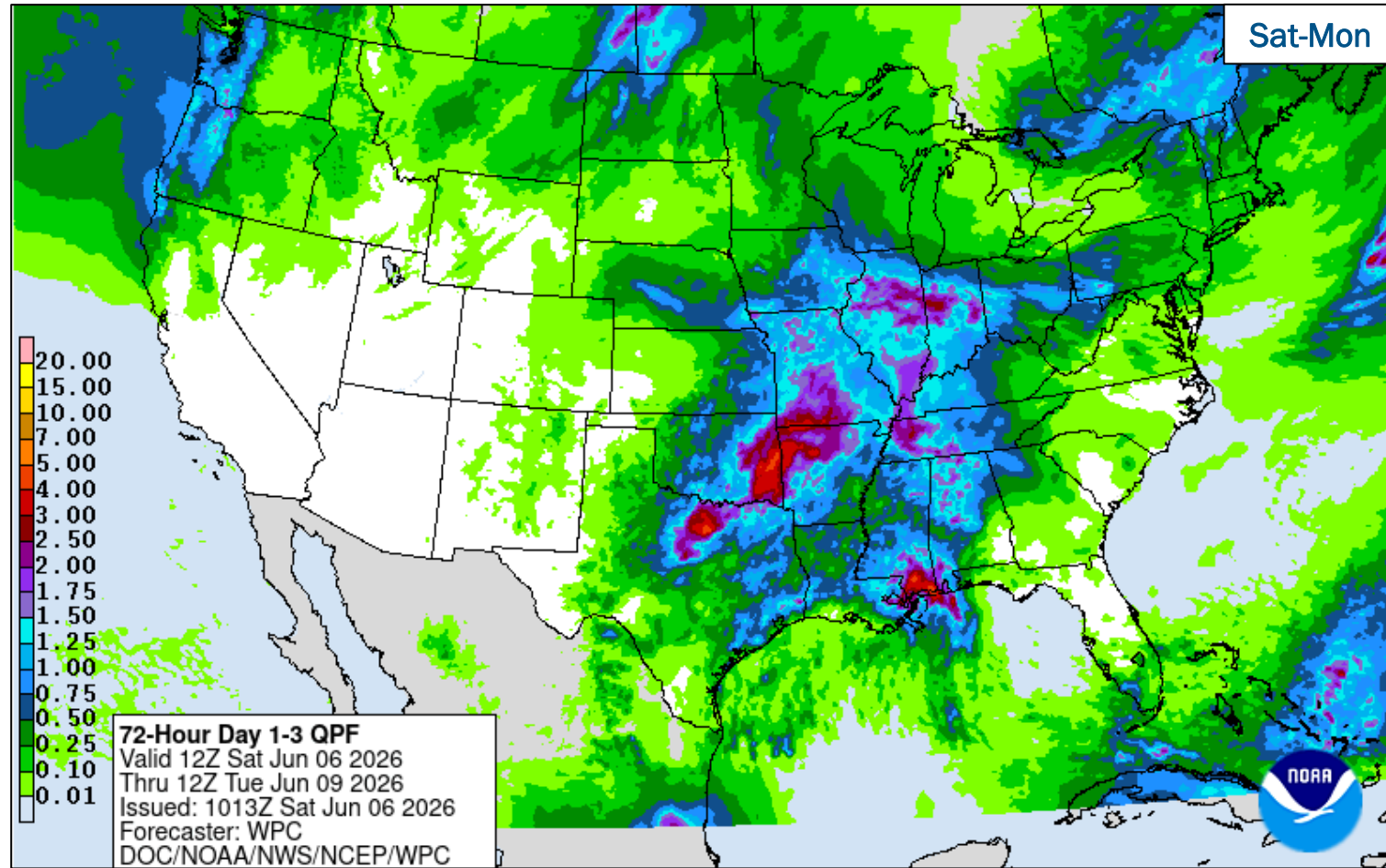
Severe Weather Outlook



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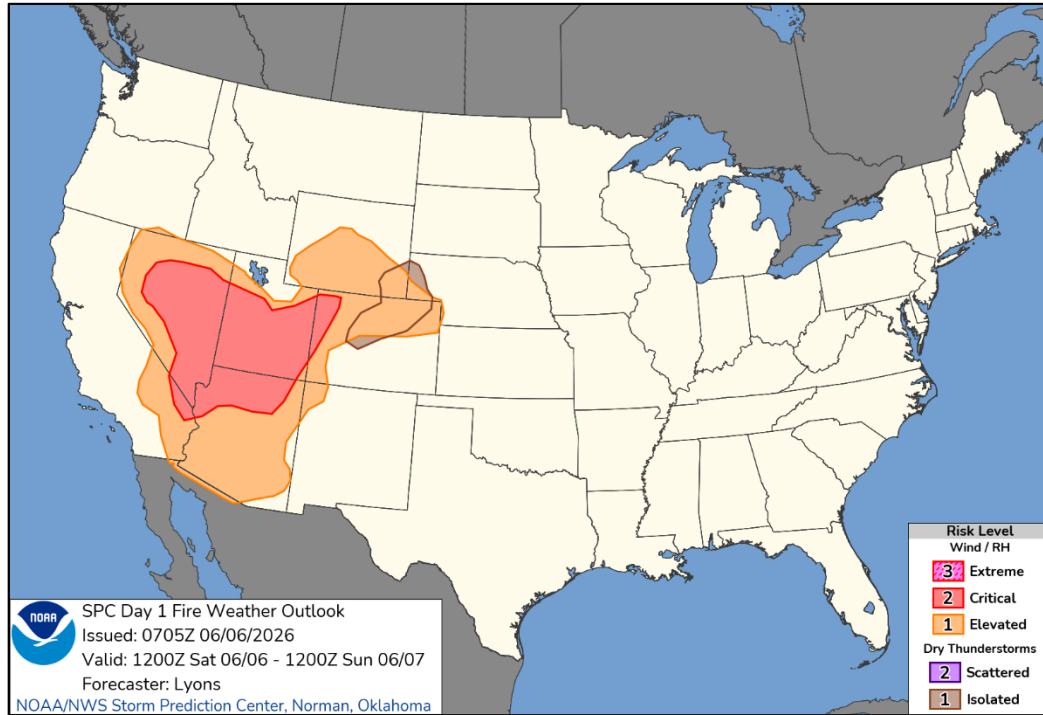
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



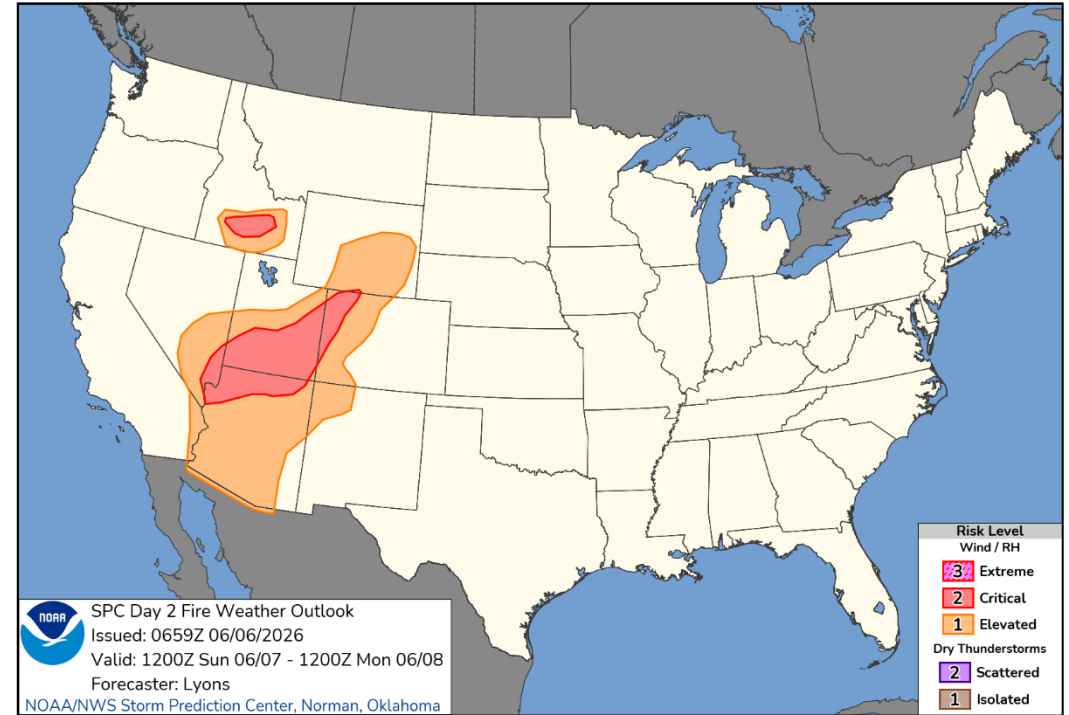
