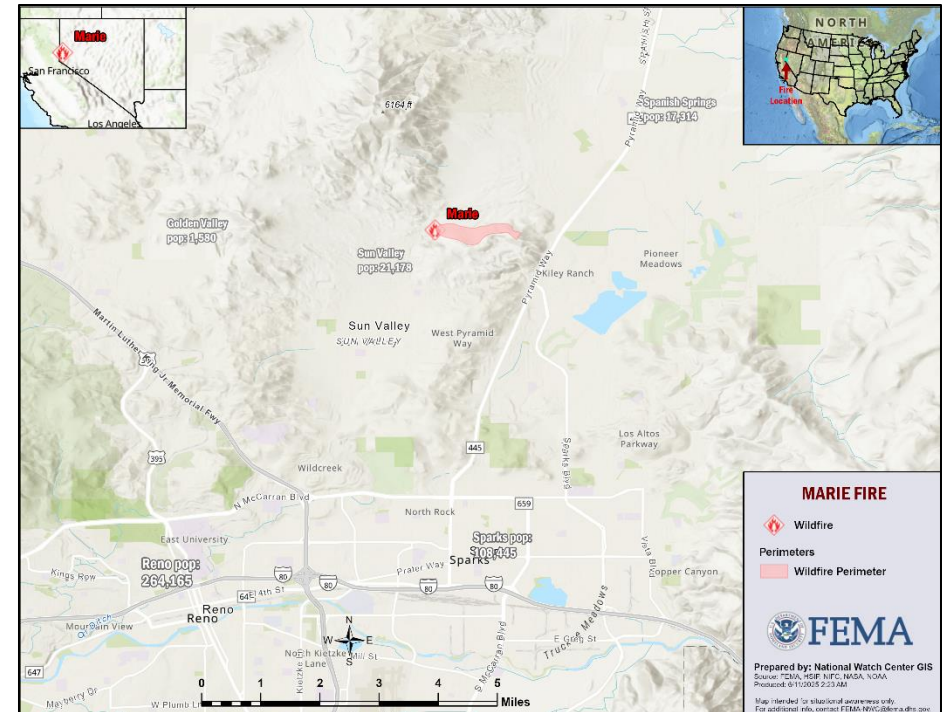
**Situation and analysis:** The Regional Administrator for FEMA Region IX granted a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Marie Fire, which has burned 140 acres and is currently 30% contained. The fire is affecting state, private, and federal lands in the community of Spanish Springs, NV (pop. 17k), 6 miles north of Reno and Sparks (combined est. pop. 382k). Following the approval, mandatory evacuation orders have been lifted, and no further federal assistance has been requested.

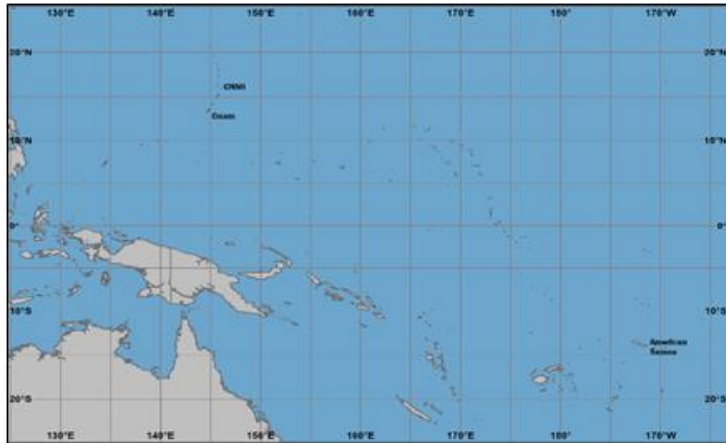

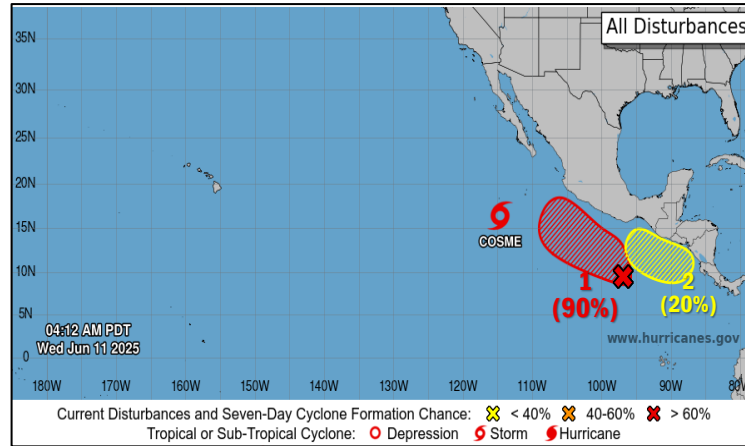
# Tropical Outlook

## Western Pacific



- No tropical cyclones threatening the U.S. territories are expected during the next 7 days

## Central and Eastern Pacific



### Tropical Storm Cosme: (Advisory #12 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 595 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph; moving NE at 3 mph
- Continues to weaken; expected to become a remnant low on Wednesday and forecast to dissipate by late Thursday or Friday

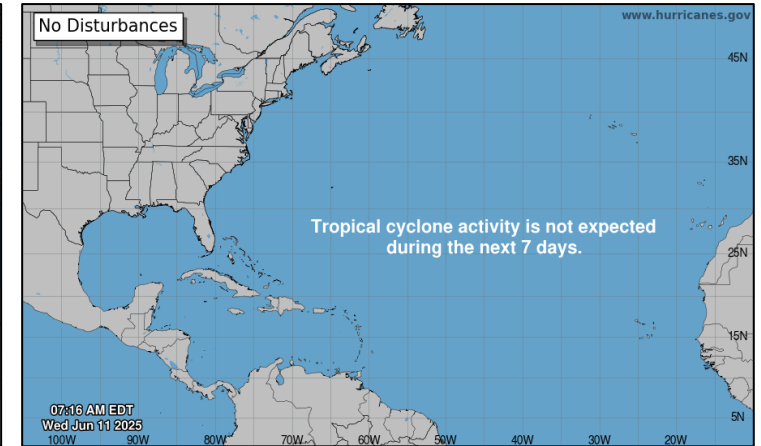
### Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for gradual development; a tropical depression is likely to form over the weekend
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: High (90%)

### Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Offshore of Central America and Southern Mexico
- Gradual development is possible as it moves WNW
- Formation chance – 48 hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)
