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U.S. Army's 250th Birthday Parade – Washington, DC

Situation: The U.S. Army will hold its 250th Birthday Parade in Washington, DC on June 14th. The Secretary of Homeland Security has designated this event a NSSE, and as such FEMA has the primary responsibility for the coordination of federal consequence management planning.

- VA EOC is Steady State

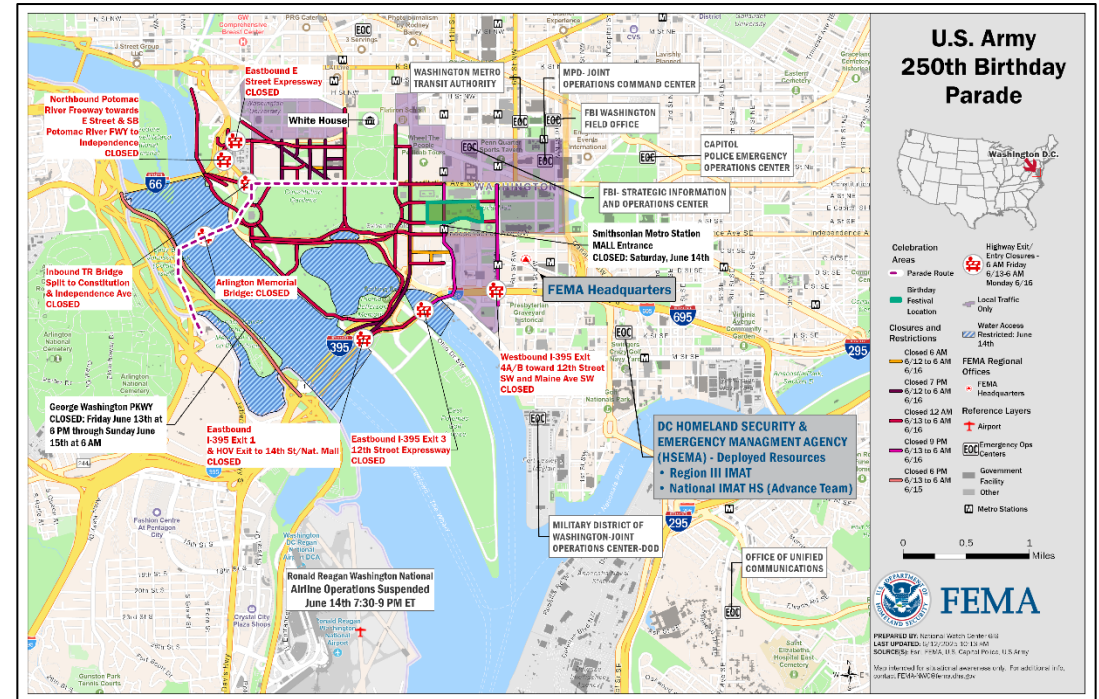

- RWC is at Normal; RRCC will be Enhanced Watch from June 14, 2025, 11:00 a.m. ET
- IMAT deploying to DCHSEMA EOC effective June 14, 2025, 11:00 a.m. ET
- R3 LNOs at USSS-WFO and MACC

FEMA HQ:

- NWC is at Enhanced Watch as of 8:00 a.m. ET Jun 14
- IMAT HS is on Alert as of 8:00 a.m. ET Jun 14
- CMCU members on Alert as of 8:00 a.m. ET Jun 14
- DEST members on Alert as of 8:00 am. ET Jun 14
- US&R will issue an ESF #9 Advisory
- Frederick MERS Detachment will provide communications and mobile command post functions to FEMA Region III and other federal agencies, as required
- NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with FEMA Region III



Office of National Capital Region Coordination (ONCRC):

- ONCRC will deploy liaison officers to multiple Joint Operations Centers, including the Joint Task Force – National Capital Region at Ft. McNair
- The ONCRC Virtual Situation Room will be activated at 7:00am ET Jun 14 until the event conclusion to provide real time situational awareness to interagency partners

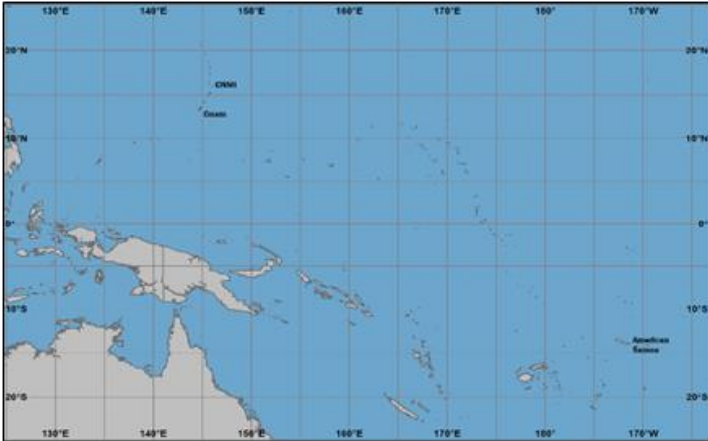


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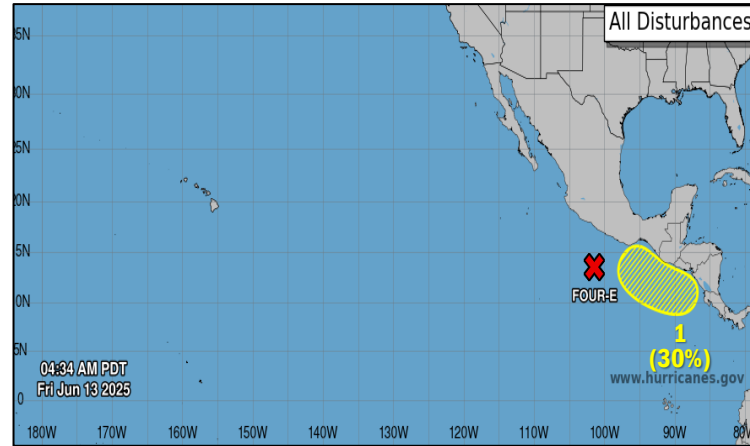
Tropical Outlook

Central and Eastern Pacific



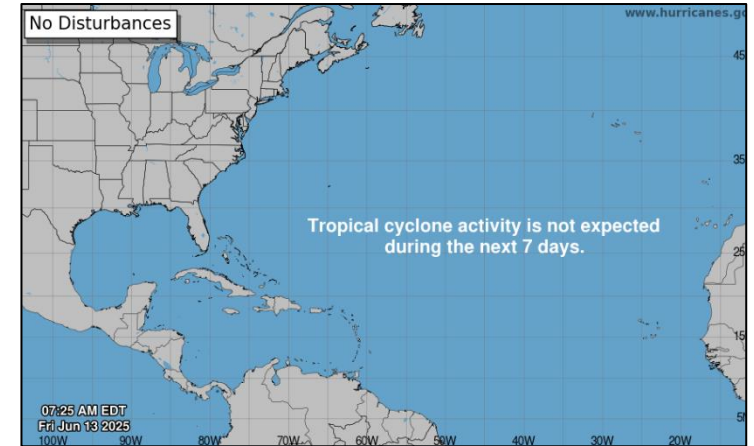
Potential Tropical Cyclone Four - E: (Advisory 3A, as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 295 miles S of Zihuantanejo, Mexico
- Moving NNW at 9 mph with maximum sustained winds of 35 mph
- Expected to become a tropical storm later today
- Formation chance – 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day: High (90%)

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Near the coast of Central America
- Conditions favor gradual development as it moves WNW
- Formation chance – 48 hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (30%)

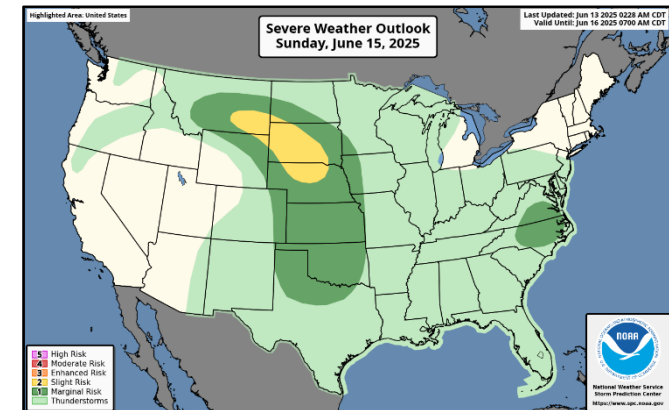
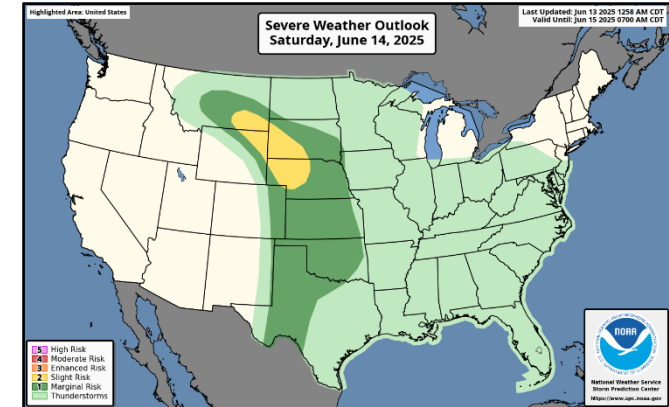
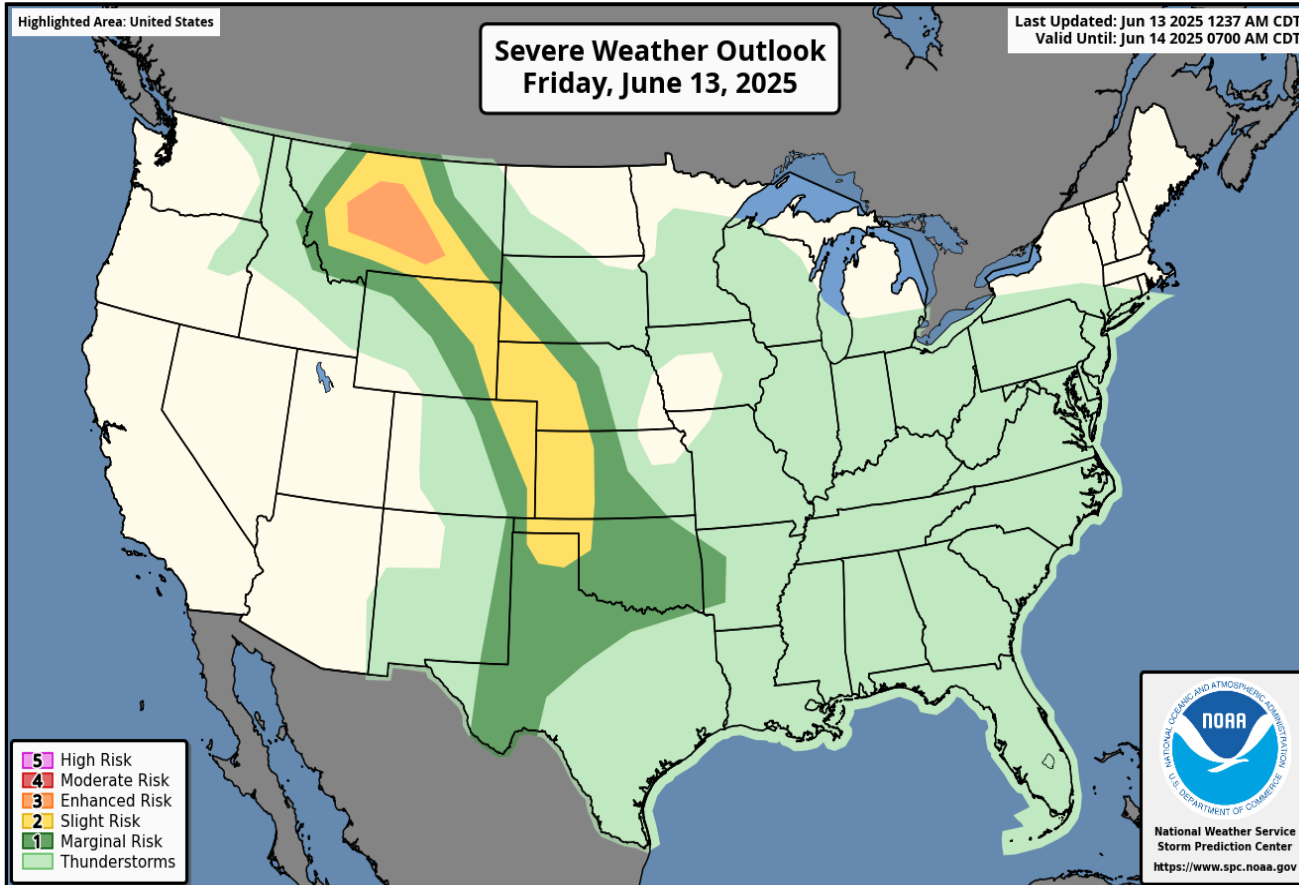
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Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



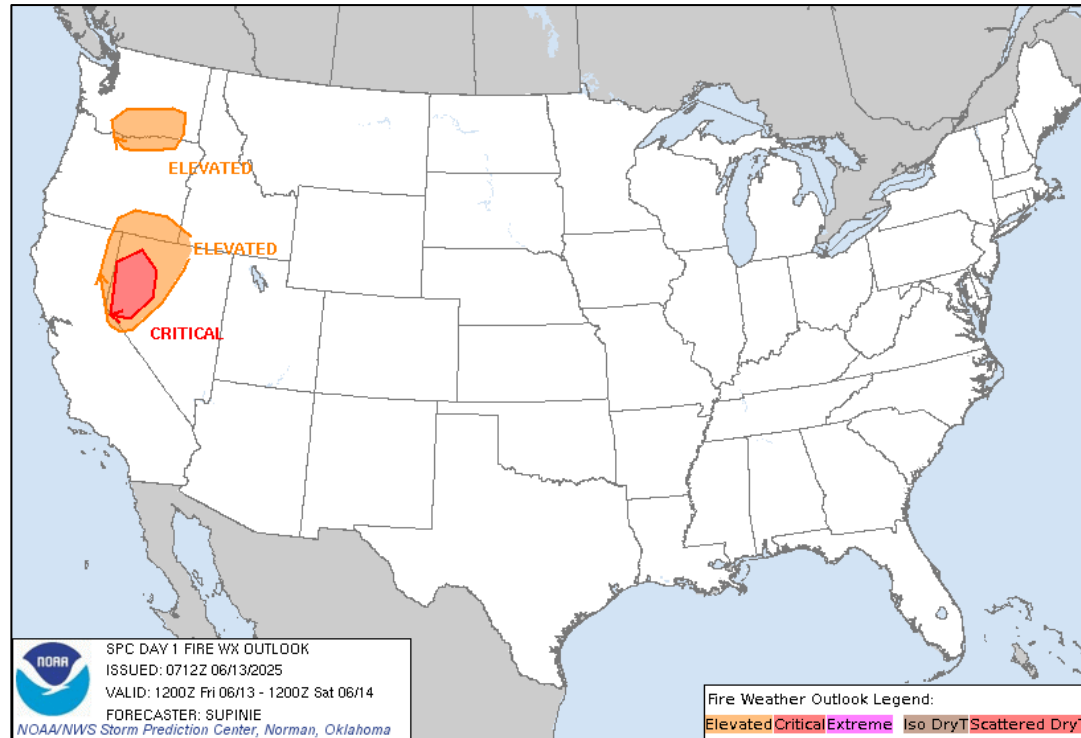

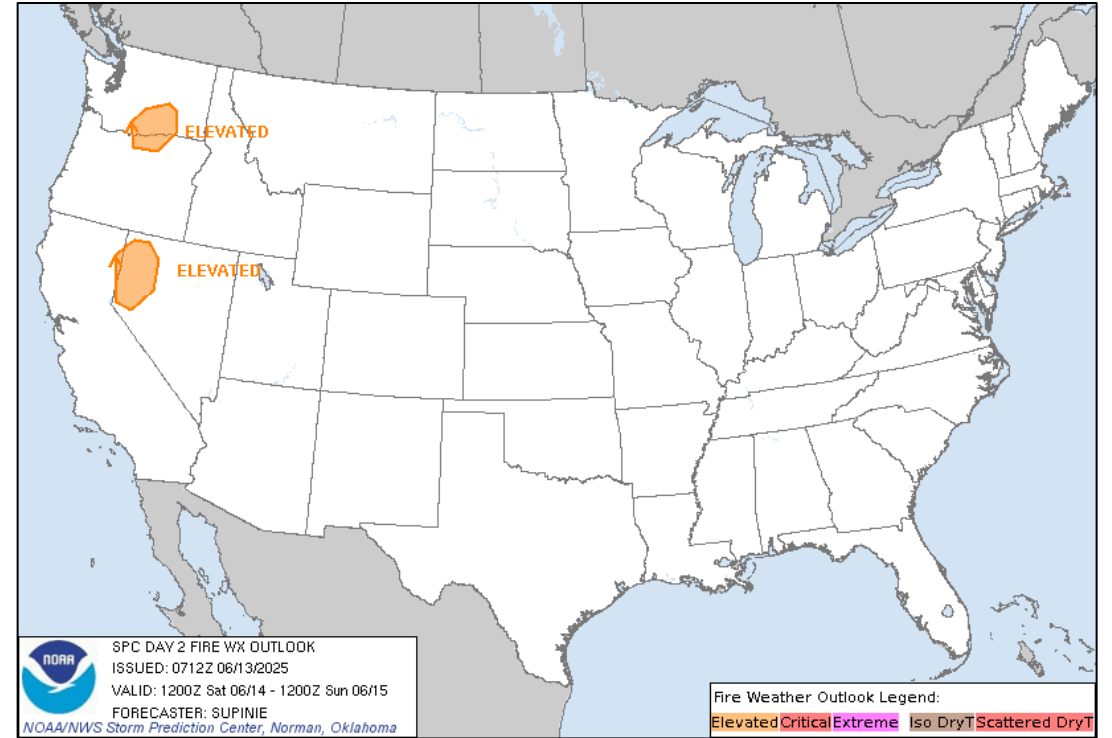


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Fire Weather Outlook
