  - Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Low (30%)
  - Eastern Pacific: Tropical Storm Blas; Disturbance 1: Medium (60%)
- Severe thunderstorms Middle/Upper Mississippi Valleys to Great Lakes; Southeast to Mid-Atlantic
- Heavy rain and flash flooding Upper Mississippi Valley to Great Lakes

<u>Current Situation:</u> Moderate to heavy rainfall and high elevation snowmelt caused significant and record-breaking river flooding across portions of the Yellowstone River Basin which includes Yellowstone National Park and the cities of Livingston (population 8k) and Red Lodge (population 2.2k). Water has crested near Red Lodge and Livingston, expected to crest near Billings

#### Lifeline Impacts:

#### Safety and Security

- Yellowstone National Park closed through Thursday
- Evacuations for portions of Red Lodge (pop 2,200 with 1,000 tourists), Fromberg, and Belfry; Stillwater County and Stillwater mine; 350 people evacuated in Park and Carbon counties; Cooke City and Silver Gate are isolated due to flooding on major roadways

#### Food, Water, Shelter


- Cooke City water plant damaged by flooding; city is trying to find water provider in WY
- Boil water advisories for Red Lodge, Fromberg, and all flood-affected areas of Stillwater County; Gardiner is under a Do Not Drink order
- 6 shelters open with 11 occupants statewide (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:48 a.m. ET)

*Health and Medical:* 1 hospital in Red Lodge, 1 hospital in Livingston, 1 long-term care facility in Stillwater evacuated

**Energy:** All of Red Lodge without power due to a transmission tower failure; centralized power outage around Gardiner in Park County; generator delivered to Carbon County to power hospital and water treatment plant

*Transportation:* At least 8 bridges washed out (Stillwater and Carbon counties), portions of U.S. 89, 191, 212; MT 78, 308, 419, 410; CR 419, 420 closed






#### Response:

- MT EOC at Partial Activation (Flooding); Governor declared a state of emergency
- MT NG deploying helicopters to Stillwater and Carbon counties for search and rescue
- MT coordinating with WY for EMAC support for the flooding response
- State requesting assistance from USACE under their own authority for sandbags and to determine water flowing through Red Lodge
- Region VIII, Denver MOC, and the NWC continue to monitor
- Region VIII RRCC will go to Level III at 12:00 p.m. ET; IMAT deploying to MT

#### **Eastern Pacific**




#### Tropical Storm Blas (Advisory #5 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 285 miles SSE of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving NNW at 6 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 65 mph
- Expected to become a hurricane later today
- Tropical storm force winds extend 60 miles

#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located off the coast of Guatemala and El Salvador
- Could become a tropical depression during the next couple of days
- Formation chance 48-hours: Medium (60%); 5days: Medium (60%)





#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located along the east coast of Nicaragua
