Hazard Monitoring

- Tropical Activity:
 - Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Low (10%)
 - Eastern Pacific: Hurricane Blas (CAT 1); Tropical Depression Three-E
- Severe thunderstorms Lower Ohio Valley to Southeast
- Critical fire weather Central Great Basin

Event Monitoring

No significant events



Flooding - Montana

<u>Current Situation:</u> Heavy rains with rapid snowmelt caused historic flooding in Montana. The Yellowstone River near Billings crested with a new historic record but has rapidly receded. Flood risk across Montana remains elevated due to extremely high snowpacks, warmer anticipated temperatures, and additional rain chances this weekend.

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security

- Yellowstone National Park will remain closed until further notice
- Evacuations lifted in Red Lodge and Stillwater County, but remain for Fromberg, and Belfry;
 new evacuations for Flathead County; pre-evacuations for Yellowstone County
- Cooke City and Silver Gate are now accessible from WY side

Food, Water, Shelter

- City of Billings water plant is now operational at full capacity
- Boil water advisories for Red Lodge, Fromberg, Gardiner, Cooke City, Silver Gate, and all flood-affected areas of Stillwater County
- Homes and businesses in eastern Red Lodge and east side of Fromberg do not have water service
- 1 (-3) shelters open with 5 occupants statewide (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 7:35 a.m. ET)

Transportation:

 8 bridges washed out; portions of US 89 and 212; MT 78, 308, 540; and CR 419 remain closed; US 191 re-opened; US 89 to Gardiner open to local traffic and essential/emergency services only




















State /Local Response:

- MT EOC at Partial Activation (Flooding); Governor declared a state of emergency;
- MT coordinating with WY for EMAC support for the flooding response

FEMA/Federal Response:

- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4655-DR-MT was approved June 16
- Region VIII RRCC at Level III; IMAT deployed to MT
- Region VIII, Denver MOC, and the NWC continue to monitor
- Coordinating Mission Assignments with MT for debris removal and access to water treatment plants
- Logistics deployed Incident Support Base (ISB) and Staging Management Team (SMT) teams to MT




Hurricane Blas (CAT 1) (Advisory #13 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

Tropical Depression Three-E (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 190 miles SSW of El Salvador
- Moving N at 2 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Some strengthening is forecast

Atlantic



<u>Disturbance 1</u> (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located along the coast of Honduras
- Some gradual development possible as it drifts WNW
- Formation chance 48-hours: Low (10%); 5days: Low (10%)



Hurricane Blas (CAT 1) – Eastern Pacific


Hurricane Blas (CAT 1) (Advisory #13 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 250 miles SW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph
- Little change in strength is forecast during the next 12
- Weakening expected through the weekend
- Hurricane-force winds extend 15 miles
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 140 miles






National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook







Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall





Fire Weather Outlook




