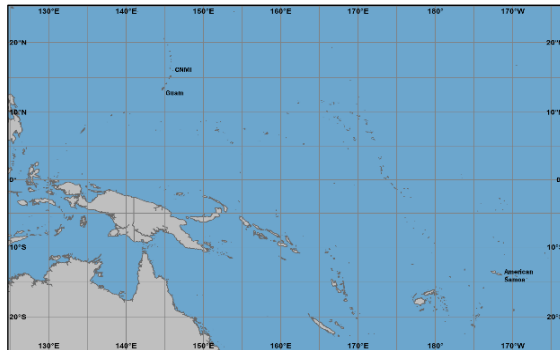

Western Pacific



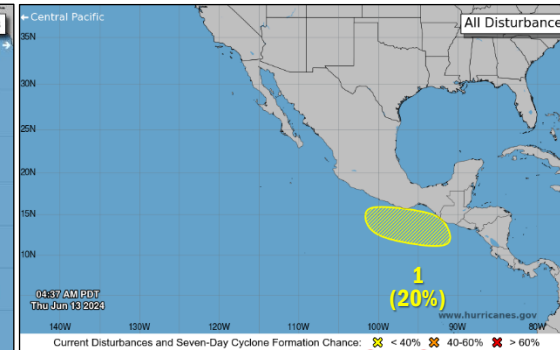
- No areas of concern for Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands or American Samoa

- No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days

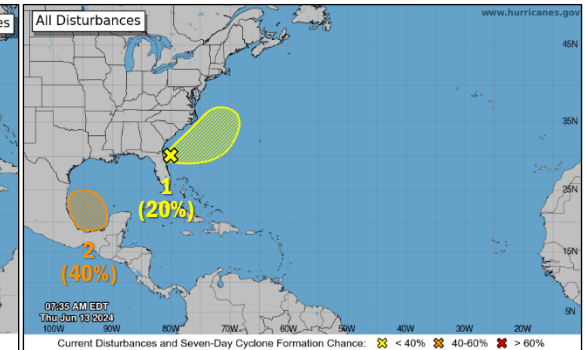
Eastern Pacific

- Moving NE
- Some slow development is possible
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (20%); 7-day: Low (20%)

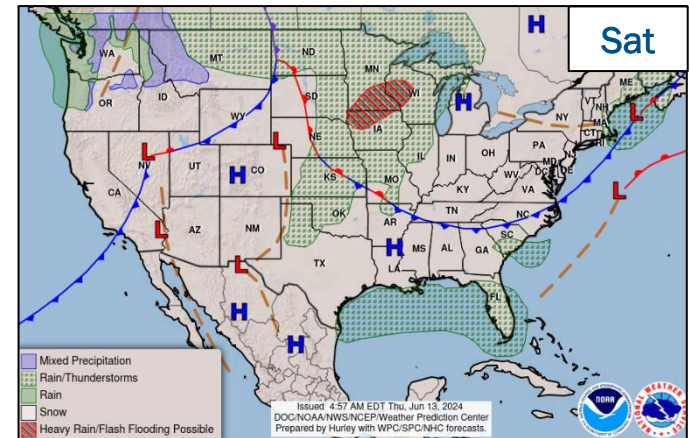
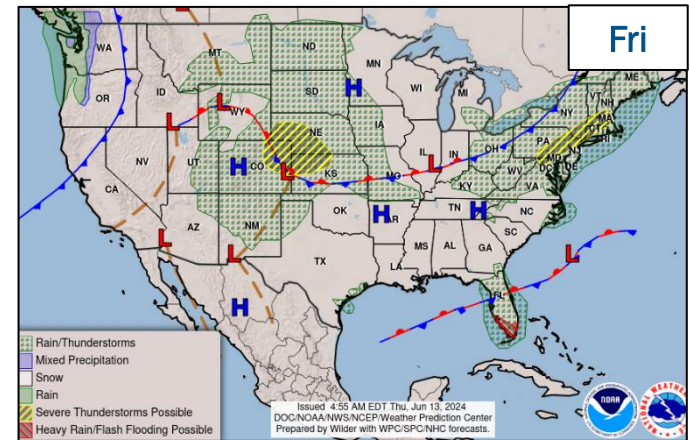
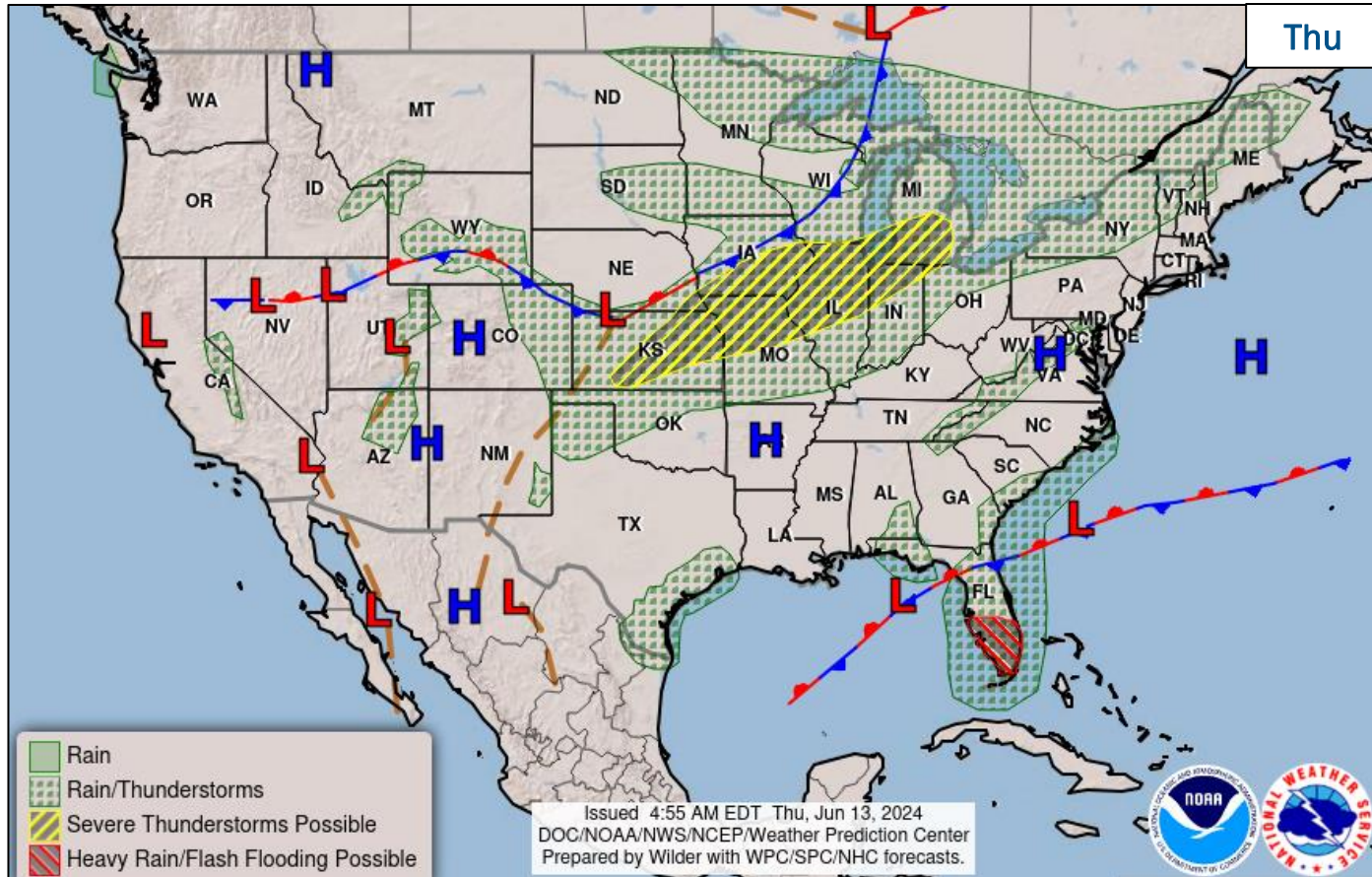
Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

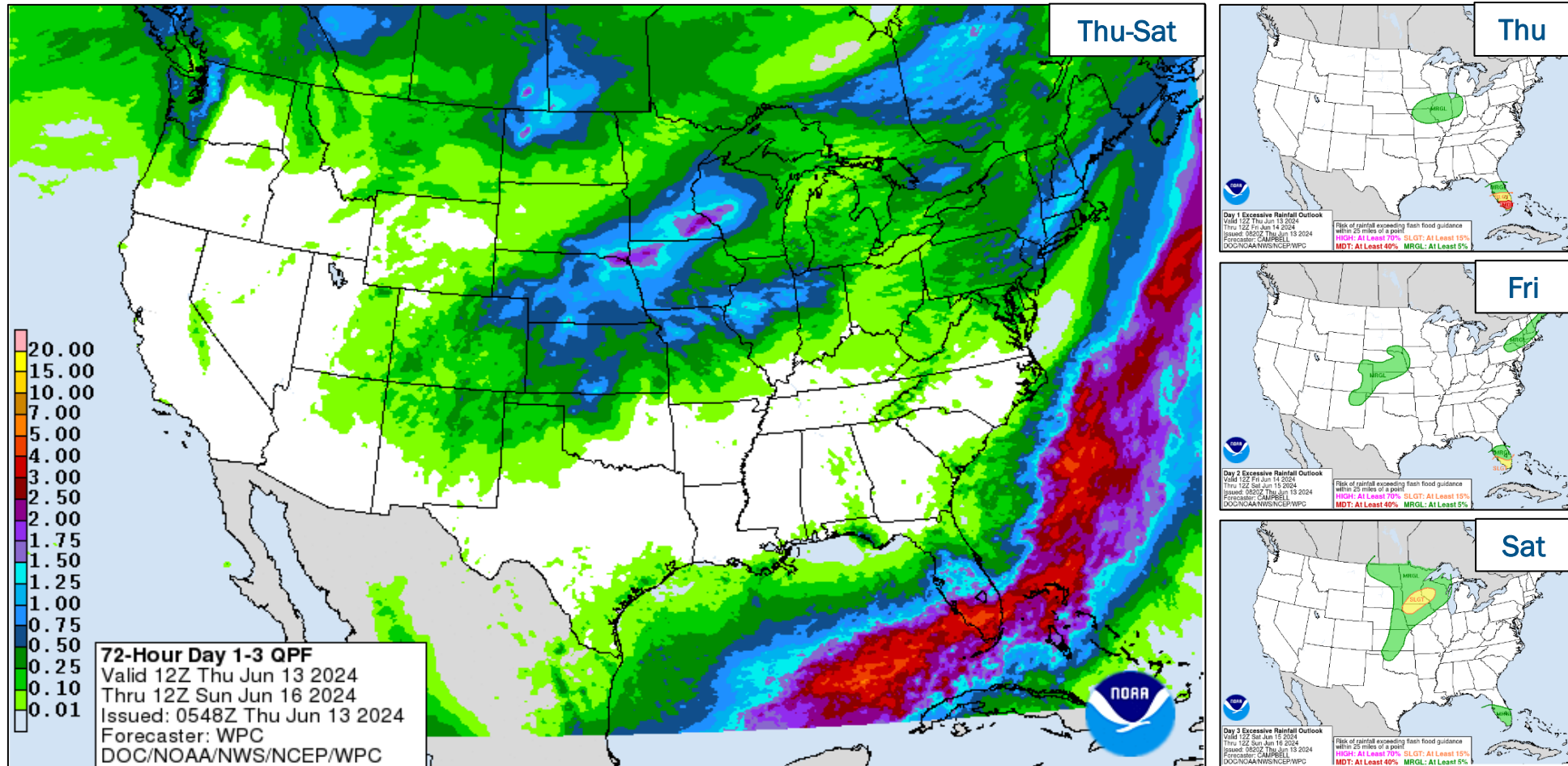
Severe Weather Outlook

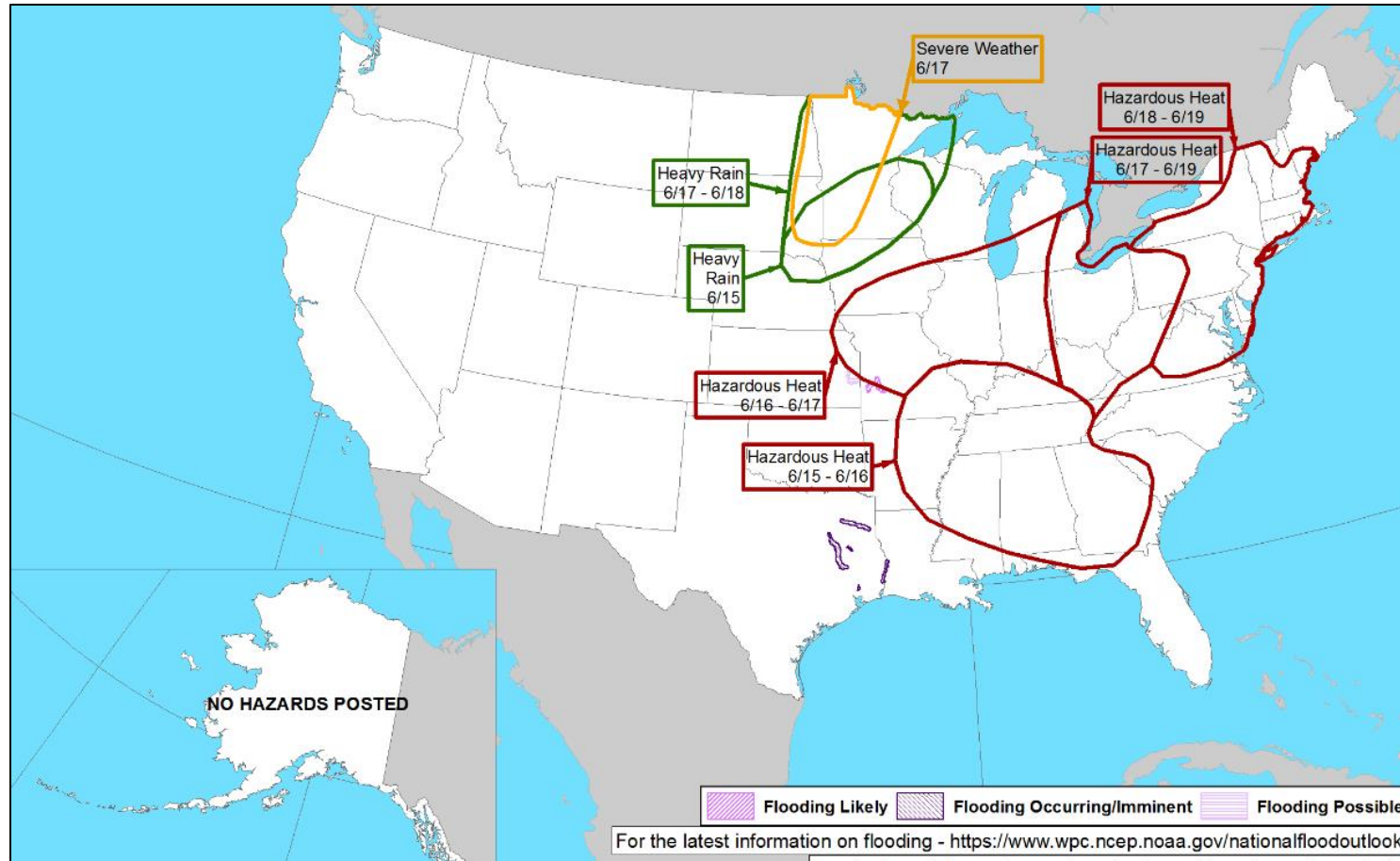
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

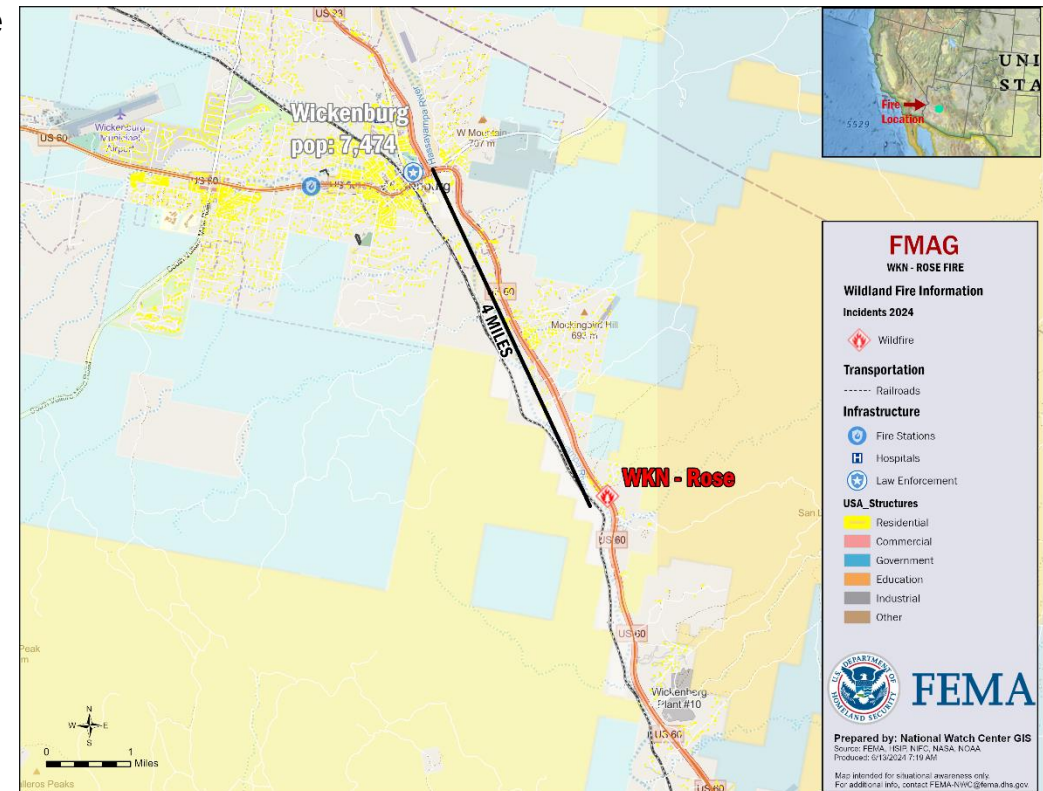

Situation: The Rose Fire began on Jun 12 and is burning on federal and state land around the communities of Wickenburg and Morristown (combined est. pop. 8k). The fire is threatening a police station, correctional facility, a water preserve, power transmission lines, and U.S. 60 is closed in both directions.

An evacuation assistance center has been established at the Wickenburg Community Center.

Response:

- FMAG approved Jun 12
- AZ EOC at Partial Activation (Southwest Border)
- Region IX RWC and NWC continue to monitor

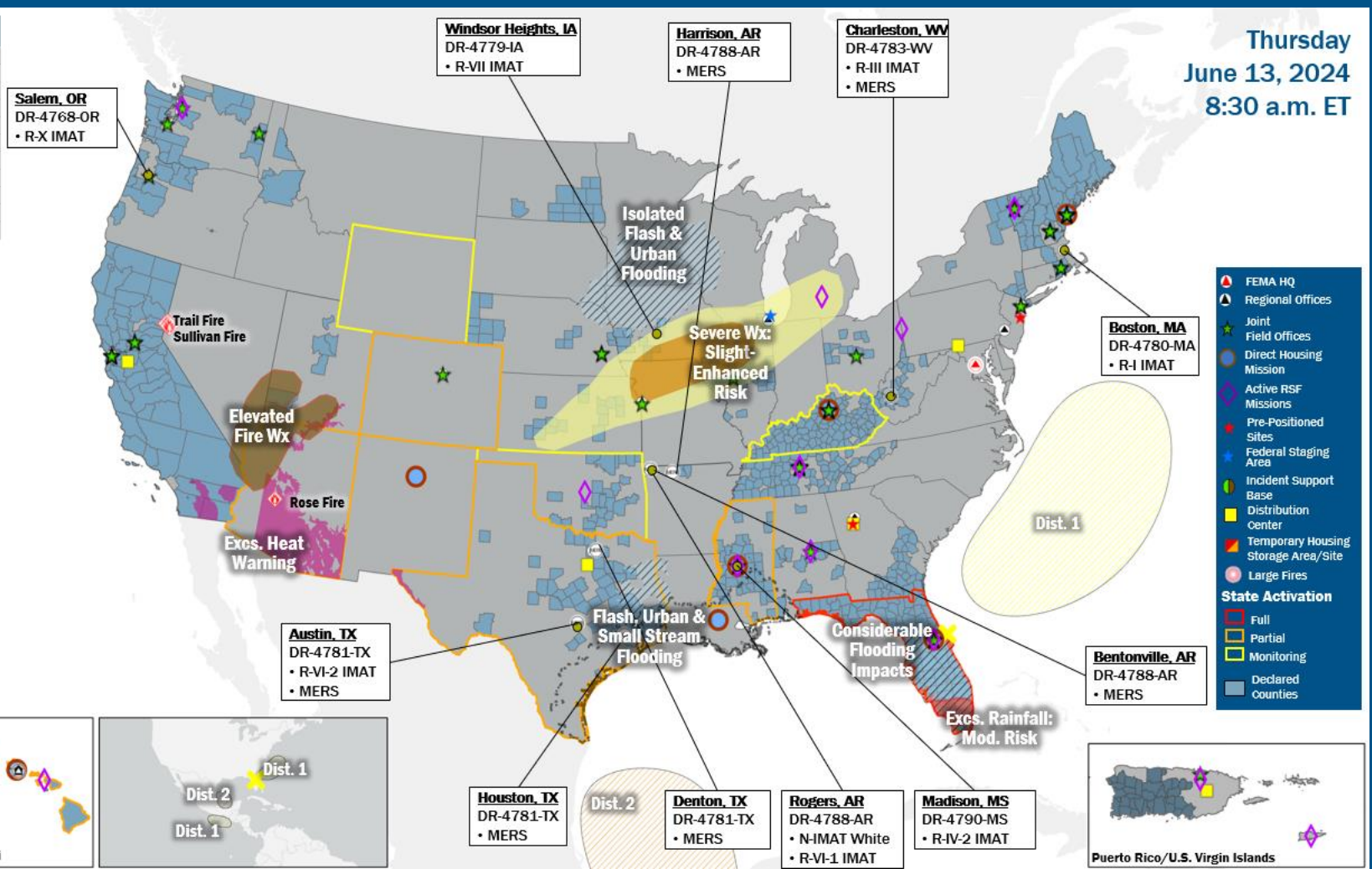
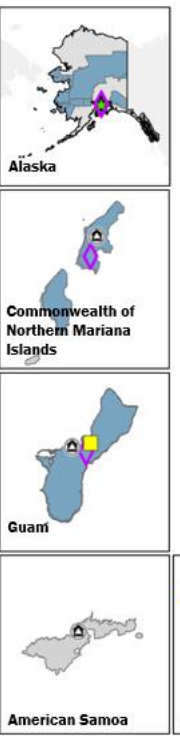

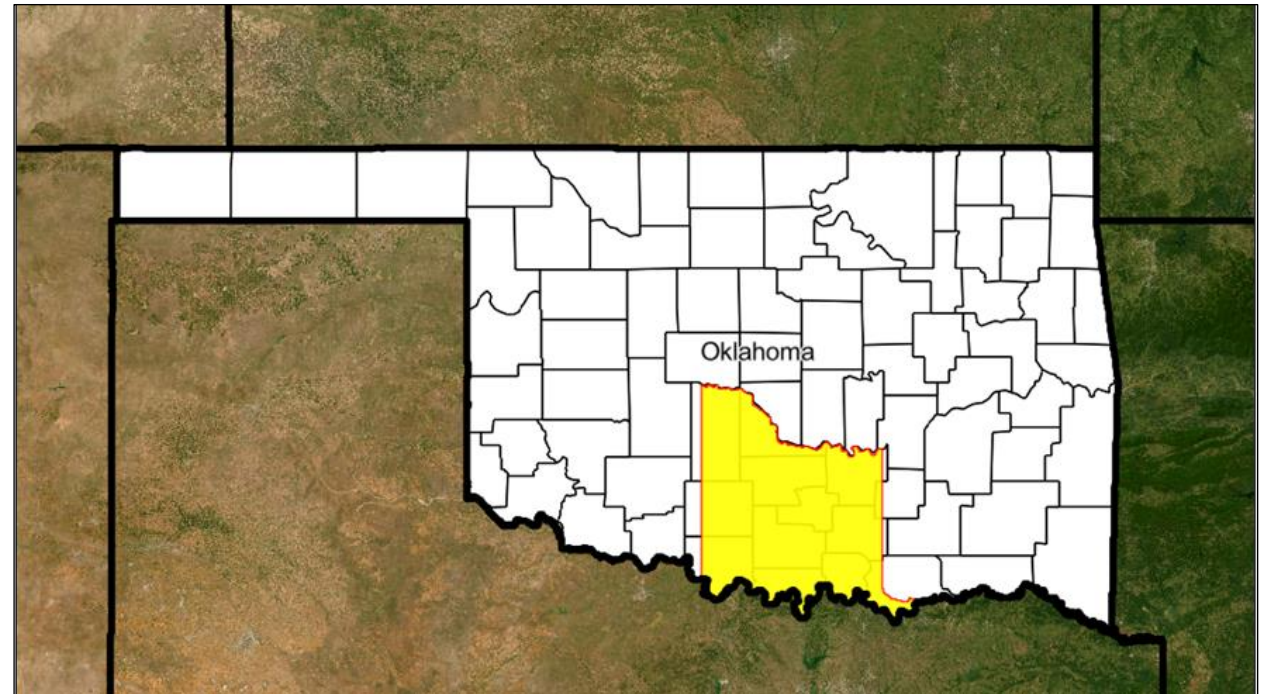
