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# National Current Ops / Monitoring

## New Significant Incidents / Ongoing Ops

- COVID-19

## Hazard Monitoring

- Tropical Activity:
  - Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
  - Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1: High (90%); Disturbance 2: Low (30%)
- Severe thunderstorms – Northern Plains; Upper Mississippi Valley to Ohio Valley
- Heavy rain and flash flooding – Northern Plains
- Critical fire weather – Southwest to Southern/Central Plains and Southern/Central Rockies

- FMAG Approval – Pipeline Fire, AZ

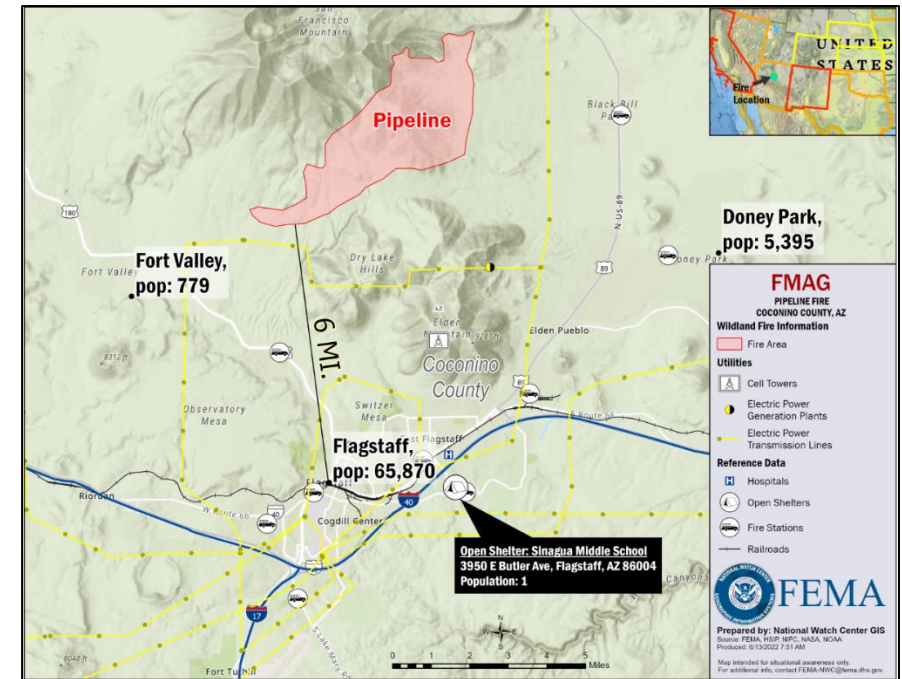

## Current Situation:

- Fire began June 12 and is burning on state and private land in and around Doney Park, Timberline, and Blackbill Park (combined population 8k), approximately 6 miles north of Flagstaff (population 77k)
- 3,100 homes (85% are primary residences, 15% are secondary residences) and 50 commercial structures threatened
- Also threatening schools, fire stations, post offices, cell towers, electrical transmission lines, and cultural site
- Evacuations in effect for 1,800 people
- 1 shelter open with 1 occupant (*ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:52 a.m. ET*)
- Portions of Highway 89 closed with detours available

## Response:

- AZ EOC at Partial Activation (Wildfires and COVI)
- Region IX RWC and the NWC continue to monitor
- FMAG approved June 12

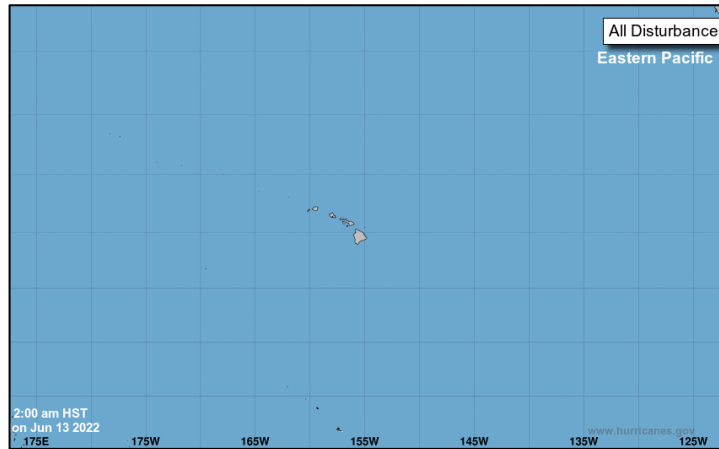


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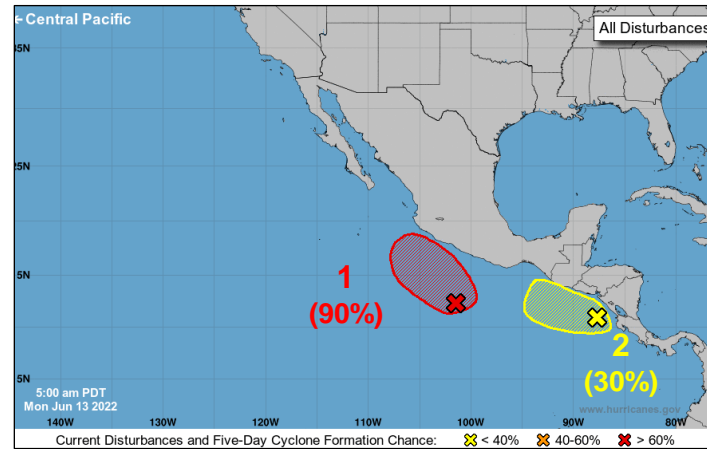
# Tropical Outlook – Five Day

- No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days

## Eastern Pacific



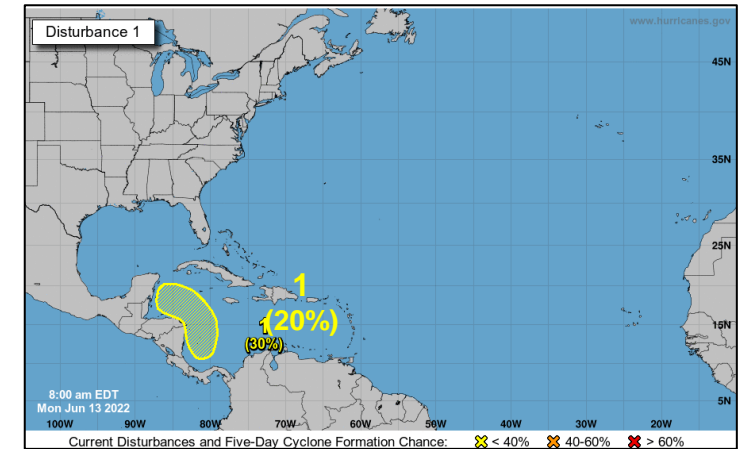
### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a few hundred miles S of the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Tropical depression likely to form in the next day or two
- Formation chance – 48-hours: High (80%); 5-days: High (90%)

### Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a couple of hundred miles southwest of the coast of Nicaragua
- Some additional development is possible over the next few days
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Low (20%); 5-days: Low (30%)

### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

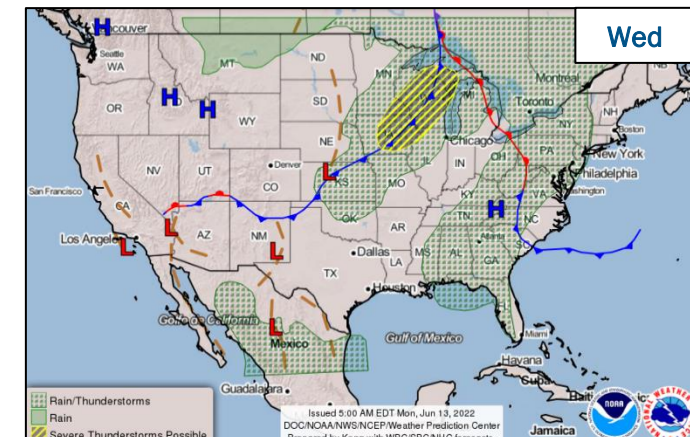
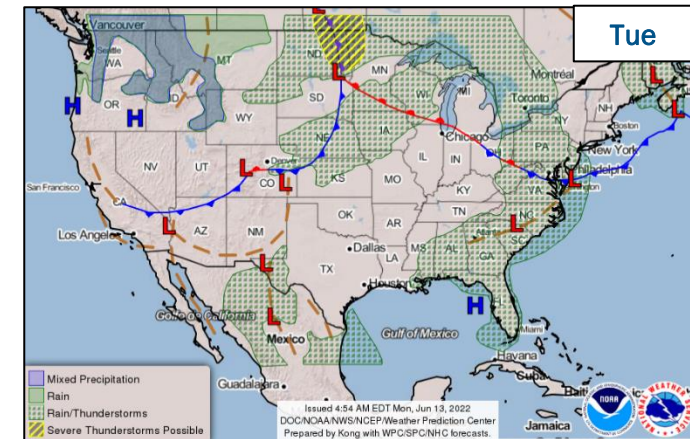
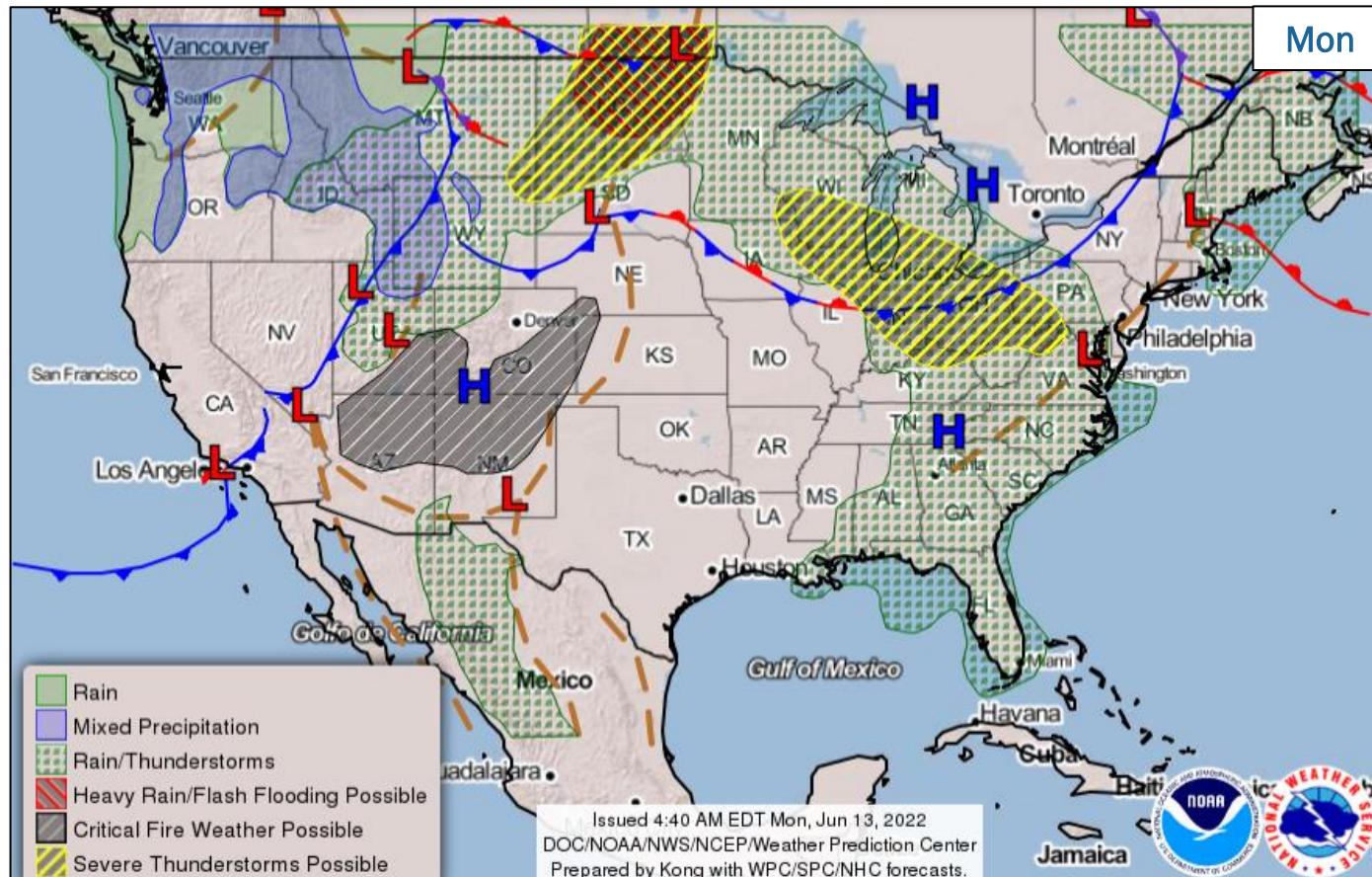
- Expected to develop by the middle of this week over the southwest Caribbean Sea
- Some slow development is possible thereafter as it drifts northwestward off the coasts of Nicaragua and Honduras
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Low (0%); 5-days: Low (30%)



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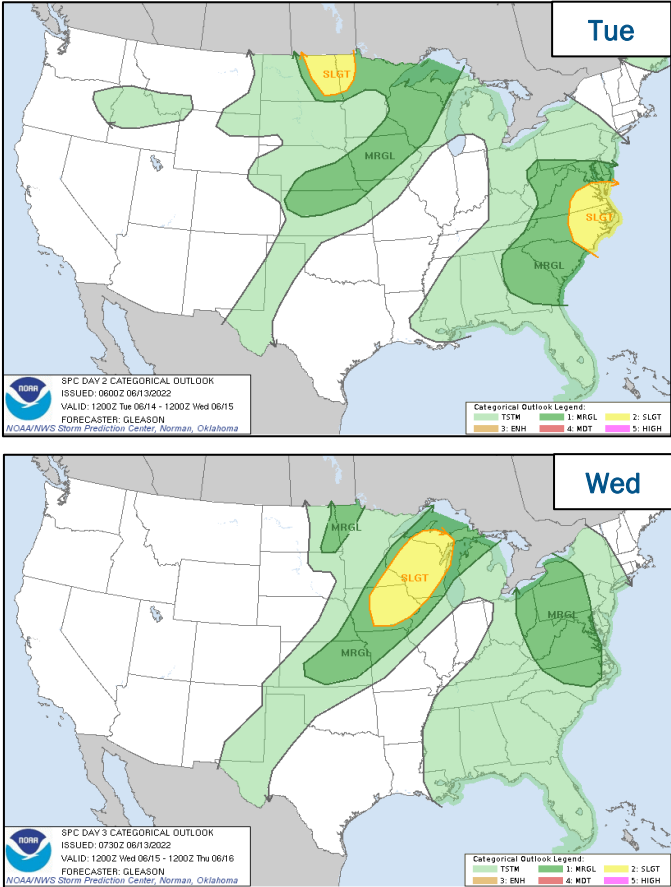
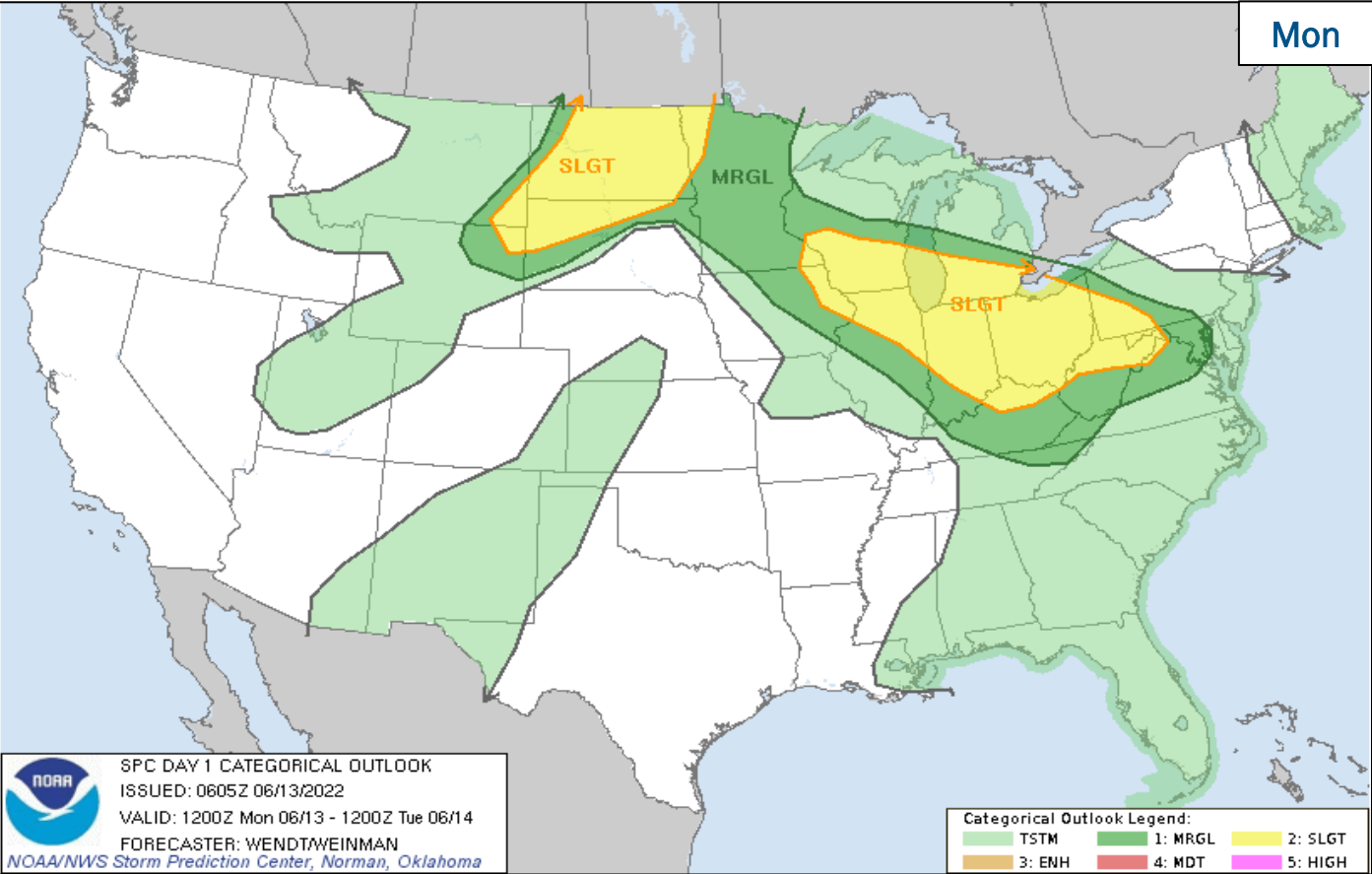
