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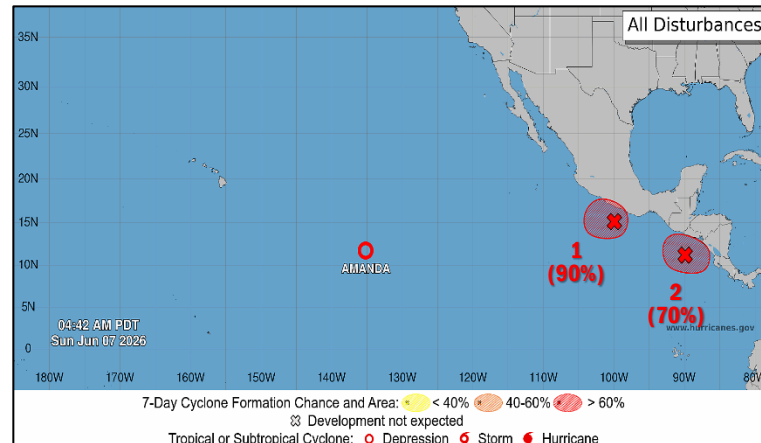

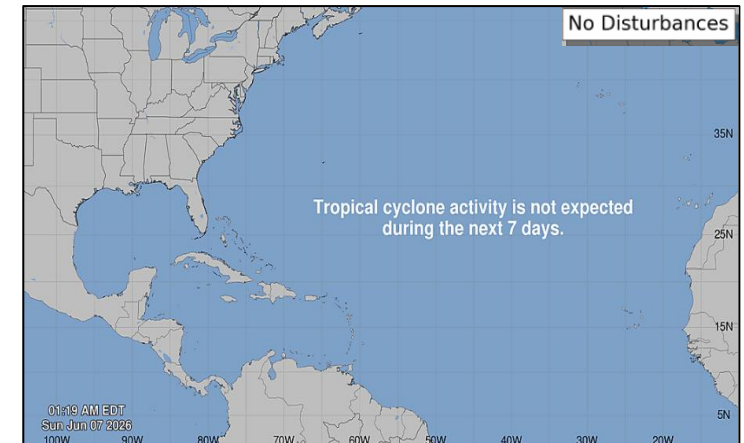
[Disturbance 1 \(EP91\):](#) (*as of 8:00 a.m. ET*)

- Offshore southern and southwestern Mexico
- Forecast to move [northeastward then northward](#), [approaching the coast of southern Mexico tonight and Monday](#)
- [System becoming better organized](#); a tropical depression is likely to form [today](#)
- Formation chance – 48-hour: [High \(90%\)](#); 7-day: [High \(90%\)](#)

[Disturbance 2 \(EP92\):](#) (*as of 8:00 a.m. ET*)

- Offshore of Central America
- Moving slowly to the N [toward the coast of Central America](#)
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for development; a tropical depression [is likely to form in the next day or two](#)
- Formation chance – 48-hour: [High \(70%\)](#); 7-day: [High \(70%\)](#)

Atlantic



- No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days



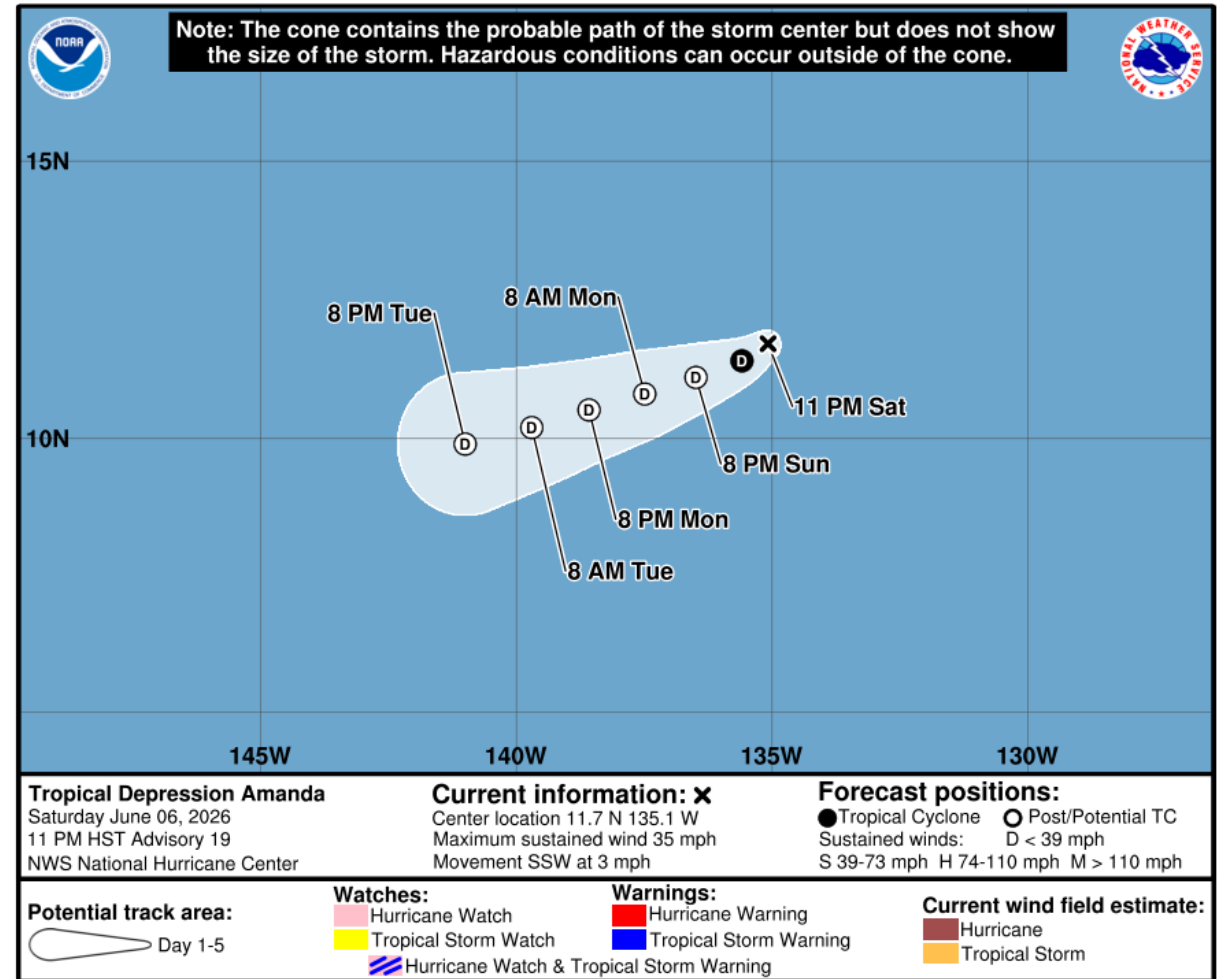
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Tropical Depression Amanda – Eastern Pacific

Situation: *(Advisory #19, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)*

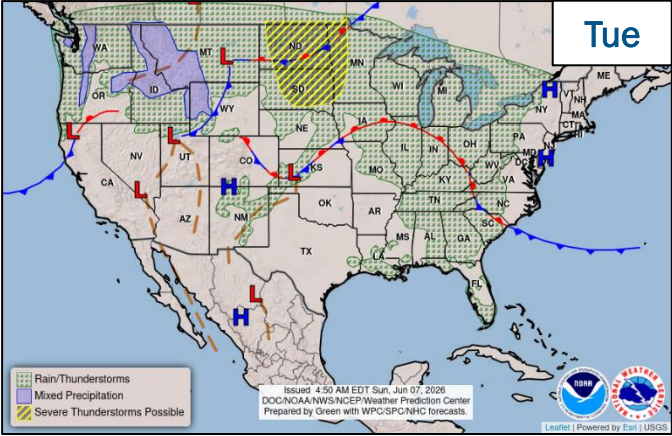
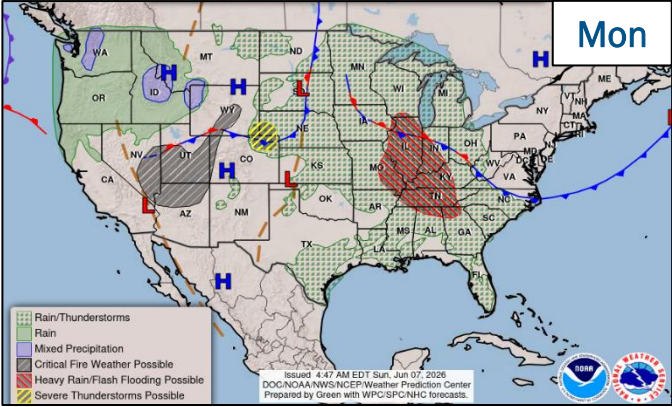
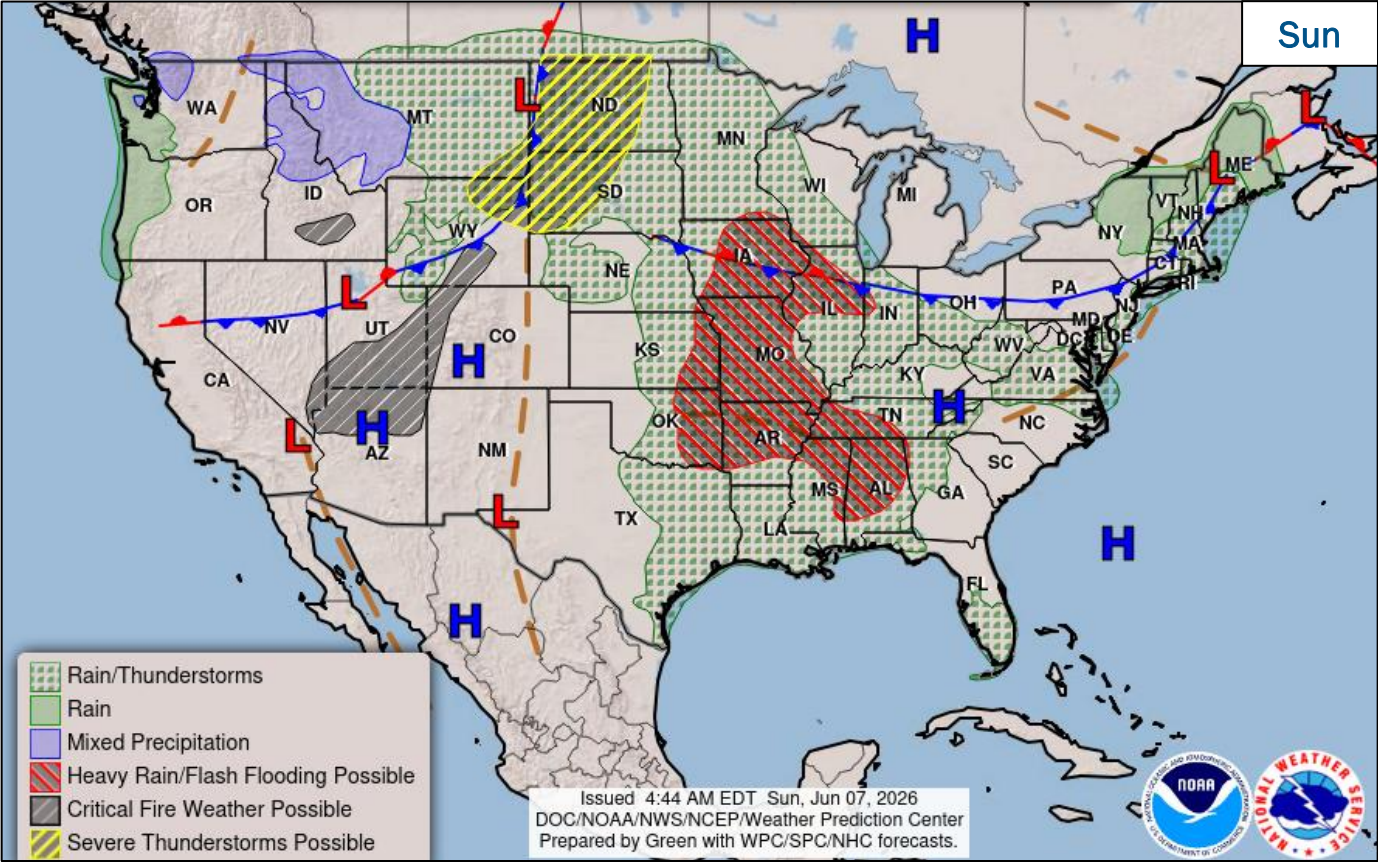
- Located **1,440** miles ESE of Hilo, HI

- Gradual weakening expected through the weekend; forecast to degenerate into a remnant low **by late today**



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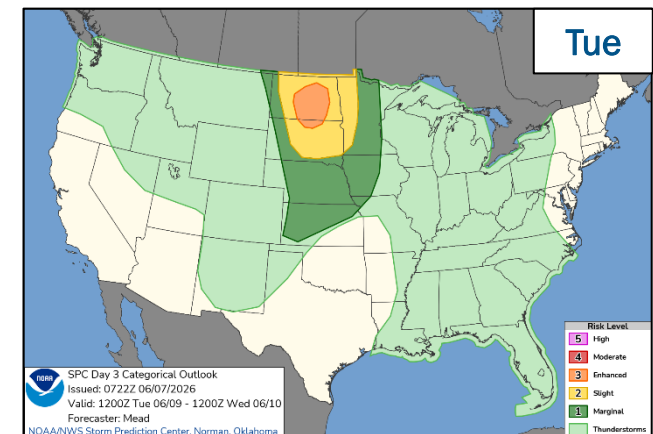
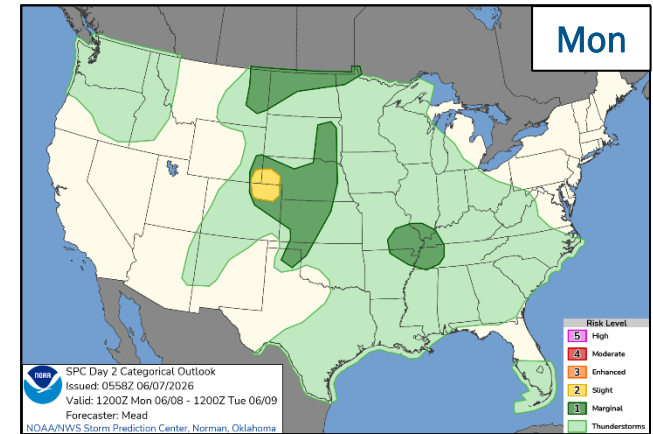
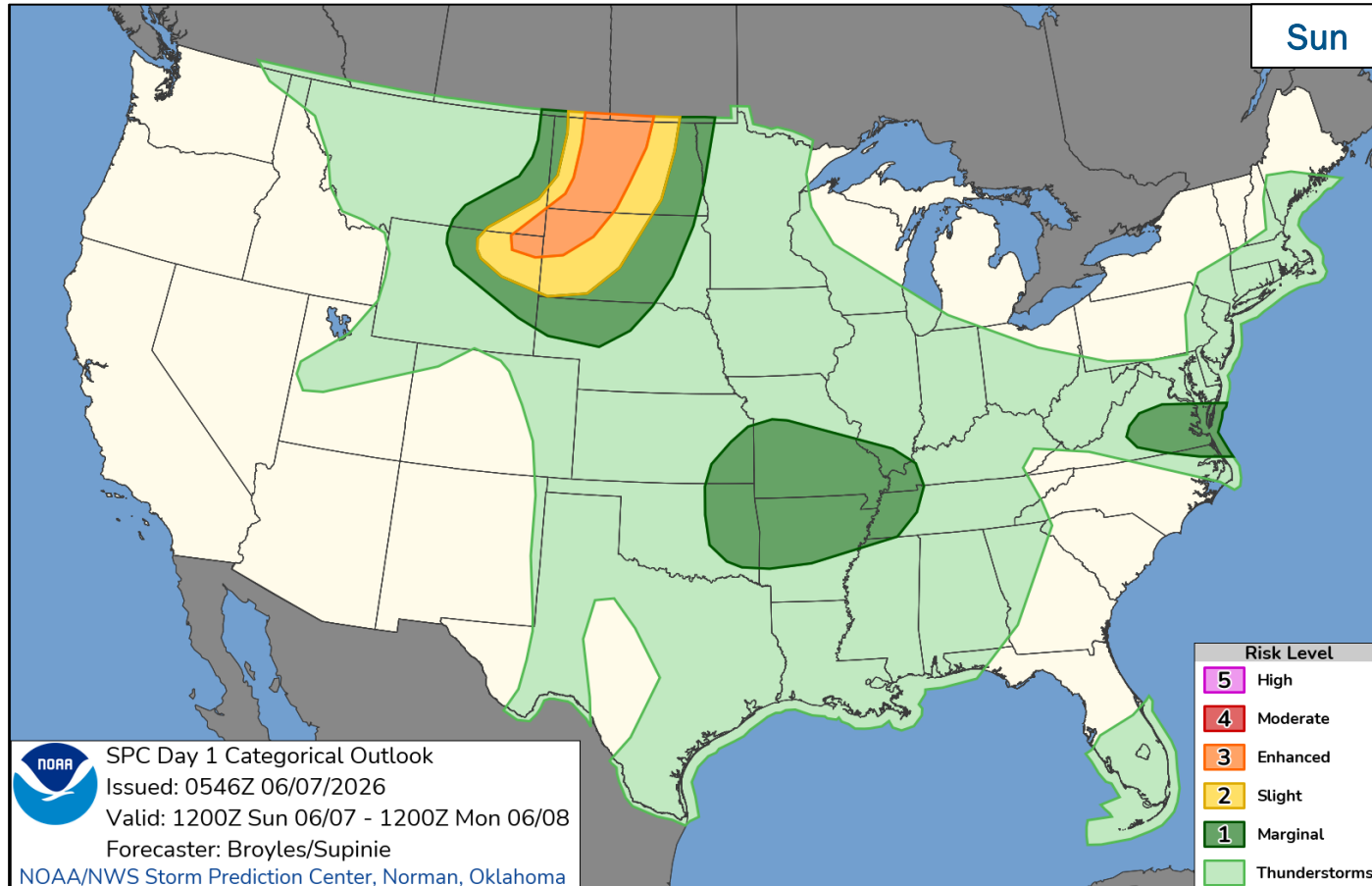

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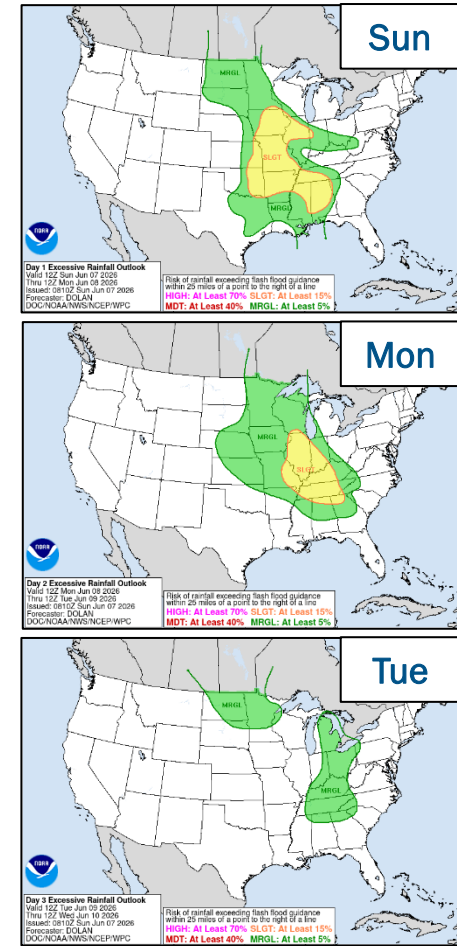
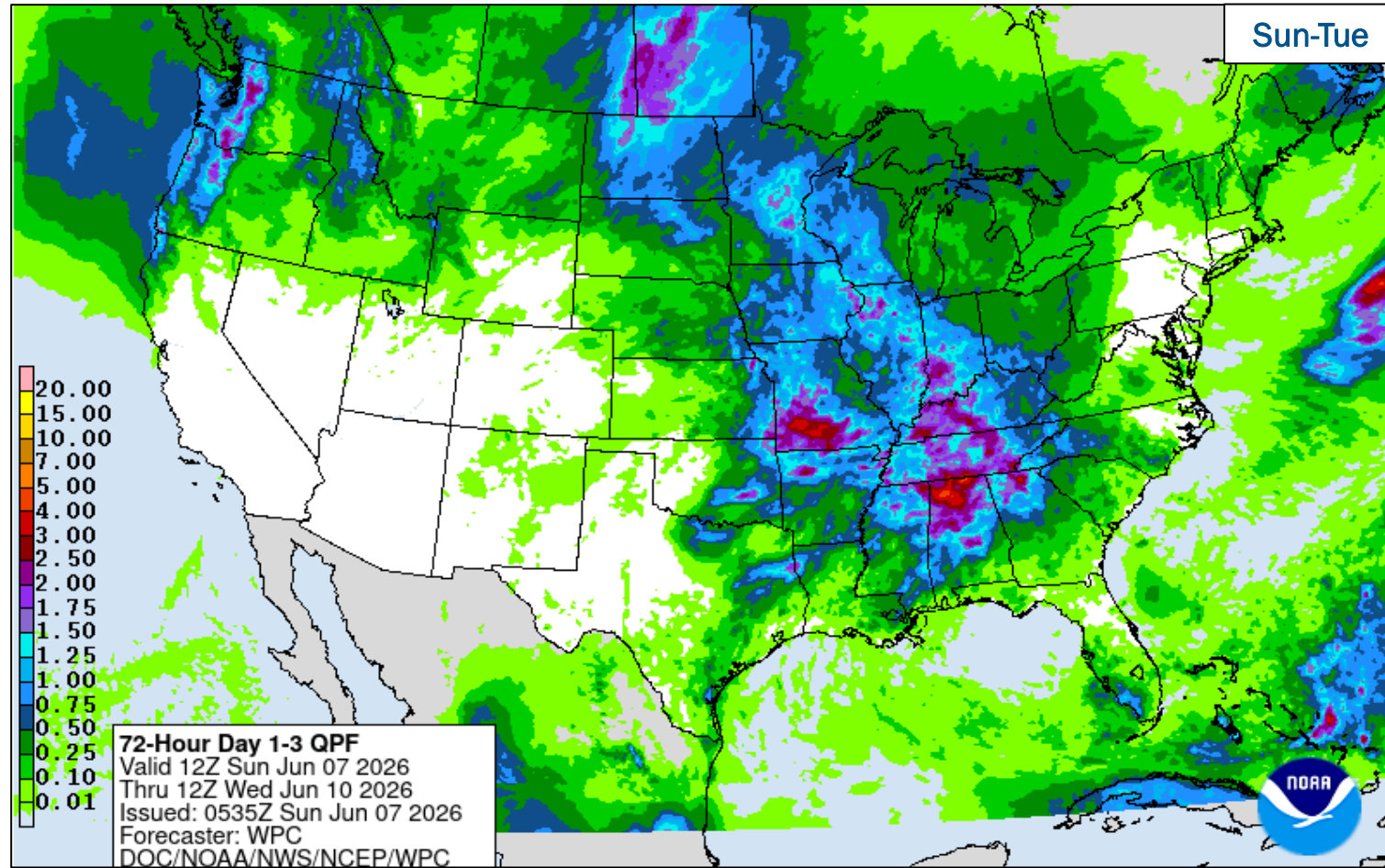
Severe Weather Outlook



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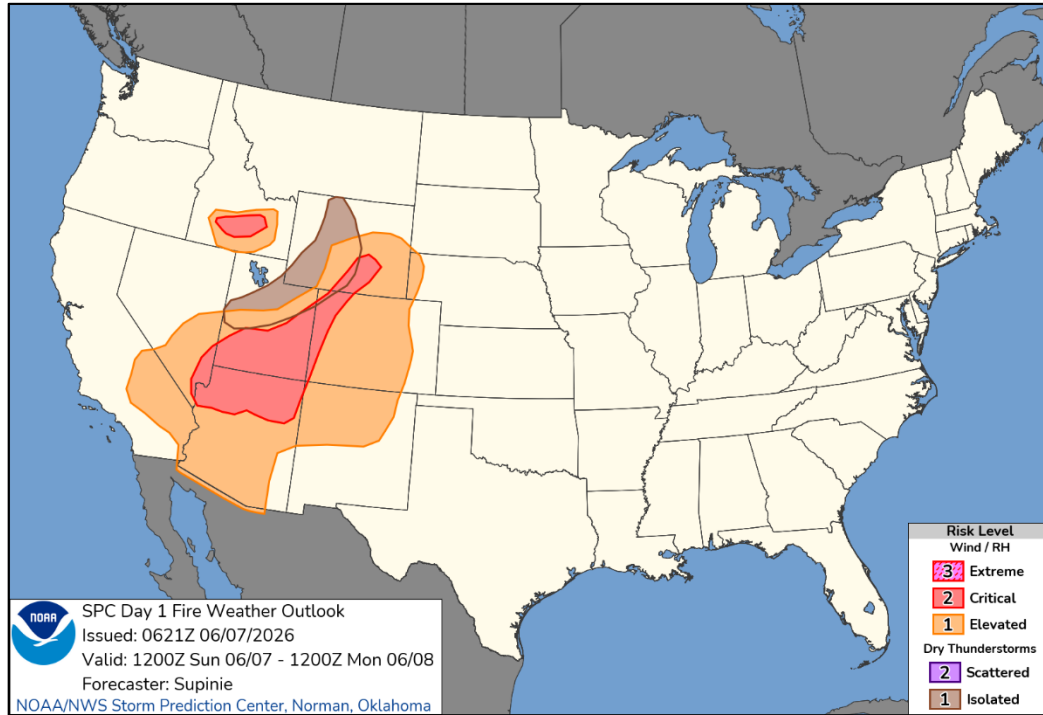
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



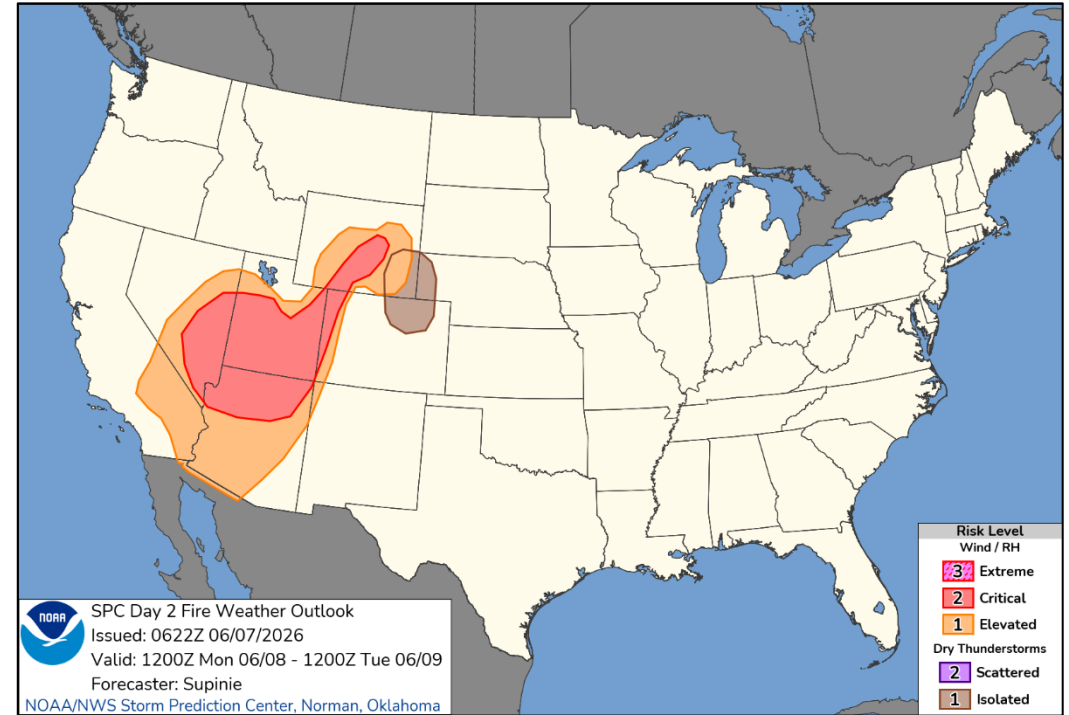

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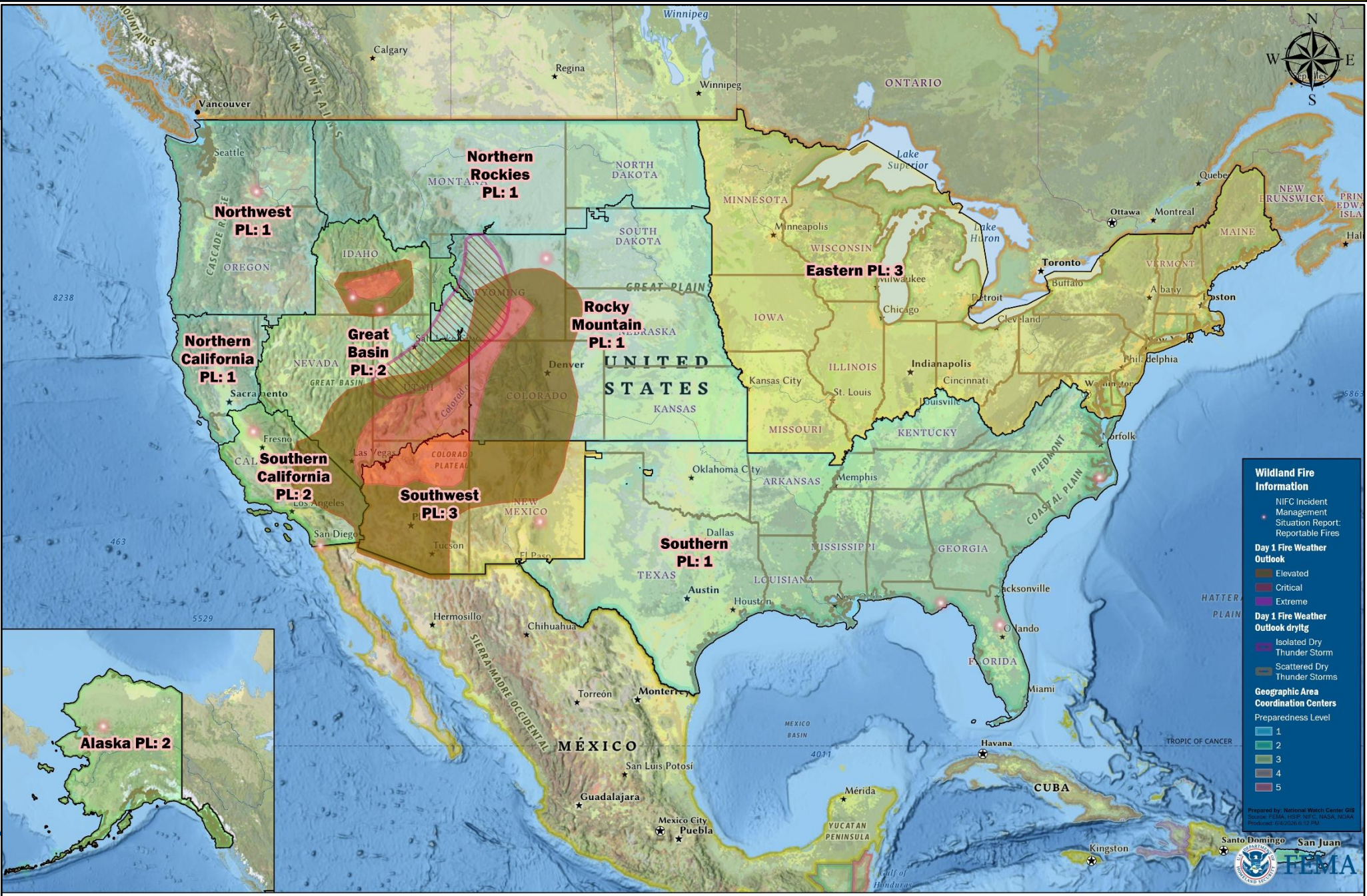

PL 3	Wildfire activity ongoing throughout 25% of country; National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC) sets priorities, allocates resources, and mobilizes assets at national level
PL 4	High levels of fire activity and areas are competing for firefighting resources; 60% of the nation's wildland firefighting resources committed
PL 5	Extremely high levels of fire activity; 80% of nation's firefighting resources committed

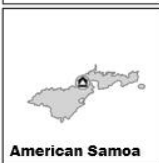
