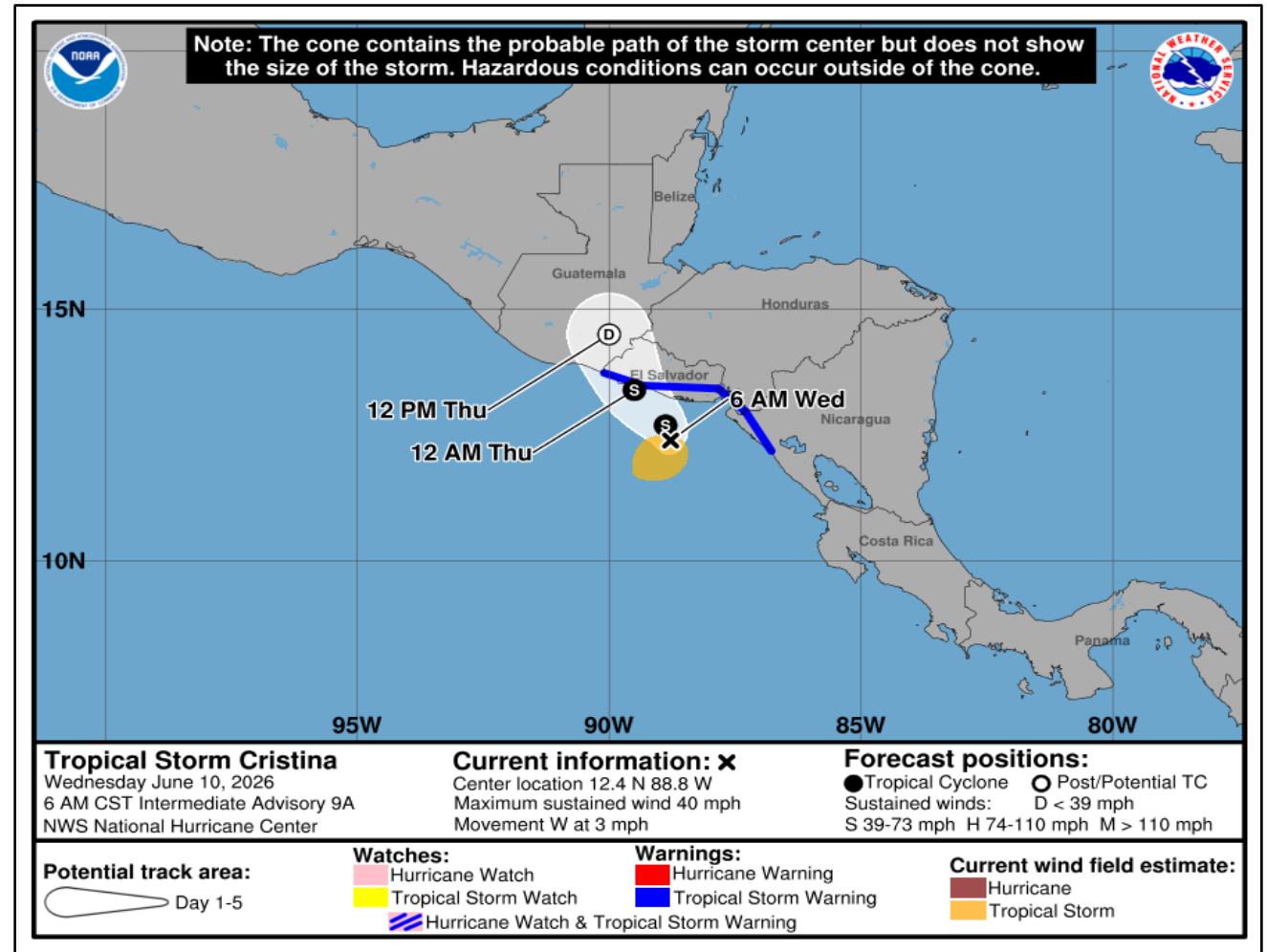


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Tropical Storm Cristina – Eastern Pacific

Situation: (Advisory #9A, as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Slight strengthening is possible through tonight, with weakening forecast for Thursday after making landfall



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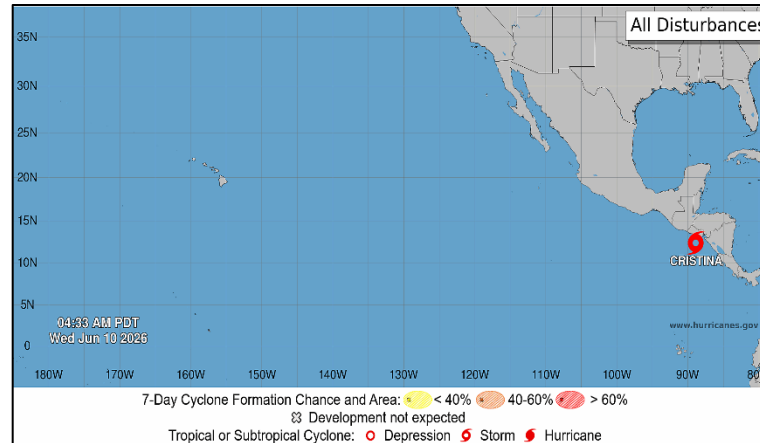

- No tropical activity is threatening the U.S. territories

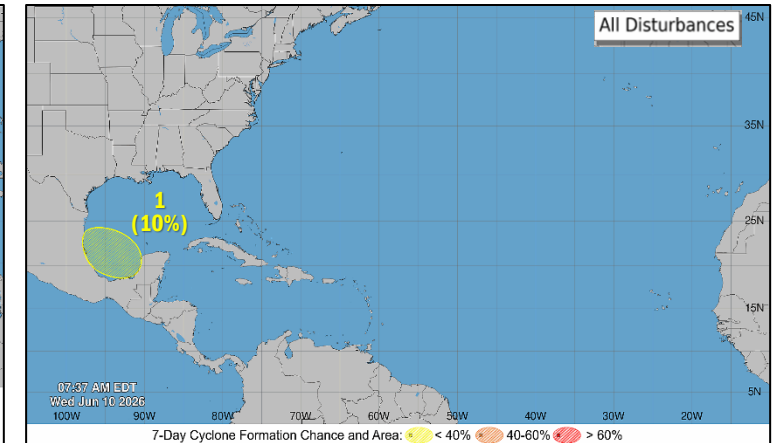
Eastern and Central Pacific

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

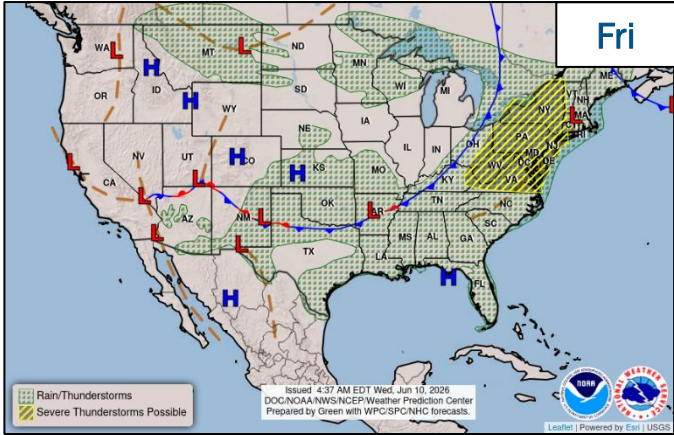
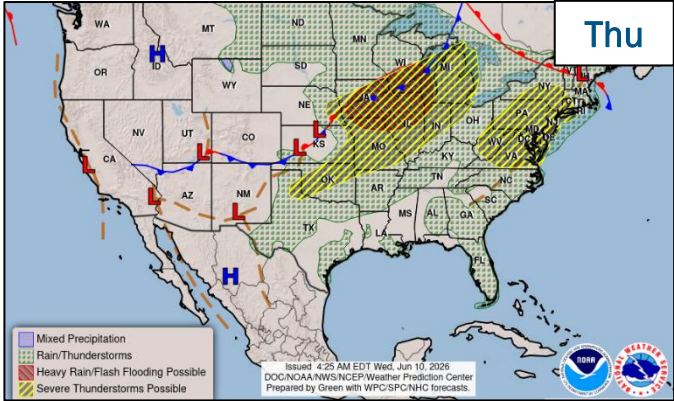
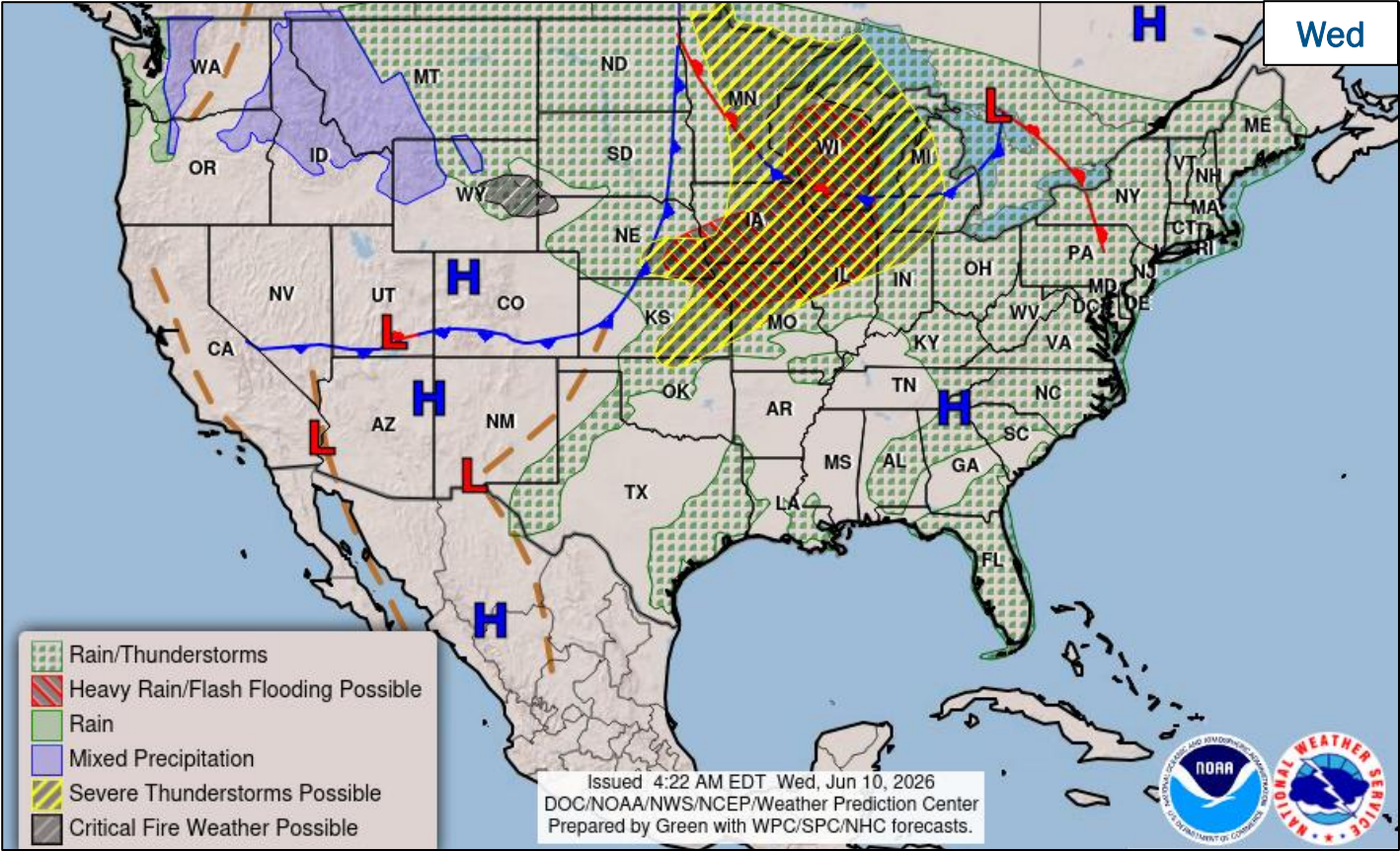
- Located in the Bay of Campeche, Mexico

- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (0%); 7-day: Low (10%)



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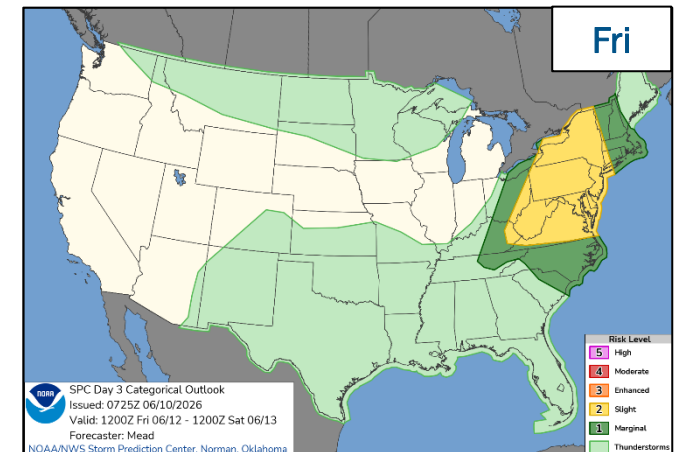
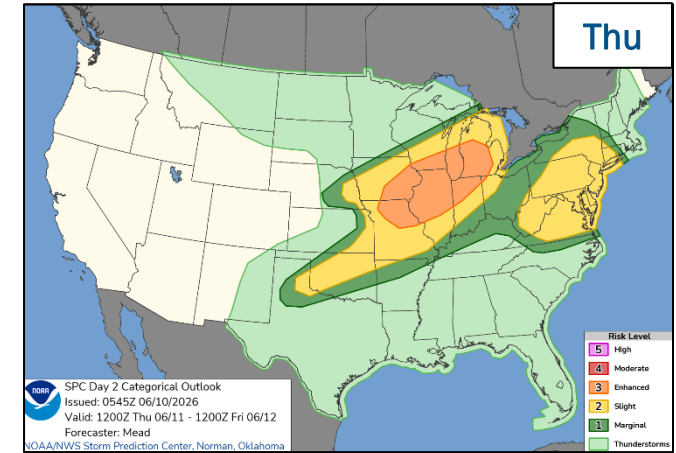
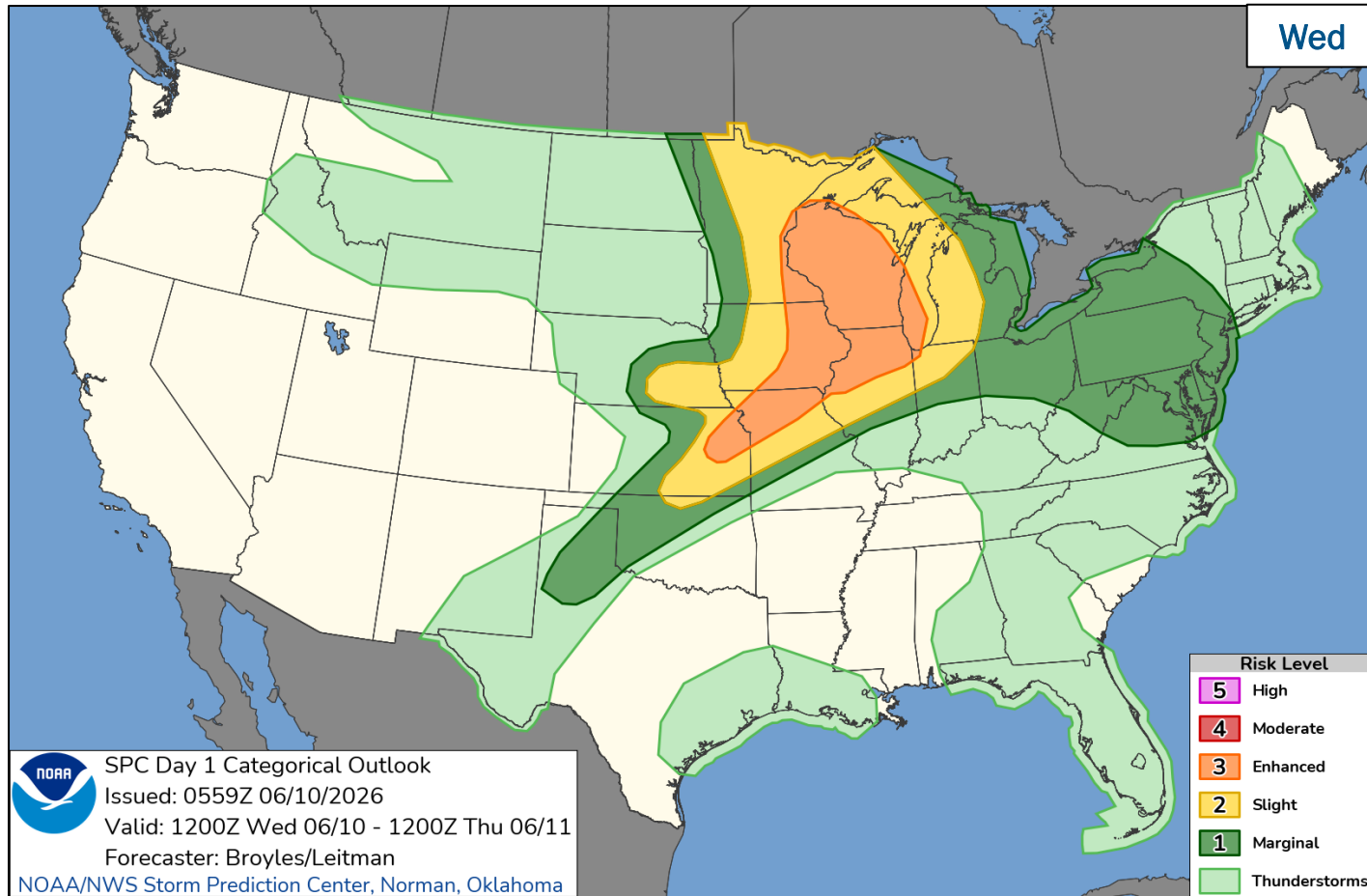
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National Weather Forecast



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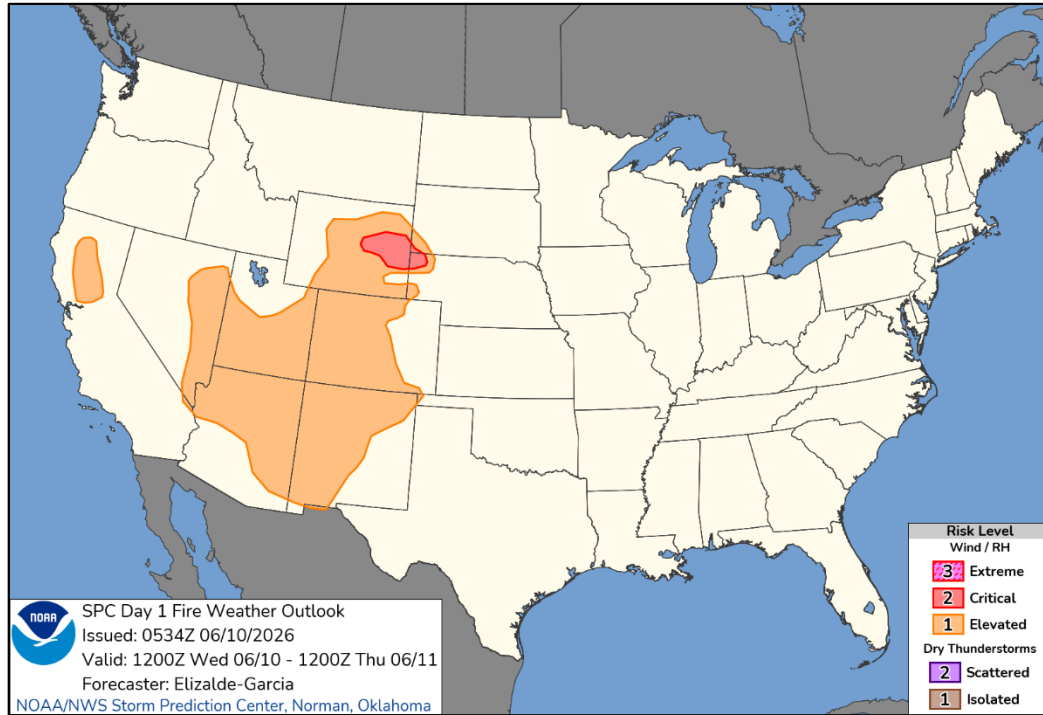
Severe Weather Outlook



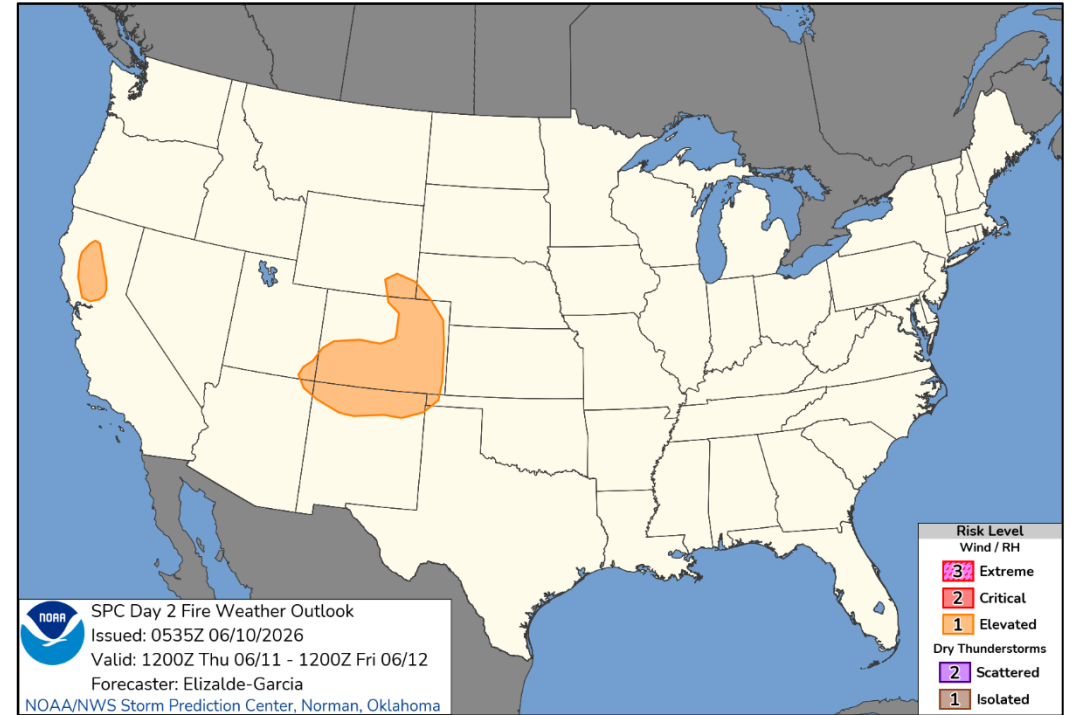
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Fire Weather Outlook

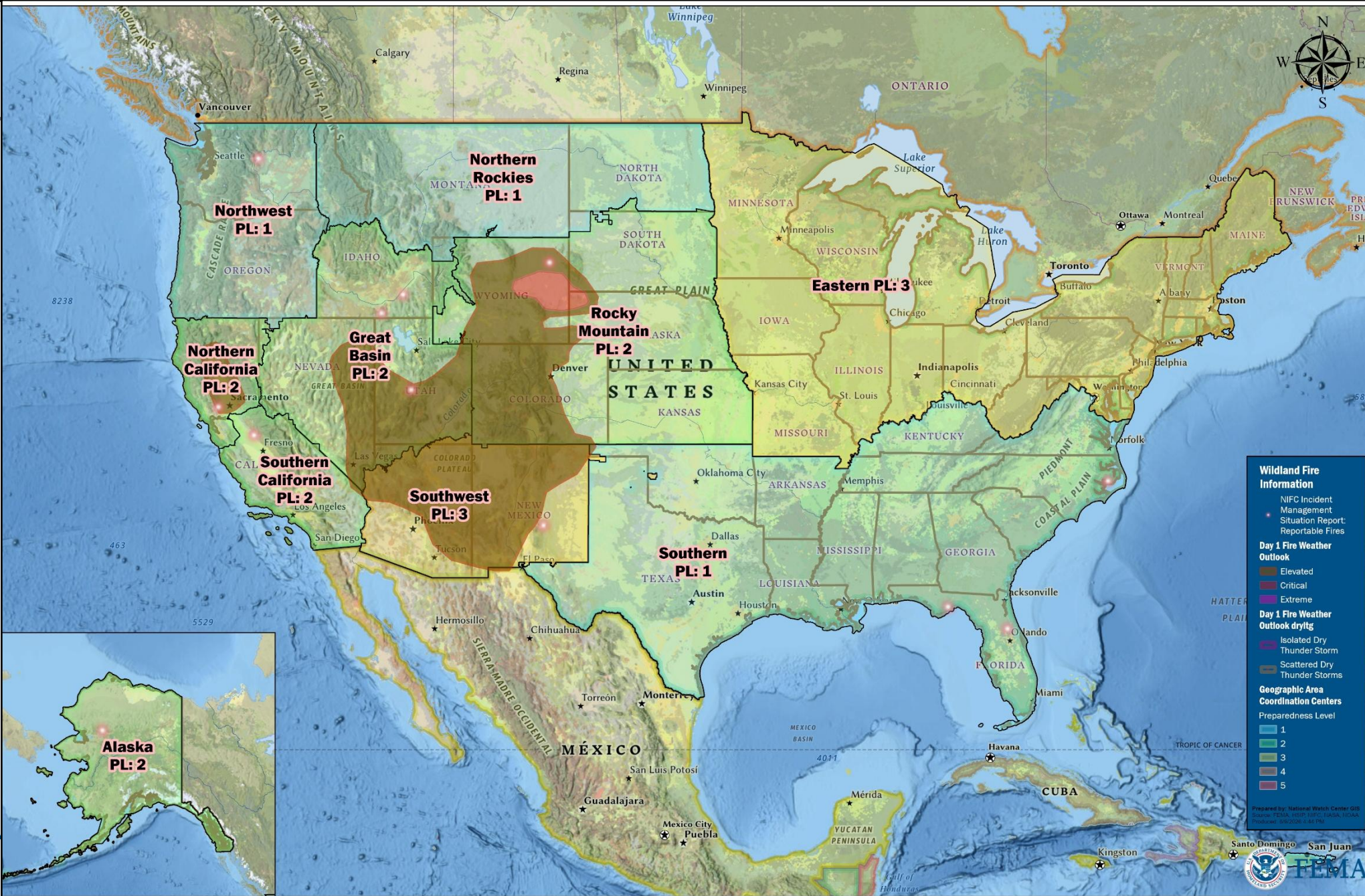

PL 5	Extremely high levels of fire activity; 80% of nation's firefighting resources committed

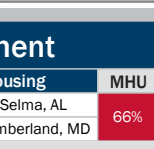

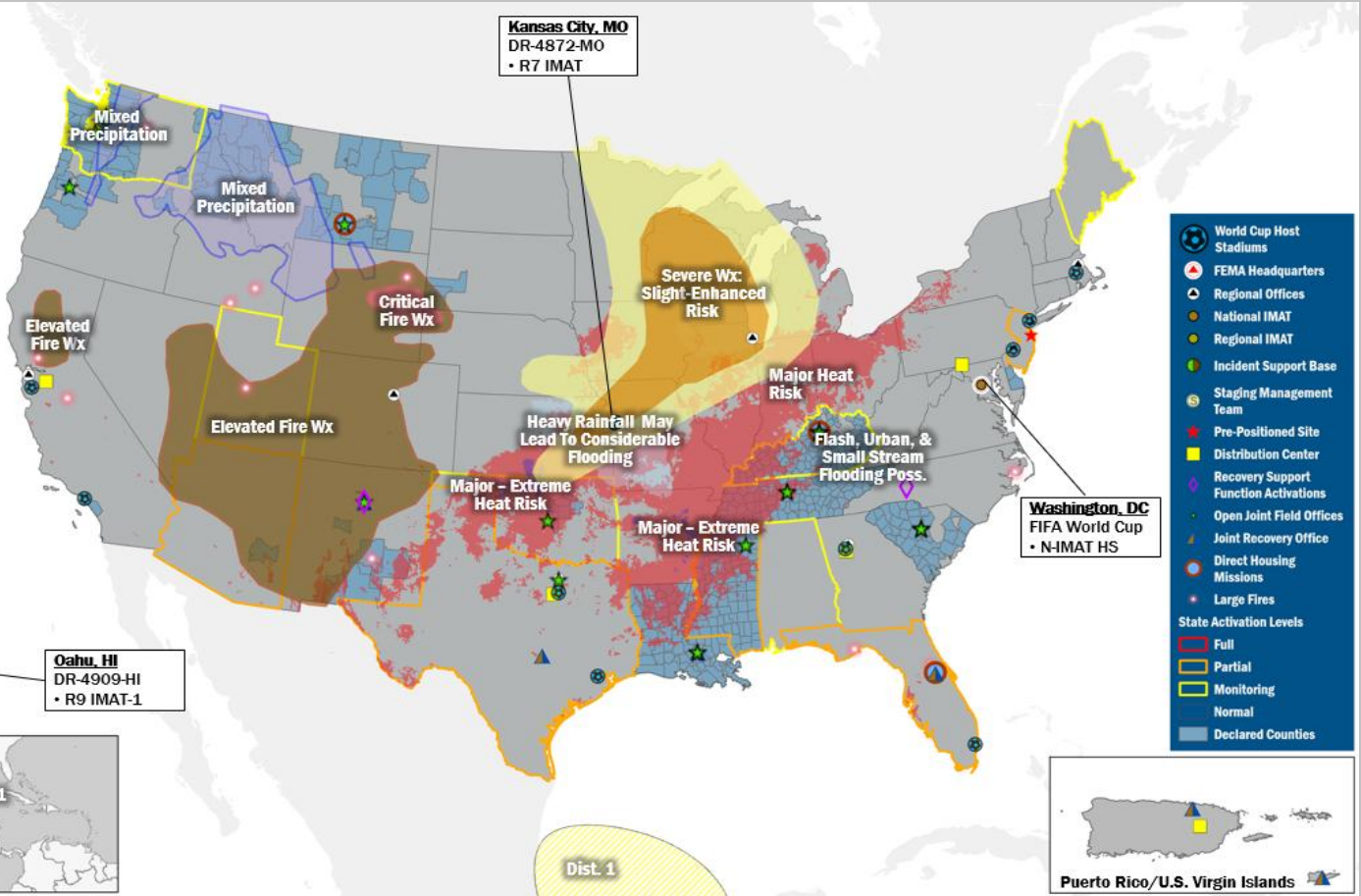
